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A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on January 21, 2014. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 4:00 p.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, Randy Maluchnik, Vice Chair, James Ische, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the January 7, 2014, Organizational Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Professional services agreement with Henning Professional Services, Inc., pending finalization of the contract review process.

Professional services agreement with Alliant Engineering, Inc. for county wide signal retiming pending finalization of the contract review process.

Resolution #03-14, Support of Transportation Alternative Grant Application for the Lake Minnetonka Regional Trail.

Resolution #04-14, Support of Transportation Alternative Grant Application for the Minnesota Bluffs Regional Trail.

Approved charitable gambling application for exempt permit-Make-A-Wish Foundation of Minnesota.

Renewed contract with Madden Galanter Hanson, LLP.

Reviewed January 14, 2014, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$483,593.77 and January 21, 2014, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$582,101.32.

Motion carried unanimously.

Bill Weckman, Public Works, requested Board approval to amend a contract with the L.D. Martin Law Office. He explained the County contracted with Attorney Martin for legal services for land

acquisition related to the CSAH 11 project. He indicated the land commissioner hearings were completed, awards had been filed and appeals have been made. He stated the amendment provided for the additional legal services that were needed and for the appeal process. Weckman reviewed the estimated costs and recognized the Board's request to negotiate a discounted hourly rate. He explained the discounted rate and noted the rate was only available to the County.

Mark Metz, County Attorney, recognized the Board's approval to hire an attorney in 2014 with expertise in this area. He noted the work had been sporadic in the past but given the increase in demand his office was in the process of posting for this position.

Workman clarified he would be abstaining as he was related to a property owner.

Maluchnik moved, Ische seconded, to authorize the Chair and Administrator to sign Amendment No. 1 to the contract with L.D. Martin Law Office pending finalization of the contract review process. Degler, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik voted aye. Workman abstained. Motion carried.

The Board considered appointments to various advisory committees.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to appoint Virgil Stender to the Carver County Board of Adjustment. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to appoint Gerald Bruner to the Carver County Park Commission. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to rescind the January 7th Susan Maki District 3 Library Board appointment and instead appoint Jim Weygand as the District 3 Library Board representative. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to enter into closed session as provided by Minnesota Statute to discuss County Administrator Hemze's 2013 performance. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned the closed session and Regular Session at 4:50 p.m.

Dear Mr. Engelen:

Thank you for submitting your letter containing Carver County's list of 67 tax-forfeited parcels for DNR review. Of the tax-forfeited parcels submitted, 37 parcels in The Preserve 3rd Addition did not require DNR review. DNR staff has reviewed 30 parcels and have the following comments:

PARCELS WITH OVER 150 FEET OF WATERFRONT - WITHDRAWN FROM SALE

Please take note that according to Minn. Stat. 282.018, Subd. 1, these parcels must be withdrawn from sale because waterfront exceeds 150 feet. Special legislation will be needed for the county to proceed with the sale of this parcel. The Department has no objection to the sale of the following four parcels if legislation was passed authorizing the sale.

PIN 25.3420210

The parcel has approximately 575 feet of water frontage on an unnamed PWI watercourse. In addition the parcel contains wetlands, and is adjacent the Lake Minnetonka LRT Regional Trail, managed by Three Rivers Parks District. The DNR recommends that the county contact Three Rivers to discuss a conveyance as a park or trail amenity use.

PIN 25.3420220

The parcel has approximately 300 feet of water frontage on an unnamed PWI watercourse. In addition the parcel contains wetlands, and is adjacent to City of Chanhassen property and close to the Lake Minnetonka LRT Regional Trail, managed by Three Rivers Parks District. The DNR recommends that the county contact the city or Three Rivers to discuss a conveyance as a park or trail amenity use.

PIN 58.6520890

This parcel appears to have approximately 2,300 feet of waterfront footage on Young America Lake, a public waters inventory (PWI) waterbasin (i.e. lake). This parcel is ecologically significant to Young America Lake as a buffer against development and potentially for wildlife habitat. The DNR recommend that the county consider conveying the parcel to the City of Young America for the public use of park and/or lake access.

