A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on April 21, 2015. Vice Chair James Ische convened the session at 4:00 p.m.

Members present: James Ische, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent: Randy Maluchnik.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the minutes of the April 7, 2015, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Resolution #18-15 Grant Agreement to State Transportation Fund Local Road Improvement Program Grant Terms and Conditions SAP 010-610-047.

Contract with Indigital, Inc. pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved the one to four day temporary on-sale liquor license application for Augusta Ball Club, Inc., for May 29, 30 and 31, 2015.

Approved issuing a tobacco license to United Farms Coop d/b/a United Xpress.

Approved the elimination of the 1.0 FTE Facilities Coordinator positon, created the position of 1.0 FTE Project Manager/Licensed Master Electrician, eliminated a vacant 1.0 FTE Maintenance Worker position and created the position of 1.0 FTE Assistant Project Manager, Low Voltage Electrical and related budget amendment.

Joint Powers Agreement with City of Chanhassen for property acquisition adjacent to TH 101 pending finalization of the contract review process.

Resolution #19-15, Agreement to State Transportation Fund Local Bridge Replacement Program Grant Terms and Conditions SAP 010-610-047.

Resolution #20-15, Approval of Repurchase of Tax Forfeited Land.

Resolution #21-15, Agreement to State Transportation Fund Local Bridge Replacement Program Grant Terms and Conditions SAP 010-640-010.

Reviewed April 14, 2015, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$488,407.50 and reviewed April 21, 2015, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$413,562.80.

Motion carried unanimously.

Paul Moline, Public Health & Environment, requested the Board adopt a Resolution to continue the implementation of a SSTS direct discharge incentive program for 2015. He explained Bevens and Carver Creek were listed as impaired in 2004 and, as a result, the TMDL implementation plan was approved in 2007. He stated one of the implementation steps was to eliminate septic systems that have direct discharge systems to water. Moline noted the Board adopted the incentive program in 2008 and has carried it forward every year.

He identified the funding source. Moline indicated Environmental Services implements the program and the water management organization provides the funds. He stated there have been 281 participants since 2008 and pointed out the associated loan program that is available. He identified the Bevens Creek priority area for 2015 and indicated, if funds were left over, the Resolution designated Carver Creek has a backup. Moline reviewed program qualifications.

Degler offered the following Resolution, seconded by Workman:

## Resolution #22-15 Continuing the Elimination of Direct Discharge Sub-Surface Treatment System (SSTS) Program

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to recess as the County Board and convene as the Carver County Regional Rail Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

Martin Walsh, Parks, requested the Rail Authority approve a permit agreement for a trail on Railroad Authority property.

He identified the project area beginning at Athletic Park and totaling 2.1 miles. He noted the property acquisition and indicated, because the property did not have an identified owner, they were in the process of acquiring by eminent domain. He highlighted the alternates and pointed out the alternate to complete in 2015 or construct and complete the project in 2016. He indicated they hoped to bid in June and award in July or August.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to approve a permit agreement for a trail on Carver County Regional Rail Authority property. Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn as the Rail Authority and reconvene as the Carver County Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to go into closed session at 4:27 p.m. pursuant to Minnesota Statute Section 13D.05 in order to review confidential appraisal data and possible options for PID #060151500. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned the closed and Regular Session at 5:01 p.m.

#### BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

This agreement with Minnetonka Aquatics is to provide lifeguard services at County beaches of Lake Minnewashta and Lake Waconia Regional Parks for the years 2015 and 2016. The arrangement with Minnetonka Aquatics to provide staffing of lifeguards at County beaches continues service efficiency. The County does not hire, train and or directly supervise lifeguards. Minnetonka Aquatics provides necessary training, supervision, scheduling, and payments to lifeguard employees.

Summer day use visitation for the two park areas exceeds 121,000 visitations annually. The recommended 2015/16 lifeguard services agreement continues the same level service as previous agreements. For 2015, lifeguard services will begin June 6, 2015 and will conclude August 10th for total of 65 continuous days of service during peak beach season. Staffing is provided seven days a week weather conditions permitting. Hours of service run from 12:00 noon to 6:00 p.m. all days of the week. Cost of 2015 services is not to exceed \$40,004.37, and is acknowledged in the parks department budget.

