A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on October 1, 2013. Chair Tim Lynch convened the session at 9:00 a.m.

Members present: Tim Lynch, Chair, James Ische, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Ische seconded, to approve the minutes of the September 24, 2013, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Degler moved, Ische seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Adopted the NACo Proclamation declaring the month of October 2013 as Cyber Security Awareness Month in Carver County.

Approved the purchase of a water tank swaploader attachment from Aspen Equipment in the amount of \$30,000.

Approved issuing a charitable gambling license to Mayer-Watertown DandyLions for a raffle to be held on November 2, 2013.

Resolution #55-13, Authoring and Setting Time and Terms of Tax Forfeited Land Sale.

Resolution #56-13, Seizure and Sale of Abandoned Personal Property from Tax Forfeited Parcels.

Resolution #57-13 Limited Land Sale of Additional Tax Forfeited Lands by Sealed Bid.

Reviewed Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$317,392.44.

Motion carried unanimously.

Nick Koktavy, Administrative Services, requested the Board approve a joint powers agreement for cooperative purchasing. He stated this initiative came out of the Metro County Administrators group that has been meeting and identified several initiatives the group has been working on. He explained the joint powers agreement authorizes the counties to jointly purchase goods and services. He stated the agreement does not lock the County into anything and each county would be responsible for their own acts.

He indicated the next step would be to develop a tool to manage the program and identify specific purchasing opportunities. Koktavy confirmed other counties could join in the future.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to enter into the joint powers agreement establishing a cooperative purchasing agreement among the metropolitan counties pending finalization of the contract review process. Motion carried unanimously.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Board adopt a Resolution including the expansion of 212 between Carver and Cologne in the Corridor of Commerce Program. He explained the County was a lead agency on a 212 study and he believed the projects on 212 were right for this program.

He explained during the last legislative session three hundred million in bonds was appropriated for trunk highway improvement projects. Robjent reviewed the vision of 212 in the County and identified the eligibility requirements for the program and the selection process. He stated MnDOT has established five categories within the program and recognized there were huge amount of requests being submitted. He suggested they still needed to keep moving forward with the request. He reviewed the expansion from Carver to Cologne and the funding needed.

Robjent explained the selection criteria and project readiness. He stated the funding request was flexible and identified options for three different phases. He noted the County's required funding commitment and possible source of funds.

Ische offered the following Resolution, seconded by Maluchnik:

### Resolution #58-13 Requesting Funding for the Expansion of TH 212 Between Carver and Cologne through the Corridor of Commerce Program

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to authorize the County Engineer to submit the request to MnDOT. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 9:40 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.

	Center [EC] annually collects about 4,700 cubic ers deliver yard waste to the facility, pay a fee [\$			

brush] from residents. EC customers deliver yard waste to the facility, pay a fee [\$1 per bag or \$8 per cubic yard], and unload the material into the yard waste bunker. When the bunker is near capacity, a contractor brings roll-off boxes to the site, loads them using the EC's skid steer loader, and hauls the material off-site to a composting facility. Prices have generally decreased each year due to the changing and increasingly competitive nature of the composting business. Total expenditures for 2012 were \$37,535 based on a \$8.25 per cubic yard contract price. The current contractor is Elite Waste Disposal. They have been hauling the material to a site operated by the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community in Shakopee.

A request for written bids was sent to known hauling and composting companies on July 22, 2013. Six written bids were received by the due date of Friday, August 9, 2013. The lowest bid was Minnesota Topsoil at \$7.00 per cubic yard. Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community Organics Recycling Facility [SMSC] was slightly higher at \$7.25. The current contractor, Elite Waste Disposal, was the next highest at \$7.45 per cubic yard.

The County reserves the right to award this contract where such action serves the County's best interest. We reviewed the bids and have developed a contract for services with SMSC based on the completeness of the bid and the site and equipment resources this contractor has to offer. Factors such as proposed delivery sites and experience were also considered. The contract would have an expiration date of December 31, 2014, with the option of a one year extension. Based on 4,700 cubic yards per calendar year, this would result in total expenditures of about \$50,000 over the life of the contract. Note that yard waste volumes fluctuate from year to year and the contract spans about one and a half years' worth of yard waste collections. For these reasons, the contract has a cost not to exceed of \$60,000. Fees collected from residents will offset this cost and make this contract and program revenue/expenditure neutral.

