A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on September 16, 2014. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 4:00 p.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, Randy Maluchnik, Vice Chair, James Ische, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the September 2, 2014, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved application for a one day to four day temporary on sale liquor license for St. Peter Lutheran Church, Watertown.

Approved application for renewal of the on-sale and Sunday liquor license for WJVA, Inc., d/b/a Timber Creek Golf Course.

Approved the donation of one SMART Board and one SMART tabletop sympodium to the Eastern Carver County School District.

Approved joint powers agreement with Hollywood Township for replacement of Bridge No. L2811 pending finalization of the contract review process.

Two year service agreement with Carver County Townships and Cities, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Authorized the Chair to sign and submit the County comments on the Metropolitan Council's Draft Housing Policy Plan.

Authorized the Chair to sign and submit the comment letter regarding the 2020-2030 Metropolitan Council forecasts.

Approved the 2014 rates chart for seasonal, temporary and on call positions, including authorization for the Employee Relations Division to adjust seasonal, temporary and on-call positions' minimum wage rates as needed to maintain ranges in compliance, corresponding with applicable Federal and State minimum wage requirements.

Reviewed September 9, 2014, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$259,118.14 and reviewed September 16, 2014, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$307,899.93.

Motion carried unanimously.

Keri Anderka, Employee Relations, requested the Board approve a modification of one vacancy position. She updated the Board on the Division's organizational structure and explained the new job classification she was requesting and job responsibilities.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve elimination of one FTE vacant ER Business Partner position at grade 15 and establish one FTE Employee Relations Coordinator position at grade 14. Motion carried unanimously.

Dave Hemze, County Administrator, requested the Board set the 2015 preliminary budget and levy. He pointed out the work that had been done on the budget over the last several months and stated the amount adopted today can be decreased but not increased. He indicated the tax impact they are recommending is a zero increase to the average valued home. Hemze pointed out the significant overall budget decrease related to the 101 bridge project and the 2.3 million levy increase was coming from new tax base.

He highlighted the services provided by the County and the new library in the City of Victoria. Hemze identified the dollars spent on various services.

Kerie Anderka, Employee Relations, explained proposed 2015 staffing changes she was recommending to respond to increased demands for services. She outlined the addition of 13.65 positions and clarified the funding sources. Anderka pointed out the total FTE and stated the number of employees per capita has been gradually decreasing each year since 2008.

Dave Frischmon, Finance, summarized 2015 capital projects. He stated adjustments were made to various line items throughout the budget and a policy change was made in terms of vacancy savings. He outlined State CPA received over the past several years and the County's reduced reliance on State aid. Frischmon pointed out the new tax base that was captured and property value increases. He indicated it would be difficult to maintain services if they were not able to capture this new tax base.

He summarized the tax impact to residential homes, commercial and agricultural properties. Frischmon noted he would be coming back with the long term financial plan and would be looking at roads, bridge, buildings, trials and operations.

Frischmon reviewed the 2015 budget schedule. He pointed out the public hearing that would be held on the budget December 4th, at 6:00 p.m. and the plan to adopt the final budget on December 16th.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the 2015 Administrators recommended \$94,396,850 preliminary total budget and \$49,861,920 preliminary tax levy. Degler, Ische, Maluchnik voted aye. Lynch, Workman voted nay. Motion carried.

Martin Walsh, Parks, requested the Board award the bid for the Lake Minnewashta Regional park road and parking lot improvement project. He noted the one mile gravel roadway and the service complaints received.

He explained project scoping work was done and highlighted the improvements they were recommending. He stated a bypass lane at the entrance would make it more efficient and boat access would be provided at one location. Walsh indicated some trees would be lost and closures and delays could be expected.

Walsh outlined the project budget and alternates. He stated work would be done during off peak periods and highlighted project benefits.

Workman moved, Maluchnik seconded, to award the contract to the low bidder, Park Construction Company, for \$1,286,671.35 for the Lake Minnewashta Regional Park improvement project. Motion carried unanimously.

