Approved the Memorandum of Agreement with AFSCME Council No. 65 representing the Public Works Bargaining Unit outlining the agreement regarding the changes in job classifications and corresponding salary adjustments for incumbents in the job classifications of design engineer and senior engineering technician.

Reviewed April 29, 2014, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$329,637.29; reviewed May 6, 2014, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$560,148.41 and reviewed May 13, 2014, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$257,854.57.

Motion carried unanimously.

Jackie Hamre, Employee Relations, requested the Board recognize the recipients of this year's PEER awards. She noted there were fourteen nominees for the awards and competition was tough this year.

The Board recognized and congratulated the Watertown Library Remodel Team for receiving the Teamwork Award, Sam Pertz for receiving the Innovation Award and Sue Orvik for receiving the Customer Service award.

Don Heywood, Community Social Services, requested the Board approve various staffing revisions. He pointed out the mental health needs in the jail and funding received through grants. Heywood identified the proposed positions to be eliminated and created and indicated an agreement was reached with the Sheriff to fund a .25 FTE.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to delete the 1.0 FTE Social Worker II (Jail Pre-Release Coordinator/Truancy) position effective April 3, 2014; to delete the .25 FTE Social Worker II (Department of Justice Grant); to create a 1.0 FTE Jail Pre-Release Coordinator position effective April 3, 2014, to create a 0.5 FTE Social Worker II (Truancy) position effective April 3, 2014 and to approve related budget amendment transferring funds from the Sheriff's Division to Community Social Services. Motion carried unanimously

Nick Koktavy, Administrative Services, requested the Board approve the Chaska License Center drive thru project.

He explained the property owner at 407 Pine Street in Chaska approached the City earlier this year to determine if the City was interested in purchasing the property. Koktavy identified the location of the property and indicated the City contacted the County to determine if there was an opportunity to partner on the purchase.

He explained the proposal to demo the house and clear the site in 2014 and expand the parking lot and adding a drive thru window to the License Center in 2015. He stated the City did approach the property owners to the South and they did not have any issues with the project moving forward. He stated benefits included additional parking and allowing for a customer friendly drive thru service. He highlighted the utilization rates at the Chaska and Chanhassen License Center sites.

Koktavy explained the agreement reached with the City of Chaska on the acquisition costs and parking lot construction. He stated funding sources included the Commissioner's contingency, unallocated CPA funds and unspent CIP funds. He stated additional staff would probably be needed and that budget request would be made in the future.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to approve the Chaska Service Center drive-thru project including the project budget, the purchase of 407 Pine Street North in Chaska, to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Chaska and Carver County for the cost share on the project pending review by County Attorney/Risk, to delegate signature authority for the purchase agreement, closing documents and memorandum to the County Administrator and related budget amendments. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board considered an appointment to fill the remaining vacancy on the Water, Environmental and Natural Resources Committee.

Degler moved, Maluchnik seconded, to appoint John Siegfried to a three year term on the Water, Environment and Natural Resources Committee. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to recess as the County Board and convene as the Carver County Ditch Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Lundgren, Taxpayer Services, requested the Ditch Board authorize staff to move forward with an acquisition of an easement vs replacing a bridge on County Ditch 6. He stated the bridge was in disrepair and the cost to replace would exceed \$160,000. He noted purchasing an easement was an option and would save the County Ditch a significant amount of money.

Mike Wanous, Soil and Water, identified the location and stated the bridge was beyond repair. He pointed out drainage law that allows the drainage authority to purchase an easement to provide access for the landowner vs replacing the bridge. He indicated total cost to remove the bridge and acquiring an access easement from the adjacent landowner was estimated to be less than \$14,000.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to direct staff to move forward with the easement from the adjacent landowner and remove the existing bridge with the cost of the project to be paid from the County Ditch #6 fund. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn as the Ditch Board and reconvene as the County Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Board award the construction contract for the Southwest Reconnection project.

