A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on July 17, 2018. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 4:01 p.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, Randy Maluchnik, Vice Chair, James Ische, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Under public comments, Linda Hoffman and Nicole Taylor, stated they were present to explain the urgent need for an animal control facility in the County. Hoffman noted she was the lost and found cat volunteer for Carver County. She pointed out occurrences that have happened over the past year that support the need for this type of facility for cats.

She distributed information on a proposed model that is used in Scott County and with other agencies. She indicated having such a facility would allow them to network to find the cat's owner and keep the pet safe. Hoffman stated rescues are full and they were asking for help. She added agencies were willing to work with the County and understand the need.

Karen Johnson Leuthner, 15735 38th Street, Mayer, stated she was present as a relevant public watchdog and did not represent anyone from the County or Township. She noted she was required to wear a seatbelt while driving here but she had a tower built next to her that she knows is a health problem. She stated things went wrong and no one is talking about it. She understood the tower was owned by the township but antennas were being added after the CUP was issued. She stated additional antennas should not be allowed on the tower. She questioned the future solar locations in the rural service districts and if citizens were ever informed.

Lynch moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the July 10, 2018, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Professional services agreement with Stonebrooke Engineering for \$59,400 for bridge safety inspections for 2018, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Resolution #57-18, Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owner for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 140 Bridge Project-Carver Creek East

Resolution #58-18, Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owner for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 140 Bridge Project-Carver Creek West.

Resolution #59-18, Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 41 Project-Jonathan Area.

Approved eliminating vacant Senior Planner position in the Planning & Water Management Department and replace it with a Planner position.

Approved eliminating the vacant Administrative Representative (DBM A12) at First Street Center and replace with Administrative Assistant (DBM A13) and related HH&S budget amendment.

Contract with Michel Masonry Construction, Inc., pending completion of the contract review process.

Authorized Carver County Foster Care Licensing receipt of \$50 Amazon gift card donation and giving away items at River City Days.

Reviewed July 17, 2108, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$363,888.48.

Motion carried unanimously.

Derek Gunderson, Chair of the Local Advisory Committee on Mental Health, appeared before the Board to give an update on the Committee's work. He indicated this was not a comprehensive report and the Committee would report back on that later.

He pointed out the listening session scheduled for September in Chanhassen. Gunderson encouraged the Board members to attend the Committee's monthly meetings. He noted the Committee supported the stabilization center in the past and would like an update on programming. He pointed out transportation, the shortage of beds and affordable housing have all been identified as areas for improvement. He understood budgets were tight and asked that mental health needs be a priority as the Board considers its budget.

The Board thanked Gunderson for his leadership and expressed appreciation for the work of the committee.

Maluchnik moved, Lynch seconded, to go into closed session at 4:35 p.m. to discuss pending litigation under the attorney-client privilege, pursuant to Minn. Stat. 15D.05, Subd. 3(b). Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn the closed and Regular Session at 5:30 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owner for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 44 Bridge West Chaska Creek Project

- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carver County is the official governing body of Carver County ("County"); and
- WHEREAS, the County, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, is authorized by law, and pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, § 163.02, subd. 2; §117.012; and § 117.042, to acquire land and other real property interests in Carver County which the County needs for a public use or public purpose; and
- WHEREAS, the County proposes to construct highway and related improvements in Carver County for the Highway 44 Bridge Project ("Project"); and
- WHEREAS, to complete the Project, the County must acquire the real property interests described in Exhibit A, attached hereto, from the Owners of the real property interests identified in said Exhibit A; and

