

Carver County Board of Commissioners March 16, 2021 Regular Session

A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on March 2, 2021. The building remained closed due to the health pandemic but was webcast live. Chair Tim Lynch convened the session at 9:11 a.m.

Members present: Tim Lynch, Chair, John P. Fahey, Matt Udermann and Tom Workman (present in County Board Room) and Gayle Degler (participating via WebEx).

Members absent: None.

No public comments were received.

Degler moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the agenda. On a roll call vote, Degler, Fahey, Lynch, Udermann, Workman voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Fahey moved, Degler seconded, to approve the minutes of the February 16, 2021, Regular Session. On a roll call vote, Fahey, Lynch, Udermann, Workman, Degler voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved the special use permit for Special Olympics Minnesota for the March 20, 2021, polar plunge fundraiser event held at Lake Waconia Regional Park.

Resolution #19-21, Grant Application for Multi-Purpose Docking Facility at Lake Waconia Regional Park.

Resolution #21-21, Grant Application for ADA Assessment Plan Updates for Each Regional Park in Carver County.

Professional services agreement with RJM Construction for construction management services for the Waterfront Service Center at Waconia Regional Park and authorized the Chair to sign the agreement upon completion of the contract review process.

Approved issuing a tobacco license to E-Cig POD USA LLC dba E-Cig POD.

Authorized the Chair to sign the BWSR Watershed Based Implementation Funding Grant Agreement pending contract review and related Public Service budget amendment.

Authorized Chair to sign the grant agreement with the City of Waconia pending finalization of the contract review process.

Authorized the Chair to sign the grant agreement with the City of Chaska for the Lake Grace ravine project pending finalization the contract review process.

Authorized the Chair to sign the City of Chaska for the Jonathan Association gully project and related Public Services budget amendment.

Professional services agreement with WSB & Associates for the Jonathan Carver Parkway Project, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Resolution #24-21, Authorizing Offers of Just Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 10 Project – Chaska Creek Area.

Approved the write off of 2020 penalty and interest on parcel 25.7510010.

Reviewed February 23, 2021, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$348,036.64 and reviewed March 2, 2021, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$418,335.01.

On a roll call vote, Lynch, Udermann, Workman, Degler, Fahey voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Fahey moved, Degler seconded, to open the public hearing on the Community Development Agency's request for the County's general obligation pledge. On a roll call vote, Udermann, Workman, Degler, Fahey, Lynch moved aye. Motion carried unanimously.

David Frischmon, Finance, pointed out the previous work session to discuss CDA's request for the County's general obligation pledge for three CDA debt refundings. He explained two of these bond refundings already have the County's pledge but the Windstone project did not. He clarified this was CDA's debt and there would no costs to the County.

Paul Steinman, CDA financial consultant, stated they were asking for the Board's support for three refunding opportunities. He stated the purpose of the public hearing was for the new proposed general obligation pledge for Windstone Townhomes and consider a Resolution pledging up to \$3.15 million to refund a HUD loan for Windstone Townhomes. He stated they were also asking for a Resolution to pledge the County's general obligation to refund bonds issued for Town Centre Apartments and Waybury Apartments that have an existing County general obligation pledge. He pointed out the benefits of the County's pledge and identified the Statute requirements for County backed housing projects.

Steinman explained each of the refundings and projected annual savings. He highlighted a chart showing historical and current yields. He recognized that although the market has recently changed, they believed there would still be savings on all three refundings.

He reviewed the key events that have happened or will occur within the next few months. He acknowledged there was always a chance refunding could fall out of favor and while they could push it to later if they see refunding did not work, he did not see pulling back at this point.

No public testimony was received.

Fahey moved, Workman seconded, to close the public hearing. On a roll call vote, Workman, Degler, Fahey, Lynch, Udermann voted aye.

Udermann offered the following Resolutions, seconded by Fahey:

Approving the Pledge by the Carver County Community Development Agency of the Full Faith and Credit of Carver County to Housing Development Bonds to be Issued by the CDA

Resolution #26-21

Approving the Pledge by the Carver County Community Development Agency of the Full Faith and Credit of Carver County to Housing Development Refunding Bonds to be Issued by the CDA for Town Centre Project

Resolution #27-21

Approving the Pledge by the Carver County Community Development Agency of the Full Faith and Credit of Carver County to Housing Development Bonds to be Issued by the CDA for Waybury Project

On a roll call vote, Degler, Fahey, Lynch, Udermann, Workman voted aye.

