A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on September 3, 2013. Chair Tim Lynch convened the session at 9:00 a.m.

Members present: Tim Lynch, Chair, James Ische, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the August 27, 2013, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Resolution #47-13, Carver County Right of Way Plat 21.

Authorized the use of BB guns at Lake Minnewashta Parks on September 21, 2013, by Scout Pack 337.

Adopted Findings of Fact and issued Order #PZ21030022 for the issuance of Interim Use Permit #PZ200130022, Michael Widmer, Waconia Township.

Approved amendment #7 to contract #12-050 with Short Elliott Hendrickson, Inc. for \$36,875 pending finalization of the contract review process.

Reviewed Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$169,289.33.

Motion carried unanimously.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Board adopt a Resolution in support of the continued operations of the Southwest Transit service. He explained the Met Council had been doing some studies along the 212 corridor that will affect the operations of the Southwest Transit.

Len Simich, Southwest Transit, explained Southwest Transit Commission was created 27 years ago with the support of the County Board. He stated Southwest Transit has had a strained relationship with the Met Council and he was asking for the Board's help.

He stated bus rapid transit would basically be the same service Southwest is providing and control would be shifted to the Met Council. Simich indicated light rail access to their station will affect service they provide to Carver County and they will be forced to reduce service levels. He indicated they were seeking the support from the three cities and the County that would outline the requirements if service is provided. Simich stressed the need to continue local control.

Craig Peterson, former Councilman and former Met Council representative, stated he believed that the Council was trying to take over Southwest and eliminate it. He indicated he strongly believed that if nothing is done Southwest Transit, as it is today, will not be there. He stressed they needed to take action, work with their legislators to make a difference and the upcoming session would be critical.

The Board recognized the excellent service provided by Southwest and the need to maintain local control.

Maluchnik offered the following Resolution, seconded by Workman:

Resolution #48-13

In Support of the Continued Operations of the Southwest Metro Transit Service and Opposing any Action of the Metropolitan Council that would make Southwest Transit Service Obsolete

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Bill Weckman, Public Works, requested the Board to approve a negotiated settlement for right of way on County Road 18. He stated they needed additional right of way for this project from approximately ten property owners and were trying to negotiate settlements.

Ische offered the following Resolution, seconded by Degler:

Resolution #49-13
Right of Way Acquisition – CSAH 18 – Project SP 010-618-013

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Randy Wulf, Public Health & Environment, requested the Board recognize the month of September as National Preparedness Month. He noted emergency preparedness is an issue that affects everyone and urged residents to become engaged and access information.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to adopt the National Preparedness Month proclamation. Motion carried unanimously.

Julie Frick, Community Development Agency Director, requested the Board approve the CDA's 2014 levy and budget. She explained the CDA was a local governmental agency created in 1980 and identified the services and programs they provide.

John Sullivan, CDA, explained the CDA business loan program. He stated they use levy funds and reinvest them back into growing businesses that create jobs and enhance the tax base. He noted they have not had any defaults. Sullivan pointed out their work in assisting the City of Chaska on the data center project and their collaboration with the County and the City of Carver on the Park and Ride project.

Karen Reed, CDA Finance Manager, highlighted their 2014 budget and levy. She stated they were requesting a levy of \$1,850,205 which reduces the impact on an average valued home by \$1.03.

Ische offered the following Resolution, seconded by Maluchnik:

Resolution #50-13

Approving the 2014 Proposed Budget and Payable 2014 Tax Levy of the Carver County Community Development Agency and Certifying Said Levy to the County Auditor

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Dave Hemze, County Administrator, requested the Board set the 2014 preliminary budget and levy. He noted the budget hearings and work sessions previously held and the stage they are now at to set the preliminary levy. He pointed out the decrease in tax impact to an average valued home since 2005 and the County's AAA bond rating.

He highlighted the services provided and the allocation of County taxes per month on an average value home.

David Frischmon, Finance, reviewed the overall strategy to continue the tax decrease. He stated new construction provided one million in additional tax base. He pointed out the increased demand for services, capital and inflation costs all put pressure on the budget for 2014.