Minnetonka Aquatics has provided an option for a two-year contract, allowing hourly service rates to be fixed within the language of the contract for that two year period while also providing 65 days of continous service in the second year. The two year contract agreement would provide savings to the County. Cost of the 2016 services is not to exceed \$40,004.37 which would be requested through the County budgetary process annually. Should the 2016 budget not support this level of service, the contract would be amended and service levels would be reduced as appropriate.

Additionally, Park staff have requested Minnetonka Aquatics provide training scenarios to include County Staff on emergency procedures and practices. This will ensure a County Park staff has the necessary level of understanding and involvement as to the procedures that take place in an emergency situation.

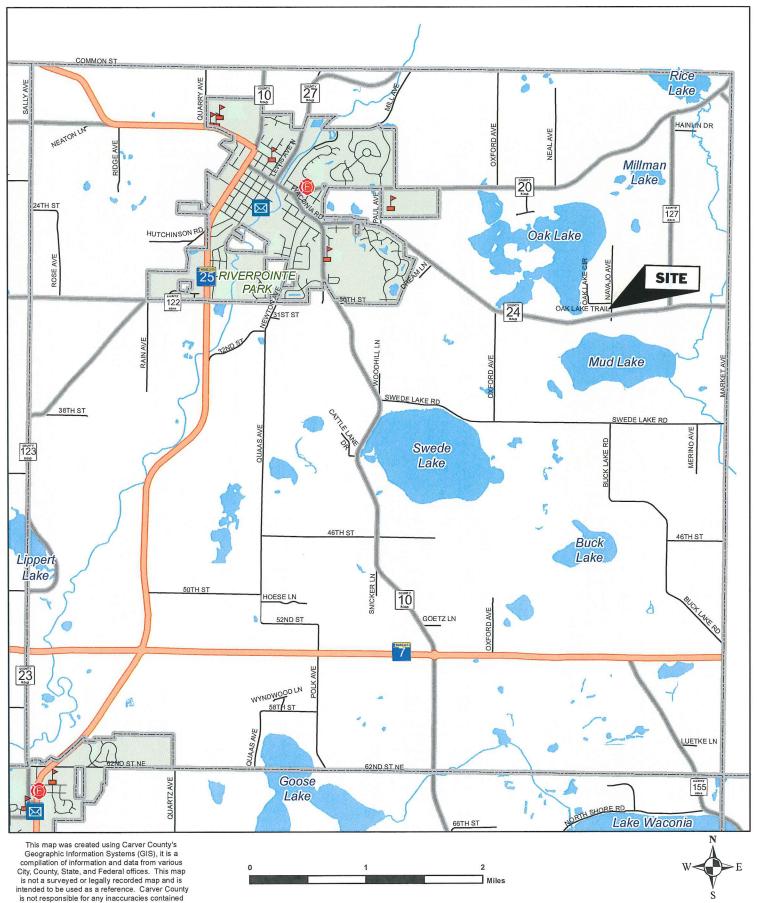

The request is for an Administrative Special Event Permit for the annual St. Peter Lutheran Church Maifest celebration in Watertown Township. The event will be similar to previous years. It will be held entirely on property owned by St. Peter Lutheran Church at 3030 Navajo Avenue, Watertown MN, with the exception of attendee parking, which will be on the two parcels adjacent to the west. **WHEREAS,** said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of April 21, 2015; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. Jerome Braun owns a 10.19 acre farmstead located in Section 1 of Hancock Township. The property is improved with a house; old house converted into an accessory structure, barn, and several other agricultural structures that are utilized as part of an existing dairy farm operation. The property is located in the Agriculture Zoning District and the Carver County WMO (Bevens Creek).
- 2. The applicant, Jerome Braun, is requesting a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to declare the existing 10.19 acre parcel a "farm", which would allow for new or expanded agricultural structures, pursuant to Section 152.076 A of the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 3. On parcels of less than 20 acres a landowner is not allowed to obtain an agricultural building permit, unless a CUP is authorized for the agricultural land use. On smaller parcels (< 20 acres), all structures would be viewed as residential accessory structures and the State Building Code would apply. By definition, agricultural structures are exempt from the Building Code and a Certificate of Zoning Compliance (zoning permit) is the only requirement.