Randy Lehs, Fiber Manager, requested the Board approve the Carver County School Network Consortium Agreement. He explained in 2012 Carver County public school districts banded together to form a consortium that allows Districts to purchase communication services as a group. He stated purchasing as a group allows Districts to maximum federal eRate reimbursement funding for communication service expenses.

Since 2013 the consortium has purchased fiber connectivity and bandwidth from Carver Link and the current contact expires on June 30, 2021. Lehs indicated the CCSN posted a request for proposal and CarverLink submitted a bid. Lehs explained the CCSN came back with a request for best and final offer and CarverLink submitted its final offer. Subsequently, CCSN awarded the bid to Carver Link for a five year agreement with an option for two year extensions.

Fahey moved, Workman seconded, to approve the service agreement for leased dark fiber and internet services provided by CarverLink to the Carver County Schools Network. On a roll call vote, Fahey, Lynch, Udermann, Workman, Degler voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Marty Walsh, Parks, requested the Board approve the final agreements and authorization to proceed to close on Hennepin County Regional Rail property. He identified the location of the trail within Carver County and explained it had been closed since 2014 due to a slope failure after heavy rains. Walsh explained they had discussions with Hennepin County Regional Rail on how to fix the slope failure with the goal to obtain funding from the Met Council. He pointed out the overall objectives and steps taken to acquire the property. Walsh reviewed the financial implications, the mortgage agreement with MnDOT and next steps. He indicated they are in the process of performing an inspection of the property and scheduling a closing date.

He also pointed out related work and discussions they were having to transfer ownership of a portion of the Lake Minnetonka Regional Trail that extends into the City of Victoria.

Dave County, Administrator, acknowledged it did make sense to own trails but trails do have ongoing maintenance costs and they may have to revisit the Regional Rail levy at some point.

Workman moved, Udermann seconded, to authorize the Administrator and Chair to execute the MnDOT Agreement, to authorize the Administrator and Chair to execute the assignment agreement for property rights, to authorize the Administrator and Chair to execute assignment agreement for contract, permitting and other documents related to the repair of the slope failure and to authorize staff to proceed to closing and execute closing documents. On a roll call vote, Lynch, Udermann, Workman, Degler, Fahey voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Fahey seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 10:35 a.m. and go into a work session with Public Works to discuss land exchange information related to PID 07.0191700 and 07.0193000. ON a roll call vote, Udermann, Workman, Degler, Fahey, Lynch voted aye. Motion carried unanimously.

The westbound Highway 5 alignment was changed with the recent construction project in the City of Norwood Young America from the intersection with Highway 212 to approximately 0.25 mile north of Highway 212. This north/south portion of highway shared the eastbound trunk highway designation as well as the southbound county state aid highway (CSAH) 33 designation. Once the project was completed, both eastbound and westbound Highway 5 traffic use this segment of reconstructed highway and the CSAH 33 designation needs to be revoked since the highway can no longer have both designations. The change of the CSAH designation requires a formal county board resolution so that Carver County can keep the excess mileage of approximately 0.25 mile in the Carver County CSAH mileage bank to be used at a later date on a different county highway. This resolution is a formality that MnDOT requires in order to change a CSAH designation. The City of Norwood Young Amercia has also approved of this highway designation change at their March 8, 2021 regular meeting. Carver County Public Works is exploring ways to use the CSAH banked mileage that will meet state aid standards.

