

Carver County Board of Commissioners March 2, 2021 Regular Session

April 20, 2021 9:00 a.m. Board Meeting April 27, 2021 9:00 Board Work Session A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on February 16, 2021. The building remained closed due to the health pandemic but was webcast live. Chair Tim Lynch convened the session at 9:01 a.m.

Members present: Tim Lynch, Chair, Gayle Degler, Vice Chair, John P. Fahey, Matt Udermann and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Public comments were received from Karen Johnson Leuthner. County Administrator Hemze read the letter into the record that raised her concerns in the handling of the CUP and RF dangers related to the Hollywood Township tower. She indicated she would be forwarding the email to the Hollywood Township Clerk for their March 8th agenda.

The following amendment was made to the agenda:

Degler moved, Udermann seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the minutes of the February 2, 2021 Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved professional services agreement with Granite Ledge Electrical Contractors, Inc., in the amount of \$33,817.10 for traffic signal improvements, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved entering into a professional services agreement with HGA Architects for design and construction administration services for the Waterfront Service Center at Waconia Regional Park and authorized the Chair to sign the agreement upon completion of the contract review process.

Approved the professional services agreement with Second Chance Recycling and authorized the Chair to sign the agreement upon completion of the contract review process.

Approved professional services agreement with Erickson Engineering for design services for the Salem Avenue Bridge project, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Resolution #13-21, Support to Submit Local Road Improvement Program Project Application for Trunk Highway 25 and County Road 20 Intersection Improvements.

Resolution #14-21, Support to Submit Local Road Improvement Program Project Application for County Highway 24 Safety and Reconstruction Project.

Approved amendment one to the professional services agreement with Kimley-Horn for the Highway 10 and 24 project pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved and accepted receipt of the unrestricted grant in the amount of \$5,000 from HealthPartners for use by Health and Human Services, specifically the Child & Family and Income Support departments to develop a program that serves low income families on Medicaid and related HH&S budget amendment.

Authorized the Chair to sign the BWSR Competitive Grant Agreement and contract pending contract review and approved related Public Services budget amendment.

Authorized the Chair to sign the BWSR Watershed Base Implementation Funding grant agreement pending contract review and approved related Public Services budget amendment.

Reviewed February 9, 2021, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$710,760.73 and reviewed February 16, 2021, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$481,138.01.

Motion carried unanimously.

The Board was asked to make a Board appointment to the County Veterans Treatment Court Steering Committee. Mark Metz, County Attorney, clarified the purpose of the committee and explained it was a wide group of people working toward the same goal. Commissioner Udermann expressed his interest in serving.

Degler moved, Lynch moved, to appoint Commissioner Udermann to serve on the Carver County Veterans Treatment Court Steering Committee, with Commissioner Degler as the alternate. Motion carried unanimously.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Board adopt Resolutions of Support to sponsor Local Road Improvement Grant applications for townships and non-state aide cities. He explained the State, through the legislative session, bonded for 75 million in local road improvement grants. He stated this allows cities, township and the County to apply for grants for local roads and identified the proposed County, City and Township projects.

Robjent explained Waconia Township had decided to pull their request. He stated townships or cities below 5,000 population have to get the County to sponsor their application and cities over 5,000 submit their own grants. He indicated the County was not competing for funds and in general

they support communities for their requests. He recommended the Board adopt Resolutions of support for cities and townships below 5,000 population and provide a letter of support for the projects in the Cities of Chanhassen and Waconia. He clarified in general all projects are scored on their merits and the state wants to make sure all agencies have a chance to get funding.

Degler moved, Fahey seconded, to authorize the County Engineer to sign letters of support for City applications to the Local Road Improvement Program and offered the following Resolutions:

County Staff are requesting authorization to apply for several projects within the scope of the grant parameters. The prioritized projects are listed below and address the equity areas based on age, income and ability. A grant application is proposed for watercraft and other seasonal rental equipment to provide affordable rental equipment opportunities at Lake Waconia Regional Park along with a storage unit for the equipment. Carver County has a high percentage of youth underage 18 and a grant application is proposed for a playground at Lake Waconia Regional Park. To address ADA access to Carver County park facilities, an ADA assessment grant application is proposed. A grant application for a portable climbing wall is proposed to address recreational needs of youth for day camps. Lastly, a grant application for a docking system at Lake Waconia Regional Park is proposed to improve access for all ages and abilities to the waterfront. The attached resolutions outline the goal of each application as well.