- 4. Mr. Braun purchased this property in 2014 when it was part of a larger, approximately 50 acre parcel. In order to construct a new home, financing required the buildings and home site to be split off from the approximate 40 acres surrounding it. The 40 acre "land only" parcel is on a contract for deed in the name of the applicant's wife and daughter (Tracy and Emily Braun) and is used as part of the overall operation. The applicant, his wife and daughter reside at the property. Currently, the operation consists of 5 steers, 8 heifers, and 4 dairy cattle. The intent was (is) for the three of them to work on the farm while maintaining their outside employment until the dairy operation can be built up to 40-60 cows in 2 phases over the course of the next 5 years. Phase 1 will consist of a new barn for the milking of 20 cows and 15 replacement and expansion stock. Phase 2 will likely include an addition to the barn to allow for the milking of 40-60 cows.
- 5. The long-term goal is to combine the two parcels back together and put them in the daughter's name as she

will continue to operate the farm. The applicant indicated that the existing barn is unusable and that he would like to replace it with a 56' x 88' barn in a similar location.

- 6. The request meets the standards of Section 152.076(A) of the County Code, based on the nature of the agricultural land use. Lori Brinkman, the Assistant Feedlot Administrator, inspected the site on April 13, 2015. She submitted a letter, dated April 13, 2015, summarizing the family's farming operation. The applicant is registered for 25.25 animal units including dairy cattle, beef cattle, horses and chickens. The feedlot permit application identifies approximately 45 acres of tillable land available for manure application and a source of feed for the livestock.
- 7. The Hancock Town Board reviewed and recommended approved of the request at their March 30, 2015 Town Board meeting.

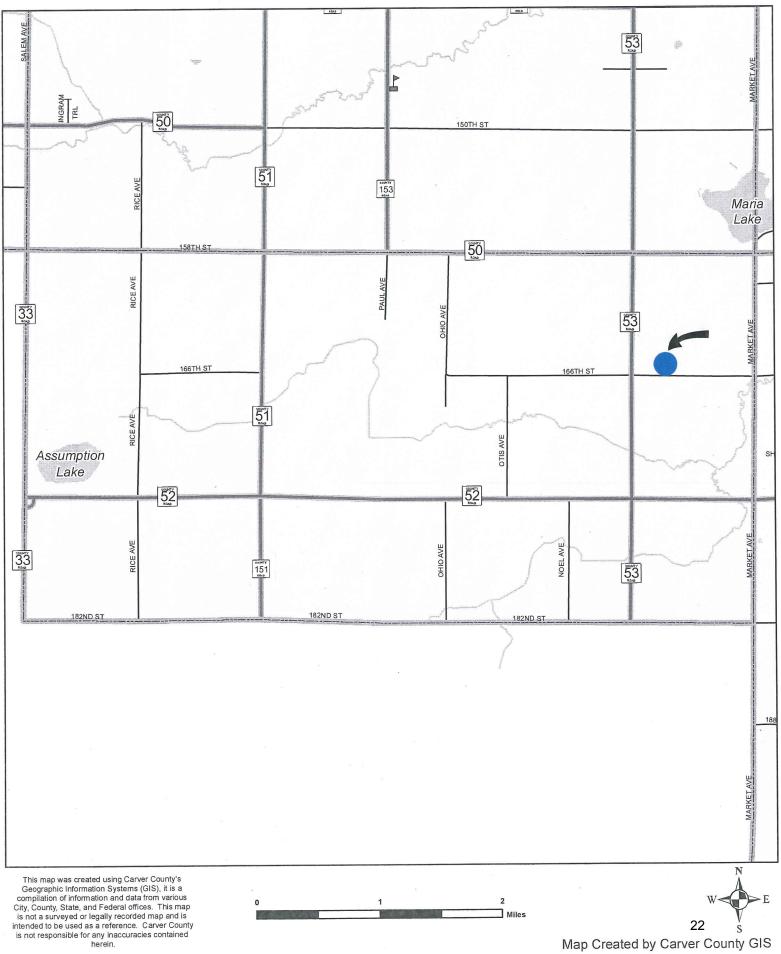
**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of Conditional Use Permit #PZ20150010 for a on the subject parcel of land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- 1. The permit is subject to administrative review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by Land Management for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners and/or operators are encouraged to contact Land Management as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. An Agricultural Structure Permit(s) shall be applied for and issued prior to the construction of any agricultural structure. Residential accessory structures, such as attached or detached garages, are subject to State Building Code and shall not be constructed unless appropriate permits have been issued.
- 3. This permit shall only be in effect as long as the subject parcel is used for active farming of an additional 40 acres or more. If the operation fails to meet this standard or if additional land is attached to meet the minimum agricultural parcel size requirements, this permit shall be terminated and the standard provisions of the Zoning Code shall apply.