The Public Health & Environmental Division recommends entering into a contract for a cost not to exceed of \$60,000 with Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community [SMSC] for management of the Environmental Center yard waste. A contract has been reviewed and approved by the County Attorney's Office and Risk Management.

### **HIGHWAY SIGN POLICY**

### Adopted by the Carver County Board of Commissioners on October 15, 2013.

### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to establish uniformity and consistency in the application, installation, and maintenance of traffic signs on Carver County's roadway system. This policy recognizes that the MN MUTCD is the standard for all traffic control devices on all public roads in Minnesota, and therefore all traffic control devices on Carver County's highway system must conform to its standards and specifications as specified in Minnesota Statute 169.06.

This policy officially recognizes the rule in the MN MUTCD that establishes minimum retroreflectivity levels for traffic signs and describes how Carver County achieves compliance.

It is in the interest of Carver County and the public to prevent the excessive use of traffic signs on the county roadway system. A conservative use of traffic signs reduces maintenance costs and improves the effectiveness of the remaining signs. Limiting the excessive use of traffic signs achieves the following:

- Fulfills demonstrated needs
- Champions a command of attention
- Reduces clutter that impedes the conveyance of a clear and simple meaning
- Fosters respect by road users, and reduces conflicts that may restrict time for a proper response that cumulatively improves traffic safety for all users
- Pursues the goals of Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths partnership in Carver County

### POLICY

All traffic signs on Carver County's highway system must conform to the MN MUTCD. Traffic signs not explicitly required to be installed by the MN MUTCD should not be installed on Carver County's highway system unless otherwise specified in this policy, or authorized by the traffic engineer or county engineer.

### POLICY CRITERIA

### Installation/Use of Signs

Carver County will develop and maintain a sign inventory of all signs on the roadway system. Based on the inventory and level of funding available for sign maintenance, Carver County will determine the amount of inventory that can be supported by the current funding structure.



Carver County will maintain the determined amount of traffic control devices (signs, traffic signals, and pavement markings) to ensure safe and efficient operations. Based on the inventory and policy considerations, signs that are not consistent with policy, and signs that are not required or are determined by an engineering study to be unnecessary will be removed through attrition. The following best practices will be implemented to assist in determining the need for all traffic signs:

- Signs that are required by MN MUTCD will be installed. Signs that require engineering judgment will undergo an engineering study, the results of which will be on file documenting reason for installation.
- Traffic signs will not be used as a reactive response to traffic crashes.
- The application of warning signs will be based on system considerations; locations with similar characteristics will be proactively signed.

### **Regulatory Signs**

Regulatory signs inform roadway users of traffic laws or regulations and indicate the applicability of legal requirements that would not otherwise be apparent. Carver County will utilize the guidance of the MN MUTCD regarding design and installation of regulatory signs.

### Warning Signs

Warning signs are used to call attention to hazardous conditions, actual or potential, on or adjacent to a roadway that would not be readily apparent to the motorist. The only type of warning signs that have been proven effective are the Horizontal Alignment Series (but only in a fairly narrow range of curve radii). Static warning signs that warn drivers of hazardous conditions they rarely encounter quickly lose credibility and become part of the background noise that drivers tune out. Signs include but are not limited to deer crossing signs, children at play, blind approach/driveway. Carver County will not install these types of warning signs and will be removing existing signs through attrition.

### Curve Warning Signs

Carver County will utilize horizontal curve warning signs and chevrons when an engineering study deems necessary. A ball bank analysis will be conducted and signs will be installed based on the results according to the guidelines provided in the MN MUTCD.

