A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on March 5, 2019. Vice Chair James Ische convened the session at 9:01 a.m.

Members present: James Ische, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent: Randy Maluchnik.

Under public comments, Ron Scheiber, Buffalo, stated he was appearing before the Board to ask for forgiveness from the County. He explained how they became guardians for a friend's children and received assistance from the County for a down payment on a home to take care of the children. He indicated they have been paying off that debt since 2015 but they are losing some financial assistance. He asked for understanding on the balance owed. Vice Chair Ische directed the County Administrator to review the matter and provide a response back to Mr. Scheiber.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the minutes of the February 19, 2019, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Resolution #15-19, Approving the Preliminary Plat of Tim Geven Addition

Adopted Findings of Fact and issue Order #PZ20190004 for the issuance of Interim Use Permit #PZ20190004, Ralph Oelfke, Young America Township.

Resolution #16-19, Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owner for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 33 Bridge Project #148750.

Approved the transfer of the 2015 Ford Explorer to the Tri-City Tactical Team.

Approved grant agreement SG-10782 with the Metropolitan Council and authorized the Chair and Administrator to sign.

Approved the addition of the Highway Operations Technician Trainee classification.

Reviewed February 26, 2019, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$724,811.08 and reviewed March 5, 2019, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$213,749.54.

Motion carried unanimously.

Anna Brown, representing the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District, appeared before the Board for an update on the District's work in the Six Mile Creek-Halsted Bay Subwatershed. She reviewed their mission statement and their organizational strategy. She indicated they work with local communities as well as private and public agencies to focus on high needs and opportunities to achieve measurable results. She highlighted the reasons the Watershed District focused on this area pointing out the substantial resource opportunities and growth within the area.

She stated in-lake as well as landscape strategies would be implemented. Brown pointed out the emphasis on carp management that is part of the District's efforts to refocus on the AIS programming. She also identified their strategy for wetland restoration and storm water management.

Brown explained their priority initiatives for 2019. She highlighted the Wassermann Lakefront Park partnership with the City and development progress to date. She indicated they will continue to work on the Zumbra Technical Assessment project as well as continue to evaluate new projects.

The Board thanked Ms. Brown for the update and Bill Olson, the County's appointment to the Watershed District, for his work.

Steve Just, Land Management, explained USS Westeros Solar's CUP request for a large solar energy system to be located in San Francisco Township. He noted the Board's Order denying the request and the subsequent Minnesota Court of Appeals reversing and remanding the Board's denial and directing the County to issue the CUP subject to reasonable conditions. He indicated the Planning Commission sought public input at their last meeting and found the fourteen conditions to be reasonable. He noted the option for stray voltage testing for dairy operators within a one mail radius of the site and both San Francisco and Hancock Townships would be involved in the road use agreement.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to authorize the signature for the issuance of CUP #PZ20170032, United States Solar Corporation/Westeros Solar LLC, San Francisco Township. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 9:45 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

Carver County is partnering with the City of Chaska and the City of Chanhassen for the reconstruction of Highway 18 (Lyman Blvd.) from 0.25 miles West of Highway 41 to Highway 15 (Galpin Blvd.) to a 2-lane urban highway. Carver County is the lead agency for this project. Total project costs to reconstruct of 1.054 miles of CSAH 18 is estimated at \$10,693,107.88.

The project has been awarded \$1,500,000 million in TED funding and \$710,000 in MnDOT Local Partnership Project (LPP) funding, both of which will only be utilized on the Highway 41 portion of this project.

The remaining funding for the project will come from CSAH Funding, County Sales Tax, City of Chaska funds and City of Chanhassen funds. The County needs to enter into Joint Powers Agreements with the City of Chaska and Chanhassen to define project responsibility and funding splits. The County will procure the TED and COOP (LPP) funding for the project. The project is planned to be constructed in 2019 and 2020.

This is the first construction project that is partially funded using the County Local Option Sales Tax.







