#### **2019 BUDGET NARRATIVE**

For the 2019 budget, the Carver County Community Development Agency (CDA) is requesting a levy of \$2,503,130 which is a \$149,429 or about 6% increase from the 2018 levy. The impact on a \$336,900 valued home is \$3.32 for a total of \$53.96.

#### **Tenant Based Rental Assistance Programs**

#### **Bridges Program**

MN Housing funded program to provide a housing subsidy for persons with serious mental illness.

#### **Housing Trust Fund**

A rental assistance program through MN Housing designed to address homelessness (preference) for those with a disability.

#### **Permanent Supportive Housing Program**

A federally funded program as part of the HEARTH Act for persons that are homeless and disabled.

#### **Coordinated Entry System**

The CDA is a point of entry for the Coordinated Entry process for single adults and families that are experiencing homelessness in Carver County. This process is a HUD mandate to connect the homeless with housing program resources.

#### **Carver County Homes**

The CDA will contract with Met Council to provide vouchers for the 81 housing units scattered throughout Carver County.

#### **Rental Housing Opportunities**

The CDA provides and manages affordable housing opportunities for working families and seniors throughout Carver County.

- Centennial Chanhassen

#### **Project-Based Vouchers:**

Thirty-one (31) units scattered throughout our properties are Project Based Vouchers.

Of that total, nine (9) are designated for homeless and three (3) are designated for homeless veterans.

A newly created partnership with the school districts includes two (2) units designated for homeless households within the Waconia School District and three (3) units designated for homeless households within Eastern Carver County School District.

#### **Community and Economic Development Programs**

#### **Community Growth Partnership Initiative**

The Community Growth Partnership Initiative was created and funded by the Carver County Community Development Agency in January 2016. The goals of the program are to increase the tax base and improve the quality of life in Carver County through three specific strategies: affordable housing development, job creation and redevelopment/community development; through direct grants to Cities within Carver County.

Since its inception, the Initiative has achieved the following:

#### Planning Grants:

- The City of Carver-Create a Redevelopment Plan for the Lenzen Bus Garage for senior housing.
- The City of Watertown-Create a Redevelopment Plan for the former Carver County Public Works satellite location. The new location for Lakeview Clinic is under construction.
- City of New Germany-Complete a Wastewater Facility Plan.
- City of NYA-Complete a Redevelopment Plan for downtowns.

#### Redevelopment Grants:

• 191 jobs created (81 FTE positions). 14 jobs retained.

#### **Housing Counseling**

The CDA is a HUD-approved housing counseling agency that provides the following services to Carver County residents:

- **Foreclosure Prevention Assistance**-The CDA assists Carver County homeowners who are delinquent or may become delinquent on their mortgage.
- Financial Fitness Counseling

   The CDA assists residents with budgets, credit repair, negative rental reference report responses.
- Pre-Purchase Counseling & Education- County residents and potential homebuyers can
  meet with the CDA to determine if they would qualify for a mortgage to buy a home. The
  CDA will set up a plan of action with the client to help them overcome any barriers they
  may have to achieving homeownership. Potential homebuyers can attend our education
  workshop (HomeStretch). First-time homebuyer mortgage and down payment assistance
  programs require education certificates.
- Post Purchase Counseling- Carver County residents can meet with counselors to discuss refinance options or budgeting questions to ensure successful home ownership and maintenance questions.
- Rental Assistance Counseling

   The CDA provides assistance in finding rentals in Carver
  County, reviewing the rental history reports and assisting with the explanation of
  barriers.

#### **Land Trust Program**

The CDA administers a Community Land Trust program. The CLT model provides access to home ownership opportunities for moderate income households who might not otherwise afford homes in the community. The CLT ensures permanent affordability by removing from the real estate purchase. Homebuyers must be at or below 80% AMI and mortgage ready. Currently, there are 28 land trust homes located throughout Carver County. Homes are currently located in Chaska, Victoria, and Waconia.

The CDA received funding in 2017 to expand the Land Trust program in the City of Waconia. The CDA will be adding an addition four to five units.

#### Septic/Well Replacement Loan

The CDA has partnered with Carver County Environmental Services to provide county residents with a low-interest loan to make improvements to their failing septic system or well. The CDA is responsible for approving clients for the program as well as filing the special assessment against the property.

#### **Small Cities Development Program**

The CDA administers this program for cities in Carver County that receive SCDP funding from the Department of Employment & Economic Development (DEED). The program can fund single-family, rental and commercial rehab, public facilities and homebuyer programs.

