A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on May 4, 2021. The building remained closed due to the health pandemic but the meeting was being recorded and posted to the County's website. Chair Tim Lynch convened the session at 9:07 a.m.

Members present: Tim Lynch, Chair, Gayle Degler, Vice Chair, John P. Fahey, Matt Udermann and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

David Hemze, Administrator, acknowledged the receipt of public comments from Sam Cooke regarding the Minnesota Broadcast Association and indicated the comments would be posted on the County's website.

The following amendment was made to the agenda:

6.4.1 Provide funding for a permanent Park Maintenance Technician position.

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

Udermann moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2021, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Awarded and approved contract with Sir Lines-A-Lot Lines Striping Company for \$55,876 for the 2021 pavement markings-epoxy hand work, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved professional services agreement with The Humanity Alliance in the amount of \$345,037.68 using budget stabilization funds to provide nutritious weekend meals to eligible residents impacted by the pandemic through 9/30/21, pending contract approval.

Approved special event use permit for St. Joseph's Catholic Church for the May 22, 2021, Walk on Waconia event.

Authorized Public Services' acceptance of donation of Cabin Fever gift cards and approved distribution of gift cards for AIS youth program.

Approved agreement with TC&W Railroad Company for the railroad crossing replacement at Highway 10, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved addition of the summer 2021 Prep Adventure program and staffing clarification to Phase III reopening plan.

Approved maintenance access agreement for stormwater pond and granting of a permanent trail easement and drainage and utility easement to the City of Watertown for the Watertown Wetland Restoration Project, peding finalization of the contract review process.

Authorized HH&S acceptance of donation to Encore program.

Reappointed Lyndon Colebrook-Robjent as the Carver County Engineer to a four year term ending December 31, 2025.

Resolution #49-21, Joint Powers Agreement No. 1045437 with State of Minnesota for Professional & Technical Services – TH 212 (Cologne to Norwood Young America).

Resolution #50-21 to Approve the Local Water Management Plan for the City of Carver.

Authorized Chair to sign the contract with WSB Associates, Inc., to complete the Watertown Streambank Feasibility Study pending contract review.

Adopted the Findings of Fact and issue Order #PZ20210009 for the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit, Michael Formaneck, Waconia Township.

Adopted the Findings of Fact and issue Order #PZ20210013 for the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit, Steven Erhard, Benton Township.

Resolution #51-21 Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for Jonathan Carver Parkway Project – Phase 1.

Resolution #52-21, Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for US 212 Project – Dahlgren Township.

Approved grant agreement SG-12363 with the Metropolitan Council pending finalization of the contract review process.

Reviewed April 27, 2021, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$338,582.90 and reviewed May 4, 2021, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$502,653.92.

Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Fahey seconded, to open the public hearing regarding the amendment to the Tobacco Ordinance. Motion carried unanimously.

Kendra Olson, Elections and Licensing Department, explained Federal and State law changes that raised the minimum age for the sale of tobacco products from 18 to 21 years. She stated the purpose of the Ordinance amendment was to bring uniformity between the County's tobacco ordinance and federal and state laws. She indicated they worked with the County Attorney's office on the language and are required to hold a public hearing. Olson stated a public hearing notice was published and no public comments were received regarding the proposed amendment.

The Board discussed if they were required to do this and who was responsible for enforcement. Olson clarified the County had enforcement authority when the County issues the license and there were compliance checks they are required to do. The Board acknowledged while this was a public hearing, they were not able to livestream today's meeting due to technical difficulties.

Hemze clarified the public could participate if they requested to participate via WebEx or participate through a phone call. The Board discussed the option to continue the public hearing to give the public an opportunity to view today's Board meeting and make comments.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to continue the public hearing regarding the amendment to the tobacco ordinance to May 18th. Motion carried unanimously.

Rod Franks, HH&S Director, appeared before the Board for an update on the Steiner Kelting Mental Wellness Facility and for approval of the use agreement. He reviewed the history of the site and explained Ridgeview Medical Center and County's proposal to convert the hospice home to a mental health residential crisis stabilization facility. He stated the County purchased the site utilizing County funds and was appropriated 1.25 million in bonding from the State to support the expansion of the facility. Franks explained short term residential stabilization services would be provided to individuals who are stable but needed additional support before returning home. He noted there was a gap for services for this type of facility in this area.