PIN 85.0092900

The parcel is over 40 acres in size, has approximately 1,400 feet of water frontage on an unnamed PWI watercourse, and contains wetlands. This parcel could make a good addition to the City of Watertown's park system. The DNR recommends that the county contact the city to discuss conveyance for the public park use.

PARCELS WITH 150 FEET OR LESS OF WATERFRONT - APPROVED FOR SALE

According to Minn. Stat. 282.018, subd. 1, any tract or parcel of land containing 150 feet or less frontage on public waters may not be offered for sale without the prior approval of the Department. The DNR approves the sale of the following two parcels.

PIN 20.0502320

According to DNR records, this parcel has less than 150 feet of waterfront frontage on Carver Creek, a DNR public waters inventory (PWI) watercourse. However, County staff indicated that the parcel does not have frontage on Carver Creek due to a constructed levee. DNR records show that permits have been issued on Carver Creek for channel work that may or may not explain the discrepancy between DNR and County records. Assuming the DNR records are correct, according to Minn. Stat. 282.018, Subd. 1, any tract or parcel of land containing 150 feet or less frontage on public waters may not be offered for sale without the prior approval of the Department.

WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of January 21, 2014; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. Donald Ingram recently purchased a 2.99 acre property in the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section 24, Dahlgren Township. The parcel is improved with a residence and several small accessory structures. The property is in the Transition Overlay District for the City of Carver and the CCWMO (Carver Creek Watershed).
- 1. The applicant is requesting a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to operate a Home Extended Business Accessory Use (Excavating Business), pursuant to Section 152.079 C9 of the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 2. Mr. Ingram is requesting to operate his excavating business (Don & Wayne LLC) from the property. The business would operate from an approximate 60' x 80' (4,800 sq. ft.) storage building, which must conform to the Minnesota State Building Code. The hours of operation would typically be 6:30 a.m. 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. There may be some activity taking place on weekends; however, it would be incidental to the home extended business use of the property. There are four (4) full-time employees associated with the business, of which two (2) employees report to the site to pickup trucks/equipment in the morning and return them in the evening. The business utilizes two (2) backhoes, two (2) bobcats, one (1) dozer, one (1) dump truck and three (3) trailers. Mr. Ingram has a pickup truck which is considered a personal/business vehicle; however, it is not counted against his restricted business vehicle number.
- 3. There are four (4) existing accessory structure on the property which will be removed due to either their extremely small size or deteriorating condition. The proposed accessory structure would also provide for the storage of tools, small equipment, etc. Outside storage of skid loader attachments is proposed; however, they would be placed in a location close to the new building. Mr. Ingram is proposing to construct a berm with tree plantings on it to provide additional screening from Dahlgren Road.
- 4. Mr. Ingram anticipates approximately eight (8) trips per day to be associated with the Home Extended Business. At this location Dahlgren Road is paved; therefore, the applicant is not anticipating the need of any road improvements/upgrades. However, if future problem occur, the local road authority would have the opportunity to require possible improvements at the landowner's expense.