In 2017, the CDA has received funding of \$511,750 for the City of Watertown for Commercial Rehabilitation and Single-Family Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation within a targeted area.

To date, grant funds totaling \$122,631 have been expended. This includes four commercial rehabs that have been completed. In process rehab includes two commercial and four single family homes. The entire amount of the commercial portion of the grant will be expended by the end of 2018 and half of the owner-occupied.

#### Watertown EDA rehab fund

The CDA is administering a home ownership rehab fund on behalf of the Watertown EDA for households throughout the entire City of Watertown at or below 100% AMI. This allows more flexibility in funding than Small Cities Development Program.

One loan has been fully executed, one is out to bid, and three applications are pending.

#### **MN Housing Rehab**

The CDA administers the Minnesota Housing Rehabilitation Loan/Emergency and Accessibility Loan Programs (RLP/ELP) throughout Carver County. The program provides deferred loan financing to eligible low-income homeowners who are unable to secure home improvement financing in the private sector. Funds may be used for basic home improvements that directly affect the home's safety, habitability or energy efficiency.

#### Single Family Mortgage Program

The CDA administers the Minnesota City Participation Program (MCPP) offered through the MN Housing. The MCPP program is designed to assist first-time homebuyers in Carver County obtain affordable financing to purchase a home. The 2018 MCPP program year has been a resounding success to date.

- Develop workforce, senior, and affordable housing in Carver County so workers can live and work here in Carver County, which will support economic development and business throughout the county.
- Promote redevelopment within the cities of Carver County through new mixed-use projects which promote downtown living and shopping.
- Provide marketing, technical assistance to cities and business finance resources to industrial and business park developments in the county.
- Establish and maintain high quality service with interested stakeholders to build a collegial working relationship that contributes to CDA initiatives.
- Participate in the Greater MSP Economic Development Partnership; represent Carver County as the Public-Sector Representative on the Greater MSP Advisory Group.

The CDA actively looks for opportunities in the County to further senior and affordable workforce rental housing in an effort to preserve the "Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing" in Carver County. The CDA actively looks for financing opportunities to construct affordable housing for Carver County to meet the housing demand outlined in the Carver County 2017 Affordable Housing Study Updates and the 2030 Comprehensive Plan.

The CDA has been in discussions with the City of Watertown regarding the 25 acres the CDA currently owns.

The CDA is also investigating the potential of utilizing the Land Trust model in partnership with MAC-V for veterans.

The CDA is going to pursue a contract to study Tourism and Economic Development in 2018/2019.

PRA 2018 - 5596				

A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on August 7, 2018. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 9:03 a.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, Randy Maluchnik, Vice Chair, James Ische, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Under public comments, Karen Johnson Leuthner, 15735 38<sup>th</sup> Street, Mayer, explained she was a public watchdog and did not represent the County or Hollywood Township. She pointed out the article that referenced a three million expenditure for the Event Center and acknowledged this was not to be used for the building but they would pay for maintenance. She stated they have an emergency communications tower that is almost 20 years old and no money is being spent on that. She noted the expansion of broadband and pointed out the request for an additional antenna on the same tower as the emergency communications equipment. She asked that the County Attorney stop this and believed that Hollywood Township should not be signing leases.

Noah McCourt, 33 West Lake Street, Waconia, stated he submitted a data request in March and he still had not received all the data. He indicated it had been difficult to correspond to the person responsible to provide the data. He stated the County was not in compliance and the current policy needs to be revised.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the July 17, 2018, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved grant agreement SG-22057 with the Metropolitan Council pending finalization of the contract review process and related Parks budget amendment.

Reviewed July 24, 2018, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$452,974.51; reviewed July 31, 2018, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$509,329.85 and reviewed August 7, 2018, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount \$577,407.14.

Motion carried unanimously.

Keith Carlson, MICA Executive Director, appeared before the Board to give an overview of the 2018 legislative session. He pointed out the legislature had three major bills but only enacted a bonding bill. He reviewed implications of not enacting the tax bill that conformed to the recent federal changes and a supplemental budget bill. Carlson stated the bonding bill was one success and provided much needed funding. He indicated MNLARS funding was largely unaddressed, as was reimbursement to deputy registrars. He pointed out the Governor's vetoes that related to environmental regulations and the veto of the Met Council restructuring bill. Carlson referenced the healthy balance remaining unspent and funds needed in the future for MnCare and MA.