He identified the location of the project and explained the need for the project. Robjent highlighted the project development beginning with the 2011 flood study and subsequent funding sources that became available. He indicated the archaeology digging was wrapping up and reviewed the selected design for the project. Robjent pointed out the amount of material going into the bridge and project.

Robjent stated four bids were received, with Ames Construction submitting the lowest bid. He reviewed the alternates he was recommending they accept. He explained construction funding sources and project budget. He indicated an open house would be held May 22nd and they were encouraging the public to attend. He pointed out the five construction phases and planned detour routes. He noted construction would start late June and end Fall of 2015.

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to adopt Resolution #28-14, Awarding of the Southwest Reconnection Project, Carver County Contract 14-402, to Ames Construction, Inc., of Burnsville, Minnesota and to accept Alternates 1 and 2 for a total award amount of \$49,273,580.35 and further authorize the County Engineer to approve change orders and supplemental agreements up to \$100,000.00. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to enter into a closed session at 10:50 a.m. according to Minnesota Statue 13D.05 in order to review confidential appraisal data for the purchase of real property within PID #09.0030300. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned the closed session and Regular Session at 11:20 a.m.

The 2013 Federal Overlay Project (SP 010-633-039, SP 010-651-010 [Minn. Proj. No. STPM 1013 (274)] - CSAH 33 and CSAH 51 included Milling, Overlaying & Paving aggregate shoulders on CSAH 33 from 1.263 miles north of Norwood Young America to S. City Limits of New Germany and Overlaying & Paving aggregate shoulders on CSAH 51 from CSAH 50 (East Leg) to 3.125 miles north (south side of railroad in Bongards).

The original project contract amount was \$2,186,750.68. The engineers estimate was \$2,550,339.82. The total of all work completed by Wm. Mueller & Sons is \$2,193,674.60 and is being completed at 0.32% above the original contract amount mainly due to additional paving needed to better transition from the south side of the existing intersection at CSAH 50 and CSAH 51.

Wm. Mueller & Sons has requested all retainage be released and the contract between them and Carver County be closed. Staff has reviewed the work done for this project and sees it as complete and is recommending finalizing it. (Signed final payment voucher from the contractor is attached.)

Also, this is a Race Gender Neutral project, so Mn/DOT's Civil Rights office did review the project for EEO and DBE provision compliance. The Mn/DOT Office of Civil Rights and Carver County have declared that Wm. Mueller & Sons has met the project requirements and goals, which allows the county to proceed with finalizing the contract.

Final payment for this contract consists of releasing the 5% retainage in the amount of \$109,683.73. Board Action is needed to release all retainage and finalize the contract.