- 5. At this time, Mr. Ingram is not proposing to have an office located within the structure; however, if an office and/or restroom were to be proposed, the appropriate building and SSTS permit(s) would be needed prior to beginning any construction activity.
- 6. A Certificate of Compliance (COC) for the existing septic system has been submitted to the Carver County Environmental Services Department, and an alternate site has been identified on the property. However, based on the close proximity of the proposed accessory structure to the alternate septic site, extra precautionary measures must be taken. Therefore, a licensed septic designer must field verify the location of the alternate site, stake the outside corners, fence off the area to protect it from construction traffic, and provide a site plan to scale. The site plan is to show the locations of the soil borings, edge of the alternate septic site, and the minimum 20' setback to the proposed accessory structure.
- 7. Mr. Ingram will need to complete some site preparation for the building pad location and driveway/parking area. The work can either be completed as part of the building permit approval process, or a separate administrative permit can be submitted for review and approved prior to any building permit application. Mr. Ingram will need to decide the timing of when all the construction activity will be taking place.
- 8. The applicant is not planning signage for the business at this time and there is not any retail sales from the property (i.e. customers would not come to the site). However, a double faced sign no larger than 30 sq. ft. in area is allowed pursuant to the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 9. The Dahlgren Town Board reviewed the request at their January 13, 2014, Town Board meeting and recommended approval.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of Conditional Use Permit #PZ20130045 for a Home Extended Business Accessory Use on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- The permit is subject to administrative review. The Permittee shall maintain homestead status on the property. A
 change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by Land Management for a
 determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners
 and/or operators are encouraged to contact Land Management as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as
 possible.
- 2. The operation shall be in accordance with the submitted operational plan (dated: 1/9/14) and site plan (dated: 1/10/14). These plans shall be attached to and become part of this permit.
- 3. Permittee shall obtain the appropriate building permit(s) prior to construction of the building. All structures used in conjunction with the Home Extended Business Accessory Use operation shall meet the requirements of the Minnesota State Building Code. Building permits will be required prior to the construction of any future additions and/or buildings.
- 4. The Permittee shall have a licensed septic contractor field verify the alternate site location, provide protection measures to ensure not soil disturbance at that location, and maintain a minimum of 20 feet from the edge of the closest corner of the alternate septic location to the closest corner of the proposed structure location.
- 5. No more than two (2) employees that report to the site shall be permitted. No more than two (2) business vehicles shall be stored at the site. Of the business vehicles, only one (1) vehicle shall exceed the one (1) ton capacity.

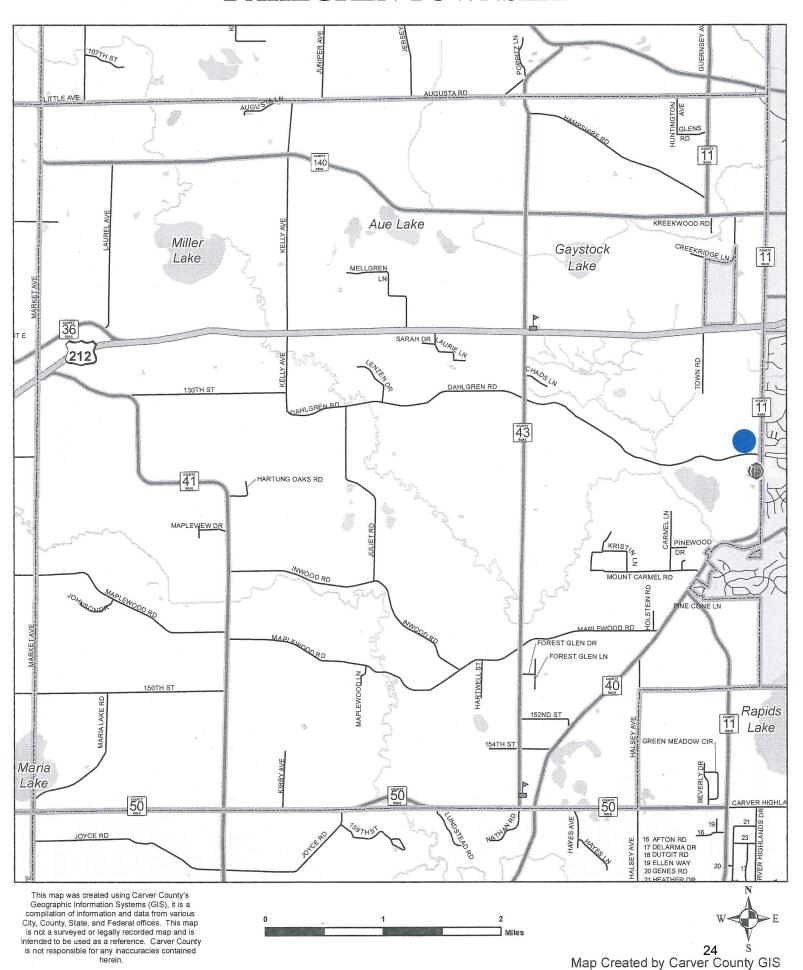
- 6. Permittee shall obtain and maintain a Non-generator's Certificate or contact the Environmental Services (E.S.) Department to determine whether a Hazardous Waste Generator's License if required.
- 7. Permittee shall comply with road access requirements/improvements as determined by the road authority.
- 8. Permittee shall submit a Certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance and/or proper affidavit to the Land Management Department.