Ryan Erdman, Steve Novak and Nancy Silesky, representing MICA, updated the Board on legislative issues related to public safety, transportation and health and human services.

Carlson recognized the results were both good and bad and there would have been a number of policy changes that would have been helpful to counties. He thanked the County for their continued membership and recognized Commissioners Degler and Maluchnik for representing Carver County on the MICA Board.

Rod Franks, Health and Human Services Director, explained he was present for an update on the Steiner-Kelting Mental Wellness Center and for approval for an advisory committee. He highlighted a sketch of the center and proposed addition. He explained a community open house was held in June and comments were all positive. He indicated a number of people had expressed an interest in participating in the advisory committee.

He stated the grant agreement has been executed with the State and the funds can be released to the County as expenditures are incurred. They are moving forward with the design of the addition and rfps for architect services have gone out.

Franks displayed a rendering of what the building will look like and stated they wanted it to be an asset to the community and be realized by the community as something as value. He identified the

areas that advisory committee would focus on. Franks stated appointments would be for two years and they would work with the consultant to review the applications and make appointment recommendations to the Board. He reviewed the proposed makeup of committee members.

The Board discussed the option to appoint a Board member to serve on the Committee. Following discussion the Board expressed consensus to have Maluchnik serve as a liaison on the Committee, with Workman as an alternate.

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to approve creation of the Steiner-Kelting Wellness Facility Advisory Committee. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 10:10 a.m. and go into a work session with Finance. Motion carried unanimously.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:						
In 2008, voters approved the Legacy Amendment to provide 3/8ths of 1% sales tax for Outdoor Heritage, Clean Water, Parks						

and Trails, and Arts. The amendment was implemented in July of 2009 and will remain in effect for 25 years or until 2034. Parks and Trails Funds collected are to supplement traditional funding sources for the State Park System, Metropolitan Regional Park System and Regional Parks of Greater Minnesota.

For Carver County as an implementing agency of the Regional Park System, the total Parks and Trails Legacy Funding allocation is anticipated to be approximately \$796,166 for state fiscal years 2020 and 2021. An actual amount will be determined during the 2019 legislative session.

Parks and Trail Legacy Funds are recommended to be allocated towards staffing, recreation programs, marketing and outreach, and capital projects. These activities are consistent with how these funds can be utilized. New to the requested allocation of Parks Trails Legacy Funds is partial funding for a new position of Parks Operations and Natural Resource Supervisor. - **91.06**(C)(1)(b) Noise; amplification of sound. Add language to allow conduct relating to music or sound equipment when County Board approves of conduct, or when County Board approves uses permit for that conduct.
- **91.06**(C)(1)(c) Noise; amplification of sound. Simplify and clarify language. Add language to allow conduct relating to making loud or unusual noises when County Board approves of conduct, or when use permit permits that conduct.
- **91.06(E) Assemblies, meetings, and the like.** Clarify language. Add language to allow conduct relating to meetings, assemblies, worship services, entertainment, parades or demonstrations when Parks and Recreation Director approves of that conduct or approves a use permit for that conduct.

**91.06(F) Amusement contraptions.** Add language to allow conduct relating to amusement or entertainment contraptions when Parks and Recreation Director approves of that conduct or when use permit authorizes conduct.

#### 91.07 Protection of Property, Structures and Resources.

**91.07(C)(2) Destruction or defacement.** Change "Public Works Department" to "Public Works Division."

#### 91.08 Recreational Activities.

91.08(A)(7). Camping. Add language for consistency.

**91.08(C)(1). Swimming.** Simplify language.

**91.08(J).** Other special activity uses. Change "Parks Division" to "Parks Department."

#### 91.09 Traffic Regulations.

**91.09(A) Motorized recreation vehicles.** Clarify language. Add language to allow conduct relating to operation of motorized recreation vehicle when Parks and Recreation Director or designee approves of that conduct or a use permit is approved for that conduct.

#### 91.10 Enforcement.

**91.10** (**D**) Clarify language. Change "Parks Division" to "Parks Department."

**91.10** (E) Change "Parks Division" to "Parks Department."

#### 91.99 Penalty.

The Parks and Recreation Director will ask the County Board to: 1) Designate select misdemeanor violations of the Parks and Recreation Ordinance as payable offenses so defendants may pay a fine and avoid appearing in district court as otherwise required by the Minnesota Judicial Branch; 2) Allow fine amounts to be set for those payable offenses; and 3) Allow enhanced fine amounts to be set for designated payable offenses for repeat offenders.
