A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on March 17, 2015. Chair Randy Maluchnik convened the session at 4:00 p.m.

Members present: Randy Maluchnik, Chair, James Ische, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler and Tim Lynch.

Members absent: Tom Workman

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve the minutes of the March 3, 2015, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved the purchase of three mowers for \$113,453.45.

Approved a 2% salary increase for the Casual Intermittent Crisis Therapists.

Resolution #14-15, Right of Way Acquisition-CSAH 10-Project SP 010-610-046.

Accepted all quotes and awarded all bids for Carver County Project No. 1503, culverts and polyethylene pipe.

Accepted Sibley Aggregates and Wm. Mueller & Sons quotes for Carver County Project No. 1504, mineral aggregates.

Awarded Carver County Project No. 1505, limestone rock, to Bryan Rock Products.

Accepted all quotes and awarded all bids for Carver County Project No. 1506, plant mixed asphalt.

Accepted quotes from Lano Equipment and Titan Machinery, Carver County Project No. 1509, rental equipment.

Contract with Kimley-Horn for professional services on the CSAH 17 and Pleasantview Road intersection improvement project.

Contract with Vanguard Appraisals, Inc., pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved amending contract with Vanguard Appraisals, Inc., pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved issuing a charitable gambling license to Zoar United Church of Christ for raffle to be held on October 17, 2015.

Resolution #15-15, Approving Support for Application to Include County Road 140 Interchange in Governor's Capital Bonding Bill for 2015.

Resolution #16-15, Approving Support for House Bill #80, a Bill to Appropriate Money for Right of Way Acquisition and Construction of Marked Trunk Highway 212 and County Road 140 Interchange.

Approved the Teamsters Non-Licensed Management & PSAP Supervisors 2015-2016 Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Approved the elimination of four petty cash funds.

Reviewed March 10, 2015, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$546,420.99 and reviewed March 17, 2015, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$325,742.58.

Motion carried unanimously.

Dave Frischmon, Finance, requested the Board approve the account write-off of \$18,437.50 accounts receivable for the "GOP Victory 2004" event. He pointed out this went back to 2004 when President Bush came to Chanhassen. He explained both the Sheriff and County Attorney reviewed and recommended the amount be written off as uncollectible.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve writing off the \$18,437.50 accounts receivable for "GOP Victory 2004" and related budget amendment. Degler, Ische, Lynch voted aye. Maluchnik voted nay. Motion carried.

Nick Koktavy, Administrative Services, requested the Board approve Veterans Service Office reorganization.

Dan Tengwall, Veterans Services Officer, explained his office handles claims for benefits that the veterans have earned, access to VA healthcare, records maintenance, outreach to services organizations and training for staff.

Koktavy stated they were proposing to eliminate the half time veteran service clerk and add an Assistant Veteran Services officer positon. He stated this would assist in alleviating the backlog and serve as a backup for the VSO to assist with applications and benefits. He identified the cost and reviewed the need for reorganization.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to eliminate the vacant .5 FTE Veterans Services Clerk; to add 1.0 FTE Assistant County Veterans Service Officer and to approve related budget amendment. Motion carried unanimously.

Paul Moline, Public Health and Environment, requested the Board authorize the Chair to sign a comment letter regarding the 2040 Regional Water Resources Policy Plan. He pointed out comments were previously submitted on the Transportation, Parks and Housing policy plans last year.

He stated the Met Council was defining their role in the plan in the areas of wastewater treatment, water quality and regional water supply planning. He explained comments in the letter touched on the duplication of efforts on the State level and supported Met Council's role in providing technical assistance and coordination with local entities. He added two other counties also emphasized the duplication of efforts that causes confusion.

Moline clarified their next steps will be to pull together comments on the next piece of implementation and the master regional water supply plan.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to authorize the Chair to sign the Water Resources Policy Plan comment letter to the Metropolitan Council. Motion carried unanimously

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to go into closed session at 4:35 p.m. to discuss labor negotiation strategy. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned the closed and Regular Session at 5:05 p.m.

Purpose:

This memo follows up on Resolution No. 01-15 which adopts Ordinance 79-2015 amending the Parks, Open Space, and Trails (POST) Chapter of the Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan. As explained at the January 20th Board Meeting, this resolution triggered submission of the amended POST Chapter to the Metropolitan Council in order for it to conduct an administrative review. Stemming from its review, the Metropolitan Council has provided comments requesting edits for purposes of clarification to more clearly align the County's amendment with regional policy.