The Resilient Communities Project (RCP) is a year-long partnership between the U of MN and one Minnesota community. Through the partnership, students and faculty from across the University collaborate with the partner community to address its self-identified needs through course-based projects.

Carver County's proposal builds on the 2030 Comprehensive Plan statement that success, "depends on the partnership and collaboration of all of Carver County's stakeholders, Cities and Townships, citizens, and decision-makers working in concert toward a common goal." Accordingly, projects will be identified and led by partners including the Carver County Community Development Agency, City of Chanhassen, City of Chaska, City of Victoria, SouthWest Transit, County Administrative Services, County Environmental Services, and County Planning & Water Management.

Projects outlined in Carver County's proposal are designed to directly impact strategies and goals set in the County's Strategic Plan and Comprehensive Plan, as well as priorities of the County's partners. The following are projects identified for inclusion in the application due for submission on February 14, 2014. The RCP will announce its selected partner for the 2014-15 school year in March, 2014.

Carver County led projects

- Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities Around Park & Rides Planning & Water Management
 Increasing multi-modal connections to transit is an expressed goal in the Carver County 2030
 Comprehensive Plan. This project would also build on the 2012 County Non-Motorized Facilities
 study to inventory the current pedestrian environment surrounding park and rides, identify options
 for improvements, and prioritize implementation.
- 2. Safe Routes to School Countywide Plan Planning & Water Management
 This project would lay the groundwork for establishing a coordinated Safe Routes to School (SRTS)
 program in Carver County. Using SRTS as a catalyst to improve the County's pedestrian environment
 encourages community input, leverages financial resources, and adds education and promotion
 strategies. Additionally, adopting an SRTS program is one strategy identified the Carver County 2030
 Comprehensive Plan.
- 3. <u>County Historical and Cultural Resources Strategy</u> *Planning & Water Management*Student work would identify best practices and define enhanced implementation steps for a countywide historic and cultural preservation approach toward preserving, educating the public, and
 maximizing the economic and tourism value of historic and cultural resources. This is an identified
 effort in the *Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan*.

- 4. Adapting Stormwater Infrastructure to Changing Weather Patterns Planning & Water Management Students will examine existing stormwater management systems designed to control runoff and protect property to determine their ability to handle increased frequency and severity of rain events Areas of impact (increased flooding, damage to property, public safety concerns, and impacts to the quality of our lakes, streams and wetlands) will be assessed. Information generated by students will may be incorporated into the City and County Water Plans and Capital Improvement Lists.
- 5. <u>Stormwater Re-use for Gardens</u> *Planning & Water Management*

This project will assess the health risks of using rain water captured from roofs on edible food; the potential surplus of vegetables grown in residential vegetable gardens for food shelf use; the total reduction in water volume, total phosphorus, and nitrogen leaving the residential site; and the ability of local food shelves to use fresh produce. Capturing and re-using rain water will help achieve EPA Approved Total Maximum Daily Load Reports and implements the CCWMO Water Plan.

- 6. Community Partners Grant Structure and Marketing Strategy Planning & Water Management The CCWMO was recently awarded a Community Partners Water Stewardship grant through the Board of Water and Soil Resources' Clean Water Fund program. This grant offers financial assistance to private and public community partners willing to engage in best management practice installations that improve water quality. Students would assist CCWMO by developing recommendations and strategies to best structure financial incentives and market the program in a way that is attractive to and inclusive of a broad audience of potential community partners.
- 7. Parcel Stormwater Runoff GIS Application Planning & Water Management

The CCWMO intends to develop a user-friendly web based educational mapping tool to help individuals connect with nearby water resources by understanding where stormwater runoff at the parcel level flows. Students would develop a GIS based application utilizing existing spatial and watershed data to create an interactive visualization of watersheds and sub-watersheds within the County.