He highlighted the services to be provided. Franks stated the expansion was now complete. He indicated the Citizen Advisory Committee provided input on the both the request for proposal and selection of the provider. Franks stated they have been working with the Minnesota Management and Budget Office and service provider on the use agreement. He explained the terms of the use agreement with People, Inc. and the future bond sale that will occur in 2022 or 2023 to reimburse the County for the purchase of the facility. He noted the option for the service provider to purchase the facility after 25 years and continue to use as a crisis residential stabilization facility or return the property back to the County ownership.

The Board discussed the terms and length of the agreement and the options the County has.

Franks stated they were working with the service provider to engage the community prior to opening and currently the provider operates three other facilities. He added it was important to maintain these short term residential facilities and continue to expand. Franks indicated the Citizens Advisory Committee could continue to be involved if warranted and they could review this six months after reopening. He believed there were enough beds to handle the number of County residents as the turnaround was quick.

Franks clarified the County does not have to sell the property after 25 years to People, Inc. and they are aware of that. He stated the intent was to establish this facility in the community and keep it here.

Dave Frischmon, Finance, explained they did have discussions with MMB and explained to the Board the requirement to issue debt.

Workman moved, Udermann seconded, to approve the use agreement with People, Inc., for the Steiner Kelting Mental Wellness Facility pending the approval of Attorney, Risk and Minnesota Management and Budget office. Motion carried unanimously.

Franks requested the Board approve the addition of 1.0 program supervisor for the Crisis Team. He explained the previous partnership with Scott County to provide crisis program services and the decision to separate from the joint program. He indicated as they began to grow, they looked at ways to provide support and funding.

Stephanie Combey, HH&S, pointed out the work of the crisis co-responder and the number of calls to National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. She indicated the Suicide Prevention Lifeline grant, along with the crisis program grant, provided an opportunity to increase staff.

Degler moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the addition of 1.0 FTE crisis program supervisor effective July 1, 2021 and related budget amendment. Motion carried unanimously.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Board approve the reorganization in the Public Works Park and Recreation Department. He reviewed the current shared position between the Parks and Highway Department and plan to create a full time parks maintenance position funded with the Regional Rail funds. Robjent identified current FTEs also funded through the Rail budget. He indicated the highway maintenance position would become a part time position until a full time position can be funded through the 2022 budget.

He highlighted proposed Rail Authority projects over the next five years and the need to consider increasing the Rail Authority levy in 2022. Robjent noted, as they added corridors, they have to look at future needs.

Udermann moved, Degler seconded, to approve a reorganization in Public Works to combine partial FTE's into a 1.0 FTE creating a permanent Park Maintenance Technician position and to approve related budget amendment. Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Fahey seconded, to recess as the County Board and convene as the Carver County Regional Rail Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

Fahey moved, Workman seconded, to authorize using \$26,000 to provide additional funding for a permanent Park Maintenance Technician position. Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Fahey seconded, to adjourn as the Carver County Regional Rail Authority and reconvene as the County Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Mary Kaye Wahl, Finance, requested the Board approve creating a 1.0 FTE accounting supervisor and eliminate 1.0 FTE accountant. She reviewed the number of Finance FTEs and the reorganization that occurred with Taxpayer Services in the past. Wahl stated they were looking at creating efficiencies for more complicated processes and proactively prepare for future growth. She clarified necessary funds would be redirected from their current budget.

Degler moved, Udermann seconded, to approve the elimination of the 1.0 FTE Finance Accountant position, to create a 1.0 FTE Accounting Supervisor and approve related budget amendment. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 10:55 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.

