The Solid Waste Management Coordinati	ng Board (SWMCB) wa	s formed in 199	0 throu	gh a Joint Powe	ers Agreement (JP)	Α)
among the seven metro counties. Scott Co	ounty departed the org	anization in the	late 19	90's, leaving si	x member counti	es.
The SWMCB is engaged in transition planning this year, as they prepare for organizational changes that will occur on January 1, 2018, when Richardson, Richter, and Associates will no longer provide SWMCB with administrative and policy services. The existing JPA will also expire on that same date. SWMCB has hired Phil Eckhert as an independent consultant to survey SWMCB members, policy staff members, and policy consultants in order to assess stakeholders' desire to grow, maintain, or eliminate various aspects of SWMCB (and SWMCB as a whole). In addition, each member county must decide by June 28 whether it would like to continue its membership in SWMCB or leave the organization. The staff will present an analysis, options, and a recommendation to the Board. ACTION REQUESTED: Board guidance on the County's future relationship with the SWMCB.

2) The area is highly attractive to access the trail and the lake. At this spot people are observed accessing the lake to kite surf,					
fish, picnic and access the trail creating a parking demand. Foot traffic to the lakeshore has eroded the embankment and trail					
shoulder causing a safety and trail maintenance concern.					
3) Last fall the County worked with Waconia Township to sign the railroad property at North Shore Road, a no parking area.					
Residents near the trail and North Shore Road complained of parking and visibility issues at the trail crossing. Since the					
installation of the no parking signs we have received some complaints from residents of Waconia about not allowing parking.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION: Carver County Public Works is undertaking a joint corridor study on CSAH 61 and TH 41 with MnDOT in close coordination with the City of Chaska, Chanhassen and Carver. The primary purpose of the study is to provide for short, mid, and long-term transportation improvements along CSAH 61 between CSAH 11 and Bluff Creek Drive and TH 41 in downtown Chaska. The project includes reviewing the current issues, needs and opportunities within the corridor area. As part of the study process, recommendations for the following will be developed: future long-range corridor vision; future corridor concepts that include roadway geometrics, access management, pedestrian, intersection traffic control and alternate road locations; and concepts for stormwater management. Public Works staff and consultant staff plan to present information on the the current status of the corridor study and the upcoming scheduled activities in order to complete the study process.
