BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

Staff from Environmental Services, Planning and Water Management, and the Carver SWCD have been considering new programs to increase compliance with manure management regulations. Enforcement of State and County manure management regulations can be time consuming, counterproductive to educational efforts, and very time consuming for staff from these departments and the County Attorney's Office. The following proposal has been reviewed and recommended by the Water Environment & Natural Resources Committee and has been presented to a group of feedlot owners for input.

A concentrated educational and financial incentive effort has been developed which could result in better manure management within a sub watershed of Bevens/Silver Creek in the southwest portion of the county. Fecal bacteria contamination in this watershed remains above standards despite updating the majority of the older sewage treatment systems. This area includes 18 registered feedlots with a total of 2,261 animals units. Land application of manure from these feedlots is likely contributing to the bacteria problem.

The program is based on compliance with MPCA and Carver County guidelines and rules for manure management but also provides these feedlots an incentive to go a few steps further by doing more testing, planning, and ultimately keeping manure on the land instead of in the water. It stresses the need to keep manure application sites and manure stockpile sites away from sensitive areas such as open drainage tile intakes, drainage ditches, streams, and lakes.

The program will offer one on one education to individual feedlots and a financial incentive including a base payment of \$500 and a maximum payment of \$1000 per year to implement specific best management practices. The incentive program would be funded by the Water Levy at a maximum cost of \$17,000 per year for 2 years [\$34,000 total]. Summary of Incentive Eligibility

Timeline:

- Summer 2013 Introduce sensitive area planning and create sensitive area plan.
- November 2013 Producers submit sensitive area plan reviewed by staff for approval, submit 2014 land application plan and short term stockpile plan.
- December 2013 December 2014: Level III land application of manure inspections.
- November 2013 December 2014: Maintain records, develop Manure Management Plans, Soil testing, EQIP enrollment.
- November 2014 Producers submit Winter 2015 land application plan.
- November 2014 December 2014 Verify compliance and first payment distribution.
- January 2015 Producers submit 2015 land application plan and short term stockpile plan.
- January 1- December 31, 2015 Producers maintain land application records.
- January 2015 December 2015 Ongoing compliance review by Carver County Staff.
- November 2015 Producers submit winter land application plan.
- November 2015 December 2015 Verify compliance and second payment distribution.