8. Streets to Waters Display Planning & Water Management

Education is a key component of implementing the CCWMO Water Plan and City Local Water Plans, and the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems permits held by many cities in Carver County. Carver County would develop an interactive display that educates citizens about runoff pollution in areas where both storm drains and a local water resource are visible. This would be a permanent display for use in high traffic urban areas next to a water resource.

9. Environmental Action Plan for Difficult to Reach Constituents Environmental Services

Carver County Environmental Services operates and oversees programs such as feedlots, septic systems, and recycling, organics, and hazardous waste management. The programs have enjoyed success for recognized outcomes. However, a segment of constituents have not participated in these programs for a variety of reasons having to do with perceived value. This project will identify these constituent perceptions and recommend plans and ideas to increase their participation in the three County program areas: feedlots, septic systems and solid waste (recycling, organics and hazardous waste management).

10. Wellness Programs Administrative Services

Design and enhance a wellness activity that is specifically tailored to Carver County's employee population. Project would include reviewing overall health assessment and claims data to pinpoint a

specific health/wellness area to target and then design an effective activity/program that county employees can voluntary participate in.

11. Strategic Communication Action Plan Administrative Services

Develop goals, objectives, action steps and marketing templates to build upon our community outreach efforts including print, community events, video, website and social media.

Carver County Community Development Agency (CDA) led projects

12. County and City Housing Policy Review

The Carver County CDA is currently sponsoring a housing market study to understand demand across the housing spectrum, and update findings from a similar study conducted in 2007. To build on the results of this study, the County needs to understand how existing policies and codes at the County and City level impact market supply for senior housing, workforce housing, and homeless populations. This study would develop recommendations to the County and specific Cities that could improve the environment for builders seeking to develop housing for all County residents.

13. Housing Improvement Areas

The Carver County CDA intends to evaluate the feasibility of developing Housing Improvement Areas (HIA's) in Carver County. Numerous homeowner associations located throughout Carver County are short of required funding. Many of these associations are what can be described as "affordable housing" stock in Carver County. The needed funding that can be addressed by the establishment of HIA's include but are not limited to; street repair, siding, windows, decks, roofs, sidewalks, and trails. This project would examine existing HIA models, best practices, and evaluate and study selected existing projects for an applied case study.

14. Website Enhancements for Economic Development

The Carver County CDA intends to re-develop and re-invigorate its web site (www.carvercda.org). Specifically, enhancements to the Economic Development web areas/content would better align with industry standards, features, and improve integration with key partners such as Carver County, Greater MSP Economic Development, newly developed property listings and site selection databases, and the State of Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development.

15. Housing Rehabilitation/Development and Funding Needs

The Carver County CDA would like to study and evaluate existing funding programs offered through the state, federal, non-profit, and private sectors that are targeted at housing programs and initiatives. The CDA, and Carver County as a whole, are challenged by a lack of available housing programs to assist with housing rehabilitation, new housing development, affordable rental housing development, etc. Barriers of access to these programs seems to be existing Carver County incomes, a limited public transit system without direct connections to the light/commuter rail system, fewer connections to the urban core of Minneapolis and St. Paul, and cuts to federal and state budgets that support these programs.

City of Chanhassen led projects

16. Review and Evaluate the City's Bluff Creek Overlay District Ordinance

The Bluff Creek Watershed Natural Resources Management Plan was written in 1996 outlining a number of goals to help the City of Chanhassen balance protection of this natural resource with the economic development. One outcome of the plan was City Ordinance Number 286, which established a Bluff Creek Overlay District in 1998. Fifteen years after implementation, the City would like to evaluate the ordinance's effectiveness as a tool to protect important natural resources while

allowing for well-designed developments. Outcomes of this evaluation will inform implementation of the overlay district as land in the middle and lower reaches of Bluff Creek develops in the future.

