Local Agency Revolving Loan Fund

SECTION: Accounting and Finance EFFECTIVE: XX/XX/XXXX

AUTHORITY: Motion on XX/XX/XXXX REVISED:

Purpose

To assist cities and townships finance their cost share of county transportation and parks and trails projects.

Policy

The County may provide loans to cities and townships to fund their cost share of cooperative Carver County transportation and trail projects using the following guidelines:

Revolving Loan Fund Structure-

The Local Agency Revolving Loan (LARL) fund will use County transportation or County fund balance to create the initial balance available. The total LARL fund will be capped at five million dollars (\$5M), unless adjusted by a Carver County Board resolution. The maximum LARL amount per agency shall not exceed two million dollars (\$2M), this is aggregate, not per project. The minimum LARL amount per agency shall not be less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), this is per project. Once the LARL fund has reached \$5M, no new loans will be approved until the fund has at least \$100,000 available again for spenddown. The County reserves the right to suspend the LARL fund at any time. The LARL fund will be updated on a monthly basis and made available upon request.

Eligibility and Preference-

Loans will only be made to cities and townships on their cost share of county transportation and parks and trails projects, the loan requests will be considered on a case by case basis. Costs to construct city utilities are not eligible for a loan. Loans will need to be recommended by the Public Works Director with final approval from the County Board. Applicants will need to justify why the loan is needed.

If more than one request is received at any given time the County will determine the amount available to each applicant. In general agencies who have not already received a loan will get preference.

Local Agency Revolving Loan Agreement-

The term of the LARL will be five (5) years. A ten (10) year loan will be considered with justification and County Board approval. Interest rates will be reset annually on January 1st and will be equal to the average of the two (2) year Treasury rate for the last two year ends. Refinancing of the debt will not be considered and early repayment will be allowed under conditions laid out in the loan agreement. The County will not charge loan origination fees or closing costs. Agencies will be required to enter into a loan agreement, approved by both parties, which will define terms and payback requirements in more detail.

State Statute requires that the preliminary Carver County Watershed Management Organization (CCWMO) levy request be certified by the CCWMO authority, which is the County Board. The levy request is for the special taxing district making up the CCWMO. The levy consists of funds for projects plus general operating expenses. In May of 2020, the CCWMO Advisory Committee recommended a levy amount along with a list of funded projects for 2021. Since that time, a budget hearing was held where staff presented the 2021 budget and levy request to the County Administrator and attending commissioners. Staff will review the recommended levy, the recommended projects, and the tax impact with the Board. On September 15th, the County Board will be asked to adopt a 2021 preliminary property tax levy for the CCWMO. The final property tax levy, adopted in December, can be lower than the preliminary levy but not higher. ACTION REQUESTED: Board guidance.