Dave Hemze, County Administrator, requested the Board approve a lobbying services agreement. He pointed out the County's legislative needs and the efforts needed to move issues through the legislative process. Hemze noted the research he did and the discussions he had with Scott County that lead him to reach an agreement Scott County regarding their lobbyist. He pointed out Ms. Robling had legislative experience and served in the senate for a number of years.

He outlined the work to be performed and the contract amount. He stated he was projecting 100 hours as a starting point. Hemze explained he was also proposing to create an internal legislative committee that would include two Board members.

Lynch moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve lobbying services agreement with Scott County. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Workman seconded, to create a legislative committee that includes two County Commissioners and County Administrator and to direct the County Administrator to determine meeting times and time commitment. Motion carried unanimously.

Hemze requested the Board adopt a Resolution to provide input on the Met Council's draft 2040 Transportation Policy Plan. He noted the focus on the Thrive MSP 2040 plan and the concerns that were raised with the direction of that document and in particular the Transportation Policy Plan.

He stated the Transportation Policy Plan was a very significant document that attaches to County funding and it has become evident that the suburban counties were not getting their fair share. Hemze explained the counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Scott and Washington got together to talk

about their concerns and recommended solution. He noted elected representatives from each County were part of the discussion and the end document outlines what the concerns are in the TPP document. He pointed out the joint meeting to be held on September 29th between the County Boards and the Met Council and indicated each County would vote separately and independently on the Resolution.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, explained meetings were held with transportation staff. He indicated the key issues for the five suburban counties were the TPP process, content and regional solicitation. He highlighted the concerns and recommended solutions.

Hemze stated a packet would be put together that included all Resolutions that are adopted by the Counties. He noted the draft letter sent to the Met Council is tailored for additional Carver County input.

Maluchnik offered the following Resolution, seconded by Ische:

Response to the Metropolitan Council's Proposed Transportation Policy Plan

and to authorize the Chair to sign the letter to the Chair of the Metropolitan Council.

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 5:50 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.

A Resolution Authorizing and Directing Condemnation of Easements Required for the CSAH 10 (between CSAH 30 and Trunk Highway 7) Reconstruction Project

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carver County is the official governing body of Carver County ("County"); and

WHEREAS, the County, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, is authorized by law to acquire land and other interests in real estate which are needed for public use or purpose; and

WHEREAS, Carver County wishes to construct roadway and related improvements as part of the County State Aid Highway ("CSAH") 10 (between CSAH 30 and Trunk Highway 7) Reconstruction Project ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2014, by its Resolution No. 51-14, the Board of Commissioners approved Carver County Right of Way Plat No. 22 (County State Aid Highway No. 10) to identify right of way required by the County to construct the Project; and

WHEREAS, based upon appraisals prepared by independent real estate appraisers, and in accordance with authorization of the Board of Commissioners, agents of the County have previously made offers of compensation to owners of property affected by the Project for the easements required for the Project, but, despite good faith efforts, have been unable to reach agreement with the owners of properties which are legally described in Exhibit A attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners finds that it is reasonably necessary, proper, and convenient, and in the interest of the public health, convenience, and general welfare of the citizens of the County that title to and possession of the easements hereinafter described be acquired through use of the power of eminent domain in furtherance of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners finds that the funding and construction schedule for the Project make it necessary to acquire title to and possession of the easements hereinafter described prior to the filing of the final report of the condemnation commissioners to be appointed by the district court.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF CARVER IN REGULAR MEETING ASSEMBLED, that it is the considered judgment of the Board of Commissioners that the easements described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof as though fully set forth at this point, be acquired for the stated public purposes, and that the interests be acquired, if necessary, through the exercise of the power of eminent domain.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Attorney and legal counsel retained by the County are authorized and directed to take all steps necessary to acquire the easements described herein by filing an action in eminent domain, negotiation of early entry authorization, and the use of the quick-take procedure.