### **Guide Signs**

Guide signs are used to provide directions to motorists, informing them of intersecting routes, directing them to cities and other important destinations, and guiding them to available services, points of interest, and other geographical, recreational, or cultural sites. Primary guide signs consist of advance junction signing, destination, and distance signs. Supplemental guide signs further provide the driver geographic orientation and secondary destinations at certain interchanges. Destinations include cities, motorist services, or state parks.



### Primary Guide Signs

### Intersection Street Name Signing

Street name signs are installed and maintained at all public intersections with County roadways and are typically placed in a corner at the intersection. Signs on each side of the roadway are installed at wide (multi-lane or divided roadways) intersections. City logos on the street name sign will not be permitted due to consistency and County maintenance responsibilities. The County installs street name signs for all intersections, including new intersections that are constructed by permit.

### Signal Mast Arm Signing

Street name signs are placed on the overhead mast arm at signalized intersections to provide better visibility at these higher volume locations. These signs are key to alerting motorists to the crossroad and are visible prior to crossing the intersection. Once the mast arm signing is in place, ground mounted street name signs may be removed.

### Highway Route Marker and Auxiliary Signing

County highways intersecting a state or county highway route are identified by a route marker (highway number) with an auxiliary junction plaque in advance of the intersection.

Route marker signs with junction and directional sign plaques are installed in advanced of highway designation intersections in conformance with MnMUTCD standards. The route marker signs used are standard M1-X4 (square block on white) signs with corresponding junction and directional plaques. Pentagon (white and yellow on blue) route marker signs, M1-6, are not used in Carver County.

### Street Name Signs in Advance of Intersections

Advanced street name signs with directional arrows are placed prior to intersections to alert motorists of the upcoming cross road. The sign is intended to assist the motorist in preparing for action at the upcoming intersection.

Highways must be designated a principal or minor arterial in the Carver County Roadway Systems Plan. County highways with a collector road designation will not be eligible for advanced street name signs.

A roadway designated a principal arterial has the primary purpose of mobility, therefore access is limited. The roadways that connect to the highway are intended to be public roads serving the collector function or greater. Public road intersections will qualify for advance signing with the following exceptions:



- 1. Minor public street connections that serve a very limited function (cul-de-sacs, right in/out only or other short roadway connections.
- 2. For segments with more than one roadway leading into an area (roadways closer than one-quarter mile apart), only one road (main connection) for the area may be selected.
- 3. Intersections with Trunk or County Highways will typically not receive advance street name signs because they are denoted by advanced route-marking signs. However, a location may receive advance street name signing in select locations if the street name is determined to have regional significance provided signing will not diminish the effectiveness of State or County highway advance signing.

Roadways designated as a minor arterial primarily serve traffic throughout the County. Installation of advance street name signs are typically installed along multi-lane divided highway or high-speed rural highways with a daily traffic volume exceeding 1000 vehicles and with a speed limit of 50 MPH or greater. The same conditions as stated under principal arterials will apply. Additionally, the following intersecting street eligibility must be met:

Highways within suburban area factors:

- Intersecting roadway serves to connect to other highway routes and the local city street system (typically intersecting street will be a MSAS route).
- Locations with all-way stops will not typically be considered for advanced signing. At all way stops, intersections signing will be placed at both near corners of the main line to provide intersection crossing recognition.
- Roadways with a high generator directly off the main highway that serves motorists unfamiliar with the area. High generators include high schools, industrial parks, churches, business districts, regional parks or community facilities located along a side road within one-half mile of the County highway intersections.
- Eligible locations will be a half-mile or further apart to ensure guidance signing provides information without overwhelming the regulatory and other warning signing along the corridor.

Highways within rural area factors:

- Roadways serve to connect to other highways with the town road system.
- For a segment with more than one roadway leading into an area, only the main road for the area would be selected. Preferably, a full intersection would be selected over T-intersections to provide guidance to the major access for the area.
- Eligible locations will be located 1 mile apart or further.