Frischmon reviewed the 2014 proposed bond sale to fund the 101/Y/61 construction and County Road 10 contribution.

Kerie Anderka, Employee Relations, summarized 2014 recommended staffing changes totaling 17.58 FTEs. She noted 56% of those were non levy funded and they would still not be at the same staffing level as they were in 2008.

Frischmon reviewed 2014 levy adjustments. He pointed out the increase in wheelage tax revenue for road projects and the plan to continue to operate the existing AIS program. He highlighted county program aid received over the past several years.

He reviewed budget increases and pointed out the major increase in the 2014 budget was driven by the \$76 million for the 101/Y/61 project. Frischmon identified the preliminary tax impact to an average value home, commercial and agricultural properties.

Frischmon highlighted the 2015 long term financial plan pointing out the need to look at federally deficient rated bridges, two new libraries, a master plan for Public Work facilities and continuing to focus on sustainability and maintenance of Parks and expansion of trails.

He reviewed the budget schedule and proposed date for the public meeting on the 2014 budget.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to set the 2014 preliminary County tax levy at \$47,546,920 and set the truth in taxation public meeting for December 5, 2013, at 6:00 p.m. Degler, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik voted aye. Workman voted nay. Motion carried.

Paul Moline, Public Health and Environment, requested the Board set the preliminary 2014 Water Management Organization levy. He pointed out this was separate from the general levy and the WMO covers 85% of the County. He noted the increase of \$32,000 over 2013 to cover the AIS program and project budget. Moline identified the proposed projects for 2014 and stated the projects had been recommended by the Water, Environment and Natural Resources Committee.

Maluchnik moved, Ische seconded, to set the preliminary 2014 Carver County Water Management levy at \$556,984. Degler, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik voted aye. Workman voted nay. Motion carried.

Degler moved, Ische seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session and convene as the Carver County Regional Rail Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Rail authority approve the preliminary levy for the Rail Authority. He reviewed the proposed use of the funds in 2014 and indicated the levy has remained the same since 2008.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to approve setting the Carver County Regional Rail Authority's 2014 preliminary tax levy at \$120,000. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn as the Carver County Regional Rail Authority at 10:28 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.



The MCWD is the local unit of government responsible for managing and protecting the water resources of the Minnehaha Creek Watershed. Most of the watershed - 148 square miles - is in Hennepin County while the remaining 29 square miles are in Carver County. Four percent of the District's annual levy or about \$309,680 in 2013 is collected from property taxes in Carver County with the remaining 96 percent coming from Hennepin County and state grants.						
Recent MCWD project and partnership highlights						
<ul> <li>Victoria, the MCWD recently completed a \$448,507 restoration of a wetland near Steiger Lake, which will catch and filter stormwater from a 250-acre area before it enters Steiger Lake. The wetland, located on the south side of Highway 5 between 80th Street and 78th Street, was previously drained and ditched, sending polluted stormwater downstream.</li> <li>In 2013 and 2014 the District will embark on a comprehensive effort to improve water quality in the Six Mile creek system. It recently completed a diagnostic study of the Six Mile Creek subwatershed which will set goals and identify opportunities to enhance area lakes. Part of this effort includes a partnership with Dr. Peter Sorenson (U of M) to help the District design effective, long- term carp management programs.</li> <li>The MCWD has been working on many fronts to help the county and its cities become state leaders in resource management. In addition to the annual Clean Water Summit it hosts at the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum each</li> </ul>						
<ul> <li>year, the MCWD has partnered with the county and citizen-led lake associations on AIS management and hosted an open house in Victoria earlier this year as part of its Weigh in on Clean Water initiative.</li> <li>The MCWD is also partnering with the City of Victoria on a project to help it adapt its stormwater management systems to a changing climate. Funded by a \$400,000 grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and in partnership with Antioch University, the researchers used scientific models to determine how the city's stormwater infrastructure will withstand more frequent and heavier storms. The MCWD hosted focus groups and community meetings to develop effective strategies to keep up with the changing weather patterns.</li> </ul>




