A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on June 6, 2017. Chair Tim Lynch convened the session at 9:04 a.m.

Members present: Tim Lynch, Chair, James Ische, Vice Chair and Gayle Degler.

Members absent: Randy Maluchnik, Tom Workman

Under public comments, Don Atkins, 14990 Jonathan Carver Parkway, raised his concerns with the spread of leafy spurge. He believed when the State did 212 they did not use certified straw and the weed has not been mowed and allowed to spread. He stated the State did not want to deal with it, pushed it to the County that in turn pushed it to the townships. He noted it already has gone to seed and this is something that should be addressed and taken care of.

Karen Johnson Leuthner, 15735 38<sup>th</sup> Street, stated she was present today to speak on behalf of someone that is no longer with us. She read the 2006 letter that was sent by this person to the County Attorney's office and sections of a letter that was sent by the attorney representing Northern Lights Broadcasting. She stated her concerns have been ignored, clarified she was present as a relevant public watchdog and distributed information to the County Attorney.

Degler moved, Ische seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

#### Motion carried unanimously.

Greg Boe, Environmental Services Manager, appeared before the Board to review the option to withdraw from the Solid Waste Management Coordinating Board. He explained the SWMCB was

created in early 1990's through a joint powers agreement between the seven metro counties out of a desire to address problems and challenges in solid waste and materials management. He indicated challenges were addressed, problems have been solved and there was a question of need for ongoing membership. He stated 2017 was a transition year and the transition was driven by the consulting firm that managed the Board. He indicated they needed to determine how the SWMCB would look in the future and while these answers would be coming in the future, the deadline to give notice to withdraw is June 30<sup>th</sup>.

He also noted the recent work session held on the issue and the recommendation to withdraw that was discussed.

Ische offered the following Resolution, seconded by Degler:

Resolution #39-17
Calling for the Withdrawal of Carver County from the Solid Waste Management Coordinating Board (SWMCB)

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn as the County Board and convene as the Carver County Regional Rail Authority. Motion carried.

Dan McCormick, Public Works, appeared before the Board to review the City of New Germany's request to install an electronic message board on Rail Authority property. He identified the location and indicated they reviewed it to ensure it did not conflict with any other traffic signs. He displayed an aerial view of the location and indicated the permit would be subject to Rail Authority review.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve a permit with the City of New Germany to allow the installation of an electronic message board sign and to authorize the Chair to sign. Motion carried.

Degler moved, Ische seconded, to adjourn as the Carver County Regional Rail Authority at 9:29 a.m. Motion carried.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:							
The Solid Waste Management Coordinating Board (SWMCB) was formed through a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) between the seven metropolitan counties in 1993. The purpose of the original organization was to allow the region to manage solid waste in an efficient and sustainable manner that will not compromise the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. That original JPA was amended in 1998, when six of the original member counties (Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey and Washington) elected to continue those regional efforts.  On May 31, 2017, the SWMCB met to discuss revised regional waste program functions and administrative approaches. The SWMCB passed a resolution stating their support for revised regional waste program functions and a preference for continuing to provide administrative services for the SWMCB through a consultant. This resolution further requested that all six member counties pass resolutions of support allowing SWMCB to amend to current JPA to extend the date for written notices of the intent to withdraw from June 30 to September 27, 2017, and to terminate the existing JPA, effective January 1, 2018 or on the date a new JPA is effective. All six member counties must pass a resolution of support before the existing JPA can be

A Resolution supporting the authority of the Solid Waste Management Coordinating Board (SWMCB) to amend the existing Joint Powers Agreement in order to change the deadline for notice to withdraw and to terminate the existing JPA on or before January 1, 2018.

**WHEREAS** the Solid Waste management coordinating Board (SWMCB) is a Joint Powers board established on September 1, 1993; and

**WHEREAS** on March 25, 1998, the SWMCB including Ramsey, Washington, Hennepin, Dakota, Carver, and Anoka Counties, approved an amended and restated Joint Powers Agreement that remains in effect today; and

**WHEREAS** the SWMCB has evaluated its regional solid waste functions and administrative arrangements; and

**WHEREAS** the recommended revised functions will require a new joint powers agreement to be developed;

**WHEREAS** it is the SWMCB's intent that a new joint powers agreement be developed by any remaining member counties and that it would replace the existing Joint Powers Agreement in the event that the SWMCB continued to exist beyond 2017; and