City of Victoria led projects

17. Victoria Fire Department Staff Retention and Development

The City of Victoria currently has 24 paid per call volunteer firefighters. Significant development, illustrated by 95 new single family homes and 24 townhomes in 2013, combined with no increase or slight decreases in the number of firefighters in the past three years has resulted in added pressure to department volunteers. The City would like to review its staffing model and recruitment and retention methods for firefighters. Based on a thorough review, students would recommend the most effective and efficient staffing model and recruitment strategy.

18. Trail Wayfinding Signage Plan

The City of Victoria and adjacent communities have established a robust trail system that has connections to the Regional Trail system as well. Currently, the trail system lacks signage to indicate key destinations, amenities, and distances. As a result, the system works well for avid users, but is not encouraging to unfamiliar users. The Trail Wayfinding Signage Plan will identify policies for identifying sign needs as the system expands, sign locations on the existing system, and recommended sign designs for the City of Victoria's system. The Plan will also include estimated costs so the City can start including wayfinding signs in future budgets.

19. Eastern Carver County Eco-tourism Marketing Plan

Eastern Carver County has abundant natural resources and opportunities that appeal to both visitors and residents alike. Places like Carver Park Reserve, Lake Minnewashta, Lake Waconia, the University of Minnesota Landscape Arboretum and Apple House, and local businesses all attract people to both visit and live in Carver County. Students would recommend a marketing strategy to promote these community resources and provide an economic ancillary benefit when tourists shop and dine locally.

SouthWest Transit led projects

20. SouthWest Transit Bicycle Marketing Plan

A survey of SouthWest Transit ridership conducted in summer, 2013, revealed that time, lack of interest, distance, and weather are perceived barriers to bicycle commuting. Addressing barriers related to perception, in part, requires outreach and education to raise the profile of bicycling as a valid transportation option. This project would recommend best practices, and create materials to educate SouthWest Transit riders about bicycle connections at park and rides and promote opportunities to each the bus by bike.

21. Transit Market Study

Presently, SouthWest Transit serves many commuters to the urban core and reverse commuters who choose to use transit instead of driving, while SmartLink provides dial-a-ride service primarily to transit-dependent individuals. Consistent circulator service, service to cities west of Chaska and Chanhassen, and options to complete the last mile for reverse commuters are currently limited. This study would analyze existing transit service in Carver County and Eden Prairie to understand where the market supports increased service, what increased service could look like, and recommend options to take advantage of synergies between SouthWest Transit and SmartLink.

Cost Sharing

RCP receives some funding from the University of Minnesota's Center for Urban and Regional Affairs and Institute for the Environment, but asks for a local financial contribution from the partner community. RCP views this contribution as an indication of community commitment and the value attributed to the partnership. Local contributions assist with expenses incurred by students while implementing projects. In line with the collaborative nature of Carver County's application, all partners involved have committed to participating in financial support for this project. The following table outlines estimated contributions from each of the project partners.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

Bids for the City of Carver Park and Ride and CSAH 11/Ironwood Intersection Improvements - Projects SP 010-596-007 & SP 010-611-013, MINN. PROJ. NO. CMAQ 1013(158) were opened on Thursday, December 19, 2013. The project was bid using two bid packages. Both bid packages where opened on the same date and in the same location. The project includes Grading, Aggregate Base, Concrete Curb & Gutter, Bituminous Surfacing, Storm Sewer, Parking Lot, Trail, Irrigation System, Park and Ride Shelter, and Traffic Signal System on Carver CSAH 11 at the intersection of Ironwood Drive.

Bid amounts for Bid package 1 includes all items except for construction of the Park & Ride Shelter. Bid package 2 includes all items to construct the Park & Ride Shelter. (For additional information see attached bid abstract for Bid Package 1 and Bid Package 2.)

The Bid Package 1 low bidder is Minger Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$3,385,378.52. Two alternate bids were included as part of Bid Package 1. Alternate No. 1: Hartwell Drive Trail is in the amount of \$17,834.00 and Alternate No. 2: Irrigation System is in the amount of \$41,900.00. The city has decided to construct both alternates and include the costs in the award. The total bid amount for Bid Package 1 that includes Alternate 1 and Alternate 2 is in the amount of \$3,445,112.52.