Today, we have one Emergency Management Specialist FTE allocated exclusively to EM functions, coupled with the Commander of Emergency Management and Communications who divides her time in oversight of EM and 911 Communications. Understanding that a typical employee spends roughly 1,850 hours working of the scheduled 2,080 hours, the workload exceeds the available work hours.

The Crime Lab remains a valuable operational resource for the Sheriff's Office. It is used by trained Crime Scene Technicians who utilize the Lab to process evidence that is further processed/examined by certified personnel working in another lab (e.g., MN BCA, Hennepin County).

Approve Sheriff Olson's request to convert the Criminalist FTE to an Emergency Management Specialist FTE.

Sheriff Olson is seeking a 1:1 FTE conversion, maintaining status quo in overall FTEs allocated to to the Sheriff's Office. If approved, the Emergency Management Specialist position is a grade 13, which represents a reduction in personnel expenses as the Criminal position is a pay grade 14. There is no immediate budgetary impact because the Criminalist FTE is currently funded in the 2015 operating budget. However, personnel expenses for this conversion will decrease year over year because of the pay grade reduction. Specifically, the Criminalist ranges \$52,874 - \$78,957 compared to the Emergency Management Specialist range of \$48,880 - \$73,008.

#### RE: Draft Amendment to the 2040 Housing Policy Plan (HPP)

Dear Chair Duininck,

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this amendment to the 2040 Housing Policy Plan (HPP). A number of communications from the County Board to Former Chair Haigh and from County staff to Council staff have stated that significant investment in housing options will be needed to attract and retain a competitive workforce and meet the changing needs of seniors in Carver County. Although Carver County's numbers are smaller for these populations, the market challenges related to affordable housing development are significant.

Land prices, development fees including Sewer Access Charges (SAC), and rising material costs are a few examples of challenges organizations like the Carver County Community Development Agency (CDA) face when pursuing affordable housing projects. The CDA's on-the-ground experience demonstrates that affordable housing projects do not come together without assistance from communities, the Metropolitan Council, and other outside sources working together. This letter identifies areas that can be improved in order for the Council to support communities more effectively to achieve the ambitious housing allocations.

 HPP amendment language explains that affordable units should be allocated across the region's communities in a way that places more units where they will expand housing choices the most. At the same time, HPP policies stress that the Council will focus its affordable housing development assistance in transit oriented development (TOD) along fixed transitways. Most communities in the region and all communities in Carver County do not have fixed transitways identified in the Transportation Policy Plan.

> Carver County requests that the Metropolitan Council re-evaluate its strategies to support affordable housing development so that all communities can reasonably compete for scarce funds. Market realities dictate that financial assistance is a key component to successfully developing affordable workforce and senior housing options regardless of proximity to fixed transitways. This holds true for all bands of affordability, but particularly for units affordable to incomes at or below 50% AMI.

 Page 47 of the HPP states that Housing Performance Scores will be used in the Regional Solicitation for federal transportation funding. A list of Council Actions on Page 8 of the HPP amendment states that the Council will, "discontinue the calculation of county Housing Performance Scores and embed county activities into city and township Housing Performance Scores."