This memo will summarize:

- 1. Metropolitan Council Comments and County Staff Response
- 2. Staff communications to affected Townships
- 3. Staff recommendation

Metropolitan Council Comments and County Staff Response:

Metropolitan Council staff provided a letter dated February 19, 2015, to Carver County staff explaining that parts of the amendment submittal are incomplete. The Met Council letter is attached to this memo. The letter recommends revisions in order to complete the review and to bring the County's amendment into conformance with the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan. Following receipt of this letter, County staff has communicated directly with Council staff to find acceptable solutions to address the Council's concerns. The following will summarize the Council's comments and County staff responses:

Metropolitan Council Comment:

Figure 6.8 Trail and Bikeway Plan map shows the proposed Minnesota Prairie Line as a linking regional trail corridor. The 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan does not designate this corridor as a regional trail. The map needs to be revised accordingly.

County Staff Response:

The following edits have been made to Figure 6.8:

- 'Regional' has been removed from the 'Linking Regional Trails Corridors' list heading, so that it now reads 'Linking Trail Corridors'
- 'Regional' has been added to all trail names that are regional trails. The MN Prairie Line trail is the only one without regional in the name.

• The MN Prairie Line trail (MPL) is now a dashed line on the map to indicate the trail does not have regional status, this is also indicated in the key in the lower right of the map.

Metropolitan Council Comment:

The Minnesota Prairie Line is described on page 6.42 as a regional trail. The 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan does not designate this corridor as a regional trail. The text needs to be revised accordingly.

County Staff Response:

The following edits have been made to text on pages 6.40-6.42:

- "Regional" is struck from the section heading on 6.40 to now read "Linking Trails".
- The Minnesota Prairie Line Trail description, which was formerly shared with the Twin Cities and Western Regional Trail Corridor description, has now separated to have its own description. This is to clarify that the route is not planned to have regional status.
- "Regional Trail" is added following to the County Road 10 and County Road 25 trail titles.

Metropolitan Council staff also provided the following advisory comments:

- 1. The reference to the "Dakota Regional Trail" on page 6.36 should be revised to "Dakota Rail Regional Trail".
- 2. The reference to the "Lake Minnetonka Regional Trail" on page 6.36 should be revised to "Lake Minnetonka LRT Regional Trail".

County Staff Response:

These suggestions have been incorporated on figure 6.8 and page 6.36.

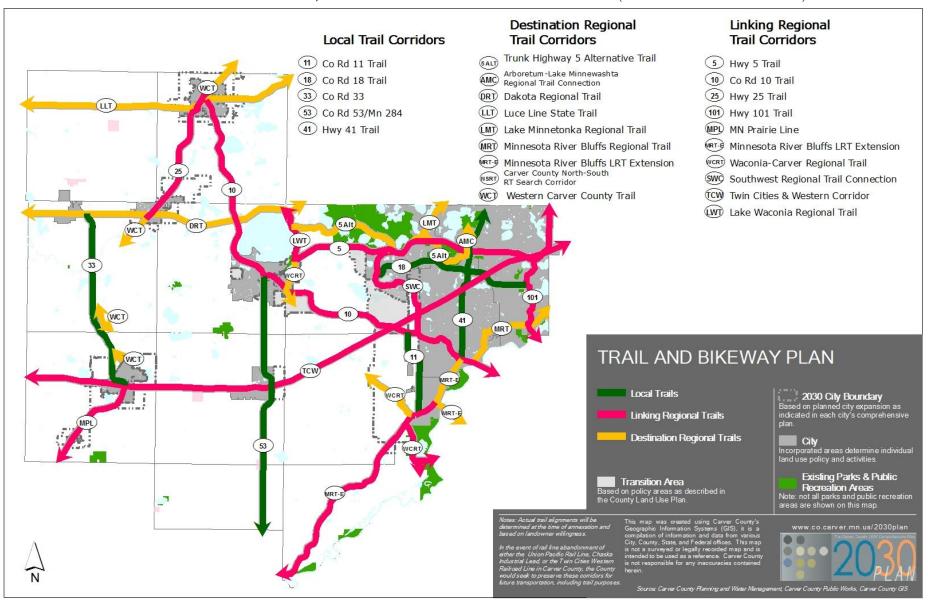
Staff Communications to Affected Townships

Staff have communicated the Metropolitan Council's feedback and associated changes to Townships where trails affected by the edits are located. On March 11th, a letter was sent to the Young America Township Chair and Clerk and emails were sent to Neil Johnson from Watertown Township and Larry Schmidt from San Francisco Township.

