REGULAR SESSION January 24, 2012

A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on January 24, 2012. Chair James Ische convened the session at 9:00 a.m.

Members present: James Ische, Chair, Gayle Degler, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

The following amendment was made to the agenda:

Add: 5.7 Charitable gambling application from the Waconia Lions Club

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to approve the minutes of the January 17, 2012, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Resolution #09-12, Authorizing the Chair of the Dakota County Board of Commissioners to execute a contract with Regina Medical Center to provide medical examiner services to Carver County in 2012 and the appointment of Dr. Lindsey Thomas as the medical examiner for Carver County in 2012.

Approved subgrant agreement #2011-118 with the Metropolitan Council and authorized the Chair to sign the agreement.

Approved tobacco license for Jamen, LLC d/b/a Schmidty's New Germany.

Approved amendment and renewal of Metropolitan Emergency Services Board joint powers agreement.

Approved charitable gambling application form the Waconia Lions Club.

Community Social Services' actions.

Approved payment of the following Commissioners' warrants:

Motion carried unanimously.

Jim Stark, Metropolitan Mosquito Control District, appeared before the Board with an update on the District's activities and levy.

He explained the District was established in 1958 and is governed by a board of 18 County Commissioners. He pointed out the District provides serves to the seven metro Counties. Stark indicated the District has taxing authority and reduced the levy 5% in 2010 and kept it the same in 2011 and 2012. He stated they would continue to look at ways to provide services and reducing costs.

Stark explained they are primarily a larval control program and identified the materials used. He highlighted the increased use of technology. He noted their efforts that related to the control of blackflies and tick transmitted disease.

He stated their plans for 2012 will be to continue process improvement and identify costs savings, to expand testing of control materials and to continue to incorporate new technologies to increase efficiencies.

Stark thanked the Board for their support and stated they would continue to work hard the upcoming season.

Martin Walsh, Parks Manager, reviewed the discussion that occurred at the last work session related to a possible AIS inspection program and outlined the proposed program. He indicated the \$31,000 cost would be split between Carver County and the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District. He stated Land and Water Services would continue to seek funding and monitor lakes.

Eric Evenson, Minnehaha Creek Watershed Director, confirmed the District would support the County's efforts and appreciated the lead the County was taking. He noted this was a pilot project and they were not looking at this long term. Evenson stated zebra mussels were a serious problem and impacts quality of life. He stated the Watershed was committed to looking for a long term plan but they needed to get a stop gap measure in place. He added the State could not do this alone and they will need local partners.

Dave Peterjohn stated the pilot program would benefit all lakes in the County. He acknowledged Minnehaha Creek Watershed has stepped up to the plate and the DNR cannot do this alone. He suggested 95% of boaters view inspections favorably and stated they have an opportunity to be progressive on a short term basis to learn more.

Walsh clarified the DNR would provide training at no cost.

The Board inquired if Minnehaha Creek would continue to look for other partners for other public accesses.

Evenson stated they were looking at stop gap measures this year and they were looking to work with other willing partners. He added they are also looking at a longer term program and that will take time to put together. Evenson noted they would also assist with costs associated with training.

The Board inquired if there was a problem in the County and how this can be monitored.

Randy Wolf, Public Health and Environment, stated they do have plans to go out and test for zebra mussels as part of their water testing program. He indicated they know there is some cross traffic between lakes and anticipated by mid-summer they would have some sort of idea.

The Board recognized they had asked for partnerships, that Minnehaha Creek had stepped in, but also expressed concern there would be additional requests.

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to authorize the AIS inspection program at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park, to allocate \$15,500 from the County's year end savings account for the program and to direct staff to develop a contract with Minnehaha Creek Watershed District for financial participation in the program. Degler, Maluchnik, Workman voted aye. Ische, Lynch voted nay. Motion carried.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to go into closed session at 10:05 a.m. for discussion of labor negotiations strategy as allowed by Statute. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned the closed and Regular Session at 10:55.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

The Metropolitan Regional Homeland Security & Emergency Management Committee (MRHSEMC) was formed by a Joint Powers Agreement between the County governments of the 10-county Metropolitan Emergency Management Region and the Cities of Minneapolis and Saint Paul to coordinate, plan and execute the procurement of regional planning, training and equipment to build the region's ability to prevent, prepare, respond, and recover from disasters and emergencies of all hazards.