Carver County has contracted for STS services with the MN Department of Corrections since 1990. Each year, the STS Crew Leader supervises groups of offenders on probation and those released from the jail for the purpose of reducing jail sentences and fulfilling court orders. As a result, Carver County benefits from the labor provided by non-violent offenders. STS crews have worked directly with Carver County Parks, Public Works, Environmental Services, Carver County Facilities, Sheriff's Office, Three Rivers Park District, and many other entities, including cities and townships. The State of Minnesota covers 25% of the total cost of the program each year, including management and training for crew leaders, maintenance of vehicles and equipment, fuel costs, insurance and liability. Court Services also receives additional outside revenue over \$10,000 through a service contract with Three Rivers Park District, and through other user fees. The program places AmeriCorps members with host organizations around the state to assist communities and local governments in addressing a variety of statewide needs. Members serve at their host sites for 11 months, from mid-September through mid-August. Host site organizations include cities, counties, public schools, universities, watershed districts, and non-profit organizations. Carver County Environmental Services has participated in the program since 2010, hosting members on six occasions. We are fortunate to be selected as a host site once again for 2021-2022. The MN GreenCorps program received 84 total applications and selected a total of 48 host sites. Our GreenCorps member will assist Environmental Services staff with expanding organics recycling and food rescue through the County's partnerships with the Minnesota Composting Council and local non-profits His House Foundation and The Humanity Alliance. The member will also help implement Fix-it Clinics, a new source reduction effort designed to reduce the number of repairable objects that are thrown in the trash. These efforts are important to meet goals in our Solid Waste Management Master Plan, as approved by the Carver County Board and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA). Costs to Carver County are limited to in-kind training, supervision, office space/equipment, and potentially some minor incidental costs (such as mileage and training). Salaries of GreenCorps members are paid by the AmeriCorps program and the MPCA. The MPCA requires that finalists submit a resolution of support from their governing body. BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:									
The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program is to provide federal funds to States to assist State, local, territorial, and tribal governments in preparing for all hazards. Title VI of the Stafford Act authorizes FEMA to make grants available for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal Government, States, and their political subdivisions. A cost match is required under this program. The County must equally match the Federal contribution pursuant to Sections 611(j) and 613 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Pub. L. No. 93-288), as amended, (42 U.S.C. §§ 5121-5207). Unless otherwise authorized by law, Federal funds cannot be matched with other Federal funds. Wages and benefits are eligible for reimbursement with EMPG funds, so long as the staff time is spent on emergency management work during the sub-grant period by personnel who meet the training and exercise requirements and are included in the application's Staffing Pattern - Paid Staff form. Carver County Emergency Management utilizes this grant for earned wages within the Emergency Management Program. - WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners authorized the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, to make initial written offers of just compensation to the Owners within the Project from whom property interests are required; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, have negotiated settlement(s)
with the Owners impacted by the Project as described in said Exhibit A.