Adequate spacing of all signs in necessary to ensure that sign clutter does not diminish the visibility and message. While the criteria above may be met, the ability to install a sign without blocking other key signs will also be taken into consideration. Closely spaced intersections or lack of right of way width for sign placement may not allow for a advanced signing for a particular roadway. In areas with closely spaced intersections, motorists may see the directional sign and inadvertently be misdirected on to the wrong roadway. Location



and placement of all signing is dependent on space, right-of-way availability and other signing. These issues can result in the inability to install a sign although qualifying criteria is met.

The municipality may be consulted to help determine the appropriate intersection to sign when a choice must be made between two or more intersections accessing the area.

### **Secondary**

### City Destination Signing

In rural areas, cities are typically isolated from each other and are often located off local or lower classification county highways. It may be desirable to supply the road user information concerning the destination in addition to the guidance provided from route markers and advanced street name signs. Guidance to specific cities off a highway route is done by means of Destination Signs (per the MnMUTCD).

In addition, all the following criteria must be met:

- Signing is permitted from the major county highway to a lower county highway or local road. Signing will not be permitted from the major county highway to another major county highway or directing to the trunk highway system.
- City must be located in an isolated rural area (this signing is not intended for cities that share borders with other cities.
- City must be located directly off the highway qualifying for signs and be no further than 6 miles from the qualifying highway where the sign would be placed. Trailblazing from the destination sign on the major highway or other highways or local routes will not be permitted.
- City will be permitted only one sign in each direction from the qualifying highway.

Destination signs are placed following any junction or advance route assemblies. Because the destination sign is of lesser importance than the Junction, Advance Route assemblies, the Destination sign may not be able to be accommodated where sign spacing is critical. Due to spacing, if a destination sign is at a location with a county highway, advanced street name signs may be eliminated to accommodate the city Destination sign. A judgment will be made by the County to determine which message (Street Name or Destination) will provide better overall guidance to the motorist.

### Water Crossings

In Carver County highway crossings with the South Fork of the Crow River and the Minnesota River will be signed. All other water crossings are not eligible for signing.



### Traffic Generator Signing

The street name sign and directional guidance signing is the primary traffic signing to help direct unfamiliar motorists to destinations along the County highway system. However, signing for a specific regional attraction or facility that generates significant volume of motorists unfamiliar with the local area can be beneficial. Guide and information signs are intended to provide notice to motorists unfamiliar with the area to better facilitate travel and turn maneuvers to the destination. Highway signing is not intended to be an advertising medium. The County will review each request to determine if permitting this signing would be the appropriate method to aid traffic on the County system traveling to a specific facility.

This signing is meant for traffic generators that are major regional attractions or facilities that draw motorists from beyond the local community. They are significant for the cultural, historical, or recreational experience and public appeal of the generator. Signing shall not be provided if the facility is readily visible or if effective off right-of-way directional signing is present or can be provided. Signing of this type is to help direct traffic and straight ahead signing will not be permitted. Predominantly retail, business, or manufacturing centers are not normally eligible for guide signing. In addition, either the following criteria 1 or criteria 2 (parts a through e) must be met to qualify for consideration for traffic generator signing:

1) Facilities that qualify for white on green or brown (depending on facility) signing on the state or interstate system under generator sign criteria in the MnDOT Traffic Engineering Manual, Chapter 6 that require supplemental signing on the County system to identify the route to the generator. OR

2) Facilities that generally attract non-local persons or groups unfamiliar with the location of the generator. Information regarding the generator will be sued to determine the benefit of the signing to the motorists including the following:

- a. Public or private but open to the general public and provide a historical, cultural, or recreational experience. Retail, business or manufacturing centers are not eligible uses.
- b. Generates approximately 250 vehicles daily (measured based on site information and traffic generation tools).
- c. Open a minimum of 5 days a week, during normal business hours (typically eight hours per day).
- d. Open at least 6 months of the year. (signing indicating seasonal operation may be required.)
- e. Generators with access directly to the County system are not eligible unless the access/facility signing for the generator is poorly visible to the motorists on the highway and on-site changes cannot be reasonable made to allow the generator's on-site signs to be more visible.