WHEREAS the SWMCB recommends that each county take action to terminate the existing joint powers agreement, effective January 1, 2018 or on the date a new joint powers agreement becomes effective, whichever comes first; and

**WHEREAS** the SWMCB recommends that all member counties approve an amendment to the existing joint powers agreement that amends Article X, Section 1, of the joint powers agreement to allow written notices of withdrawal to be provided to the SWMCB no later than September 27, 2017, for withdrawals to occur effective January 1, 2018; and

**WHEREAS** the SWMCB approves the recommended regional solid waste program functions and prefers that its administrative services be provided by a consultant, for the initial purpose of working with member counties to develop a new joint powers agreement; and

**WHEREAS** each SWMCB Member County is requested to advise SWMCB as soon as possible, but no later than the SWMCB meeting scheduled for September 27, 2017, of that member county's intent to remain or withdraw from the SWMCB, given the proposed terms for the new joint powers agreement.

WHEREAS, The County Engineer has secured and designated funding for this contract in the current fiscal year Road and Bridge budget; and

WHEREAS, On Thursday, May 25, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. at Carver County Public Works, 11360 Highway 212, Cologne, Minnesota, one (1) bid was received by Carver County Public Works and opened by two (2) representatives of Carver County Public Works for the **CSAH 61 Bridge & Roadway Improvements** Project, said bids for the responsible bidders are summarized as follows:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Carver County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes and directs the Carver County Board Chairman and Carver County Administrator to enter into Carver County Contract 17-250 with Minger Construction Co. Inc. of Jordan, MN, in the name of the County of Carver for the construction of the CSAH 61 Bridge & Roadway Improvements Project in accordance with the construction plans and specifications contained in the project manual; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Carver County Public Works is hereby authorized and directed to return the proposal guaranty to the bidders, except that of the successful low responsible bidder and second and third lowest bidder, which shall be retained until the construction contract has been signed and the performance and payment bonds of the low responsible bidder have been executed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Carver County Engineer, or his designee, is hereby authorized to take actions necessary and to enter into work orders, change orders or supplemental agreements on behalf of Carver County with an amount less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) and an increased aggregate project total of all project changes of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00), when time is of the essence to make contract changes due to unforeseen construction conditions in order to minimize construction delays and to efficiently carry out the planned project improvements.

To Whom It May Concern,

Recon, a 3.5 yr. old M/I German Shepherd Dog, presented to the University of Minnesota Veterinary Medical Center on May 23, 2017 for evaluation of diarrhea and weight loss. He has undergone an endoscopic procedure to evaluate him more fully and has been diagnosed with protein losing enteropathy. This is an immune mediated disease where the body causes inflammation in the intestinal lining which causes subsequent loss of nutrients primarily protein through the gastrointestinal tract. This is a lifelong disease that will require daily medical and dietary therapies to manage.

Dogs with this medical condition are sensitive to environmental changes primarily stress. The immune system is already altered and the therapies involved suppress the immune system which can make these patients predisposed to infections. Additionally, the protein loss they experience can make it difficult for them to maintain muscle mass and body conditioning. Both of these factors combined make it difficult for a working dog to maintain their previous level of activity and ability. High stress behaviors such as running down a subject, riding in a squad car, and working a large crowd are considered higher stress behaviors and demanding on the dog's body. Low impact behaviors such as drug sniffing, airport surveillance, and demonstration dog could be possible if such activities would be feasible for the department.

In my professional opinion, a dual trained dog such as Recon would not be able to maintain his current job with the diagnosis of protein losing enteropathy given the demands of his job on his body both physically and psychologically. The stresses that his job demands would make management of his disease difficult and would put his health and life at risk and quite honestly could put the safety of others relying on him in jeopardy. I would strongly consider his retirement for the best management of his health and well-being.



# Program Year 2017 Performance Measures

# **About This Program**

The Minnesota State Legislature in 2010 created the Council on Local Results and Innovation to develop standard performance measures to aid residents, taxpayers, and state and local elected officials in determining the efficiency and effectiveness of counties and cities in providing services and measuring residents' opinion of those services. The Council released a standard set of 10 performance measures for counties and created a comprehensive performance measurement system for counties to implement.

Carver County voluntarily agreed to participate in the state's Performance Measurement Program in 2011 and has participated each year since that time. The County follows the guidelines sent out by the Council and receives Local Government Aid reimbursement for its participation in the program. Carver County is one of 19 counties in the state (22 percent of all counties) that participate in the Performance Measurement Program.