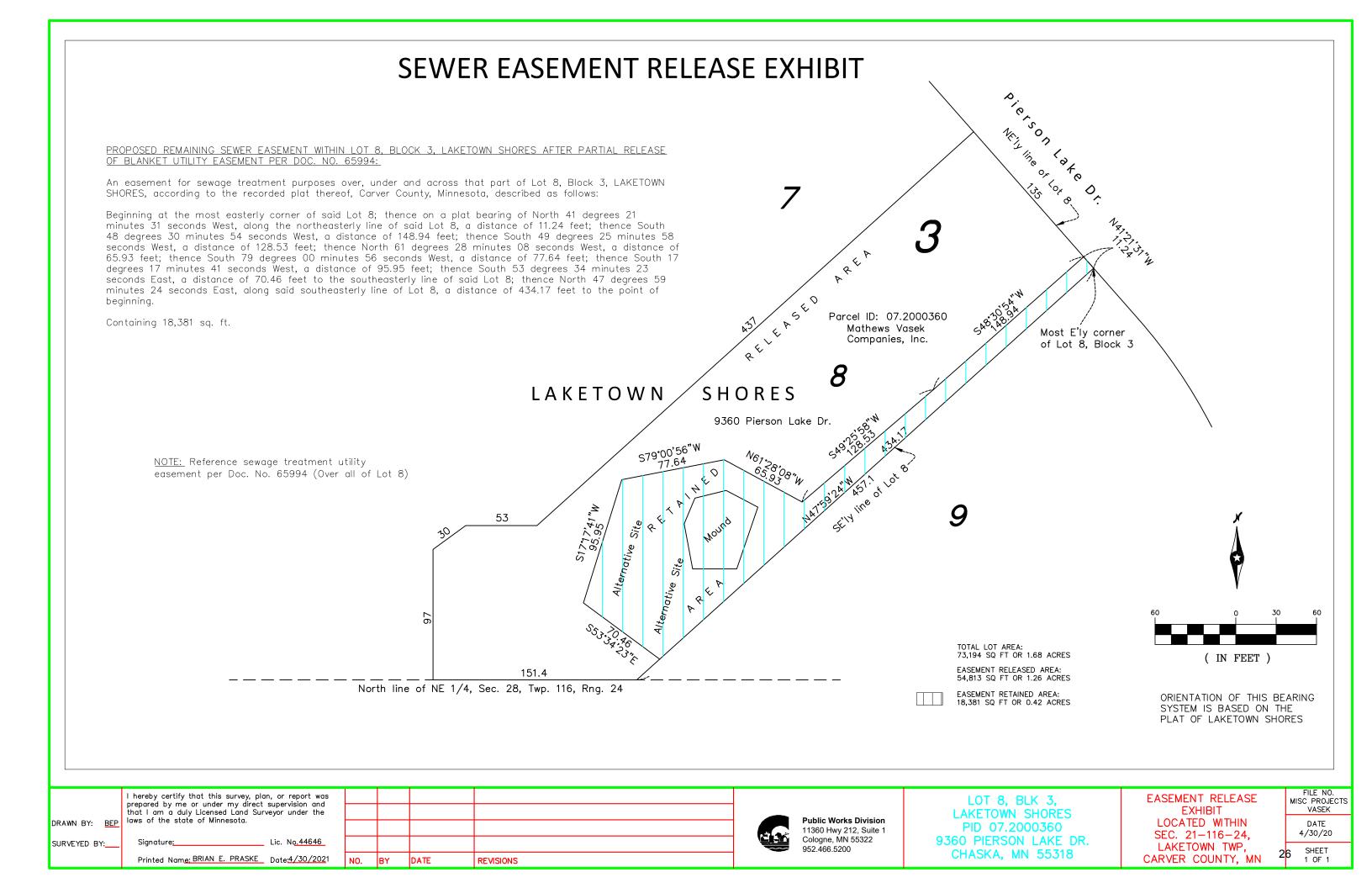

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Amount of Time Requested: minutes Presenter: Title: Strategic Initiative: Growth: Manage the challenges and opportunities resulting from growth and development BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION: Carver County, MnDDT and the Southwest Corridor Transportation Coalition have been working together to improve US 212 between Chaska/Carver and Norwood Young America for many years. Carver County has led or assisted in many activities along the corridor in the last several years. Preliminary design work is continuing on the Benton Township Phase from the City of Norwood Young America to the City of Cologne, which includes a 4-lane expansion and safety improvements as necessary along the corridor, which will complete the vision for the corridor. SRF Consulting Group has started work to update the environmental documentation and prepare preliminary engineering plans, a cost estimate and environmental documentation and prepare preliminary engineering plans, a cost estimate and environmental documentation in support of the project. It has been determined by County and MnDOT staff that additional requested services are needed from SRF Consulting Group that are not able to be performed by our internal staff. The additional scope of work includes preparing the right of way acquisition title research, drawings and legal documents needed to begin the appraisal and acquisition process. In addition, additional public engagement and communication efforts are needed to connect with the public to promote the need for this important project and for future grant applications. THE HOME EXTENDED BUSINESS ACCESSORY USE IS AUTHORIZED BY PLANNING COMMISSION RESOLUTION #PZ20140023, AS FOLLOWS:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT THE CARVER COUNTY ZONING ADMINISTRATOR SHALL ISSUE INTERIM USE PERMIT #PZ20140023. THIS PERMIT IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO THE CARVER COUNTY CODE, SECTIONS 152.079 C2 & 152.080 C6 FOR A FARM RELATED BUSINESS/LARGE SCALE ACTIVITY ON PROPERTY LEGALLY DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A". THIS PERMIT SHALL TERMINATE AND SUPERSEDE THE PRIOR CUP #PZ20100020 ON THE SUBJECT PROPERTY. THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS SHALL BE ATTACHED TO THE PERMIT:

- 1. The permit is subject to compliance review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by Land Management for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners and/or operators are encouraged to contact Land Management as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. The Sovereign Estate Wine (SEW) shall operate in accordance with the submitted operational plans (dated: 9/17/14 & 10/3/14) and site plan (2014 aerial). These plans shall be attached to and be considered part of this permit. Any future buildings will require discussion with Land Management for a determination as to whether an application for amendment or similar consideration is necessary.
- 3. The SEW operation shall be permitted to be open year round (January December), and shall be allowed to be open Monday Thursday (10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.), Friday and Saturday (10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.) and Sunday (12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.). Wine processing is considered to be an agricultural use and would be conducted year round and not open to the public.