MRHSEMC has received grant funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to be spent toward the goal of developing regional interoperable capabilities, so all member jurisdictions can mutually support each other in times of crisis or in daily emergency management, public safety, and homeland security endeavors. Washington County is MRHSEMC's fiscal agent, authorized to disburse funds as contractually obliged. The equipment purchased for each County will be owned and maintained by the County it was purchased for.

Carver County requested and received approval from MRHSEMC to fund a project to connect several ARMER 800 MHZ radio sites to the Carver County Fiber Optic Ring to enhance the performance and reliability of the public safety radio system. This upgrade will provide fiber optic back-up to the present microwave connectivity between infrastructure sites.



WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of January 17, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. M&P-P, LLC currently owns a 106.03 acre parcel located in the Southeast Quarter (SE½) of Section 1, Dahlgren Township. The parcel consists of ag production land, a protected tributary creek and floodplain area. The site is located in the Transition Area Overlay District for the City of Carver and the City of Chaska, Shoreland Overlay District (West Chaska Creek Tributary Creek), Floodplain Overlay District and the CCWRMA West Chaska Creek.
- 2. Carver County Public Works is proposing a road reconstruction and realignment project for the spring of 2012. The project proposes the reconstruction of existing two-lane County State Aid Highway (CSAH 11) roadway between CSAH 61 (Chaska Boulevard) and County Road 140 (approximately 0.75 miles), and the construction of an approximately 1.25 mile segment of CSAH 11 between County Road 140 and CSAH 10 (Engler Boulevard). The project corridor dissects the M&P-P, LLC property and will require the placement of fill material in the floodplain (floodway) of the tributary creek.
- 3. The applicant is requesting a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to place fill material in the floodplain pursuant to Section 152.147 C (4)(6) of the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 4. The proposed project would meet the standards of the Zoning Code. The placement of fill for the road will not cause any increase in the stage of the 100-year or regional flood or cause an increase in flood damages in the reach or reaches affected. Pursuant to the Carver County Zoning Code, Essential Services Section 152.051 D, public roads, street, and highways are permitted uses. The majority of the CSAH 11 road project meets the permitted use Essential Services criteria; however, the floodplain regulations necessitate the approval of a conditional use.
- 5. The project purpose is to address roadway deficiencies and safety hazards, reduce high crash rates, improve the CSAH 11 system linkage consistent with the County's functional classification plan, provide an adequate freight route, and provide a pedestrian/bicycle connection.
- 6. Carver County Public Works is required to prepare an Environmental Assessment/Environmental Assessment Worksheet (EA/EAW) to provide background information including: need for the proposed project, alternatives considered, environmental impacts and mitigation and agency coordination and public involvement. Carver County is the proposer and Responsible Governmental Unit (RGU) for this project. Preparation of an EAW is considered

mandatory under Minnesota Rules. This document is made available for public review and comments in accordance with the requirements of Minnesota Rules. The comments received will be used by Carver County Public Works, Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in deciding whether there is a potential for this project to result in significant impacts to the environment and whether an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is required. The purpose of this EA/EAW is to identify and address any social, economic, or environmental impacts as a result of the proposed CSAH 11 project in Carver County.

- 7. The proposed project will convert a total of approximately 35 acres of farmland to roadway right of way, including 16.8 acres of prime farmland and statewide and locally important farmland. The subject parcel (M&P-P, LLC) converts approximately 2.4 acre of farmland to roadway right of way for the project. The proposed project will have a total of approximately 5.8 acres of permanent wetland impacts. Impacts to wetlands within this area of the state must be replaced at a ratio of 2:1; therefore, a total of 11.6 acres of mitigation are required. A Public Waters Work Permit for a new crossing of the West Chaska Creek will be required from the Minnesota Department of natural Resources (MnDNR).
- 8. The project will be designed to minimize fill impacts into the Shoreland Overlay District and will include several stormwater treatment Best Management Practices to mitigate any potential effects from stormwater runoff.
- 9. The proposed roadway crosses the floodplain area of West Chaska Creek, and results in a transverse encroachment of 35 feet. The conditional use is required for the placement of fill material in association with the transverse encroachment into the 100-year floodplain. The design of any necessary mitigation measures, including sizing of the proposed crossing box culverts, will be coordinated with the appropriate agencies during final design and permitting of the project. The Carver County Planning and Water Management Department and Carver Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) are currently reviewing submitted plans to determine compliance with County Stormwater Management Rules (level 3 project).
- 10. The Dahlgren Town Board has reviewed and recommended approval of the request during their January 9, 2012 Town Board meeting.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CARVER COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION HEREBY RECOMMENDS THE ISSUANCE OF THE SUBJECT PERMIT ON THE LAND DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" OF THE PERMIT APPLICATION. THE PLANNING COMMISSION FURTHER RECOMMENDS THAT THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS BE ATTACHED TO THE PERMIT:

- 1. The permit is subject to administrative review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by the Land Management Department for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners and/or operators are encouraged to contact Land Management as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. The final construction plans and associated alignment site plan shall be considered part of this permit. The activity must operate in conformance with the approved plans and other provisions of this chapter (Zoning Code and Floodplain regulations).
- 3. The Permittee shall comply with the following:
 - A. The Carver County Stormwater Management Rules (Level 3 project).
 - B. The Wetland Conservation Act (WCA) requirements.
 - C. The National Pollution Discharge Elimination Systems (NPDES) requirements.

File #PZ20110051. The Planning Commission recommended approval of an Interim Use Permit (IUP) for Thomas and Penny Rice (property owners) allowing for a temporary dwelling for special needs. The subject parcel is located in Section 34 of Laketown Township. According to the applicant, a need to provide for the housing is due to his disability and because he is no longer able to work. The Board of Adjustment approved Variance #PZ20110030, on January 4, 2012, allowing for the adaptive reuse of the old farmhouse as a temporary caretaker's residence. The Order for the IUP also addresses the termination of Rice's Contractor's Yard & Home Extended Business (CUP #PZ20040012) because it is no longer needed. WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of January 17, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. Thomas & Penny Rice own an 8.6 acre parcel located in the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4) of the Northwest Quarter (NW1/4) of Section 34 of Laketown Township. The property is improved with a house/garage (permanent dwelling), an old farmhouse currently used as an accessory structure, detached garage, and several outbuildings. The parcel is located in the Agriculture Zoning District and the Carver County WMO –West Chaska Creek watershed.
- 2. Conditional Use Permit (CUP) #PZ20040012 was issued in 2004 for the applicant's Home Extended Business and Contractor's Yard, Thomas Painting & LaRae Design. Thomas & Penny Rice constructed a new house/garage on the property in 2007. On February 15, 2008, an affidavit (also attached) was filed for the old farmhouse as it was converted from a dwelling into office, hobby and accessory structure space.
- 3. The applicant is requesting termination of CUP #PZ20040012 and authorization to convert the old farmhouse back into a dwelling for temporary caretaker's quarters with an Interim Use Permit (IUP) pursuant to Section 152.081 and 152.082 of the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 4. The applicant received approval from the Board of Adjustment on January 4, 2012 for Variance #PZ20110030 allowing for the conversion of the old farmhouse back to a temporary caretaker's residence to assist Mr. Rice and to help maintain the property. The request did not meet the standards for an *Elderly/special needs* parent/grandparent temporary manufactured home, thus the requested variance.
- 5. The Board of Adjustment Findings of Fact and Order (#PZ20110030) will continue in effect so long as Thomas & Penny Rice own and occupy the property. The Variance is not valid for heirs, successors and assigns and shall expire when the property is no longer owned or occupied by Thomas & Penny Rice.
- 6. Mr. Rice has become permanently disabled and their business has scaled back to the point that there is no longer a need for CUP #PZ20040012. According to the applicant, a need to provide for the housing is due to his disability and because he is no longer able to work. The old farmhouse is in good condition and it has a mound septic system that was installed in 2001. As a result, the transition from an accessory structure back to a dwelling would require minimal investment. The applicant stated that they do not have any family members nearby, so a temporary caretaker would be their only option to allow them to remain in the primary residence on the property.

