A Special Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on July 11, 2014. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 4:00 p.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, James Ische, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent: Randy Maluchnik.

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Jason Kamerud, Sheriff's Office, explained on June 18<sup>th</sup> the Minnesota DNR gave local governments an opportunity to put restrictions on lakes and on June 21<sup>st</sup> the Board adopted an Ordinance putting wake restrictions on the entire surfaces of Waconia, Bavaria and Reitz lakes. He noted the factors that would determine when the restrictions would be lifted. He stated Lake Waconia and Bavaria were still above the ordinary high water mark and today's readings indicated that Waconia has been the highest it has been this year.

He noted lake levels were changing rapidly and the proposed amended Ordinance allows the County Sheriff and County Administrator to suspend, remove or modify the slow-no wake restriction areas and times. Kamerud indicated this would allow them to be more responsive and take measures to protect property and maintain resources. He stated this would allow the Sheriff to leave or tighten restrictions in lieu of having impromptu Board meetings. Kamerud added that any change would be based upon factual information.

The Board acknowledged the need for the Sheriff to have discretion on when to modify and the ability to make a quick decision.

Sheriff Olson indicated that prior to getting today's rains, he was expecting to change restrictions on Lake Waconia but he didn't see being able to do that at this time.

Dave Hemze, County Administrator, stated he would be relying on the Sheriff to make the decision and he was in agreement with that. He noted the temporary Ordinance does expire July 21<sup>st</sup> and given the recent rain events, he would be adding this to next Tuesday's agenda. He stressed this change was about flexibility and moving ahead, they may look at having a permanent Ordinance in place that deals with this issue.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to open the public hearing to consider an amendment to the Roadways System Plan Appendix of the Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan. Motion carried.

Nate Kabat, Public Health, explained the process followed to date. He stated the purpose of the amendment was to incorporate two key planning efforts conducted by Public Works since the 2030 Roadway Systems Plan was adopted into the 2030 Comprehensive Plan in 2010.

He stated a draft plan was before the Planning Commission in April, followed by a 60 day comment period. Kabat indicated four letters were received and staff addressed those comments as necessary. Thereafter the plan was taken back to the Planning Commission who then closed the public hearing and recommended the Board adopt the plan amendment. Kabat clarified the amendment would also need to be reviewed by the Met Council.

Kate Miner, Public Works, highlighted the content of the changes and what was included. She noted the functional classification, right of way guidelines and revenue and expenditures that were updated.

No public testimony was received.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to close the public hearing. Motion carried.

Ische offered the following Resolution, seconded by Lynch:

# Resolution #45-14 Adopting Ordinance 68-2014 Amending the Roadways System Plan Appendix Of the Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Summary: Ordinance 68-2014, Amendments to Chapter 68, (*CARVER COUNTY 2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN*), of the Carver County Code.

The following is a summary of the essential elements of Ordinance 68-2014 for the purpose of publication as required by M.S. Section 375.51. A printed official copy of the ordinance is available for inspection by any person during regular business hours at the office of the Carver County Auditor, or a copy may be purchased from the Carver County Planning and Water Management Department. Ordinance 68-2014 amends Chapter 68 by updating and changing the Roadway System Plan Appendix of the Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan. The revised Chapter refines the County traffic demand model and map by incorporating 2010 U.S. Census results and other key data. The revised Chapter adjusts the 2030 Future Capacity and Connectivity Improvements map and supporting language based on traffic demand model results. The revised Chapter adjusts the Existing Functional Class map and supporting language to reflect current classifications. The revised Chapter adjusts County Road Right-of-Way Guidelines and cross-sections to reflect best practices. The revised Chapter adjusts revenue and expenditure forecasts based on existing and expected funding streams, and expected costs of planned improvements.

Pat Lambert, Public works, requested the Board adopt a Resolution approving a settlement agreement for the CSAH 11 construction project. He explained at the mediation session an agreement was reached on this parcel.

Lynch offered the following Resolution, seconded by Ische:

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Sheriff James Olson requested the Board adopt a Resolution extending the Ordinance imposing restrictions on the use of watercraft on designated lakes for an additional 45 days. He noted the June 21<sup>st</sup> emergency meeting to adopt the ordinance and the amendment adopted last week giving him and the County Administrator the authority to suspend, remove or modify the slow-no wake restrictions on designated lakes.

He stated there continued to be high water on Lake Waconia due to the recent rains and he was proposing that the County Board extend that temporary restriction for another 45 days. Sheriff

indicated they have had contact with the DNR and he believes they will approve it as well. He pointed out the requirements for the restriction to be lifted. He indicated the restriction had been lifted on Reitz Lake but that was being re-evaluated as the lake came back up since Friday. Sheriff added that if Lake Waconia continued to drop he was hoping to be able to do something later this week to reduce the restriction and he will be monitoring it to see if it continues to drop.

The Board acknowledged the need to give Sheriff the flexibility to move quickly.

Ische offered the following Resolution, seconded by Lynch:

The County works with each city to establish a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) that outlines each entity's responsibilities.  The JPA's across the County are similar but not identical. The Library has drafted a new JPA with the City of Victoria that it plans on using as a template for all future JPA's. The language in this template is in line with what other communities have approved.  Under the JPA, the County is responsible for providing, maintaining, and funding library material, furniture, shelving, services, equipment, internet connections, technology, personnel, and supplies as deemed necessary by the County successfully to operate the library branch. The County has full management and control of the library operations.  The City is responsible for providing, maintaining, and funding the space for a library including all utilities (electricity, heat, airconditioning, and the like) and miscellaneous services to maintain the premises in a functional condition, including janitorial services. The City is responsible for maintaining the exterior of the building, including snow removal, parking lot, lawn and landscag care, and all other repairs and maintenance to the exterior of the premises. In addition, the City will provide the library access to meeting rooms for programming.  The city has approved the JPA. Following their approval, the City and County have made two clarifying additions, which will be considered as an amendment to the JPA. The amendment will include a clarification that the City will provide phone service to

Minnesota Statute 197.60 requires the County Board of Commissioners to appoint a Veterans Service Officer to a four-year term. We recruited 47 applicants and empaneled a search committee including a Commissioner, a leader of County veterans' service organizations, the Veterans Service Office (VSO)  Technician, and two division directors three of whom are veterans. Two finalists met with all available VSO staff, the Commander of the County's Veterans Service Council, and the search committee as well. In its review, the committee reached a consensual recommendation to appoint Dan Tengwall as VSO. He is an active Captain in the Minnesota National Guard, where he is a Commander of a Headquarters Battery. The Army awarded him the prestigious Meritorious Service Medal for outstanding leadership during Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2009-2010. He has worked on pensions at the US Department of Veterans Affairs in Minneapolis and served as a Veterans Service Representative for the Hennepin County Veterans Service Office. A graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College, he is a lifetime member of the VFW. We have thoroughly checked his references, talked with colleagues not on his reference list, and conducted a background check on him as well. He emerged from our careful vetting with a sterling record of achievement, credentials, experience, and testimonials to his character.