CURB MULCH DETAIL





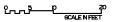

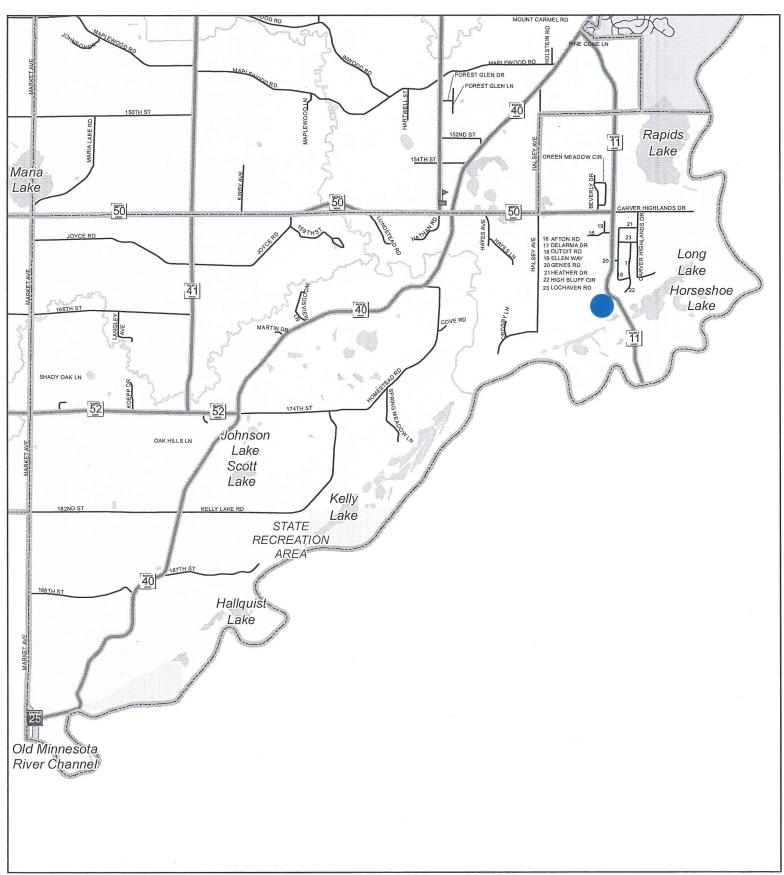

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

Carver County Library is requesting approval of the budget/funding and construction agreement for the Victoria Library project. The project is a joint partnership between the City of Victoria and Carver County where the City provides the facility and the County provides the contents and operations of the library. The City plans to construct a joint City Hall & Library facility in 2014. The Library will consist of approximately 4,000 sqft on the first floor of the new facility to be built at 1670 Stieger Lake Lane in Victoria.

Construction Agreement:

The construction agreement is between Carver County and the City of Victoria. This agreement specifically outlines who is responsible for each item in the construction of the library branch. The terms of this agreement is in line with past library projects. In summary:

- City of Victoria provides: exterior walls, sheet-rocked and painted interior walls, carpet, ceiling, ceiling fixtures
 including lights, building code items, casework that is secured to the wall or floor, utilities, electrical, etc.
- Carver County provides: furniture, equipment, shelving, computers, printers, data cabling, low voltage cabling, way
 finding signs, etc.

Project Budget:

The project budget to provide the items that Carver County would be responsible for under the construction agreement is \$550,000. This includes the following budget categories:

Furniture: \$174,000Technology: \$157,000

Collection/Materials: \$219,000

Contract awards over \$25,000 will be brought to the County Board at a later date.

In addition to the one-time costs to build the library, \$326,000 in operating costs (including staffing) is being requested in the 2015 budget.

The County and City will also negotiate a Joint Powers Agreement for the ongoing operations of the library.

Related Financial/FTE Comments:

In 2013 and 2014, \$425K (\$850K total) was set aside for future debt service on the Southwest Reconnection Project. The first debt service payment is not until 2015 so these funds are available to fund other one-time projects. The recommendation is to reallocate \$550,000 of these funds for the Victoria Library. The remaining \$300,000 will be requested in 2014 by Public Works for a new Tandem Truck that is being added to the fleet due to the turnback of roads from the Southwest Reconnection Project.

The new library branch will require additional staffing for the library. This additional staffing is included in the library's 2015 budget request.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

Carver County's Finance Director is recommending the County transition to elnvoicing where vendors electronically submit an invoice to the County directly from the vendors billing software rather than mailing a paper invoice. The advantages for Carver County are:

- significantly reduce accounts payable processing time
- ability for vendors to track the status of their invoice which is expected to reduce the number of inquiries to county staff
- ability for County Board members to click to see an invoice image from your computer as you are reviewing the list of bills

Carver County's Finance Director received proposals from three vendors and after conducting four rounds of interviews is recommending RtVision as the elnvoice software vendor for the following reasons:

- Proven business model that creates the opportunity for multiple counties to share elnvoice software development costs, maintenance and upgrades.
- Proven customer service and software development experience with Carver County: The County currently has RtVision's
 One Office, eTimePlus and eTimeBasic software programs. County finance staff helped design eTimeBasic which RtVision has subsequently sold to over 20 MN counties.
- Potential to create a clearinghouse for multiple counties to receive electronic invoices using RtVision's portal that is currently being used by over 50 counties for construction bidding.