Carver County requests the following:

- a. The Metropolitan Council needs to re-evaluate using Housing Performance Scores as a part of the Regional Solicitation scoring for transportation projects in light of its policy not to produce county level scores.
- b. If the Housing Performance Score is to be part of the Regional Solicitation scoring, the Metropolitan Council needs to define what Housing Performance Score will be used to evaluate county transportation projects.
- c. If no county Housing Performance Scores are to be calculated, the Metropolitan Council needs to justify how it can hold counties seeking to complete regionally significant transportation projects accountable for city decisions and performance related to affordable housing production.
- 3. The HPP amendment defines Affordable Housing Need targets based on a combination of existing housing stock and job/worker balance. The resulting targets are ambitious and will be a challenge for all communities to meet, particularly for communities that currently lack affordable housing options and have high targets to meet.

Carver County requests the following:

- a. All communities should have a legitimate opportunity to compete for the Metropolitan Council's housing development assistance programs, like the various LCA accounts. Project proposals should be evaluated against the existing precedent of the target community's current stage of development and previous affordable housing development experience. The Council needs to acknowledge that approaches to goals like connecting to transit and job centers, preserving the environment, and incorporating innovative practices will differ drastically from one community to another.
- b. The Metropolitan Council needs to clarify how compliance with housing allocation targets is determined as well as the consequences of non-compliance.

The Board and County Staff look forward to continuing discussions related to the 2040 HPP and the other regional policy plans as we continue to define our regional vision and implement Thrive MSP 2040.

#### RE: Revised Metropolitan Council 2040 Forecasts

Dear Ms. Torres,

Carver County appreciates the opportunity to comment on the revised 2040 local forecasts released by the Metropolitan Council on April 9, 2015 (attached).

Carver County originally submitted suggested ranges of population and household forecasts to the Metropolitan Council in a letter dated November 26, 2013, and again in a letter dated April 15, 2014. The County continues to believe suggested population (173,000–186,000) and household (70,000–79,000) ranges outlined in previous comments from the County Board are reasonable and reflect local expectations. Although the revised forecasts have been adjusted higher for Carver County, the population and household forecasts remain lower than anticipated. These suggested ranges are based on the factors emphasized in the previous letters:

- *Historical Growth Rates were not taken into account* The pattern of steady growth experienced over the past 50 years in Carver County contradicts the growth pattern shifts forecasted by the Metropolitan Council.
- Persons per household (PPH) estimates will remain higher in Carver County Because household growth in the County will largely be made up of new families, in order to appropriately reflect local dynamics Metropolitan Council forecasts must recognize that Carver County's household size has always been, and will continue to be, higher than the regional average.
- *Planned developments infrastructure improvements were not recognized* A number of significant developments are planned in Carver County that will directly impact growth. Many of these developments were not identified in the Traffic Analysis Zone (TAZ), and forecasting modeling.

Accordingly, the County Board continues to support 2040 household and population forecast ranges provided in its previous letters (population: 173,000–186,000; households: 70,000–79,000).

Carver County also recognizes that local forecasts will continue to be revised as systems statements and local comprehensive plans are developed. The County is encouraged by the Council's continued movement towards the County's original suggested ranges, and the Board and County Staff look forward to continuing discussions related to 2040 forecasts as the numbers are refined.

We will not publish these draft local forecasts until we have responded to local comments and the Council formally adopts those revised forecasts in July. Some draft forecasts will change based upon the local comments we receive.

A few things to note:

- The updated regional forecast released in March (metrocouncil.org/forecasts) reduces regional growth by 2040 by 5% for population, 6% for households, and 15% for jobs. These reductions alone reduce many community forecasts.
- The draft local forecasts use updated real estate and land use data. These revisions have changed our forecasts of growth across the region.
- Please remember that while the Council has reduced 30-year population forecasts for some jurisdictions, the Council will provide necessary wastewater infrastructure to honor existing 2030 commitments for land to be included in the Metropolitan Urban Service Area by 2040 (*Thrive MSP 2040*, p. 21).