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF THE MINNESOTA PUBLIC FACILITIES AUTHORITY TO PURCHASE AN \$18,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT NOTE OF 2014, PROVIDING FOR ITS ISSUANCE, AND APPROVING EXECUTION OF A PROJECT LOAN AGREEMENT

- A. WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carver County, Minnesota (the "County"), has heretofore applied for a loan from the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority (the "PFA") to provide financing pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475 and Section 373.40, for the purpose of financing eligible project costs of the Transportation Revolving Loan Fund project described as follows: road and bridge improvements—Southwest Reconnection Project as detailed in the Minnesota Department of Transportation project certification dated July 23, 2014 (the "Project"); and
- B. WHEREAS, the Project is further described in the County's Road and Bridge Capital Improvement Plan adopted March 4, 2014, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 373.40; and
- C. WHEREAS, the PFA is authorized pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 446A, as amended, to provide loans to municipalities to fund eligible costs of construction of certain public transportation projects; and
- D. WHEREAS, the County has applied for a loan from the PFA pursuant to such program, and the PFA has committed to make a loan to the County in the principal amount of \$18,000,000, to be disbursed and repaid in accordance with the terms of a Bond Purchase and Project Loan Agreement, MPFA-14-0048-R-FY15 (the "Project Loan Agreement") to be entered into by the PFA and County, a copy of which is before this meeting and on file with the County Administrator; and the Project Loan Agreement, as executed, is incorporated herein by reference; and
- E. WHEREAS, interest on the \$18,000,000 General Obligation Capital Improvement Note of 2014 (the "Note") of the County is not tax-exempt, but the County will need to assure that it will not affect the tax exemption of any PFA Bonds; and
- F. WHEREAS, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.60, Subdivision 2(4), the County is authorized to issue obligations to a board, department or agency of the State of Minnesota by negotiation and without advertisement for bids and the PFA is, and has represented that it is, a board, department or agency of the State of Minnesota; and
- G. WHEREAS, a contract or contracts for the project have been made by the County with the approval of the PFA and all other state and federal agencies of which approval is required:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Carver County, Minnesota, as follows:

1. <u>Acceptance of Offer; Payment</u>. The offer of the PFA to purchase an \$18,000,000 General Obligation Capital Improvement Note of 2014 of the County (the "Note"), bearing interest at the rate of 1.00% per annum, and to pay therefor the sum of \$18,000,000 as provided below, is hereby

accepted, and the sale of the Note is hereby awarded to the PFA. Payment for the Note shall be disbursed in installments as eligible costs of the Project are reimbursed, all as provided in the Project Loan Agreement.

2. <u>Title</u>; <u>Date</u>; <u>Denomination</u>; <u>Interest Rates</u>; <u>Maturities</u>. The Note shall be a fully registered negotiable obligation, shall be titled the "General Obligation Capital Improvement Note of 2014," shall be dated as of the date of delivery and shall be issued forthwith. The Note shall be in the principal amount of \$18,000,000, or so much thereof as shall be disbursed pursuant to the Project Loan Agreement, shall bear interest on so much of the principal amount of the Notes as (i) may be disbursed from time to time as provided in the Project Loan Agreement and (ii) remains unpaid, from the date of each disbursement until the principal amount of the Note has been paid or has been provided for, at the rate of one percent (1.000%) per annum (calculated on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months), payable semiannually on each February 20 and August 20, commencing August 20, 2015, and shall mature on August 20 in each of the years and in the installments as follows:

Interest shall accrue only on the aggregate amount of the Note which has been disbursed and is unpaid under the Project Loan Agreement. The principal installments shall be paid in the amounts scheduled above even if at the time of payment the full principal amount of the Note has not been disbursed; provided that if the full principal amount of the Note is not to be disbursed under the Project Loan Agreement, the amount of the principal not disbursed shall be applied to reduce the unpaid principal installments and the remaining principal payment schedule shall be reamortized as provided in Sections 2.2(f) and 1.3 of the Project Loan Agreement. Principal, interest and any premium due under the Note will be paid on each payment date by wire payment, or by check or draft mailed the last business day prior to the payment date to the person in whose name the Note is registered, in any coin or currency of the United States which at the time of payment is legal tender for public and private debts.

Interest on the Note includes amounts treated by the PFA as service fees.