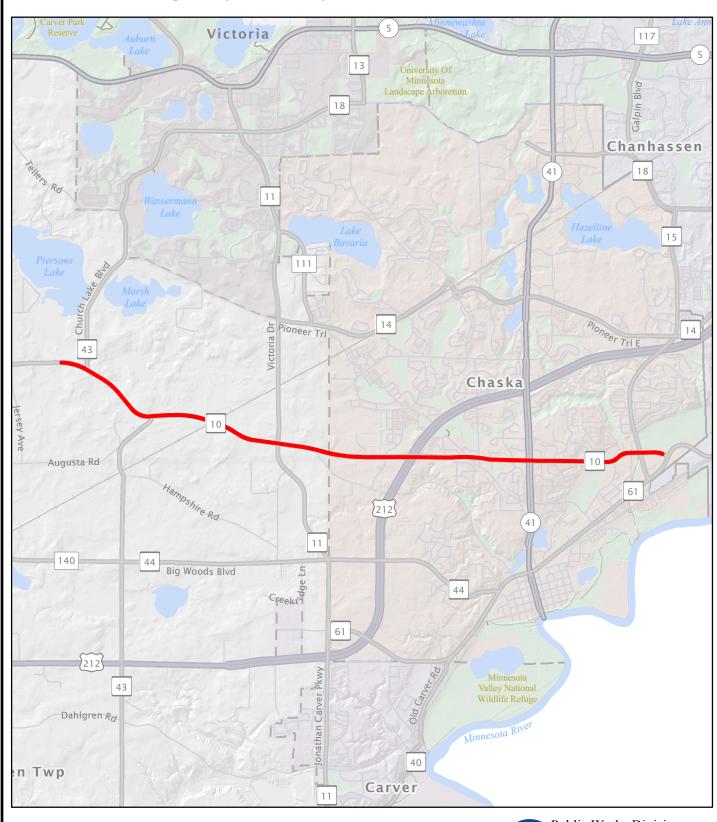

WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of July 17, 2018; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. Reginald & Elizabeth Vinkemeier own an approximate 42.73 acre parcel, located in the East Half (E ½) of the Southeast Quarter (SE¼) of Section 11, Watertown Township. The property is unimproved (vacant land) with the potential for additional density ("High Amenity Lot"). The applicants obtained a variance for a reduced lakeshore setback, on July 11, 2018, pursuant to Board of Adjustment Order #PZ20180011 (i.e. 50' variance, 100' vs. 150' setback). The parcel is in the Agricultural Zoning District, Shoreland Overlay District (Oak Lake) and CCWMO Crow River watershed.
- 2. The applicants are requesting a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to allow for the development of one (1) High Amenity Lot pursuant to Section 152.078 (A) & (D) of the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 3. The subject property was a parcel of 40 acres or more (47.75 ac.) as of July 1, 1974 and was under one ownership at that time. The "1 per 40" building eligibility (existing house) was split off the north side of the property with 5.02 acres in 2013. Watertown Township allows for additional density in their Chapter of the Comprehensive Plan. The applicant is pursuing only one (1) building eligibility pursuant to 152.078 D, which provides for flexibility and incentives for pursuing a single eligibility or lot split. The proposed building site would comply with the "4 per 40" limitation. The subject property is not enrolled in the Ag Preserves program.
- 4. The applicant's request would meet the intent of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan. The property is a substantially wooded lakeshore, which could support two or more building sites.
- 5. The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (Mn/DNR) Area Hydrologist, Jennie Skancke, has reviewed the request and indicated that there are no objections or concerns since the site is not within the Shoreland Impact Zone (i.e. not within 75 feet of the OHW).
- 6. The proposed (new) dwelling would meet the 50' bluff setback, and the new septic system would meet the 150' OHW setback. According to the applicant's, the location near the lake was selected to take advantage of the most desirable building site and to save two White Oak trees.
- 7. The property would not be platted, and a new township road would not need to be constructed. The applicants' proposal would allow for the creation of a residential lot in the future (e.g. minor subdivision off Oak Lake Circle), however, their current plan is to build a retirement home on the 42.73-acre subject parcel. The balance of the land

would continue to be farmed and remain in agricultural use. The owners have indicated that their family plans to continue farming, in conjunction with their feedlot (farmstead) located on Navajo Ave to the east. They intend to keep the property in the Green Acres program, which is administered by the Assessor's Office; or the agricultural portion of the parcel may be added to their other farmland, which is currently enrolled in the Ag Preserve Program.

- 8. The applicants have acknowledged that no additional wooded or high amenity eligibilities would be permitted in the future. Section 152.078 states that the CUP provision may be exercised only once for each parcel that was of record as of July 1, 1974.
- 9. The Watertown Town Board reviewed and recommended approval of the request at their June 4, 2018 Town Board meeting.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of Conditional Use Permit #PZ20180013, for a One Building Eligibility Incentive on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