Examples of eligible and ineligible signs:

<u>Typically Eligible</u> Regional Park Public Golf Course (Not driving ranges or miniature golf) School/Church Zoos

<u>Typically Ineligible</u> City Park Industrial Shops Retail Shops/Private Businesses

Fabrication, installation and replacement costs will be the responsibility of the requestor at current County rates. Replacement will be every 15 years.

### **Community Recognition Signs**

Incorporated cities/townships often request to have a sign placed along the highway at the city/township limit to advise motorists that they are entering this community. These signs can be permitted within the right of way provided the signs meet the following conditions:

- 1. Sign conveys city name and may contain city logo provided it is legible for the highway speed.
- 2. Standard signs are located at the city limit on main County routes.
- 3. Sign may utilize city logo and can have a maximum of three colors.
- 4. Additional city information such as parking regulations, drug free community or city awards may be posted on or beside the city sign. Standard signing should be utilized for ordinance information and installation criteria must be met.
- 5. No advertising will be permitted.

Costs to fabricate, install and replace the signs will be the responsibility of the city/township at current County rates.

### **Parking Restrictions**

The County will install parking restriction signs provided the city/township pass a no parking resolution for the area.

### **Political and Private Signs**

Political and private signs will not be permitted within road right of way.



### Electronic Signs

Electronic signs will be utilized and installed only after an engineering study determines the need. Electronic signs include:

- Driver Feedback Signs (used in school zones and transition zones)
- Rapid Flashing Beacons at Pedestrian Crossings
- Blinking Signs (i.e. LED Stop Signs)
- Rural Intersection Conflict Warning System (RICWS)
- Other electronic signs that are proven by research

### **Maintenance of Signs**

It shall be the Carver County engineer's responsibility to decide which signs should be replaced by maintenance personnel or by contract. Compliance with MN MUTCD retroreflectivity requirements will be achieved using a management method using the expected sign life. Carver County adopts 15 years for the life of signs with ASTM Type XI sheeting material. Applicable sign life may be revisited to determine appropriate length based on the latest research. Maintenance personnel should replace signs according to the following guidelines:

- 1. All signs are inspected annually for normal daytime visibility and legibility. Nighttime surveys may also be completed every few years to discover locations of vandalism or other issues. All signs not performing their function shall be repaired or scheduled for replacement.
- 2. Before each year's replacement program, the sign crew should review all signs. Additional signing, relocation of signing, or removal of needless signing can be incorporated into the program at this time. The available sign budget and the current inventory will be reviewed to determine feasibility of maintaining the current inventory.
- 3. The replacement program includes the use of the latest standards for sign design, dimensioning, mounting, and roadway location.
- 4. As each new sign is installed, the mounting should be checked for deterioration. Bent or excessively rusted posts should be replaced. All posts will comply with the AASHTO Manual for Assessing Safety Hardware for crashworthiness.

#### BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

Carver County Personnel Policy and certain collective bargaining agreements require the County to contribute to Countysponsored health insurance for certain retirees. Personnel Policy further requires the Board to set the amount the County will contribute to each retiree's insurance for the coming year. In order to qualify for this benefit, retirees must have:

- been employed prior to June, 1, 2010,
- had at least 20 consecutive years of benefit-eligible service prior to retirement,
- attained age 60, but not yet be Medicare-eligible,
- maintained County-sponsored insurance since retirement, and
- refrained from full-time employment.

The recommended monthly cafeteria contributions for active employees are \$1,175.00 for employees selecting family health insurance and \$660.00 for employees selecting single health insurance. In past years, the County Board has set the contribution for eligible retirees at an amount consistent with the cafeteria contributions. Retirees selecting family coverage would receive \$1,175.00 per month toward their insurance and those selecting single coverage would receive the lesser of the single premium amount or \$660.00 per month. Employee Relations is recommending the same contributions for 2014. The qualified retirees for 2014 include two with family insurance and fifteen with single insurance, with an additional single coverage anticipated to come on mid-year. The anticipated total 2014 County cost is \$150,300.