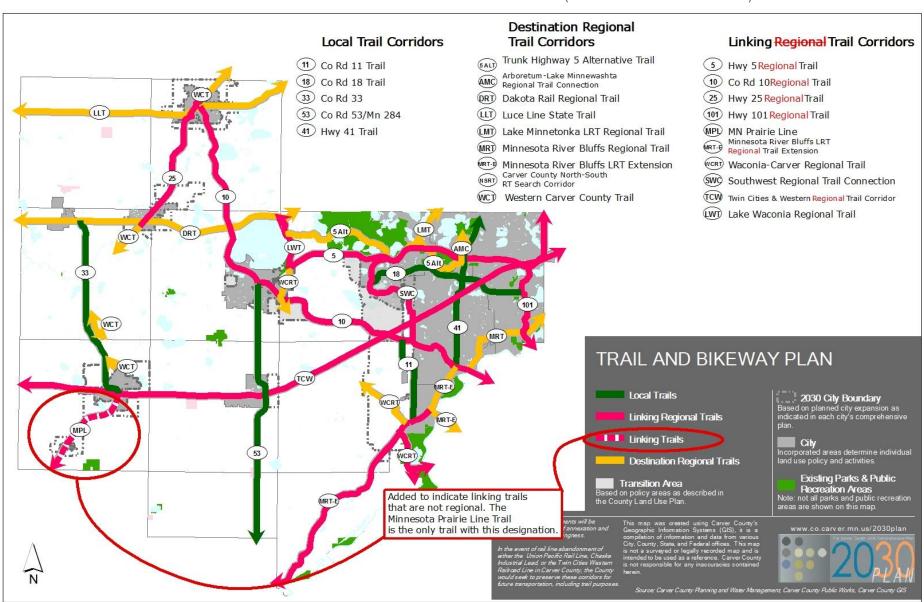
Staff Recommendation

Existing Destination Trails

Luce Line State Trail

The Luce Line Trail is an aggregate surface State trail located in a former rail bed and managed by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

Dakota Rail Regional Trail

The Dakota Regional Trail is in a former rail bed. As of 2012, the trail is asphalt paved to the Carver/McLeod County line.

Lake Minnetonka LRT Regional Trail

Lake Minnetonka Regional Trail has pavement through the downtown area of the City of Victoria. The remainder of the trail is primarily in an aggregate trail surface to the east County line.

Minnesota River Bluffs LRT Regional Trail

The Minnesota River Bluffs LRT Regional Trail is primarily aggregate surfaced. In 2013 a section of the trail was paved leading into Chaska along HWY 61 and Engler Blvd.

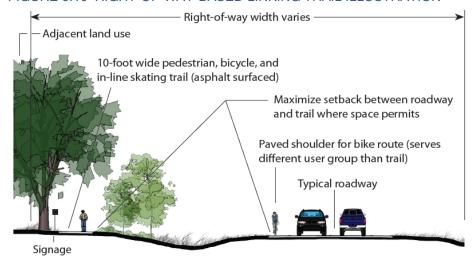
Planned 2030 Destination Trails

Minnesota River Bluffs RT Extension

As illustrated on the Trail and Bikeway Plan, this destination trail is essentially an extension of the Minnesota River Bluffs LRT Regional Trail. A trail master plan was completed and adopted by Carver County and the Metropolitan Council in 2011 and amended in 2013. In Caver County, the trail corridor extends from Athletic Park in Chaska to County Road 40 and Carver Bluffs Parkway in Carver In the future the corridor is proposed to be extended as it heads southwest to the new visitor center at the National Wildlife Refuge. Continuation of the trail to the undetermined location of the Minnesota River Bluff regional park and on to Belle Plaine is also envisioned, although most likely in a post-2030 time frame. This portion of the trail is classified as a linking regional trail on Figure 6.8, because the trail is envisioned to be within the County Road 40 right of way. Due to current road conditions, collaboration with San Francisco Township and landowners will be key in establishing a corridor for all stages of planning, including the master planning process, as will seeking regional status in the Met council RPPP.

