Vice Chair Degler, on behalf of the County Board, extended the Board's thoughts and wishes to County citizens as they made progress in the fight against COVID-19. He recognized Governor Walz's stay a home order continues and clarified the County's current suspension of walk-up/walk-in services also remains in effect. Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. On a roll call vote, Degler, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik, Workman voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the April 14, 2020, Special Session. On a roll call vote, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik, Workman, Degler voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Approved accepting COVID Emergency Response Funds of \$34,000 to shelter the homeless during the COVID-19 emergency and related HH&S budget amendment.

On a roll call vote, Maluchnik, Workman, Degler, Ische, Lynch voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING A 2020 Federal BUILD GRANT APPLICATION FOR MINNESOTA VALLEY REGIONAL RAIL AUTHORITY

Whereas, the Minnesota Valley Regional Rail Authority is a publicly owned railroad statutorily formed by the State of Minnesota in 1982 under the provisions of the Minnesota Statute Section 398A.0 to 398A.09, and

Whereas, the Minnesota Valley Regional Rail Authority includes representation from and serves Carver County, Sibley County, Renville County, Redwood County, and Yellow Medicine County in Minnesota for the purpose of preserving and improving local rail service for agriculture, industry, and passenger traffic when determined to be practical and necessary for the public welfare, and,

Whereas, the Minnesota Valley Regional Rail Authority owns and maintain 94 miles of rail track from Norwood Young America to Hanley Falls, MN, which includes 16 communities, and provides service to shippers on a larger regional basis, and

Whereas, the Minnesota Valley Regional Rail Authority requests a stakeholder resolution for the application of a FY 2020 Federal BUILD grant application to improve 36.7 miles of railroad modernization, including public rail crossing improvements between Gibbon, MN, and Delhi, MN.

Whereas, Minnesota Valley Railroad Authority requests the authority to request \$24, 137,638 million in BUILD funds, which will be matched with a \$7.5 million grant from the State of Minnesota to accomplish this necessary rail improvement project to anchor economic revitalization in Southwest Minnesota, and

Whereas, rural communities along our track rely on railroad service to connect 300 local farms to distant markets and more than \$448 million in economic growth is attributed to rail activities in this region which supports 960 local jobs and sustains more than \$65 million in annual wages, and

Whereas, the current rail line is inefficient and cannot support the most efficient modern rail cars due to outdated rail infrastructure, track speed is limited to 7 miles per hour which creates a non-competitive environment for Minnesota producers who rely on railroad economies of scale to move goods to market, and

Whereas, the Railroad Authority has a proven track record of job creation with new and existing businesses, and has stimulated economic growth with past rail renovation on other line segments in the region, and

Whereas, the Minnesota Valley Regional Railroad Authority has been a good steward of federal and state funding over the past eighteen years has undertaken \$37 M worth of rail replacements, bridge work and surface projects which has helped attract new industry and local growth, and

Whereas, the objective of this BUILD grant is to modernize railroad service to a state of good repair allowing freight trains to move at 25 miles per hour with the ability to handle the most modern and efficient 286,000 pound rail cars, which will reduce truck traffic on local roads, improve safety and anchor economic revitalization and job growth in Southwestern Minnesota.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Carver County Board of Commissioners strongly supports this project and MVRRA's application request for \$24M under the 2020 Federal BUILD grant program to secure further funding to complete rail and bridge modernization from Gibbon, MN to Delhi, MN, with an additional \$2.5M in 2020 bonding funds from the State of Minnesota.

Dear Secretary Chao:

This letter is in support of the Minnesota Valley Regional Railroad Modernization Project which is seeking federal funding support through the Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) grant program.

The Minnesota Valley Regional Rail Authority serves Carver County, Sibley County, Renville County, Redwood County and Yellow Medicine County. What we would like is a safe, efficient, and reliable rail line that will help us attract more business and help us keep what we have. We view the MVRRA as a critical transportation infrastructure that we are fortunate to have access to for attracting new rail-served businesses to our counties.

This rail modernization project will bring much needed upgrades from MP 88.3 at Gibbon, MN to MP 125 at Delhi, MN, such as rail relay with new 115 lb CWR, install 29 new turnouts, repair bridges, replace 33 public crossings, replace 39 private crossings, install 15,000 new ties, install 11,000 tons of ballast, install signals at 7 crossings. This work will upgrade the line to Class II standards and allow 286,000 lb cars at 25 mph.