The Bid Package 2 low bidder is Project One Construction in the amount of \$698,778.00. (No alternate bids are part of Bid Package 2.)

The Victoria Library budget for one-time costs is \$550,000 and \$275,000 for ongoing expenses. The funding sources will be determined through the 2015 budgetary process. 2015 CPA is an option to fund the one time costs and ongoing expenses could be funded by the new tax levy freed up from the expiring Chaska TIF District.

The LEO A DALY contract is for \$35,040 plus reimbursables up to \$3,750 - unallocated 2013 CPA will be used to fund this portion of the project.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

The County has been awarded a two year grant from the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, Office of Justice Programs to fund a small mental health unit in the Jail. The Board accepted this Grant on January 7, 2013 and the Grant Agreement, new positions and budget need to be approved to operationalize the grant. The grant is for \$299,930 from January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2015.

Due to the decline in the overall mental health system in the state, each year results in an increase in mentally challenged persons being jailed due to a lack of appropriate placement. Jails by default are housing persons with significant mental health issues. This grant aims to provide mental health services to the inmates in the jail. The program will at same time offer professional consultation to the Court's Veterans Diversion Court.

The jail mental health unit will be composed of a 0.5 FTE Psychologist, 0.5 Advance Practice Nurse, .25 FTE Social Worker II and a .25 Account Technician. The .25 FTE will be added to the current Jail Pre-release Coordinator and the Account Technician will handle the third party billing.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

An agreement has been reached with the City of Watertown to pursue the ownership of a tax forfeited property and purchase adjacent property located in the City of Watertown. The tax forfeited parcel is identified as Parcels A-1 and A-2 on attached Exhibit 1. The adjacent, privately-owned property is identified as Parcels B and C.

The tax forfeited parcel is 45 acres and is currently held in trust by Carver County on behalf of the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) as it has more than 150 feet of water frontage area and associated wetlands. The County is currently working with the City of Watertown to obtain special legislation necessary to acquire this parcel.

The adjacent property is roughly 35 acres and is owned by Vern and Elaine Rosckes. The City has reached a three-year option agreement with the Rosckes to purchase that property for \$200,000.

This Board action requests approval of a Memorandum of Understanding that meets the interest of both jurisdictions including the following.

- The County's ownership of Parcels A-2, B and C for future wetland development and related wetland credit creation.
- The City's ownership of Parcel A-1 for a possible future public works facility site and the County's interest in potentially locating a joint public worksfacility on that site.
- The City's interest in acquiring the County's existing public work's shop (see attached Exhibit 2).

Additional details on this agreement will be presented during the Board meeting.

- 1. Motion to approve Memo of Understanding with City of Watertown concerning Parcel # 85.0092900 contingent upon final review by the County Attorney and Risk Management offices.
- 2. Motion to approve a debt service reserve transfer of \$316K from the 2004A bonds that have been fully retired to the Watertown tax forfeited conservation land project.
- 3. Motion to approve attached resolution supporting special legislation for the conveyance of tax forfeited conservation land in the City of Watertown.