Staff will work to further evaluate the projects and then complete the applications by the program deadline of March 15, 2021. Successful applicants will be notified in the Spring of this year, funds will be eligible to be spent towards the grant(s) beginning July 1, 2021 with a 3-year term duration. Grant terms specify that no more than \$400,000 can be awarded to an implementing agency. If the County is successful in the application process, not all the projects below will be funded due to this funding cap.

- ADA Assessment Plans for the Three Regional Park Areas: \$20,000
- Portable Rock-climbing Wall Unit: \$60,000
- Docking system for Lake Waconia Regional Park: \$200,000
- Partial Funding for a Playground Facility at Lake Waconia Regional Park: \$200,000

Background

The state Board of Water & Soil Resources (BWSR) changed the process for distributing State Clean Water Legacy (CWL) funds to the Carver County Water Management Organization (CCWMO) and other watershed districts for the FY 2021 period. Previously, the CCWMO would compete with all other watersheds in the state for annual CWL grants. For the next fiscal cycle, BWSR is allocating funds directly to large Metro Watersheds to implement eligible projects. This is part of the State's One Watershed One Plan Program. The Program allocates a set fund amount to each metro watershed and relied on a collaborative group to determine which projects are funded by the allocation. The larger metro watershed identified as the South Fork Crow Watershed was allocated \$330,063 for FY 2021.

Process

Staff members representing two Water Management Organizations (Pioneer Sarah Creek, and Carver County), two Municipalities (City of Medina and the City of Watertown) and two Soil and Water Conservation Districts (Hennepin County and Carver SWCD) recommended that funds be split based upon a ranking criteria approved by all voting members of this group and submitted a project list to BWSR. Funding was allocated as follows:

CCWMO	2 Projects	\$90,000.00
CARVER SWCD	1 Project	\$60,000.00
PIONEER SARAH CREEK WMO	3 Project	\$180,063.00
TOTAL	6 Projects	\$330,063.00

At this time, staff is recommending that the grant agreements be approved by the Board to begin implementing the projects with the CCWMO allocated CWF funds.

Projects

Watertown Streambank Restoration Feasibility Study and Implementation

This project will complete a feasibility study identifying streambank areas along the South Fork Crow River through the City of Watertown that are failing, identifies cost benefits, and rank potential projects. Any remaining funds will be used to begin design on the top identified projects. Total funding from BSWR is \$50,000 with an additional \$10,000 in CCWMO Levy Funding as match.

Turf to Native Program

The goal of the program will be to reach out to LGUs and County Parks Division on parcels that have large maintained turf grassed areas or agricultural land and convert to those areas to native prairie. BWSR will be funding \$40,000 of this program with an addition \$10,000 from CCWMO Levy Funds as a match. With this budget, it is estimated that we can convert roughly 8 acres to a native prairie with 2 to 3 years of maintenance included to help establish the native plantings. Research has shown that by converting this amount of area to a native prairie, infiltration rates increase by 0.6 inches per hour resulting in a stormwater volume reduction of 2,540,000 gallons, reduction of 4.9 pounds of phosphorus, and 1,700 pounds of sediment removed per acre of converted turf grass.

Resolution Authorizing Offers of Just Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 10 Project – Chaska Creek Area

- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carver County is the official governing body of Carver County ("County"); and
- WHEREAS, the County, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, is authorized by law, and pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, § 163.02, subd. 2; §117.012; and § 117.042, to acquire land and other real property interests in Carver County which the County needs for a public use or public purpose; and
- WHEREAS, the County proposes to construct highway and related improvements in Carver County for a Highway 10 Project Chaska Creek Area ("Project"); and
- WHEREAS, to complete the Project, the County must acquire the real property interests described in Exhibit A, attached hereto, from the Owners of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A; and
- WHEREAS, the County obtained either an appraisal(s) from a licensed real estate appraiser when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A exceeds \$25,000, or the County obtained a minimum damage acquisition report from a qualified person with appraisal knowledge, in lieu of an appraisal, when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A is under \$25,000; and
- WHEREAS, County must determine and submit an initial written offer of just compensation to the Owners of said needed real property interests covering the full amount of damages caused by the County's proposed acquisitions; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests may obtain an independent appraisal by a qualified appraiser of the real property interests which the County proposes to acquire for the Project; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests are entitled to reimbursement for the reasonable costs of the appraisal from the County up to a maximum of the limits stated in Minn. Stat. §117.036, provided the Owners submit to the County the information necessary for reimbursement.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that County's acquisition of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A and the construction of highway and related improvements as part of the Highway 10 Project Chaska Creek Area constitute a valid public use or public purpose; and