A key concern with this trail corridor is coordinating its alignment with Chaska, Carver, USFWS, and MN DNR. The trail will be located within an approved corridor or adjacent to the refuge or WMA lands. Note that current USFWS and MN DNR land use and management policies do not allow paved trails to be developed on refuge and WMA lands. It is also not common practice for these agencies to provide an easement for a paved trail since that can inhibit land management and hunter access.

As the images illustrate, the setting for linking trails greatly affects their recreational value as judged by scenic quality, continuity, and separation from vehicular traffic.

Roadway right-of-way widths are defined and determined in the Roadway System Plan.

Linking Regional Trails

Southwest LRT Connection Regional Trail (Connects Lake Minnetonka LRT and Minnesota River Bluffs LRT Regional Trails)

This linking trail corridor connects the Lake Minnetonka LRT and Minnesota River Bluffs LRT Regional Trails as shown on the plan map. The latter of these currently ends in the City of Chaska, with the northern trail ending in the City of Victoria.

A master plan for this trail connection was completed in 2006 and consists of a combination of existing local trails and newly proposed regional trail alignments, with an overall length of 13 miles. The Master Plan was approved by the Metropolitan Council, which makes the trail eligible for regional funding.

Although not identified as part of the master plan for this connection, a river crossing near the downtown area of Chaska over to the Minnesota River Valley State Trail, which connects to Shakopee, is provided via the CSAH 41 bridge structure.

Lake Waconia Regional Trail Corridor

From south to north, this destination trail corridor makes a connection between Lake Waconia Regional Park and Dakota Rail Regional Trail on the north side of the lake. As illustrated on the Trail and Bikeway Plan map, the alignment of this trail is optimally located along the shoreline of the lake until CSAH 30, which it would then parallel (heading north) until CSAH 155. The trail would connect to the existing boat launch near the junction of CSAH 30 and 155. Once to CSAH 155, establishing the trail along the west side of the roadway would provide the most appealing experience to the trail user, albeit in close proximity to the road. The challenges with developing the trail

following this alignment include limited space, steep grades, and established vegetation along the lakeshore, each of which posing significant constraints to trail development.

Future options should be explored to replace the road along the eastern edge of Lake Waconia from Lake Waconia Regional Park to the Dakota Rail Regional Trail. Presumably, the existing roadway would be relocated further to the east as part of future roadway and development planning. (Importantly, the existing private properties would require assured access under any roadway realignment scenario. The advantage, presumably, to these landowners would be that their properties would front a greenway versus a county road, with direct access to an extensive trail system and open space.)

Highway 101 Regional Trail

The Metropolitan Council RPPP identifies a proposed Highway 101 Regional Trail, which will connect the Minnesota River Bluffs LRT Regional Trail to the Lake Minnetonka Regional Trail.

Highway 5 Regional Trail

The RPPP identifies the proposed Highway 5 Regional Trail, which will connect the proposed Highway 101 Regional Trail to Carver Park Reserve and Lake Waconia Regional Park. An alternate alignment which would route this regional trail corridor through the Carver Park Reserve and via the Lake Waconia Regional Trail is presented on the trail map. The county would seek re-alignment of this corridor in the RPPP.

Twin Cities and Western Regional Trail Corridor and Minnesota Prairie Line Trail

Existing rail corridors provide opportunities for long term trail corridors as evidenced by the Luce line and Dakota trail corridors. Of particular note is the Twin Cities Western Railroad through the county. Although the TCW line is not anticipated to be abandoned within the 2030 time frame, this corridor offers a high value opportunity for a trail if it was ever to be abandoned. Accommodating a trail along this corridor if it is ever converted to a rail transit corridor should also be considered at such time as part of a multi-modal approach to transportation.

Minnesota Prairie Line Trail

Existing rail corridors provide opportunities for long term trail corridors as evidenced by the Luce line and Dakota trail corridors. Of particular note is the Minnesota Prairie Line heading south out of Norwood Young America and through Hamburg. Although the Minnesota Prairie Line is not anticipated to be abandoned within the 2030 time frame, this corridor offers a high value opportunity for a trail if it was ever to be abandoned. Accommodating a trail along this corridor if it is ever converted to a rail transit corridor should also be considered at such time as part of a multi-modal approach to transportation.

County Road 10 Regional Trail

Intended to follow the road right of way. The establishment of any future trail alignment will result from a master plan process done in cooperation with affected Cities, Township, Carver County, and others. At the time the trail is to be built, the appropriate Cities and Townships will determine the final location of the trail through public process with residents.