- 4. Two (2) annual special events shall be allowed, which will exceed the normal hours of operation (the two special events will be closed by 11:00 p.m. each day): The 4th of July Holiday Event (not to exceed 2 days in length) and the Fall Grape Stomp Festival (not to exceed three (3) days in length). A maximum of three (3) additional special events (per calendar year) shall be allowed, with the County Board of Commissioners approval, pursuant to Section 152.074 and of the County Zoning Code. All special event requests shall be subject to review by the Waconia Town Board (Road Authority) and the Carver County Land Management Department. Special event requests require an Administrative Permit Application to be submitted, pursuant to Sections 152.074 and 152.080 of the Carver County Zoning Code, for review at least 30-days prior to the special event taking place.
- 5. Outdoor live music events shall be allowed within the approved business hours of operation. Unless it is a reviewed and approved special event, amplified music shall cease at 8:00 p.m.
- 6. All new and existing structures shall be constructed and/or maintained in accordance with State Building Code if they are for personal storage and/or public use. The applicant shall apply for and obtain all necessary building permits from Carver County prior to the modification of any existing structure and/or new construction. Food production activities may only occur if appropriate building permits have been obtained and a Certificate of Occupancy has been issued for those specific business activities. Future structures and/or change in use of the facility will need to be reviewed by the Carver County Land Management Department for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary.
- 7. The existing structure(s), not utilized for the business, shall be used only by the occupant(s) of the residence for agriculture, personal storage, hobbies, recreation, entertainment, family uses, private maintenance and repair activities, and for the keeping of animals and appurtenant equipment and supplies, and as otherwise regulated by this Ordinance.
- 8. The Permittee shall submit a copy of Worker's Compensation insurance for all employees annually, if applicable.
- 9. The Permittee is responsible to the Minnesota Department of Agriculture, and to any other County, State or Federal agencies, for maintaining the required permits and licensure for the retail, liquor, food production and growing operations. The Permittee shall submit copies of all required permits and licenses to Carver County Land Management annually.
- 10. Subsurface Sewage Treatment System (SSTS) compliance is required for the home as per Carver County Zoning Code Section 152.122. Also, pumping records for all holding tanks shall be submitted to the Carver County Environmental Services Department prior to CUP issuance.
- 11. The Permittee shall maintain a conforming Subsurface Sewage Treatment System (SSTS) to accommodate any wastewater that has contact with humans or chemicals associated with the retail sales facility and wine production operation and maintain a monitoring contract with a licensed service provider to keep a valid Operating Permit for the SSTS that serves the facility.
- 12. The Permittee shall comply at all times with the County standards as detailed in Chapter 152 Zoning Code and Chapter 154 Sign Regulations. The Permittee shall not exceed the allowed square footage of signage per property. Any proposed signage within public road right-of-way shall be approved by the local road authority. Off premise signage (on private property) is prohibited, unless a variance is granted for the placement of the signage.
- 13. Outside storage of business equipment and supplies is prohibited unless the storage area is adequately screened from the view of neighboring residences and public roads.
- 14. Pursuant to Section 152.079 of the Carver County Code the residence shall be occupied as a homestead by a principal of the activity.

Hello North Shore neighbors,

I have had discussions with some of our neighbors who have expressed concerns and complaints about operations at Sovereign Estate. This letter is an update of our efforts to ameliorate these problems. We believe that the issues come down to **noise**, **signage**, **traffic**, and we think the following remedies are a fair solution.

- 1. We fully appreciate the nighttime music disturbance, especially from exuberant wedding bands and DJ's. As I have told many of you, and stated at TWSP and County Planning meetings, Sovereign Estate would phase out evening wedding receptions and loud evening music events when other winery revenue alone could sustain our business. Wedding receptions lasting till 10pm or later are quite demanding on SEW staff and are not our idea of a really good time, (even though our guests cannot believe their fantastic experience). We are happy to report SEW is now positioned to phase out late evening wedding receptions beginning 2015. We will also schedule Saturday and Sunday outdoor music for afternoons, seldom lasting past 8pm. We do have one late evening wedding reception already booked for 2015 that we must honor. Starting next year we hope the only time you ever find our music too loud is if you are sitting too close to the stage at the winery, enjoying our wine.
- 2. Waconia Township approved, and we have placed a handsome visible winery sign at the 155 North Shore Road intersection. This should greatly reduce lost drivers turning around on 155 driveways. Also, we qualify for additional directional signs through Carver County Public Works to be located on CR 155. We have always maintained that very little traffic arrives at the winery from the west of North Shore Road. Every directional piece we publish always directs traffic in from 155.
- 3. Two of our county commissioners are personally looking into a 35 mph speed limit on 155 at Raether's bend where there is now only an orange 35mph speed sign. Mr. Ische warned us not to get our hopes up though, because traffic signs are notoriously hard to get, even for a Commish. Regarding winery traffic speed, I think any fair surveillance of our customers would conclude they do not speed on NSR or HWY 155, either coming in or leaving. In fact Phil Burandt told me he personally watched our traffic and he observed slow, courteous driving, no speeders. Furthermore, Mr. Burandt concurred that nearly all Winery traffic came and departed the winery from the east.