RtVision submitted a proposal for \$66,200 split up into three phases:

Phase I: Proof of Concepts \$30,000

- First 5 critical components (\$6K each) relating to receiving and processing elnvoices and interfaces with other county programs.
- County can cancel agreement if any component is not acceptable by our standards. The County would be responsible
 for fees for services provided up to canceling.

Phase II: Approval Workflow \$35,000

- Software will be rolled out division by division and payments will be made as follows:
- o 40% after software is operating in one division
- o 40% after software is accepted by one division
- o 10% after software is accepted by a second division
- o 10% after software is operating in all divisions

Phase III: Training \$1,200

Carver County has the potential to earn up to \$50,000 in Development Credits from RtVision for being the elnvoice development partner. The County will earn a \$3,000 credit for each of the first 10 counties (\$30K total) who purchase elnvoice and a bonus credit, if 10 counties purchase elnvoice withing three years, to be used on elnvoice software enhancements of \$1K for each of the next 20 (11-30) (\$20K total).

The County shall sell up to \$10,000,000 in principal amount of General Obligation Capital Improvement Plan Bonds (the "Bonds") on June 3, 2014, or such later date as the County Administrator may determine, and the County officers and Ehlers and Associates, Inc., as financial consultants, shall take such action as may be necessary for this Board to consider proposals for the purchase of the Bonds.
- 3. The Board of Commissioners declares that it intends for the County to undertake the Plan with available funds and to obtain reimbursement for such expenditures out of the proceeds of the Bonds. This declaration is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to Treas. Reg. § 1.150-2. Reimbursement allocations made under the provisions of this resolution shall be made within 18 months of the date hereof and shall not exceed \$10,000,000 in aggregate principal amount. 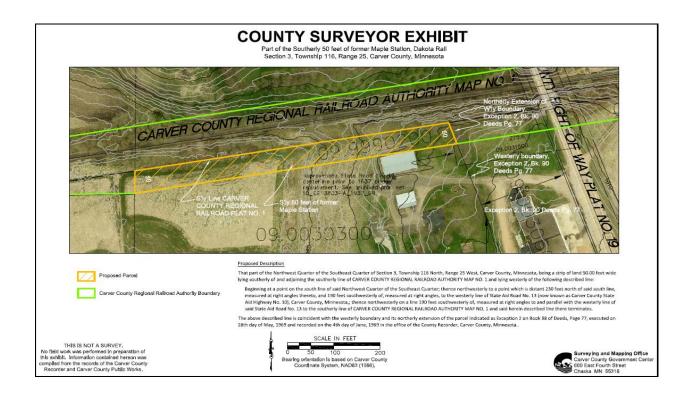
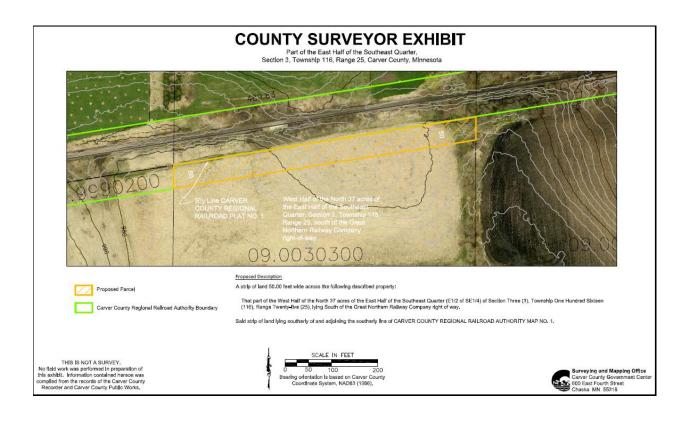