Resolution Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for CSAH 10 NW Lake Waconia Reconstruction Project #138711

- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carver County is the official governing body of Carver County ("County"); and
- WHEREAS, the County, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, is authorized by law, and pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, § 163.02, subd. 2; §117.012; and § 117.042, to acquire land and other real property interests in Carver County which the County needs for a public use or public purpose; and
- WHEREAS, the County proposes to construct highway and related improvements in Carver County for widening and reconstruction as part of the CSAH 10 NW Lake Waconia Reconstruction Project #138711 ("Project"); and
- WHEREAS, to complete the Project, the County must acquire the real property interests described in Exhibit A, attached hereto, from the Owners of the real property interests identified in said Exhibit A; and
- WHEREAS, the County obtained either an appraisal(s) from a licensed real estate appraiser when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A exceeds \$25,000, or the County obtained a minimum damage acquisition report from a qualified person with appraisal knowledge, in lieu of an appraisal, when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A is under \$25,000; and
- WHEREAS, County must determine and submit an initial written offer of just compensation to the Owners of said needed real property interests covering the full amount of damages caused by the County's proposed acquisitions; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests may obtain an independent appraisal by a qualified appraiser of the real property interests which the County proposes to acquire for the Project; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests are entitled to reimbursement for the reasonable costs of the appraisal from the County up to a maximum of the limits stated in Minn. Stat. §117.036, provided the Owner submits to County the information necessary for reimbursement; and
- WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners authorized the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, to make initial written offers of just compensation to the Owners within the Project from whom property interests are required; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works	Division Director	r or agents under hi	s supervision,	have negotiated	settlement(s)
with the Owners im	pacted by the Pro	ject as described in	said Exhibit A	۸.	

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that County's acquisition of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A and the construction of highway and related improvements of County Highway 10 as part of the CSAH 10 NW Lake Waconia Reconstruction Project #138711 constitute a valid public use or public purpose; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that based upon the estimate of damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A which the County obtained either from an appraisal(s) or a minimum damage acquisition report(s) and the negotiations between said Owner(s) and the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, County shall make a payment of compensation to the Owners within the Project from whom the County must acquire needed real property interests, in the amounts as described in said Exhibit A; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Carver County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes and directs the Carver County Board Chairman and Carver County Administrator to enter into Stipulation of Settlement Agreement with said property owner(s), in the name of the County of Carver for the Project.

Carver County administers an Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) prevention program, which has historically included watercraft inspections and decontamination services, early detection monitoring and rapid response, and community outreach. Agreements with the City of Chanhassen and Minnehaha Creek Watershed District (MCWD) will again contribute to the program's budget and operation. The 2019 program includes a staffing change that reflects the transition of 10% of the existing Watercraft Inspector hours to an AIS Monitoring Intern position (STOC - Seasonal Temporary On Call). A summary of the proposed 2019 AIS Prevention Program is attached. The staff is requesting several motions below.

The following is a summary of the proposed 2019 Carver County Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Program. The staff is proposing a program similar to what was in place for 2018 with adjustments that reflect changes as follows:

- Reduced Minnehaha Creek Watershed District partnership funding from 35% to 25% of watercraft inspection costs
- Adjustment in watercraft inspection service model
 - Some lower priority/lower use waterbodies will not receive dedicated inspections
- New addition of AIS monitoring intern positions to enhance early detection monitoring efforts
 - o Interns will perform early detection surveys on County lakes
 - More lakes will receive early detection monitoring
 - Interns will also perform watercraft inspections when they are in the field as they
 encounter boaters launching or retrieving watercrafts

<u>Proposed Watercraft Inspection Service Model</u>

- County partners with cities and watershed districts to determine level of inspection service
- Lakes are prioritized based on AIS risk assessments including infestation risk and zebra mussel suitability risk high risk lakes receive watercraft inspections
- 19 weeks of base level service
 - Fishing opener to Labor Day
 - Extended service may be provided based on partner agreements and available staff
- Lakes receiving watercraft inspections:
 - Carver County Water Management Organization
 - Waconia, Bavaria
 - Minnehaha Creek Watershed District
 - Minnewashta, Piersons
 - Riley Purgatory Bluff Creek Watershed District
 - Susan, Ann, Lotus

Proposed Decontamination Service

- Provided weekends (Saturday and Sunday) mid-May through early October
- Free service to all users
- Service provided at Lake Waconia east public water access

<u>Inspection Partnership Agreements (in negotiation)</u>

- Minnehaha Creek Watershed District Lakes
 - o MCWD funding reduced from 35% in 2018 to 25% in 2019
 - o Lake Minnewashta Cost Share \$20,000
 - o Piersons Lake: Cost-share \$10,000
- City of Chanhassen Lakes
 - o Agreement similar to 2018 Total Cost \$61,000
 - Includes funds from Riley Purgatory Bluff Creek and Lotus Lake Alliance

- Initiative Foundation vegetation removal grant
 - o Two year: 2018-19
 - o Match to provide aquatic vegetation management at various public water accesses
- Carp management project
 - o Restore water quality and habitat of Benton Lake in Cologne