This information demonstrates our sincere desire to be good neighbors and solve any current and future complaints you may have with SEW. We truly want you to be as proud of our winery as we are, and feel welcomed anytime on our patio. We hope that with these changes we now have your support for the extended regular evening hours in the CUP request. We want to focus our efforts in the tasting room experience and less on large outdoor events, but can only succeed financially by extending our evening hours of operation. By the way, the requested hours we seek are in line or less than most other Minnesota wineries. Our plan to end evening wedding receptions absolutely necessitates replacing them with more regular winery customers, the majority of which work till 5pm and cannot get here by 6pm. Staying open til 8pm on weekdays, and 10pm on weekends will keep us in business with the courteous, slow driving, quiet crowd that you desire for us, as stated in your petitions.

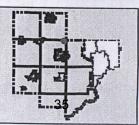

ORDINANCE NO. 96-2021

AMENDING CHAPTER 111: TOBACCO REGULATIONS

This amendment is necessitated by changes to federal law and state law (M.S. § 461) raising the minimum age for the sale of all tobacco products from 18 to 21 years.

THE CARVER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Strikethrough signifies deleted language and underline is new language. The specified sections of Chapter 111: Tobacco Regulations, shall be amended as follows:

§ 111.01 PURPOSE.

- (A) Because the county recognizes that many persons under the age of <u>21</u>18 years purchase or otherwise obtain, possess and use tobacco, tobacco products and tobacco related devices, and the sales, possession and use are violations of both state and federal laws; and because studies, which are hereby accepted and adopted have shown that most smokers begin smoking before they have reached the age of 18 years and that those persons who reach the age of 18 years without having started smoking are significantly less likely to begin smoking; and because smoking has been shown to be the cause of several serious health problems which subsequently place a financial burden on all levels of government.
- (B) This chapter shall be intended to regulate the sale, possession and use of tobacco, tobacco products and tobacco related devices for the purpose of enforcing and furthering existing laws, to protect <u>young people minors</u> against the serious effects associated with the illegal use of tobacco, tobacco products and tobacco related devices, and to further the official public policy of the state in regard to preventing young people from starting to smoke as stated in M.S. § 144.391, as it may be amended from time to time.

§ 111.02 DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

that those authorized to sell tobacco, tobacco products and tobacco related devices are following and complying with the requirements of this chapter. *COMPLIANCE CHECKS* shall involve the use of individuals at least 17 years of age but under the age of 21 minors as authorized by this chapter. *COMPLIANCE CHECKS* shall also mean the use of individuals at least 17 years of age but under the age of 21 minors who attempt to purchase tobacco, tobacco products or tobacco related devices for educational research and training purposes as authorized by state and federal laws. *COMPLIANCE CHECKS* may also be conducted by other units of government for the purpose of enforcing appropriate federal, state or local laws and regulations relating to tobacco, tobacco products and tobacco related devices.

§ 111.05 LICENSE; BASIS FOR DENIAL.

(1) The applicant is under the age of 2118 years;

§ 111.06 PROHIBITED SALES

(A) To any person under the age of 2118 years;

§ 111.08 SELF-SERVICE SALES.

(C) A license holder who operates an establishment that sells only tobacco-related products is exempt from the self-service merchandising provision if the license holder prohibits anyone under <u>21</u>+8 years of age from entering the establishment, unless accompanied by a parent, and the license holder conspicuously displays a notice prohibiting persons under <u>21</u>+8 years of age from entering the establishment unless accompanied by a parent. (Ord. 42, passed 2-10-98) Penalty, see § 111.99

§ 111.10 COMPLIANCE CHECKS AND INSPECTIONS.

(B) From time to time, but at least once per year, the county shall conduct compliance checks by engaging <u>individuals</u> at least 17 years of age but under the age of 21 years, with the written consent of <u>a their</u>-parents or guardians, <u>minors over if the person is under</u> the age of 15 years but less than 18 years, to enter the licensed premise to attempt to purchase tobacco, tobacco products or tobacco related devices. <u>Individuals minors</u> used for the purpose of compliance checks shall be supervised by designated law enforcement officers or other designated county personnel. <u>Individuals minors</u> used for compliance checks shall not be guilty of the unlawful purchase or attempted purchase, nor the unlawful possession of tobacco, tobacco products or tobacco related devices when the items are obtained or attempted to be obtained as a part of the compliance check. No <u>individual minor</u> used in compliance checks shall attempt to use a false identification misrepresenting the <u>individual's minor's</u> age, and all <u>individual's minors</u> lawfully engaged in a compliance check shall answer all questions about the <u>individual's minor's</u> age asked by the licensee or his or her employee and shall produce any identification, if any exists, for which he or she is asked.

§ 111.11 OTHER ILLEGAL ACTS.