County Road 25 Regional Trail

Intended to follow the road right of way. The establishment of any future trail alignment will result from a master plan process done in cooperation with affected Cities, Township, Carver County, and others. At the time the trail is to be built, the appropriate Cities and Townships will determine the final location of the trail through public process with residents.

The Metropolitan Council received the County's Parks, Open Space, and Trails comprehensive plan amendment (CPA) for review on January 28, 2015. Council staff finds that parts of the CPA submittal are incomplete and further review has been suspended pending receipt of the following:

The CPA is incomplete for regional parks review. In order to be complete for review and conform to the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan, the following revisions should be made:

- Figure 6.8 Trail and Bikeway Plan This map shows the proposed Minnesota Prairie Line as a linking regional trail corridor. This designation does not conform to the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan, as it has not been designated by the Metropolitan Council as a regional trail and is not consistent with previous iterations of the County's 2030 Comprehensive Plan, which reflected this corridor as a local trail. The map should be revised to show the Minnesota Prairie Line as a local trail corridor.
- The Minnesota Prairie Line is described on page 6.42 as a regional linking trail. The text of the plan should be revised to move the description of this trail from the regional linking trail section to the local trail section.

Council staff offers the following advisory comments:

- As the County is making the required revisions, Council staff recommends that the reference to the "Dakota Regional Trail" on page 6.35 be revised to "Dakota Rail Regional Trail" and the reference to the "Lake Minnetonka Regional Trail" on page 6.36 be revised to "Lake Minnetonka LRT Regional Trail" to be consistent with the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan.
- The CPA was reviewed based on the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan. The Metropolitan Council adopted the 2040 Regional Parks Policy Plan (RPPP) on February 11, 2015. The 2040 RPPP added two regional trail search corridors in Carver County to the Regional Parks System the Highway 41 Regional Trail Search Corridor and the County Road 61 Regional Trail Search Corridor. The CPA shows the Highway 41 trail as a local trail, which is appropriate under the 2030 Regional Parks Policy Plan. When the County prepares its 2040 Comprehensive Plan, the status of this trail should be updated to a regional trail.

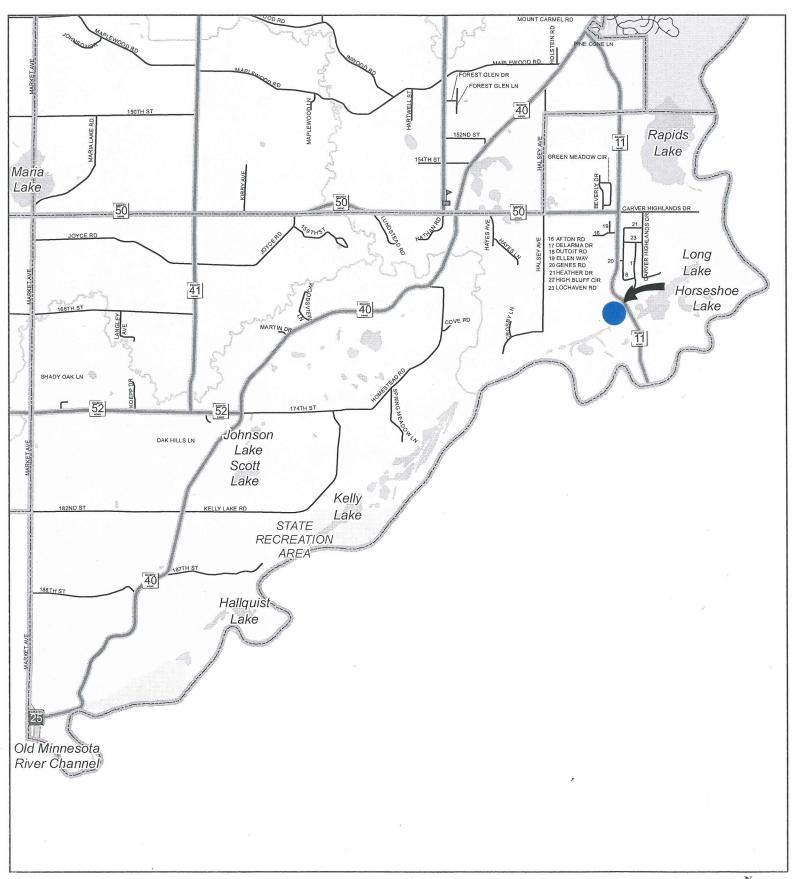

WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meetings of March 17, 2015; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. The applicant, LeRoy Chard (Sibley Aggregates), operates a mining operation on the Terry Hanson property (approximately 22 acres) located in the South Half (S½) of Section 1, San Francisco Township. The property is improved with an existing farmstead, Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for a Public Equestrian Facility (CU-11590) and a CUP for a Mining Operation (CU-7111). The property is located in the Agricultural Zoning District, partially in the Shoreland and Floodplain Overlay Districts of the Minnesota River and the CCWMO (Bevens Creek Watershed).
- 2. Aggregate mining has been in existence on the site since the 1950's. However, on June 30, 1992, CUP (CU-7111/Order #8708) was issued to the prior owner, Todd Lundquist, as a renewal permit which provided for the approval to enlarge the existing aggregate mining area on approximately 22 acres. Mr. Hanson has continued to operate under the approved CUP since he purchased the property in 1998.
- 3. Mr. Chard is requesting to replace the existing CUP (CU-7111), with an Interim Use Permit (IUP), which would include expanding the aggregate mining area to 35 acres. The operation would include ten (10) acres of active mining, fifteen (15) acres of processing (screening, stockpiling and loading), and ten (10) acres of active reclamation activity. Reclamation will be completed concurrently, at the same or greater rate than mining, so that no more than ten (10) acres of active mining area is open at any given time. The existing CUP (CU-7111 & Order #8708) would be terminated upon the approval of the new IUP (PZ20150004). The San Francisco Town Board recently approved an IUP for Mr. Chard pursuant to their Mineral Extraction Ordinance, reflecting the same operational area.
- 4. The request is for an IUP to operate a Mining Activity pursuant to Section 152.082 of the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 5. The applicant's engineer, Sunde Engineering, PPLC, has provided the mineral extraction application and supporting documentation for the IUP request. The application materials are the same materials which were reviewed and approved by the San Francisco Town Board. The San Francisco Town Board has a Mineral Extraction Ordinance (Ordinance #8) which has established standards and/or provisions for minimum requirements for the "promotion of the public health, safety, morals and welfare" for these types of land uses. The Ordinance became effective upon the Town Board's adoption and publication (June 20, 2011). A Township Ordinance is required to be as restrictive, or more restrictive than the County Zoning Code.