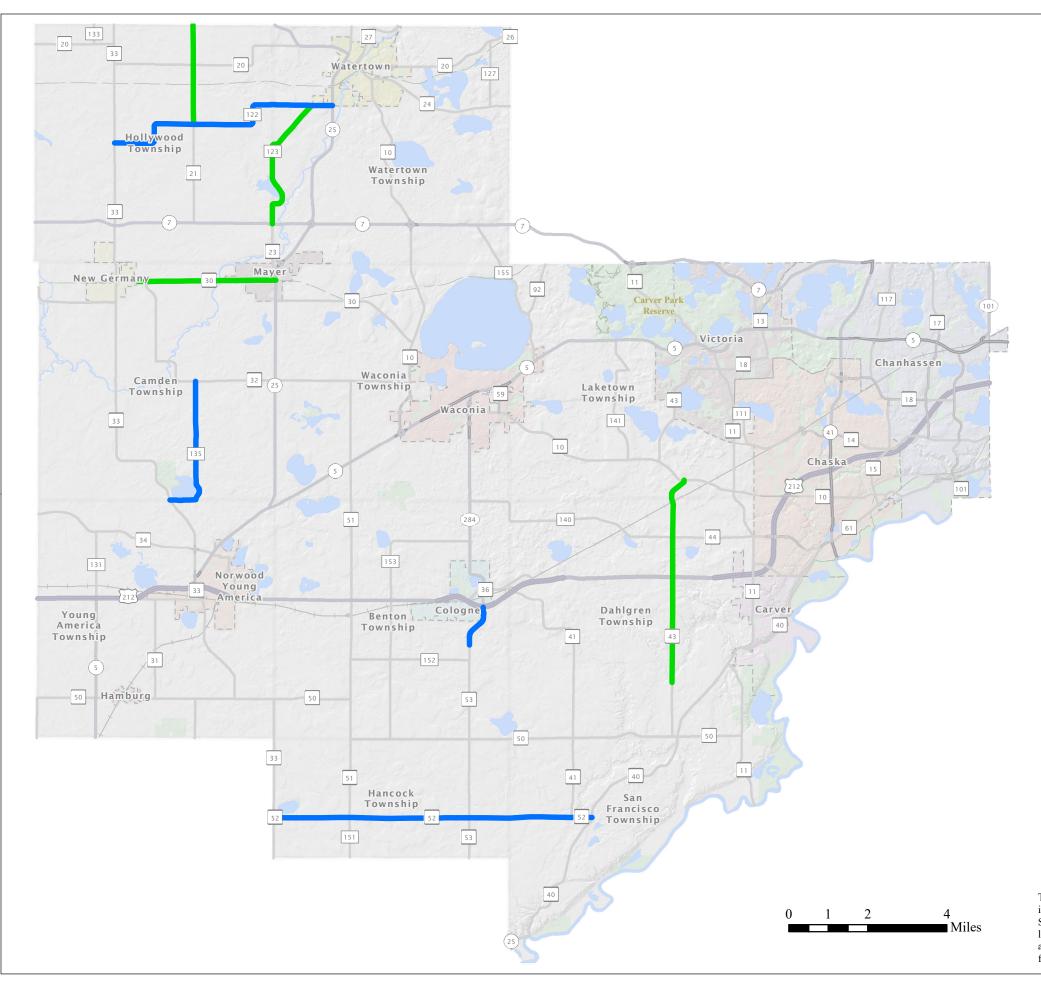

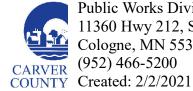
2021 Crack Sealing Plan

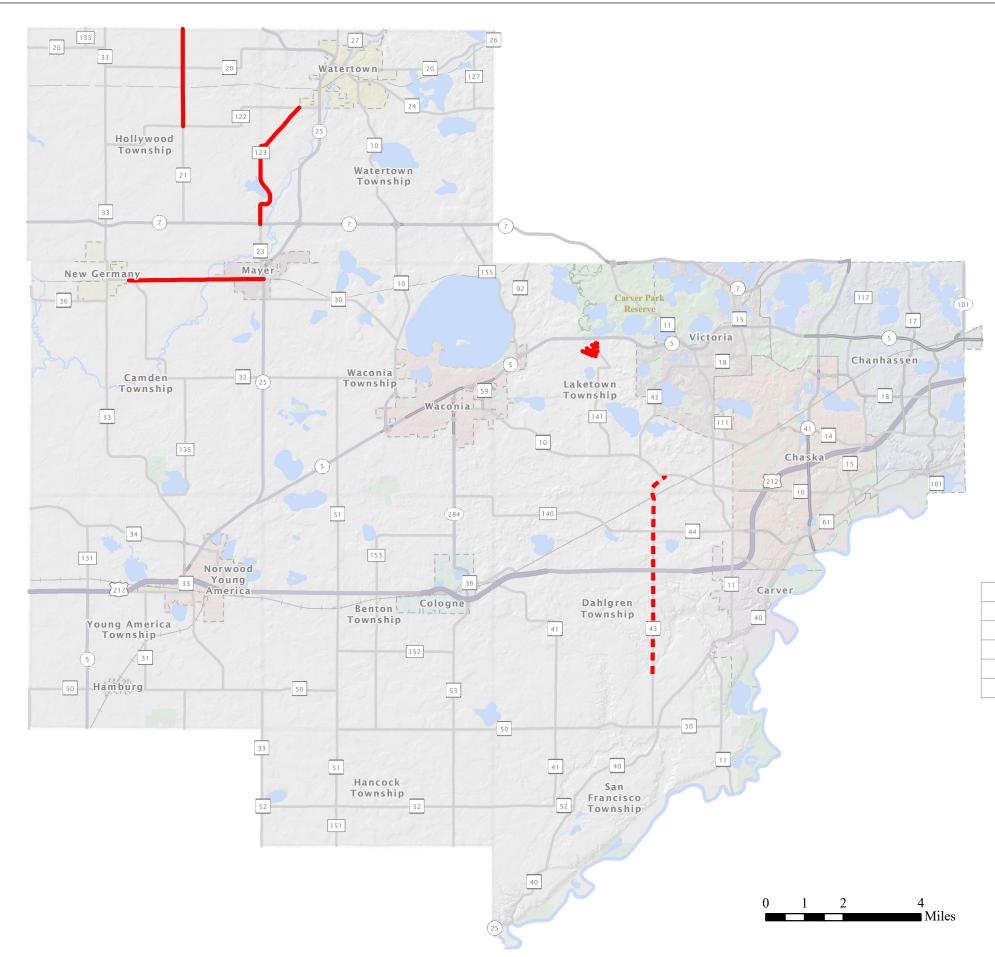

Project partners including the cities of Victoria, Chanhassen, and Chaska, the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum, and MnDOT recently completed the Arboretum Area Transportation Plan to develop a shared vision to complete this two-mile gap in the transportation network. 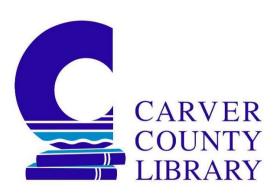

Grant applications must be received by the Library Director by the last Friday in September and then be disseminated to the Grant Board and will be evaluated in October. Grant funding confirmations will be made no later than November 30.

The grant board will be made up of the Library Director, a branch manager chosen on an annual rotating basis, a Library board member chosen on an annual basis, a Friends of the Library representative chosen on an annual rotating basis and the Assistant County Administrator and/or designee. Recommendations from the grant board will be presented to Library Board at its November meeting for preliminary approval of funds allocation. Projects with preliminary approval will be forwarded to the County Board approval as part of its annual December budget process.

WHEREAS, the Carver County Administrator's Office, Health and Human Services Division, and Department of Emergency Management recommends the Carver County Board of Commissioners extend the Local State of Emergency in Carver County for COVID-19 until September 30, 2021.

WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners authorizes Richard Scott, Carver County Community Health Services Administrator, and statutorily authorized agent of the local Community Health Board (MN Statute 145A, Subd. 2), to sign Grant Agreements and Amendments from the Minnesota Department of Health pertaining to the COVID-19 response throughout the duration of Local State of Emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carver County Board of Commissioners extends the Local State of Emergency effective March 17, 2020; and subsequently extended to December 31, 2020 and March 31, 2021 to September 30, 2021, unless otherwise terminated or extended due to the ongoing and expected response to and recovery from COVID-19 and direct the County Administrator, Deputy Division Director