- (A) It shall be a violation of this chapter for any person to sell or otherwise provide any tobacco, tobacco product or tobacco related device to any <u>individual under the age of 21 yearsminor</u>.
- (B) It shall be a violation of this chapter for any <u>individual under the age of 21 yearsminor</u> to have in his or her possession any tobacco, tobacco product or tobacco related device. This division shall not apply to <u>individualsminors</u> lawfully involved in a compliance check.
- (C) It shall be a violation of this chapter for any <u>individual under the age of 21 yearsminor</u> to smoke, chew, sniff or otherwise use any tobacco, tobacco product or tobacco related device.
- (D) It shall be a violation of this chapter for any <u>individual under the age of 21 yearsminor</u> to purchase or attempt to purchase or otherwise obtain any tobacco, tobacco product or tobacco related device. It shall be a violation of this chapter for any person to purchase or otherwise obtain the items on behalf of <u>any individual under the age of 21 yearsa minor</u>. It shall further be a violation for any person to coerce or attempt to coerce <u>an individual under the age of 21 yearsa minor</u> to illegally purchase or otherwise obtain or use any tobacco, tobacco product or tobacco related device. This division shall not apply to <u>individualsminors</u> lawfully involved in a compliance check.
- (E) It shall be a violation of this chapter for <u>any individual under the age of 21</u> <u>yearsa minor</u> to attempt to disguise his or her true age by the use of a false form of identification, whether the identification is that of another person or one on which the age

of the person has been modified or tampered with to represent an age older than the actual age of the person. (Ord. 42, passed 2-10-98) Penalty, see § 111.99

§ 111.99 PENALTY.

(2) Other individuals, other than <u>individuals under the age of 21 years</u> minors regulated by division (A)(3) below, found to be in violation of this chapter shall be charged an administrative fine of \$50.
(3) <u>Individuals under the age of 21 years Minors</u> found in unlawful possession or who unlawfully purchase or attempt to purchase, tobacco, tobacco products or tobacco related devises, shall be issued a citation and processed through the Criminal Justice Intervention Project, as established by County Court Services.
SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the date of its passage.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), each local Workforce Development Board must develop and submit a comprehensive Regional and Local plan to the Governor. Federal Government requires each area to submit a plan to outline workforce development strategies. The plan serves as an authorization to receive funds from the Federal Government, and allows to use funds to support program administration in Carver County. The comprehensive Regional and Local plan is a separate document required by the Federal Government.

The plan is not a Joint Power Agreement between Hennepin and Carver Counties. The existing Joint Power Agreement (JPA) between Hennepin and Carver Counties establishes a mechanism for Hennepin and Carver to cooperate in the development and the implementation of the employment and training services related to Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. The JPA is set to terminate July 1, 2022.

Carver County workforce development staff leadership will be working with the Carver and Hennepin County staff leadership and appointed Commissioner liaisons to re-negotiate terms of the agreement as well as explore all other available options to ensure successful service delivery model for the Carver County residents and families. The new Joint Power Agreement or alternative will be presented to the Carver County Board for their review and approval prior to being finalized before it expires on July 1, 2022.

In Minnesota, these plans are submitted to the Department of Employment and Economic Development. While Federal guidance requires a four-year plan must be submitted, DEED guidance states that effective date of the plans submitted this year will be 7/1/2021-6/30/2024. This is because local and regional plans should align with the state plan's timeframe, and Minnesota needs to get back on schedule in this area. This also means there will be an update of the local and regional plans taking place around 6/2022 to align with the state plan's 2-year update.

Hennepin/Carver is a part of Minnesota Region 4 (Metro Area). Each of the six Workforce Development Boards within this region will submit identical regional plans to DEED.

The local portion of the plan was completed by Hennepin, Carver and partners program staff (Vocational Rehabilitation Services, Veterans Services, Job Services and Adult Basic Education).

Per Federal and State Guidance, the plan was posted for public comments on the Hennepin County website, Carver County website and the DEED website. The local board chair and the WIOA-designated WDA 09 Local Elected Official (Hennepin County Commissioner Irene Fernando) are required to sign the plan prior to submittal on behalf of our area. The plan must be approved by the Hennepin-Carver Workforce Development Board, followed by the approval by the Hennepin County and Carver County Boards. The plan can be signed by the Local Elected official after the approval from the Carver County is granted and review by the Carver County Commissioner acting as a liaison to the Hennepin/Carver Workforce Development Board is completed. Hennepin/Carver Workforce development board plans to approve the plan on May 11, 2021.

