A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on July 2, 2019. Chair Randy Maluchnik convened the session at 9:06 a.m.

Members present: Randy Maluchnik, Chair, James Ische, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Under public participation, Karen Johnson Leuthner, 15735 38th Street, Mayer, clarified she was not representing anyone from Carver County and was a relevant public watchdog. She pointed out the video and email she sent yesterday that documented that the tower was built to sell for profit. She indicated there was not full disclosure and she was fighting for the safety of the people. Johnson Luethner added she had back up to support for everything she stated.

Reviewed July 2, 2019, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$229,136.65.

Appointed Paul Modeen to the Carver County Park Commission to fill an expired term in District #5.

Motion carried unanimously.

Keith Carlson, MICA Director, appeared before the Board to give an update on the past legislative session. He noted the session provided significant short-term gains for counties. He pointed out the increase in county program aid and cost shifts. He stated there was no new transportation funding and longer term the general fund outlook is a reason for concern. Carlson added the economy is slowing and the State's growth is being constrained by the lack of bodies to increase employment.

Steve Novak, Nancy Sileksy, and Carli Stark reviewed legislative changes in the areas of transportation, Health and Human Services and public safety.

Carlson thanked the County for their continued membership and recognized Commissioners Maluchnik and Degler for representing Carver County on the MICA Board. He also acknowledged the contributions of County staff in sharing information. He stated he would be retiring in August and announcing his replacement in a few weeks.

The Board thanked Mr. Carlson for his hard work and service to counties.

Rod Franks, HH&S Director and Jason Kamerud, Sheriff, requested the Board approval to create 1.0 FTE law enforcement co-responder crises therapist. Franks stated they would be creating a coresponder model between the mobile crisis team and officer on the road. Sheriff noted the increase in service calls related to mental health and increased training that has also occurred. He indicated the co-responder would provide assessment, provide immediate counseling in the field and would provide appropriate referrals. Kamerud stated Sheriff's office funding would be used to fund a position in HH&S to have someone in the field to provide immediate counseling and referrals.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to approve the creation of 1.0 FTE law enforcement co-responder crisis therapist and related budget amendment. Motion carried unanimously.

Martin Walsh, Parks, requested the Board award the construction contract for Phase 1 site development of Coney Island. He pointed out current vegetation removal work that is occurring and future work that would be occurring with Phase 1. He reviewed the alternate to construct a trail

section with retaining wall to complete the east-west connection.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to award contract to GL Contracting, Inc., for \$649,958 for the base bid Phase 1 Site Development of Lake Waconia Regional Park Coney Island, to award bid alternates to GL Contracting, Inc., for \$205,019 upon completion of the contract review process and subject to the 2020 budget approval requesting Met Council reimbursement grant funds from land acquisition of \$226,000. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Lynch left at 10:14 a.m. to attend a funeral.

Dave Hemze, County Administrator, requested the Board approve the County's 2019-2020 Strategic Plan. He explained updates were done each year and the plan included moderate changes. He pointed out the budget discussions that were held with the Board considering initiatives take funding to get done. He noted under each goal were a number of strategic initiatives.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to adopt the 2019-2020 Strategic Plan as outlined. Motion carried unanimously.

Kerie Anderka, Employee Relations, explained as part of the county wide performance process employees participate in a mid-year performance discussion to review goals and performance. She stated Statute allows the Board to meet in closed session to evaluate and discuss performance of their direct reports.

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to go into closed session as provided by Minnesota Statute to discuss County Administrator Hemze's performance to comply with the County's mid-year review process. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned the closed and Regular session at 10:50 a.m. and held a work session with Parks for an update.

Resolution Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 5/33 Roundabout Project #188847

- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carver County is the official governing body of Carver County ("County"); and
- WHEREAS, the County, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, is authorized by law, and pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, § 163.02, subd. 2; §117.012; and § 117.042, to acquire land and other real property interests in Carver County which the County needs for a public use or public purpose; and
- WHEREAS, the County proposes to construct highway and related improvements in Carver County for a roundabout and other improvements as part of the Highway 5/33 Roundabout Project ("Project"); and
- WHEREAS, to complete the Project, the County must acquire the real property interests described in Exhibit A, attached hereto, from the Owners of the real property interests identified in said Exhibit A; and
- WHEREAS, the County obtained either an appraisal(s) from a licensed real estate appraiser when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A exceeds \$25,000, or the County obtained a minimum damage acquisition report from a qualified person with appraisal knowledge, in lieu of an appraisal, when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A is under \$25,000; and
- WHEREAS, County must determine and submit an initial written offer of just compensation to the Owners of said needed real property interests covering the full amount of damages caused by the County's proposed acquisitions; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests may obtain an independent appraisal by a qualified appraiser of the real property interests which the County proposes to acquire for the Project; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests are entitled to reimbursement for the reasonable costs of the appraisal from the County up to a maximum of the limits stated in Minn. Stat. §117.036, provided the Owner submits to County the information necessary for reimbursement; and
- WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners authorized the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, to make initial written offers of just compensation to the Owners within the Project from whom property interests are required; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision	sion, l	have negotiated	l settlement(s)
with the Owners impacted by the Project as described in said Exhi	ibit A	٨.	

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that County's acquisition of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A and the construction of highway and related improvements of a roundabout and other improvements as part of the Highway 5/33 Roundabout Project #188847 constitute a valid public use or public purpose; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that based upon the estimate of damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A which the County obtained either from an appraisal(s) or a minimum damage acquisition report(s) and the negotiations between said Owner(s) and the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, County shall make a payment of compensation to the Owners within the Project from whom the County must acquire needed real property interests, in the amounts as described in said Exhibit A; and







One alternate was also bid as part of this project and award of the alternates will not effect who is the low bidder for the work. The following is our recommendation:
