

Carver County Veterans Assistance Program (CVAP)

- ★ Local committee made up of Carver County VFW, American Legion, Auxiliaries & Beyond the Yellow Ribbon membership
- ★ Assists Carver County Veterans and Military Families with needbased, emergency assistance
- ★ Not a handout! Integrates veterans into programs & services provides holistic care with the goal of self-sustainability
- ★ CVAP is 100% donation sustained with no administrative costs

What role does Carver County Veterans Assistance Program (CVAP) play in the lives of Carver County Veterans? The program provides emergency assistance for Carver County Veteran (residents) with an immediate financial assistance need on a case by case basis.

What process does CVAP follow to get quick, meaningful results to Carver County Veterans and their families?

- Carver County Veteran Services sits down with the Veteran to verify his or her service, finances, and needs
- Veteran Services makes request to the CVAP Committee on behalf of the Veteran
- Committee members work swiftly to review the request, decide, and respond in a timely manner
- If approved, the CVAP Treasurer pays veteran's vendor (landlord, billing company, etc), not the veteran
- Whether veteran qualifies for CVAP or not, they are triaged for other needs including healthcare, VA benefits, and other local benefit providers

Will the veteran be asked to do anything additional after the award is granted?

CVAP hopes to work with the recipient to help identify and create self-sustainability moving forward. In many cases, financial counseling is coordinated for the recipient.

How confidential is the process?

Protecting the anonymity of the Veteran is paramount to our success. Case numbers are assigned to replace the Veteran's name. The committee members are not aware of the identity of the Veteran making the request.

How can I help? The CVAP Committee is voted on once per year by the Carver County Veterans' Council and is made up of members of Carver County Veteran Organizations, Auxiliaries, and Beyond the Yellow Ribbon Groups. 