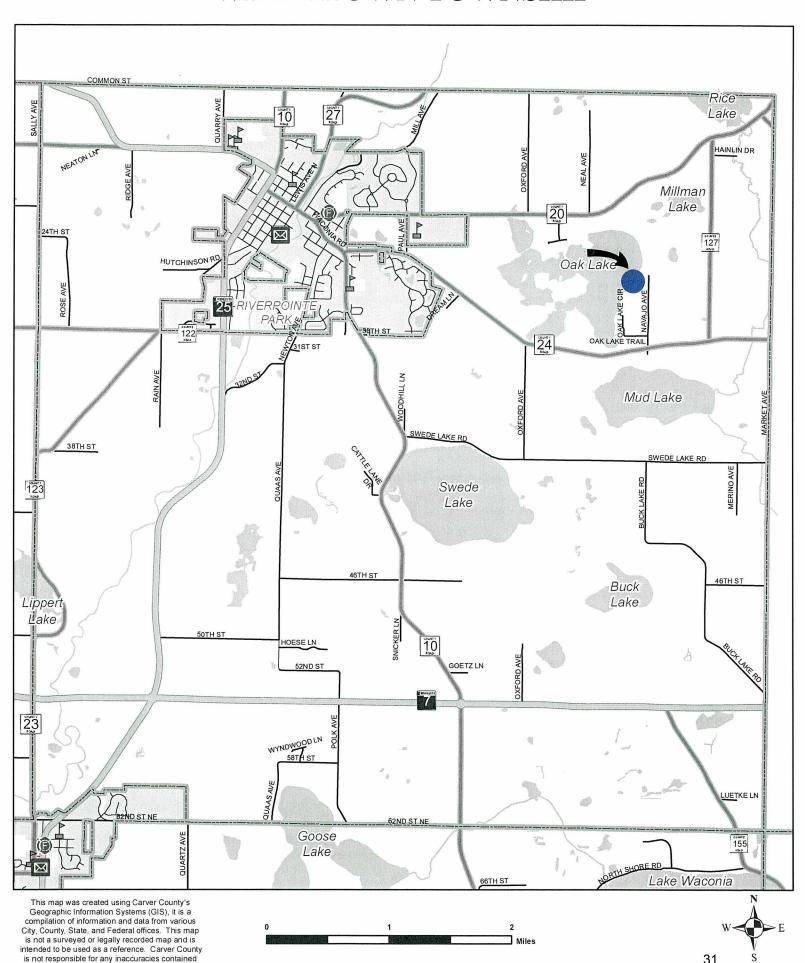
- 1. One (1) lot is permitted which shall have only one (1) building eligibility and shall conform substantially to the approved site plan with road frontage on Oak Lake Circle. Additional lots (eligibilities) shall not be granted as a conditional use.
- 2. The lot location is rural and commercial agricultural, feedlots and other rural use activities will likely be occurring in the area. The lot owner is hereby provided notice that there may be odors, dirt, dust, insects, noises, long hours of operation and other factors associated with agricultural and feedlot activities. Complaints relating to these activities shall be considered unwarranted so long as the activities are being conducted in accordance with the existing standards.
- 3. The Permittee(s) must preserve the remaining agricultural production land, as much as possible (e.g. Green Acres or Agricultural Preserve Program), until such time that there is a change in applicable zoning regulations for the subject property.

SUBJECT: CARVER COUNTY OFFICIAL COMMENT ON METROPOLITAN COUNCIL 2040 TRANSPORTATION POLICY PLAN UPDATE

Dear Chair Tchourumoff,

Carver County, as one of the seven counties comprising the Metropolitan Council's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA), submits the following comments on the Draft 2040 Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) Update for consideration by the Metropolitan Council's Transportation Advisory Board, the federally designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO).

1. Planning for Federal-Aid Highways.

- a. Federal Planning Requirement 23 CFR 450.324 specifies the requirements for the development and content of the metropolitan transportation plan. Section f.11.i. states "(f)The Metropolitan Transportation Plan shall, at a minimum include: (11)A financial plan that demonstrates how the adopted transportation plan can be implemented. (i) For purposes of transportation system operations and maintenance, the financial plan shall contain system-level estimates of costs and revenue sources that are reasonably expected to be available to adequately operate and maintain the Federal-aid highways (as defined by 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(5) and public transportation (as defined by title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53). 23 U.S. Code 101 specifies definitions and declarations of policy. Item 6 is the definition of Federal-aid highway: "The term "Federal-aid highway" means a public highway eligible for assistance under this chapter other than a highway functionally classified as a local road or rural minor collector."
- b. <u>Draft 2040 TPP Update</u> The Metropolitan Council's Draft TPP Update identifies the Regional Highway System (Page 5-1 & Figure 5-2) as roadways functionally classified as Principal Arterials and Minor Arterials identified as "A-Minor Arterials." The Draft TPP Update excludes regional planning and analysis for Federal-aid highways functionally classified as Urban and Rural Major Collectors, Urban Minor Collectors, and Minor Arterials identified as "B-Minor Arterials" and thus does not meet the federal Metropolitan Transportation Plan requirement identified above to plan for all Federal-aid highways.