Approving the pledge by the Carver County Community Development Agency of the full faith and credit of Carver County to housing development bonds to be issued by the CDA

WHEREAS, the Carver County Community Development Agency (the "CDA"), is authorized to issue bonds backed by revenues of a housing development project and by the full faith and credit of Carver County (the "County") to refund bonds issued by the CDA to finance a qualified housing development project, following approval by the County of the principal amount of the bonds; and

WHEREAS, the CDA has previously issued its Governmental Housing Revenue Bonds (GNMA Collateralized Mortgage Loan-Jonathan Acres Apartments Project), Series 1998A, in the original principal amount of \$3,475,000 (the "Series 1998A Bonds"), for the purpose of financing the acquisition and rehabilitation by the CDA of the Jonathan Acres apartment facility located in the City of Chaska, Minnesota, now known as Windstone Townhomes (the "Windstone Facility"); and

WHEREAS, in 2010, the Windstone Facility was transferred by the CDA to Jonathan Acres LLC, a Minnesota limited liability company created by the CDA pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.012, Subd. 2j, in which the CDA is the sole member (the "LLC"); and

WHEREAS, the Series 1998A Bonds were refunded by the proceeds of a first mortgage loan made by Oak Grove Commercial Mortgage, LLC to the LLC in the original principal amount of \$3,475,000 (the "2010 Note"); and

WHEREAS, the CDA proposes to issue its housing development bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$3,150,000 (the "Series 2021A Bonds") pursuant to an Indenture of Trust (the "Indenture") to be entered into between the CDA and U.S. Bank National Association (the "Trustee") to refinance the 2010 Note; and

WHEREAS, the Windstone Facility constitutes a "qualified housing development project" within the meaning of Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.034, Subd. 2; and

WHEREAS, the CDA has determined that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare that it issue the Series 2021A Bonds, and that it pledge the full faith and credit of the County to the 2021A Bonds; and

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Board forms of the Indenture and a Continuing Disclosure Certificate to be entered into in connection with the issuance of the Series 2021A Bonds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA as follows:

Approving the pledge by the Carver County Community Development Agency of the full faith and credit of Carver County to housing development refunding bonds to be issued by the CDA for Town Centre Project

WHEREAS, the Carver County Community Development Agency (the "CDA"), is authorized to issue bonds backed by revenues of a housing development project and by the full faith and credit of Carver County (the "County") to refund bonds issued by the CDA to finance a qualified housing development project, following approval by the County of the principal amount of the bonds; and

WHEREAS, the CDA issued its Governmental Development Refunding Bonds (Carver County Unlimited Tax General Obligation-Town Centre Apartments Project) Series 2011A (the "Series 2011A Bonds") pursuant to an Indenture of Trust dated November 1, 2002 (the "Original Indenture") between the CDA and U.S. Bank National Association (the "Trustee"), as amended by a Supplemental Indenture of Trust dated as of December 1, 2011 (the "First Supplemental Indenture") to provide financing for a multifamily rental housing facility in the City of Waconia (the "City") known as Town Centre Apartments (the "Town Centre Facility"); and

WHEREAS, the County pledged its full faith and credit to the payment of principal and interest on the Series 2011A Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the CDA proposes to issue its housing development refunding bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$4,495,000 (the "Series 2021B Bonds") as Additional Bonds under the Original Indenture pursuant to a Second Supplemental Indenture of Trust (the "Second Supplemental Indenture") to be entered into between the CDA and the Trustee (a) to refund the Series 2011 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Town Centre Facility constitutes a "qualified housing development project" within the meaning of Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.034, Subd. 2; and