- 3. <u>Purpose; Cost.</u> The proceeds of the Note shall provide funds to finance construction of the Project. The Note is issued pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 373.40. The total cost of the construction of the Project, including legal and other professional charges, publication and printing costs, interest accruing on money borrowed for the Project before the collection of tax revenues pledged and appropriated therefor, and all other costs necessarily incurred and to be incurred from the inception to the completion of the Project, is estimated to be at least equal to the amount of the Note. The County covenants that it shall do all things and perform all acts required of it to assure that work on the Project proceeds with due diligence to completion and that any and all permits and studies required under law for the Project are obtained.
- 4. <u>Redemption</u>. The Note shall be subject to redemption and prepayment in whole or in part at the option of the County to the extent and in the manner provided in the Project Loan Agreement. If redemption is in part, each installment of principal shall be prepaid in the proportion that such installment bears to the total of all unpaid principal installments (i.e., the remaining principal payment

schedule shall be reamortized to provide proportionately reduced principal payments), unless the County and the holder of the Note agree to a different result.

- 5. Registration of Note. At the time of issuance and delivery of the Note, the County Administrator shall register the Note in the name of the payee in a note register which he and his successors in office shall maintain for the purpose of registering the ownership of the Note. The Note shall be prepared for execution with an appropriate text and spaces for notation of registration. The force and effect of such registration shall be as stated in the form of Note hereinafter set forth. Payment of principal installments and interest, whether upon redemption or otherwise, made with respect to the Note, may be made to the registered holder thereof or to his, her or its legal representative, without presentation or surrender of the Note except upon its final payment.
- 6. <u>Form of Note</u>. The Note, together with the Certificate of Registration thereon, shall be in substantially the following form:

<u>Principal and Interest Payments</u>. Interest shall accrue only on the aggregate amount of this Note which has been disbursed under the Bond Purchase and Project Loan Agreement, by and between the County and the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority (the "Project Loan Agreement"). The principal installments shall be paid in the amounts scheduled above even if at the time of payment the full principal amount of the Note has not been disbursed; provided that if the full principal amount of the Note is not to be disbursed, under the Project Loan Agreement the amount of the principal not disbursed shall be applied to reduce the unpaid principal installments and the remaining principal payment schedule shall be reamortized as provided in Sections 2.2(f) and 1.3 of the Project Loan Agreement. Interest on this Note includes amounts treated by the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority as service

<u>Purpose</u>; General Obligation. This Note has been issued pursuant to and in full conformity with the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota for the purpose of providing money to finance the construction of transportation improvements of the County, and is payable out of the PFA Debt Service Account of the Capital Improvement Fund of the County, to which account have been pledged the taxes levied or to be levied in connection with the Note. This Note has been issued pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 373.40. This Note constitutes a general obligation of the County, and to provide moneys for the prompt and full payment of said principal installments and interest when the same become due, the full faith, credit and taxing powers of the County have been and are hereby irrevocably pledged.

Registration; Transfer. This Note shall be registered in the name of the payee on the books of the County by presenting this Note for registration to the County Administrator, who will endorse his or her name and note the date of registration opposite the name of the payee in the certificate of registration attached hereto. Thereafter this Note may be transferred to a bona fide purchaser only by delivery with an assignment duly executed by the registered owner or his, her or its legal representative, and the County may treat the registered owner as the person exclusively entitled to exercise all the rights and powers of an owner until this Note is presented with such assignment for registration of transfer, accompanied by assurance of the nature provided by law that the assignment is genuine and effective, and until such transfer is registered on said books and noted hereon by the County Administrator.

<u>Fees Upon Transfer or Loss</u>. The County Administrator may require payment of a sum sufficient to cover any tax or other governmental charge payable in connection with the transfer of this Note and any legal or unusual costs regarding transfers and lost notes.

<u>Project Loan Agreement</u>. The terms and conditions of the Project Loan Agreement are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof. The Project Loan Agreement may be attached to this Note, and shall be attached to this Note if the holder of this Note is any person other than the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority.