of Health Services, and Emergency Management Director to coordinate such actions and request such state and/or federal assistance as needed to protect lives, businesses, and public and private property in Carver County for the response and recovery of the county from the impacts of COVID-19 to the extent practicable and allowed by law, ordinance, and charter.

Reopening Carver County - Phase II

As of January 26 Proposed March 16, 2021

Reopening Carver County – Phase II recommendations are attached. The main objective of the phased plan is to keep our citizens and employees safe and healthy while gradually reopening County services. Related strategies include the following.

- 1. All buildings remain closed to general walk-in traffic during Reopening Phase I and during the initial stages of Phase II.
- 2. Service by appointment is offered for certain services that cannot be completed via other methods or are difficult to complete online due to lack of an electronic solution, complexity of transaction, or customer barrier to accessing the service online.
- 3. Electronic processing of documents and applications, and delivery of services via virtual methods are continued and increased where possible. Methods for effective virtual service delivery are refined. Innovations are continued into the future when appropriate.
- 4. Physical spaces are appropriately prepared (room arrangements to support social distancing, protective barriers installed, enhanced cleaning protocols continued, etc.).
- 5. Employees continue to telework where effective service delivery can be provided through remote work arrangements.

Protocols related to services that are reopened will be guided by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) recommendations. Additional Phase II and Phase III recommendations will be provided to the Board later based upon health data and trends, with the goal of incrementally reopening all Carver County buildings and services.

Continuing to strategically enhance the County's ability to quickly convert to effective service delivery in the event of renewed social distancing or stay at home guidance will remain an ongoing area of focus. It is the County's goal to be prepared and responsive to current and future challenges, while maintaining employee and community health, safety, and wellbeing as top priorities.