WHEREAS, the CDA has determined that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare that it issue the Series 2021B Bonds, and that it pledge the full faith and credit of the County to the 2021B Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the CDA will pledge the full faith and credit of the City to reimburse the County for any payment of debt service on up to \$3,000,000 in principal amount of the Series 2021B Bonds; and

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Board forms of the Second Supplemental Indenture and a Continuing Disclosure Certificate to be entered into in connection with the issuance of the Series 2021B Bonds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA as follows:

- 1. That the County hereby approves the issuance of, and pledge by the CDA of the full faith and credit of Carver County to, the Series 2021B Bonds for the purposes described above.
- 2. That the County hereby approves the pledge by the CDA of Town Centre Facility revenues and other sources as provided in the Original Indenture and Second Supplemental Indenture.
- 3. That the Chair and County Administrator are authorized to execute the Second Supplemental Indenture in acceptance thereof and to execute the Continuing Disclosure Certificate in substantially the forms on file, but with such changes as the Chair and County Administrator may approve.
- 4. That Commissioners, officers and staff of the County are authorized and directed to execute and deliver such other documents and certificates as are necessary or convenient to provide for the issuance of the 2021B Bonds.

Approving the pledge by the Carver County Community Development Agency of the full faith and credit of Carver County to housing development bonds to be issued by the CDA for Waybury Project

WHEREAS, the Carver County Community Development Agency (the "CDA"), is authorized to issue bonds backed by revenues of a housing development project and by the full faith and credit of Carver County (the "County") to refund bonds issued by the CDA to finance a qualified housing development project, following approval by the County of the principal amount of the bonds; and

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

In June of 2014, a section of the Southwest Light Rail Transit Line (SLRT) /Minnesota River Bluffs Regional Trail (MN RB RT) between Bluff Creek Drive and the east county line was closed due to a slope failure after heavy rains. Hennepin County Regional Rail Authority (HCRRA) owns approximately 3 miles of the Southern LRT/MN RB RT within the boundary of Carver County, that includes the area with the slope failure.

In January of 2019, HCRRA and Carver County entered a Purchase and Acceptance and Sale and Donation Agreement for the conveyance of an approximately 3-mile portion of the Southern LRT Corridor/ the Minnesota River Bluffs Regional Trail located in Carver County ("Trail"), from HCRRA to Carver County. The terms of the agreement included:

- Purchase Price \$5,840,000
- Seller Donation \$4,140,000
- Balance of Purchase Price \$1,700,000
- Sixty-day Physical Inspection Period
- MnDOT Mortgage Agreement
- Assignment Agreement (Leases, Licenses, Other Property Rights)
- Donative Bill of Sale

Carver County was awarded \$1,700,000 in grant agreement SG-11404 from the Metropolitan Council, effective June 26,2019, for the acquisition of the property from HCRRA. Carver County is to acquire ownership and possession of the property after HCRRA has repaired the slope failure and addressed other land stewardship needs associated with the property.

HCRRA began slope repair work August 2020 and has issued Carver County a notice of substantial completion on January 22, 2021 triggering the sixty-day Physical Inspection Period of the work.

The Purchase and Acceptance and Sale and Donation Agreement includes that the parties will execute the MnDOT Agreement which breaks out a proportionate share of a MnDOT mortgage on the area to be acquired by Carver County but does not trigger repayment of that mortgage from the sale of property. Additionally, the Purchase and Acceptance and Sale and Donation Agreement provides that the parties will execute an Assignment Agreement, thereby transferring other rights such as leases and licenses to Carver County.

Further, while the project to repair the slope failure is substantially complete, the contract for this work is with HCRRA. It is proposed that Carver County would be assigned rights to the contract documents, site access, permits and other documents necessary to ensure the final delivery through the warranty period of the project.

Steps to complete the agreement with HCRRA:

- Perform Physical Inspection of Property
- Execute the MnDOT Agreement at closing
- Complete Assignment Agreement in regard to other property obligations and rights
- Complete Assignment Agreement for construction contract, permitting and other project documents.
- Schedule closing date
- Execute Donative Bill of Sale (at closing)
- Pay HCRRA \$1,700,000