The Performance Measurement Program reinforces Carver County's work to achieve its vision, mission, and goals listed and described as follows:

**Vision:** Where the future embraces the past in keeping Carver County a great place to live, work and play for a lifetime.

**Mission:** To meet the service requirements and special needs of our residents in a fiscally responsible and caring way. We will plan the county's growth to preserve its uniqueness and will encourage rural and urban compatibility. We will protect our history while planning for a dynamic future.

**Goals and Outcome/Output Measures:** Carver County's Strategic Plan outlines five goals designed to serve as the foundation for all future strategies, work, and priorities of the County. Each year, the County Board works with County staff to develop an Implementation Plan that outlines outcome/output measures that address the following five goals:

- **Communities Goal**: Create and maintain safe, healthy, and livable communities.
- **Connections Goal**: Develop strong public partnerships and connect people to services and information.
- Finances Goal: Improve the County's financial health and economic profile.
- **Growth Goal**: Manage the challenges and opportunities resulting from growth and development.
- **Culture Goal**: Provide an organizational culture which fosters individual accountability to achieve goals and sustain public trust and confidence in County government.

Within this Performance Measurement and Indicators Report, the County's goal statements related to Communities, Connections, Finances, and Growth are listed with one or more performance measures or indicators listed under the goal. No performance measures or indicators for the Culture goal were included in this report since none of the state standards for performance measures align with the County's goal statement related to Culture.







## **Public Safety Standard Measures**

Crime Rates and Response Times: One aspect of public safety is reflected in data submitted by the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehensions on Part I and Part II crimes committed in Carver County. Part 1 crimes include: homicide, rape, aggravated assault, burglary, robbery, auto theft, theft, and arson. Part II crimes include: other assaults, forgery, fraud, stolen property, vandalism, weapons, prostitution, other sex offenses, narcotics, gambling, family/children crime, driving under the influence (DUI), liquor laws, disorderly conduct, and other offenses. In 2016 a government mandated change in classification for crimes was released, Group A and Group B. Group A crimes include: animal cruelty, arson, assault, aggravated assault, bribery, burglary, counterfeiting/forgery, property damage, drugs, embezzlement, extortion/blackmail, fraud, gambling, homicide, human trafficking, kidnapping, theft/larceny, motor vehicle theft, pornography, prostitution, robbery, sex offenses (forcible and non-forcible), stolen property offenses, and weapons. Group B crimes include: bad checks, curfew/loitering, disorderly conduct, driving under the influence (DUI), drunkenness, family offenses (non-violent), liquor law violation, peeping tom, runaway, trespassing, ordinances, and all other offenses. The following table indicates Part I, Part II, Group A, and Group B crime rates for Carver County and the Carver County Deputy average response times for these types of crimes. The average response time is indicated in minutes from the time the call was dispatched to the first squad on the scene for a top-priority call for Part I, Part II, Group A, and Group B crimes:

**Adult Offenders with New Felony Convictions:** The recidivism rate for felony offenders is another measure of public safety. Data from the Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines Commission is used to determine the percent of adult offenders with a new felony conviction within three years of discharge. Pre-trial supervision cases were excluded as these cases are not formal supervision, and different results are expected for cased placed on supervision postadjudication.

Out of the sample of 644 cases, every fifth case was selected to total a sample of 128 offenders, which is approximately a 20% sample. Recidivism was tracked on these cases. Eight offenders reoffended at a felony level.
- (2) Sample generated from a Court Services Tracking System (CSTS) report of closed cases from 6/1/10 to 6/1/11. Out of the sample of 539 cases, every fifth case was selected to total a sample of 107 offenders, which is approximately a 20% sample. Recidivism was tracked on these cases. Six offenders reoffended at a felony level.
- (3) Sample generated from Court Services Tracking System (CSTS) report of closed cases from 6/1/11 to 6/1/12. Out of the sample of 537 cases, the first three pages of clients were selected to total a sample of 125 offenders, which is approximately a 23% sample. Recidivism was tracked on these cases. Five offenders reoffended at a felony level.
- (4) Sample generated from a Court Services Tracking System (CSTS) report of closed cases from 6/1/12 to 6/1/13. Out of the sample of 540 cases, random clients were selected to total a sample of 79 offenders, which is approximately a 15% sample. Recidivism was tracked on these cases. 5 offenders reoffended at a felony level.
- (5) Sample generated from a Court Services Tracking System (CSTS) report of closed cases from 6/1/13 to 6/1/14 Three year recidivism was tracked. Only felony convictions were counted as recidivism for this result. Pre-Trial Supervision cases were excluded, as these cases are not formal "supervision" and we expect different results for cases placed on supervision post-adjudication. Out of the sample of 556 cases, random clients were selected to total a sample of 75 offenders, which is approximately a 13% sample. Recidivism was tracked on these cases. 3 offenders reoffended at a felony level.