- The San Francisco Town Board (Planning Commission) held a public hearing regarding the requested IUP on February 5, 2015. The San Francisco Town Board Chairperson adopted Township Resolution #1502 approving an IUP for mineral extraction at the Hanson mine on February 9, 2015.
- The San Francisco Town Board also has a "Hanson Mine Operations Agreement" in place with Chard Tiling & Excavating, Inc. and Mr. Hanson which was executed by the Town Board Chairperson on February 12, 2015.
- 6. The applicant's request meets the standards for an IUP pursuant to Section 152.082 of the Carver County Zoning Code. Based on the permit application and Township approval, the mining operation primarily involves front-end loaders, backhoes, dozers, conveyors, screening plant and haul trucks with the intention of excavating and hauling aggregate material up to approximately 1.3 million cubic yards as part of the proposed IUP. No recycling and/or processing of concrete and/or asphalt is being proposed as part of this request. The proposed operational area would allow for expanded mining activities to take place within the required setbacks.
- 7. The proposed Hanson Mine expansion is expected to continue utilizing the existing North/South Access locations along CSAH 11 once expanded. A traffic study has been completed as part of the application process. Pursuant to the traffic study, the north driveway access would be limited to passenger vehicles. The traffic study states that, "due to proposed maximum hourly and daily load limits, a net decrease is anticipated between existing observed site trips and future generated site trips to/from the Hanson Mine". The traffic study was submitted to the Carver County Public Works Division for their review.
- 8. A Carver County Water Management Organization (CCWMO) Permit is required and Stormwater Management standards will need to be met with regard to the reclamation of all aggregate mining areas. The applicant will need to secure a permit with the Planning and Water Management Department in order to establish an appropriate restoration phasing plan. Chapter 153 Water Resource Management standards require the County to hold a financial security for the duration of the project/permit. Pursuant to the County Water Rules, an amount of \$25,000.00 will be held for erosion control/restoration. This security amount meets the County Zoning Performance Securities coverage based on the CCWMO requirements. The approved San Francisco Town Reclamation Plan shows stormwater ponding within the regulated floodplain area of the Minnesota River. As part of the Carver County Stormwater Management approval, the stormwater infiltration basin location(s) will be located to an area outside of the identified floodplain area; therefore, resolving any floodplain issues.
- 9. The Carver County Mining standards require a performance and liability security for mining, restoration and operations (compliance) to be kept in force for the duration of the permit. It has been determined that the surety being held by the CCWMO for the Water Rules are satisfactory to the Carver County Zoning coverage standards; therefore, no additional amounts will be necessary. The San Francisco Town Board Mineral Extraction Ordinance Chapter 11 (Financial Guaranty) and Chapter 12 (Liability Insurance) reference dollar amounts required to be carried for the duration of the active permit. (i.e. Township would also hold a security)
- 10. The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Area Hydrologist, Jennie Skancke, has reviewed the proposed request and indicated that all of their concerns related to stormwater management, erosion BMPs, and the protection of the kittentail populations, which have been adequately addressed in the application.
- 11. The Permittee will be allowed signage pursuant to the Carver County Sign Code which allows a single sign surface area maximum of 32 sq. ft. per property. All signage shall be placed in accordance with Chapter 154 Sign Regulations and/or the local road authority.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of Interim Use Permit #PZ20150004 for an Aggregate Mining Operation on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. This permit shall terminate and supersede the prior CUP #7111 and Order #8708 on the subject property. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- 1. The permit is subject to Compliance Review. The Interim Use Permit (IUP) is issued to the property owner, Terry Hanson. The permit allows for the mineral extraction on the subject 35 acres and it is not transferable to another property owner and/or area of the property. A change in ownership shall be cause for the permit to terminate; however, Permit #PZ20150004 shall not be terminated until all reclamation areas have been completed to the satisfaction of the approved CCWMO permit.
- 2. The San Francisco Town Board is the primary regulatory authority for the mining operation. The Permittee is responsible to the San Francisco Town Board's Mineral Extraction Ordinance, Resolution #1502 and Operations Agreement, including any approved changes thereto. Any change to the operation shall be cause for the Permit to be reviewed by the San Francisco Town Board for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. If a change is approved by the Town Board within the 10 year Township permitted timeframe and the change is more restrictive than the Carver County Zoning Code, the Permittee shall not need to amend/change the current IUP (PZ20150004) issued by Carver County. All buildings/structures utilized as part of the operation must meet the State Building Code (building permits required).
- 3. The Carver County Planning and Water Management Department is the regulatory authority for the Stormwater Management standards. The Permittee is responsible for obtaining a CCWMO Permit with regard to the stormwater management and site reclamation of all aggregate mining areas. If a CCWMO Permit is not obtained within six (6) months of the County Board's approval, IUP (PZ20150004) shall be suspended until the appropriate permit is obtained. A financial security of \$25,000.00 for erosion control/restoration shall be held by the County for the duration of the project/permit.
- 4. Permittee shall operate in accordance with the submitted Mineral Extraction Application and Supporting Documentation (dated: 12/4/14), Mining and Phasing Site Plan (dated: 11/25/14) and any/all CCWMO permit approval(s) (i.e. stormwater infiltration, BMPs and site reclamation). These plans shall be attached to and be considered part of this permit.
- 5. The permit is subject to any/all local road authority standards pertaining to access requirements.
- 6. The Permittee shall submit a copy of Worker's Compensation Insurance to the Carver County Land Management Department annually.
- 7. The Permitee shall name Carver County as an additional insured on all policies of liability insurance. The Permittee shall annually file with the Carver County Land Management Department a certificate evidencing coverage. The certificate shall provide that the County must be given thirty (30) days written notice of the cancellation of insurance.
- 8. The Permittee shall comply at all times with the County standards as detailed in Chapter 152 Zoning Code and Chapter 154 Sign Regulations. The Permittee shall not exceed the allowed square footage of signage per property. Any proposed signage within public road right-of-way shall be approved by the local Road Authority.