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED AND RECITED that all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota to be done, to happen and to be performed, precedent to and in the issuance of this Note, have been done, have happened and have been performed, in regular and due form, time and manner as required by law; that the County will levy a direct, annual, irrepealable ad valorem tax upon all of the taxable property in the County, without limitation as to rate or amount, for the years and in amounts sufficient to pay the installments of principal and interest on this Note as they respectively become due; and that this Note, together with all other debts of the County outstanding on the date hereof, being the date of its actual issuance and delivery, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory or charter limitation of indebtedness.

- 7. <u>Execution</u>. The Note shall be executed on behalf of the County by the signature of its Chair, and by the signature and attestation of its County Administrator. In the event of disability or resignation or other absence of either such officer, the Note may be signed by the manual signature of that officer who may act on behalf of such absent or disabled officer. In case either such officer whose signature shall appear on the Note shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of the Note, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if he or she had remained in office until delivery.
- 8. <u>Delivery; Application of Proceeds</u>. The Note when so prepared and executed shall be delivered by the County Administrator to the purchaser thereof prior to disbursements pursuant to the Project Loan Agreement, and the purchaser shall not be obliged to see to the proper application thereof.
- 9. Fund and Accounts. There is hereby created a special fund designated the "Capital Improvement Fund" (the "Fund") to be administered and maintained by the County Administrator as a bookkeeping account separate and apart from all other funds maintained in the official financial records of the County. The Fund shall be maintained in the manner specified herein until the Note, and interest thereon, have been fully paid. There shall be established and maintained in the Fund, in addition to other accounts heretofore or hereafter established, the following two (2) separate accounts, to which shall be credited and debited all income and disbursements of the Fund relating to the Note as hereinafter set forth. The County Administrator and all County officials and employees concerned therewith shall establish and maintain financial records of the receipts and disbursements relating to the Project and the Note in accordance with this resolution. In such records there shall be established and maintained accounts of the Fund for the purposes and in the amounts as follows:
 - a. A "<u>PFA Construction Account</u>," to which shall be credited all proceeds received from the sale of the Note. The Note shall be the only source of moneys credited to the PFA Construction Account. It is recognized that the sale proceeds of the Note are received in reimbursement for costs expended on the Project, and that accordingly the moneys need not be placed in the PFA Construction Account upon receipt but may be applied immediately to reimburse the source from which the expenditure was made. The moneys in the PFA

Construction Account shall be used solely for the purpose of paying for the cost of constructing the Project, including all costs enumerated in Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.65, provided that such moneys shall only be expended for costs and expenses which are permitted under the Project Loan Agreement. The PFA prohibits the use of proceeds of the Note to reimburse costs initially paid from proceeds of other obligations of the County. Upon completion of the Project and the payment of the costs thereof, any surplus shall be transferred to the PFA Debt Service Account.

b. A "PFA Debt Service Account," to which shall be irrevocably appropriated, pledged and credited: (1) all collections of taxes hereby levied or which may hereafter be levied for the payment of the principal of, and interest on, the Note; (2) receipts of the proceeds of a reimbursement grant provided through the state independent grant program; (3) all investment earnings on moneys held in the PFA Debt Service Account; (4) any amounts transferred from the PFA Construction Account; and (5) any other moneys which are properly available and are appropriated by the Board of Commissioners to the PFA Debt Service Account. The moneys in said account shall be used only to pay or prepay the principal of, and interest on, the Note and any other general obligation bonds hereafter issued and made payable from said account, and to pay any rebate due to the United States with respect to the PFA Bonds in connection with the Note.

Said levy shall be irrepealable and the taxes so levied are irrevocably appropriated to the PFA Debt Service Account, but the County reserves the right, to the extent permitted by the Project Loan Agreement, to reduce said levy from funds in the PFA Construction Account or other moneys in the manner and to the extent permitted by Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.61.

The County shall observe the covenants of paragraph 14 of this resolution and of section 3.1 of the Project Loan Agreement with regard to the Fund and the Project.

10. <u>General Obligation Pledge; Tax Levy</u>. The Board of Commissioners will levy additional general ad valorem taxes on all taxable property of the County in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and premium, if any, of the Note. It is hereby determined that the taxes levied in paragraph 9 hereof pledged to the payment of the Note and estimated to be deposited in the PFA Debt

Service Account will be sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Note when due and to produce at least five percent in excess thereof.