## **Public Health/Social Services Standard Measures**

**Tobacco and Alcohol Use:** In assessing the health of the County, areas of focus for the Public Health Department have included tobacco use and excessive alcohol use by County residents. The department uses the County Health Rankings to obtain information on tobacco and alcohol use by County residents.

The table below compares the percentage of County residents who use tobacco with the state average, and it compares the percentage of County residents who drink alcohol excessively with the state average.

**Low-Weight Births:** Another measure of a healthy community is reflected in the percentage of low-weight births that occur each year. Data from the Minnesota Department of Health and the County Health Rankings provide information on the percentage of low-birth-weight babies born to County residents. As the table below indicates, the percentage of low-weight births in the County has remained consistently below the state average from 2012-2016.

Maltreatment of Children: The safety of children in terms of the prevention of child abuse and neglect is also a measure of a community's health and safety. County records are used to determine the percent of children where there is a recurrence of maltreatment following an intervention. **Accuracy of Post-Election Audit:** One measure of a livable community is participation in elections and confidence in the accuracy of election results. Minnesota counties perform a post-election audit of election results returned by the optical scan ballot counters used in state general elections. The review is a hand count of the ballots for each eligible election in the precinct compared with the results from the voting system used in the precinct. The following table indicates the percentage of accuracy for the past three state elections.




## **Environment Standard Measures**

**Collection of Hazardous Household Waste and Electronics:** Hazardous waste can contaminate the soil and/or water supply if not disposed of property, posing a threat to health and the environment. Recycling rates for hazardous household waste and electronic provide another measure of a healthy community.

## **Social Services Standard Measures**

Workforce Participation Rates: The Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP) is the state's welfare reform program for low-income families with children. It helps families work their way out of poverty by expecting, supporting, and rewarding work. Direct benefits include food support and cash assistance. MFIP clients also receive Medical Assistance (MA), child care help, and employment services. When most families first apply for cash assistance, they will participate in the Diversionary Work Program, or DWP. This is a four-month program that helps parents go immediately to work rather than receive welfare. Connecting MFIP/DWP participants to services and information so they can become self-sufficient through employment is one measure of strong public partnerships.

The table below reflects data from the Minnesota Department of Human Services on the percent of MFIP/DWP adult residents of the County who are working 30 or more hours per week or are off cash assistance three years after beginning the program.

The following table reflects the number of Library visits using County records to compare the total population, total number of visits per year, and the number of visits per 1,000 residents.








## **Financial Standard Measures**

**Bond Ratings:** One indication of a county's financial health is its bond rating. Bond ratings are expressed as letters ranging from "AAA," which is the highest grade, to "C," also referred to as "Junk," which is the lowest grade. An issuer that is rated AAA has an exceptional degree of creditworthiness and can easily meet its financial commitments.

Carver County's ratings shown in the table below were issued by Standard and Poor's (S&P) Rating Services. Carver County is one of six Minnesota counties that received an "AAA" rating. Carver County's rating is also higher than Minnesota's rating of AA+.

## **Taxation Standard Measures**

**Level of Assessment Ratio:** Carver County is among the fastest growing counties in the state. As the number of households in the County increases along with population growth, the challenge is to provide accurate property value assessments. The level of assessment ratio is an indication of the quality and accuracy of the County's property value assessments. It is based on the difference between a property's assessed value and the actual sale price of the property. If the ratio falls between 90% and 105%, the level of assessment is determined to be acceptable. The following table shows the level of assessment ratio for all property types.