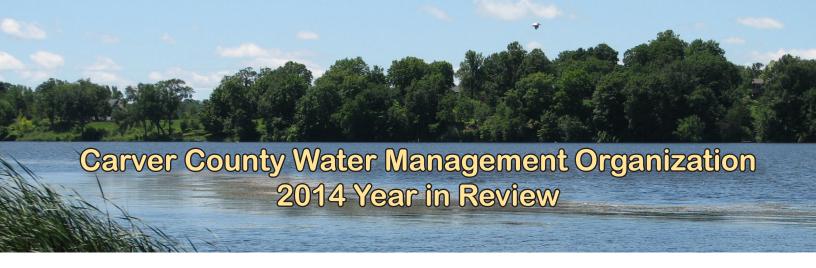

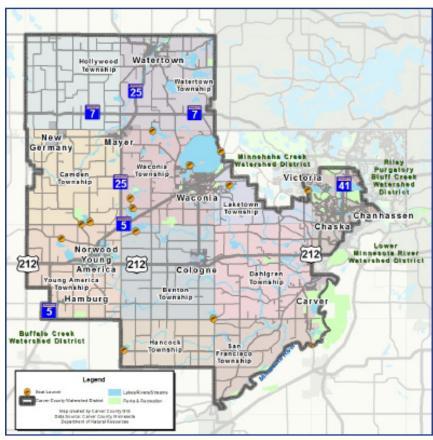


Protecting, preserving and managing surface waters and groundwaters in the midst of rapid growth and intensive agricultural activity.

WHO WE ARE

Carver County Water Management Organization (CCWMO) is a local unit of government responsible for performing tasks including planning, funding, regulation, education and implementation of the Carver County Water Management Plan.

Our staff consists of a manager, education coordinator, two water resources specialists, a water technician and two water assistants. The Carver County Board of Commissioners and our CCWMO Advisory Commitee guide and govern actions to protect, manage and restore water resources within our boundaries.



WMO BOUNDARIES

The CCWMO includes portions of the following watersheds: Bevens Creek, Carver Creek, East Chaska Creek, West Chaska Creek, Pioneer Sarah Creek and the Crow River. Within the CCWMO there are 35 lakes greater than 10 acres and 365 miles of streams.

2014 Accomplishments

Protecting Lakes and Rivers

CCWMO staff actively monitor the water quality on 18 lakes and 21 stream sites. The data is used to monitor the health of lakes and streams and plan for restoration or protection projects. 2014 was the third year monitoring for zebra mussels (an aquatic invasive species) on 7

lakes. In addition to adult mussels, staff began sampling for larvae (see photo) to aid in early detection. 10 projects are currently underway to protect waters including Benton Lake's Fish Barrier, Burandt Lake Stormwater Reuse, Fountain Park Pond in Waconia and Fireman's Lake in Chaska.



Education

CCWMO led or collaborated on 23 different programs and events in 2014. 3,758 people were reached directly through our Wetlands Education Program, Children's Water Festival, annual advisory commitee tour (photo), raingarden workshops, Shallow Lakes Forum, CCWMO online newsletter and others. Additionally, education was conducted through larger public events and media campaigns such as the fishing activity and

displays at the County Fair and the monthly Water Column, published in 5 newspapers, reaching several hundred more.



Awards & Funding

In 2014, CCWMO received many grants. Three were from Clean Water Legacy Funds. First, the Exclusion Grant of \$40,000 will install fencing on Bevens and Carver Creeks to prevent cattle access (photo) which causes erosion of the streambank and soil and bacteria pollution. Funds will also provide water to the cattle for cooling and hydration. The Carver Clean Water Initiative grant of \$150,000 provides funds to non-profits and local buisnesses to install water protecting practices. The Burandt Lake Stormwater Reuse grant of \$200,000 installs a water reuse system at Bayview Elementary to capture and treat

storwmater and use it to irrigate ballfields. Lastly, the Fountain Park Stormwater Retrofit grant of \$75,000 from Clean Water Partnership will treat stormwater from downtown Waconia.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION: In 2012-2013, the County realigned and reconstructed CSAH 11 from CSAH 61 to Engler Blvd (CSAH 10). As a consequence of the realignment and reconstruction, the County obtained right-of-way from numerous property owners along the CSAH 11 corridor. In order to complete the road construction in a timely manner, condemnation proceedings against several property owners was initiated by the County. Hearings were held before a condemnation commission and damages were awarded. The County appealed the award on PID # 04.0010710. The property owners filed a cross-appeal. As part of the appeal process, mediation is required in order to try to resolve the matter. The mediation session date is pending. In addition, updates to other pending litigation related to the CSAH 11 Construction Project will be presented to the County Board.
