Carver County Sheriff's Office TRIAD program is expanding. TRIAD is a partnership between the community, senior citizens and law enforcement; all working together to address public safety issues and protect our senior citizen community. Carver County started the program in 2011 and it has become an integral part of the community. TRIAD is expanding its activities to include more public safety engagements, volunteer staffing at major events, National Night Out/Night to Unite, and other activities. "TRIAD has been very successful in the past. Members have told us that there is more they can do to help the Sheriff's Office and community" said Lieutenant David M. Williams.