In March 2017, the County Board authorized the staff to request support from affected Cities and Townships and notify affected landowners of the proposed CCWMO boundary change. The staff is proposing to correct the boundary of the Water Management Organization. The administrative and taxing boundary between the Carver County Watershed Management Organization (CCWMO) and the Minnehaha Creek (MCWD) and Riley Purgatory Bluff Creek (RPBCWD) Watershed Districts has not matched the true drainage patterns of the watersheds since their creation decades ago. The MWCD and RPBCWD boards, city councils from Victoria, Chanhassen, Chaska, and the Laketown Township Board have all passed resolutions of support for the correction. #### **Background and Need**

The administrative and taxing boundary between the Carver County Watershed Management Organization (CCWMO) and the Minnehaha Creek (MCWD) and Riley Purgatory Bluff Creek (RPBCWD) Watershed Districts has not matched the true drainage patterns of the watersheds since their creation decades ago. To staff's knowledge, the boundary has not been updated since 1967 and the legal description since 1997.

The overall goal of this effort is to better align the tax boundaries with actual water drainage in the County. Numerous developments have occurred along the boundary since the watershed districts were formed creating inconsistencies on permitting, lack of input on water drainage impacts and lack of control on protection of area water resources.

#### **Impacted Parcels**

Based on staff analysis, the following numbers of parcels would "switch" watershed designation. A change in tax designation would accompany the switch.

#### Process

- 4. Carver County Board reviewed the draft boundary/petition and:

Petitioner, Carver County, a body politic and corporate, pursuant to Carver County Board of Commissioners Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, does hereby petition the Board of Water and Soil Resources to change the boundary of the Carver County Watershed Management Organization (CCWMO), the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District (MCWD) and the Riley Purgatory Bluff Creek Watershed District pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 103D.251 for the following reasons:

- 1. The CCWMO, MCWD, and RPBCWD are existing watershed management organizations entirely within the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area.
- 2. The areas proposed to be added to the each watershed are contiguous to the each and are also located entirely within Carver County and the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. The areas proposed to be added are described on the parcel list attached hereto as Exhibit A and the map attached hereto as Exhibit B. The areas proposed for change are located in Laketown Township and the Cities of Chanhassen, Chaska, and Victoria in Carver County.
  - a. The CCWMO encompasses approximately 320 square miles of Carver County in Minnesota. Portions of the CCWMO can be found in the following municipalities in Carver County: Benton Township, Camden Township, Carver, Chanhassen, Chaska, Cologne, Dahlgren Township, Hamburg, Hancock Township, Hollywood Township, Laketown Township, Mayer, New Germany, Norwood Young America, San Francisco Township, Victoria, Waconia, Waconia Township, Watertown, Watertown Township, and Young America Township.
  - b. The MCWD encompasses approximately 30 square miles of Carver County in Minnesota (a portion of the MCWD also extends into Hennepin County). Portions of

- the MCWD can be found in the following municipalities in Carver County: Chanhassen, Chaska, Laketown Township, and Victoria.
- c. The RPBCWD encompasses about 14 square miles of Carver County in Minnesota (a portion of the RPBCWD also extends into Hennepin County). Portions of the RPBCWD can be found in the following municipalities in Carver County: Chanhassen and Chaska.
- d. The proposed boundary change area, located within Laketown Township and the cities of Chanhassen, Chaska, and Victoria, and includes the following:
  - i. 288 parcels (X total acres) to be transferred from the MCWD to the CCWMO
  - ii. 17 parcels (X total acres) to be transferred from the CCWMO to MCWD
  - iii. 96 parcels (X total acres) to be transferred from the RPBCWD to the CCWMO
  - iv. 38 parcels (X total acres) to be transferred from the CCWMO to RPBCWD
- 3. The boundary change to these watersheds (CCWMO, MCWD, and RPBCWD) would benefit the public welfare and public interest and serve the purposes of Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103D. The affected parcels identified for the boundary change lie within the hydrological boundaries of the CCWMO.
- 4. The proposed boundary change area will be guided and managed consistent with the watershed management plan of each watershed organization as prepared, adopted, and implemented in accordance with requirements in Minnesota Statues 103B.

THEREFORE, the Carver County Board of Commissioners requests that the Board of Water and Soil Resources issues its order granting the following relief:

- 1. That the boundaries of the CCMWO, MCWD, and RPBCWD be changed to include the areas set forth on the parcel list attached hereto as Exhibit A and the map attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- 2. That the areas proposed to be included in the CCWMO, MCWD, and RPBCWD shall be guided and managed consistent with the current watershed management plan for each watershed in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 103B.




**WHEREAS**, the cities, townships, and watershed districts affected by the changes have each provided a statement of support for the proposed boundary change, found at Exhibit C; and