Motion to continue the special retiree contributions toward health insurance at the cafeteria rates, not to exceed the premium for the coverage the retirees select in 2014.

### Purpose:

Carver County Public Works and Planning & Water Management requests the Board's approval to post the Carver County Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Pedestrian Facilities Transition Plan (Transition Plan) for County Highway Rights of Way for public comment.

As required by Title II of ADA, 28 CFR. Part 35 Sec. 35.105 and Sec. 35.150, Carver County Public Works has conducted a self-evaluation of its facilities within public rights of way and has developed this Transition Plan detailing how the organization will ensure that all of those pedestrian facilities are accessible to all individuals.

The final draft Transition Plan document will be presented to Board Members at the Board meeting. This memo summarizes the Transition Plan's requirements and contents.

### ADA Background and Transition Plan Requirements:

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), enacted on July 26, 1990, is a civil rights law prohibiting discrimination against individuals on the basis of disability. ADA consists of five titles outlining protections in the following areas:

- I. Employment
- II. State and local government services
- III. Public accommodations
- IV. Telecommunications
- V. Miscellaneous Provisions

Title II of ADA pertains to the programs, activities and services public entities provide stating, "...no qualified individual with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of a public entity, or be subjected to discrimination by any such entity." (42 USC. Sec. 12132; 28 CFR. Sec. 35.130). As a provider of public transportation services and programs, Carver County Public Works must comply with this section of the Act as it specifically applies to public service agencies.

Developing a Transition Plan meets a key Title II compliance requirement that took effect in 1992. The Dept. of Justice released implementation guidance for transition plans in 2006 and 2007 and the Minnesota Local Road Research Board (LRRB) released guidance for ADA transition plans for public rights of way. Based on LRRB guidance, a Transition Plan outlines actions the County will take to ensure all pedestrian facilities within County rights of way are accessible to people of all abilities.

### Transition Plan Contents:

LRRB guidance identifies key elements to be included in a public rights of way transition plan. The following requirements are incorporated into Carver County's Transition Plan in accordance with LRRB guidance:

- Plan development includes public participation
  - Public meetings were held at the Chanhassen Public Library on September 5, 2013 and September 6, 2013 to gather input.
  - Eleven individuals attended two public meetings. Attendees included residents and City staff from Chanhassen, Chaska, Victoria, Waconia, and Watertown.
  - The final plan document will be posted for a two week comment period upon Board approval.
- Self-evaluation of existing facilities
  - Public Works has conducted a comprehensive inventory of pedestrian facilities on County rights of way to identify locations not compliant with ADA specifications.
  - A schedule of pedestrian facility improvements to ADA standards
    - The transition plan establishes a timeline for implementation.
- Prioritizes improvements
  - Walkways serving public facilities receive priority.
  - The Transition Plan also prioritizes remaining pedestrian facilities in County rights of way.
- Describe improvement methods
  - Primarily, improvements will be made as scheduled street and utility improvement projects are implemented.
  - Stand-alone sidewalk and ADA accessibility improvements projects may occur if dedicated funds become available.
- Establishes a public grievance procedure
  - A process is established for members of the public to file a complaint and for Public Works to respond if a member of the public believes the County has not provided reasonable accommodation.
- Indicates the official responsible
  - Key Public Works staff who are responsible for plan implementation and for handling filed grievances are listed in the Transition Plan.

Carver County Public Works is amending the Roadways System Plan (RSP) Appendix of the Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan. As a result, a minor plan amendment to the Comprehensive Plan is necessary. The Planning & Water Management Department is responsible for the amendment process<sup>1</sup>.

The amendment will incorporate information developed by planning and analysis completed since the RSP was adopted into the 2030 Comprehensive Plan in April, 2010. The proposed updates section of this memo provides more details outlining the content of the proposed amendment.

County staff anticipates completing the amendment process in January, 2014. Initial discussions with Metropolitan Council staff indicate this proposed amendment would likely qualify as a minor amendment eligible for a more streamlined 30-day administrative review. Prior to submitting the amendment to the Metropolitan Council the County would conduct a 60-day public comment period, and seek final approval from the Planning Commission and the County Board. The timeline section of this memo provides more details about the amendment process.