The Carver County Board of Commissioners fully supports this infrastructure modernization project that will create greater opportunity for shippers by providing competitive choices. On behalf of the County Board, I ask that you give full and fair consideration to the Minnesota Valley Regional Railroad Authority Rail Modernization Project through this BUILD application

In recent weeks, Minnesota businesses and residents have reached out to legislators, county commissioners and staff to ask for some form of property tax relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Property tax revenue represents local governments main source of revenue to operate mandated and community services so impacting their cash flow from any form of property tax relief needs careful consideration. In response to financial impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, county staff recommend: 1. The County Board declare a 30 day grace period for non-escrow taxpayers with a COVID-19 financial hardship to pay property taxes by June 15 th , 2020 without penalty for late payment. 2. The County Board, in recognition of the negative impact a 30 day grace period will have on the cash flow for schools, townships and cities, direct the County Treasurer to: A. Increase the 1st half estimated advance for funds collected from 1/1/20 – 5/20/20 to 95% for schools, townships and cities, and B. On 7/2/2020, make an Additional COVID-19 95% estimated advance for funds collected from 5/21/20 – 6/20/20 to schools,					
townships and cities.

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE FINANCIAL IMPACT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners declared a Local State of Emergency effective March 17, 2020, due to the ongoing and expected response to and recovery from the COVID-19 Pandemic; and,

WHEREAS, the impacts and effects of the COVID-19 pandemic are continuing to be realized and understood; and,

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has declared a National Emergency and the Governor of the State of Minnesota has declared a Peacetime State of Emergency; and,

WHEREAS, the preventative measures taken at all levels of government necessary to reduce the toll on human life have also created financial difficulties for many businesses and families; and,

WHEREAS, the federal government and the State of Minnesota have attempted to respond to the financial needs of individuals and businesses with a multitude of financial support and stimulus programs; and,

WHEREAS, the county board encourages all businesses and residents to utilize those resources; and,

WHEREAS, the county board recognizes the importance of businesses, including a large number of small businesses within the county, in providing the economic health and vitality of Carver County; and,

WHEREAS, the county board continues to support the business community through the efforts of our community development agency, by providing a robust transportation system, by providing county services that make the county a desirable place for both residents and businesses to locate, and by doing its part to ensure a competitive property tax burden for businesses and other property owners; and,

WHEREAS, counties are responsible for the collection and distribution of property taxes levied by all local governments; and,

WHEREAS, counties and local governments support essential services including those critical to COVID-19 response efforts; and,

WHEREAS, property taxes are the fundamental revenue sources for local government to ensure sustainability of essential services and statutory mandates; and,

WHEREAS, counties have the authority to abate or delay penalties and interest on late property tax payments under MS 279.01 and MS 375.192; and,

WHEREAS, county policy abatement policy defines hardship as an event or circumstances outside of the control of the taxpayer that does not include financial hardship.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in recognition of the financial impact on residents and businesses directly related to the COVID-19 federal, state, and local emergency declarations, the Carver County Board of Commissioners declares a 30 day grace period for non-escrow taxpayers with a COVID-19 financial hardship to pay property taxes without penalty thru June 15th, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED, that in recognition of the negative impact a 30 day grace period will have on the cash flow for schools, townships and cities, the Carver County Board of Commissioners directs the County Treasurer to:

- 1. Increase the estimated advance of funds collected from 1/1/20 5/20/20 to 95% for schools, townships and cities, and
- 2. On July 2nd, 2020, make a 95% of estimated advance of funds collected from 5/21/20 6/20/20 to schools, townships and cities.

Reopening Carver County - Phase I

Proposed April 28, 2020

Reopening Carver County – Phase I recommendations are attached with a proposed implementation date of Monday, May 4. The main objective of the phased plan is to keep our citizens and employees safe and healthy while gradually reopening County services. Related strategies include the following.

- 1. All buildings remain closed to general walk-in traffic during Reopening Phase I.
- 2. Service by appointment is offered for certain services that cannot be completed via other methods or are difficult to complete online due to lack of an electronic solution, complexity of transaction, or customer barrier to accessing the service online.
- 3. Electronic processing of documents and applications, and delivery of services via virtual methods are continued and increased where possible. Methods for effective virtual service delivery are refined. Innovations are continued into the future when appropriate.
- 4. Physical spaces are appropriately prepared (room arrangements to support social distancing, protective barriers installed, enhanced cleaning protocols continued, etc.).
- 5. Employees continue to telework where effective service delivery can be provided through remote work arrangements.

Protocols related to services that are reopened will be guided by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) recommendations. Reopening Carver County - Phase II will be recommended to the Board later based upon health data and trends, with the goal of incrementally reopening all Carver County buildings and services.

Continuing to strategically enhance the County's ability to quickly convert to effective service delivery in the event of renewed social distancing or stay at home guidance will remain an ongoing area of focus. It is the County's goal to be prepared and responsive to current and future challenges, while maintaining employee and community health, safety, and wellbeing as top priorities.