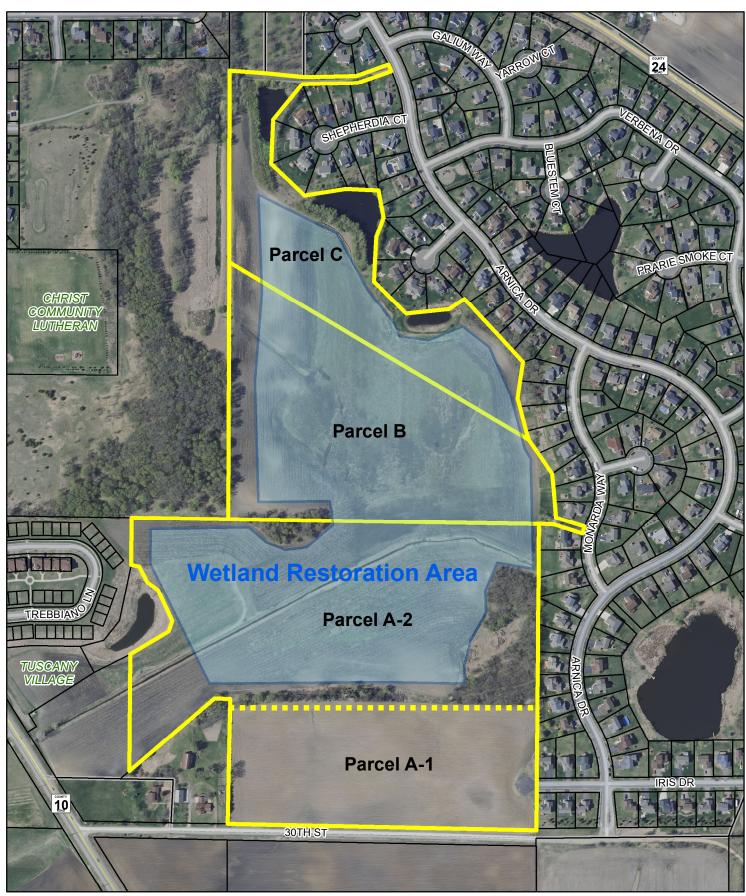
The above funding covers the initial stage of this project including the acquisition of the Roscke's property and the development stages of the wetland. The purchase price of the Roscke's property is \$200,000 with the City share at \$25,000 and the County covering \$175,000 plus closing costs estimated at \$10,000. The final budget for the overall project is estimated at \$400,000 with a \$59,000 gap that will be filled through the 2015 and/or 2016 budget process.

Due to the value of wetland credits, the ultimate net value anticipated for the County including land purchase, wetland creation, existing public works site sale is estimated to be at least \$342,000. Additional financial details will be presented during the Board meeting.

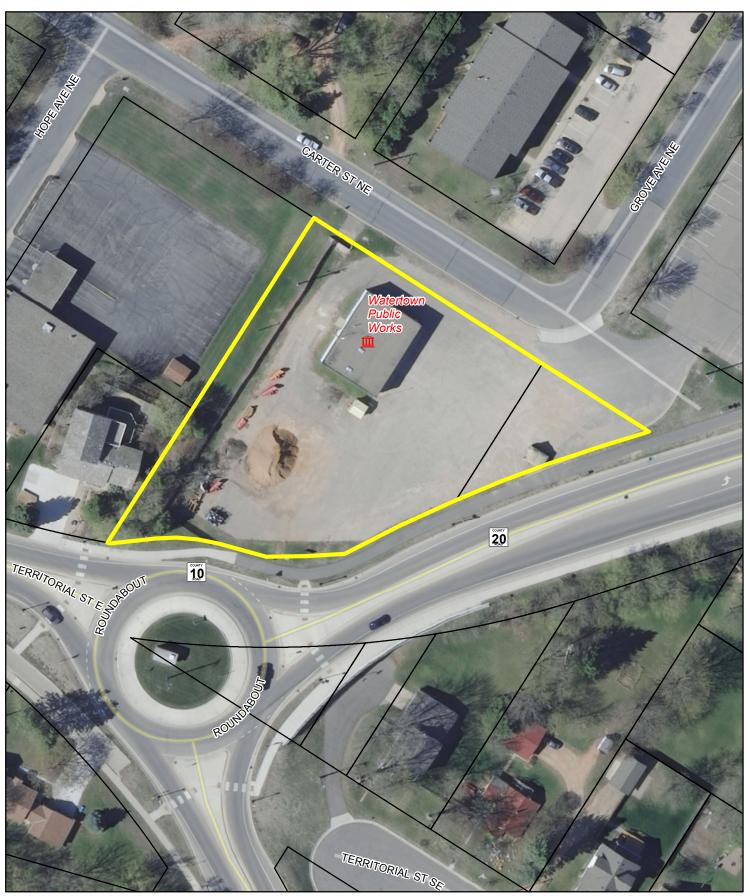