Periodically amending the RSP and the 2030 Comprehensive Plan to incorporate new information enhances consistent and coordinated implementation of goals and policies that guide the County's long-term growth and development.

### **Proposed Updates:**

Since adoption of the Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan in April, 2010, Public Works has conducted four key planning and analysis efforts that inform the proposed amendment:

1. County Safety Plan:

Prepared as part of the MN statewide highway safety planning process. The plan describes safety emphasis areas; identifies high-priority, low cost strategies; documents at risk locations.

2. Road System Plan Implementation Study:

This study includes refinements and revisions to the 2030 traffic forecasts and recommended roadway improvements for the Carver County Roadway System Plan.

3. 2012 Functional Classification Update:

Reclassification of CR 140 from a collector to an A Minor roadway, approved through Met Council in 2011.

New information from the previously listed projects will be amended into the RSP Appendix of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan by updating informational tables and figures in addition to minor updates to supporting text. Table 1 details the information to be amended, which of the four key planning efforts inform the specific update, and which page(s) of the RSP will be edited.

Given the limited nature of this routine update based on changes resulting from interim planning activities, staff considers this amendment to be a minor amendment. Updates will not impact planned land use, population projections, traffic volume, or housing unit development.

### Timeline:

Planning & Water Management is coordinating this process to submit the proposed amendment to the Metropolitan Council by the end of January, 2014. Following submission of this minor amendment, the Metropolitan Council would conduct a 30-day review.<sup>2</sup> Provided the January target is met, Metropolitan Council's administrative review and approval would occur February through March, 2014.

To meet the January, 2014, target for submission staff must draft the amended tables and supporting information, gain approval from the County Planning Commission, administer a 60-day comment period for adjacent jurisdictions, and gain conditional approval from the County Board.<sup>3</sup> Table 2 details the process and timeline for this proposed minor amendment.

**WHEREAS,** Under Minnesota Statute 103B.211 to 255, Carver County is the water management authority (Carver County Water Management Organization-CCWMO) for the area of the County not under jurisdiction by a watershed district, and;

**WHEREAS**, the CCWMO updated the Water Management Plan in 2010 which meets the requirements defined in MN statute 103B.231 - Surface Water Planning, and MN Statute 103B.255 and;

**WHEREAS,** MN state statute 103B.235 Local water management plans (LWMP's) requires that local government units having land use planning and regulatory responsibility for territory within the watershed shall prepare or cause to be prepared a local water management plan, capital improvement program, and official controls as necessary to bring local water management into conformance with the CCWMO Plan within two years of the adoption of the WMO Plan. Local Plans must meet the requirements of the CCWMO Comprehensive Water Resources Management Plan (WMO Plan) as well as the general requirements of Minnesota Statutes 103B.235 and Minnesota Rules Chapter 8410, and;

WHEREAS, The CCWMO granted an extension for the submittal of LWMP's to June 2013; and;

**WHEREAS,** The municipalities of Cologne, Mayer, New Germany, Norwood Young America, Waconia and Watertown are in the CCWMO and therefore must meet the requirements of the CCWMO Watershed ManagementPlan, and;

**WHEREAS,** The municipalities of Cologne, Mayer, New Germany, Norwood Young America, Waconia and Watertown have submitted a draft plan to the CCWMO for review, and a final plan for approval consideration, and;

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** THAT The Carver County Board of Commissioners hereby approves the Local Water Management Plans for the following municipalities: Cologne, Mayer, New Germany, Norwood Young America, Waconia and Watertown, all dated June 2013 with the conditional understanding that

1) The municipalities will update project lists and priorities within the timeframes listed in the plans and will provide this information to the CCWMO.

2) CCWMO approval of these LWMP's does not constitute approval of the funding requests listed in the plan as these will be evaluated and approved separately;

3) These municipalities are not requesting any delegation of authority in this plan and through this approval the CCWMO is not granting any such delegation.