The goal of the local plan is to utilize CareerForce locations and community partners to ensure and deliver high quality coordinated services in suburban Hennepin County and Carver County. It is anticipated building on the lessons learned about how technology (when participants have access to it) can enhance our ability to provide services that are convenient to the customers, we will continue to offer services via technology and in person. The co-enrollment with other programs to fully leverage support services across programs and funding sources is encouraged, focusing on adaption of family/resident centric service delivery model addressing 12 social determinates of heath, with specific attention on education, economic stability, community connections, income increase and health. Hennepin/Carver Workforce Development Board focuses on strategies to remove systemic barriers to employment facing individuals of color, individuals with disabilities, gender-based inequities, and barriers affecting disconnected youth. In addition, Board will focus on creating Career Pathways program to address needs of the job seekers and support employers to meet hiring needs.

Local and Regional Planning Guidance

In February of this year guidance on required local and regional planning and a draft template for the plans was provided by DEED's CareerForce Division. In that guidance the State set the expectation that new local and regional plans would be completed by 6/30/2020. In the following month the COVID-19 pandemic necessitated our workforce system's leadership's full attention and it was clear that requiring the local and regional plans by the end of June was unreasonable. CareerForce confirmed with the DOL that the State had the flexibility to move back the due date for new local and regional plans to 4/30/2021.

CareerForce has also received feedback from both state and non-state workforce system stakeholders that the optional local and regional plan template CareerForce produced in February of 2020 was problematic because of the following two reasons: the DOL may have an issue with the new template not following the questions laid out in the same order they are in WIOA law; the new template does not include all of the additional information requested from local boards in the previous template, and that information is useful to for other internal DEED operations. Because of this CareerForce has chosen to use the same template that was used in 2016 for the local and regional plans to avoid any potentially unproductive confusion, conflicts, or complications.

Also, per 20 CFR § 679.560 (c) DEED is requiring additional questions to be answered in the local plans. DEED leadership's intention in adding questions 31 – 33 in the "Local Plan-Strategic Operations" section is to emphasize that local boards should strategize about the workforce needs in their area due to both the ongoing pandemic and structural barriers to employment faced by individuals in their area. DEED also added question 4 in the "Local Plan-Program Operations" section template to ensure the latest federal guidance is taken in to account by local boards in planning.

There are components of the local and regional plans that require recent labor market information to complete. DEED's Labor Market Information Division is available to help as needed with any data requests, (cameron.macht@state.mn.us). The division does generate periodic regional labor market information data that is acceptable to use and incorporate into the plans.

The effective date of the plans will be 7/1/2021 - 6/30/2024. This is because local and regional plans should align with the state plan's timeframe, and Minnesota needs to get back on schedule in this area. This also means there will be an update of the local and regional plans

taking place around 6/2022 to align with the state plan's 2-year update. More information about this update will be shared by the CareerForce division before that time.

Please submit your area's local and regional plans to DEED by 4/30/2021 and allow DEED 60 days to respond. Prior to the submission of your plan, you must facilitate a public comment period of up to thirty days by making the plans available electronically and through one other means such as having physical copies available at public board meetings. Specifically, please seek input from representatives in your area from businesses, post-secondary education, labor organizations, and community-based organizations who serve individuals or communities facing structural barriers to employment. Upon submission of the plan to DEED you must include any comments you have received that express disagreement with the plan. DEED will either accept the plans or identify areas of the plans that need to be changed or added to gain approval.

It is a requirement that the vision of Minnesota's current state plan be incorporated into the local and regional plans. For your reference the vision, mission, and goals of the federal program year 2020-2023 WIOA State Plan for Minnesota are listed below. Alignment with the state plan should be evident in local and regional plans. For additional details and context please refer to the state plan at https://mn.gov/deed/gwdb/priorities/wioa/.

<u>Vision:</u> The strategic vision of the One Minnesota WIOA State Plan is a healthy economy, where every Minnesotan has meaningful employment and a family-sustaining wage, and employers are able to fill jobs in demand.

<u>Mission:</u> To create a Career Pathway System that aligns local, state, and federal resources, policies and services to meet the workforce needs of business and industry and improves access to employment, education, and training services for Minnesota's current and future workforce.

<u>Goals:</u> To build on this vision and to continue strengthening the workforce development system, the 2020 WIOA goals are:

- 1. Reduce educational, skills training and employment disparities based on race, disability, gender or disconnected youth.
- 2. Build employer-led industry-sector partnerships that expand the talent pipeline to be inclusive of race, disability, gender, and age to meet industry demands for a skilled workforce.