The full faith, credit and taxing powers of the County shall be, and are hereby, irrevocably pledged for the prompt and full payment of the principal and interest on the Note as the same respectively become due. If the taxes levied and pledged to the payment of principal and interest on the Note, together with other funds irrevocably appropriated to the PFA Debt Service Account referred to in paragraph 9 of this resolution shall at any time be insufficient to pay such principal and interest when due, the County covenants and agrees to levy, without limitation as to rate or amount, an ad valorem tax upon all taxable property in the County sufficient to pay such principal and interest as they become due. If the balance in the PFA Debt Service Account is ever insufficient to pay all principal and interest then due on the Note, the deficiency shall be promptly paid out of any other funds of the County which are available for such purpose, and such other funds may be reimbursed, with or without interest, from the PFA Debt Service Account when a sufficient balance is available therein.

- 11. <u>Certificate of Registration</u>. The County Administrator is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the County Auditor of Carver County, Minnesota, together with such other information as the County Auditor shall require, and to obtain the County Auditor's certificate that the Note has been entered in the County Auditor's Bond Register.
- 12. Project Loan Agreement. The Project Loan Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form heretofore presented to the Board of Commissioners, and in the form executed is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this resolution. Each and all of the provisions of this resolution relating to the Note are intended to be consistent with the provisions of the Project Loan Agreement, and to the extent that any provision in the Project Loan Agreement is in conflict with this resolution as it relates to the Note, that provision shall control and this resolution shall be deemed accordingly modified. The execution of the Project Loan Agreement by the Chair, attested by the County Administrator, is hereby approved, and shall be conclusive evidence of the approval of the Project Loan Agreement in accordance with the terms hereof. The Project Loan Agreement may be attached to the Note, and shall be attached to the Note if the holder of the Note is any person other than the PFA.
- 13. Records and Certificates. The officers of the County are hereby authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to the PFA, and to the attorneys approving the legality of the issuance of the Note, certified copies of all proceedings and records of the County relating to the Note and to the financial condition and affairs of the County, and such other affidavits, certificates and information as are required to show the facts relating to the legality and marketability of the Note as the same appear from the books and records under their custody and control or as otherwise known to them, and all such certified copies, certificates and affidavits, including any heretofore furnished, shall be deemed representations of the County as to the facts recited therein.
- 14. Tax-Exempt Status of any PFA Bonds; Rebate. The County with respect to the Note shall comply with requirements necessary under the Code to establish and maintain the exclusion from gross income under Section 103 of the Code of the interest on any bonds issued by the PFA to finance purchase of the Note or to which the Note is pledged (the "PFA Bonds"), including without limitation (1) requirements relating to temporary periods for investments, (2) limitations on amounts invested at a yield greater than the yield on the PFA Bonds, and (3) the rebate of excess investment earnings to the United States. The County covenants and agrees with the PFA and holders of the Note that the investments of proceeds of the Note, including the investment of any revenues pledged to the Note which are considered gross proceeds of the PFA Bonds under the applicable regulations, and accumulated sinking funds, if any, shall be limited as to amount and yield in such manner that the PFA Bonds shall not be arbitrage bonds within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code and any regulations thereunder. On the basis of the existing facts, estimates and circumstances, including the foregoing

findings and covenants, the County hereby certifies that it is not expected that the proceeds of the Note will be used in such manner as to cause the PFA Bonds to be arbitrage bonds under Section 148 of the Code and any regulations thereunder. The Chair and County Administrator shall furnish a certificate to the PFA embracing or based on the foregoing certification at the time of delivery of the Note to the PFA. The proceeds of the Note will likewise be used in such manner that the Note is not a private activity bond under Section 141 of the Code.

- 15. <u>Supplemental Resolution</u>. Prior resolutions relating to the Road and Bridge Capital Improvement Plan are hereby supplemented to the extent necessary to give effect to the provisions of paragraph 9 of this resolution.
- 16. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, paragraph or provision of this resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this resolution.
- 17. <u>Headings</u>. Headings in this resolution are included for convenience of reference only and are not a part hereof, and shall not limit or define the meaning of any provision hereof.