c. Requested Change to Meet Federal Planning Requirement – Revise the Draft 2040 TPP Update to incorporate planning and analysis for the full Federal-aid highway system in the MPA, including roadways functionally classified as Urban and Rural Major Collectors, Urban Minor Collectors, and Minor Arterials identified as "B-Minor." This is an important regional planning requirement to the County because the majority of this system is County-owned. It is highly important to incorporate the preservation, mobility, and safety needs of the whole Federal-aid highway system in regional planning and decision-making.

2. Fiscally Constrained Transit Planning Assumptions.

- a. <u>Draft 2040 TPP Update</u> In Chapter 6: Transit Investment Direction and Plan, as part of the Transitway System Investment Plan, the transitway expansion projects assumed to be funded within the Current Revenue Scenario are described. The six projects assumed to be funded are: METRO Orange Line, METRO Green Line Extension, METRO Blue Line Extension, METRO Gold Line, Rush Line Dedicated Bus Rapid Transit, and C Line. Page 6.62 highlights the federal funding assumptions for these transit expansions and states:
 - i. "The region will continue to plan for and prepare federally competitive projects and explore opportunities for multi-project commitments from the federal government. There is risk in these assumptions, as the Plan assumes approximately 10% of the federal budget for Capital Investment Grants (under current budget amounts) for ten years [emphasis added]. Should federal funding not materialize for any given project, the region will need to work cooperatively to determine a viable funding path forward that considers the *Thrive MSP 2040* outcomes of Stewardship, Prosperity, Equity, Livability, and Sustainability."
- b. Request for Fiscally Constrained Transit Planning Assumption The risk included in the federal funding assumption for these projects has the potential to impact regional transportation funding needs and priorities if federal funding is not awarded. The County requests the Draft 2040 TPP Update to include a financial history of federal transit funding received over the previous 20-year period to assist in justifying the federal funding assumption and to identify more details on the funding approach for transitway expansion projects if federal funding is not awarded.

3. Requested Technical Changes.

a. <u>Highway System Changes since the Last Transportation Plan (Page 5.9)</u>

i. Change the language for the "MN 101 River Crossing" project to: "In 2016 <u>Carver County</u> completed a \$34 million project..." and recognize that MN 101 was turned back to the County and is now CSAH 101.

b. <u>Table 5-10: Highway Strategic Capacity Enhancements 2018-2025 (Page 5.46)</u> –

- i. Change the Project Description for the MN 212 / Carver CR 44 project from "Freeway Ramps to/from North" to "Interchange."
- ii. Change asterisk language to "The timing of some Carver County projects may extend beyond 2025."
- iii. Identify other County or State projects that could extend beyond 2025 in addition to Carver County projects.

c. Regional Mobility: MnPASS (Pages 5.56-5.62) –

i. Figure 5-18: MnPASS Projects: Increased Revenue Scenario (Page 5.57) does not include future MnPASS facilities in Carver County. Two figures depicting 2040 congestion analysis make this a concern: 1) Figure 5-6: 2040 Congested Principal Arterials for Current Revenue Scenario (page 5.13) shows roadways in 2040 with one hour or more of congestion. US 212 is depicted with one hour or more of 2040 congestion from TH 41 to I-494; and 2) Figure 5-19: 2040 Congested Corridor Trips with Congestion Free Option, Increased Revenue Scenario (Page 5.61) shows the percentage of 2040 congested trips with a congestion free option. The majority of Carver County is shown in the 0-10% category, which represents the percentage of 2040 congested trips with a congestion free option. Due to the analysis in these two figures, the County requests the addition of a MnPASS expansion option for future study on US 212 between TH 41 and I-494.

d. Additional Highway Needs beyond Increased Revenue Scenario: New Principal or A-Minor Arterials to Support Expanding Urban Development section (Page 5.67-5.68) –

i. Add Carver County future north-south principal arterial highway: CSAH 33 from southern County border to northern County border.

These comments depict the County's primary policy level concerns and requested technical changes for the Metropolitan Council's Draft 2040 TPP Update. Thank you for your

consideration of these comments and continued partnership in the regional transportation planning process.