- 7. Aside from the items addressed in Variance #PZ20110030, the request met the standards of the Carver County Zoning Code including, but not limited to, the requirements for building and SSTS permits, the property is served by a hard surface road, and the demand for services can be accommodated by existing infrastructure. The request shall not have any adverse environmental impact or adverse effect on surrounding property. The elimination of the Home Extended Business Contractor's Yard CUP should result in reduced traffic.
- 8. Future land use is anticipated to include seasonal boat storage on the property which is allowed for agricultural structures in existence prior to January 1, 1997 per Section 152.073 of the Carver County Zoning Code. Seasonal boat storage shall be incidental to the principal use and conducted within the existing agricultural structure(s). Outside storage of boats is not permitted.
- 9. The Carver County Zoning Code requires a date or event which will terminate the use to be identified for an IUP. It is not the intent of the Zoning Code to allow for a second, permanent dwelling without a building eligibility on the site.
- 10. The Laketown Town Board has recommended approval of the request during their October 24, 2011 Town Board meeting. The Town Board's recommendation included a stipulation that the IUP terminate in three (3) years.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of the subject permit on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- 1. The permit is subject to compliance review. The Interim Use Permit (IUP) is issued to Thomas Rice/Thomas & Penny Rice and is not transferable to another person/owner/occupant. A change in ownership or occupant(s) of the permanent residence shall be cause for the permit to expire. The lease for the temporary caretaker's quarters shall identify the occupant/caretaker by name and is considered part of the permit. A copy of the lease shall be submitted to the Land Management Dept. The Land Management Dept. shall be notified if the occupant/caretaker changes.
- 2. The operational plan and site plan shall become part of the permit. The activity must operate in conformance with the approved site plan and operational plan and other provisions of this chapter.
- 3. All buildings used in the operation must meet the State Building Code. When necessary, building and SSTS permits shall be obtained prior to work commencing to the adaptive re-use of the old farmhouse. A SSTS Certificate of Compliance shall be submitted for the old farmhouse, if required.
- 4. The property shall not obtain or utilize a second (2nd) address for the old farmhouse. Only one (1) family allowed to reside in the old farmhouse at a time to serve as caretaker.
- 5. Seasonal boat storage may continue on the property so long as it meets the criteria of the Carver County Zoning Code, Section 152.073 including, but not limited to, no outside storage.
- 6. The use will be sufficiently compatible with, or separated by sufficient distance from, or screened from adjacent agricultural or residential land uses so that there will be no deterrence to the use or development of adjacent land and uses.
- 7. The IUP shall terminate three (3) years from the date of occupancy by the initial caretaker. Upon termination, the old farmhouse shall no longer be used as a dwelling and shall be converted back to an accessory structure or removed within 120 days. Conversion shall not be deemed complete until all required building permits are finaled and an affidavit is signed by the property owner(s) and submitted to the Land Management Dept. stating the structure will never be utilized as a dwelling.



BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

The Division has been operational with our Procentive system in Behavioral Health since 2008. The Division is in the process of implementing our electronic medical records for Mental Health. The goal of the federal government is for health professionals to be utilizing electronic health records by 2014. In order for Community Social Services to meet this goal, we must scan over 1000 clinical charts for Outpatient, Adult Mental Health and Crisis. All of our clinical documents must be scanned into our system so that we can start to get our program functional and ready to meet that mandate by the federal government. As part of the CY2011 and CY2012 Budget reductions, Support Services cut a 1.4 FTE Support Services Specialist positions. The increase in the caseloads over at Mental Health and the corresponding documentation have consumed the clerical support available for scanning which leaves us with no capacity to begin scanning all of our mental health charts and documentation.

In examining the situation the Division is proposing to utilize temporary staff to complete this scanning project. Since most of these records are active, the project will need to be completed on site. The Division will explore the options of hiring temporary staff or contracting with a staffing agency.

ACTION REQUESTED:

To authorize the Division to hire or contract for temporary staff to scan Behavioral Health medical records.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

In 2007, Carver County was awarded \$1,120,000 in Federal Transportation Enhancement Funds to construct 5.5 miles of the extension of the Dakota Rail Regional Trail from Mayer to the West County Line (Phase II) for Federal Fiscal Year 2012. The current estimated engineering and cost for construction is \$2,182,000. Identified project funding is \$1,723,000. The projected cost above the identified funding is largely related to work needed to rehabilitate one bridge structure over the Crow River and two trestle structures at Crane Creek. Additional cost are also associated with the trailhead parking lot and kiosk area to incorporate this work in with the planned trail construction. Additional revenues to close the project's funding gap could come from future (2013 and 2014) Parks and Trails Legacy Funds Allocations from the Met Council. The County would use funds set aside for park land acquisition to initially pay for the project which would then be paid back in 2013 and 2014 by the Park and Trails Legacy Allocation. Park projects that had been planned to be funded by 2013 and 2014 Park and Trail Legacy Allocations would have to be delayed or another revenue source would have to be found.

Plans and specifications for the project and state and federal approvals to proceed with the project have been completed. The project is ready to be advertised for bids. An expected bid opening date will be scheduled for early March, 2012. Included in the bid specs will be potential options and deductions that the Board could consider to reduce the project cost.

It is recommended that the project move forward to bidding as the bid climate is beneficial at this time. Bids are likely to increase with time as contractors workload increases. If bids come in too high, the board has the option to reject bids.
