WENR Advisory Committee Members

At their May meeting, the Water, Environment and Natural Resource Advisory (WENR) Committee recommended project funding for current CCWMO dollars. The staff request and subsequent committee recommendation was based on the following factors/considerations:

- The CCWMO evaluation process adopted in 2007 which ranks projects based on a series of criteria.
- 2011 and prior year funding and project allocation.
- Existing 2012 projects and CCWMO funds.
- · Recent requests for project funding.
- Projects identified in the CCWMO plan
- Funds committed to matching grant agreements.

Based on these factors, the following project recommendations using existing CCWMO funds are listed below. NOTE: these are projects based on new requests or partnerships with cities, and are in addition to projects previously recommended by the Committee and approved by the Board. Staff is requesting that the Board ratify the WENR Committee's recommendation.

PROJECTS RECOMMENDED FOR FUNDING WITH EXISTING CCWMO FUNDS

East Creek Carp Control Feasibility Study East Chaska Creek Lakes \$20,000
 Identify methods to control carp populations including barriers and lake drawdowns in the East Creek Chain of Lakes (Hazeltine, Big Woods, McKnight, Jonathan, Grace) and improve water quality. Partnership with the City of Chaska, RECOMMENDATION: Fund request using 2012 CCWMO funds.

2. Birdie Lane Limestone Ravine Stabilization Lake Hazeltine \$25,000

Restore eroded ravine using combination of underground pipe and limestone treatment pools and riffles. Partnership with the City of Chaska.

RECOMMENDATION: Fund request using 2011 East Chaska Creek funds

3. Wildcat Way Raingarden Carver Creek \$5,000

Construct rain garden treating impervious surface as part of City Brooke Petersen park project. Partnership with the City of Waconia.

RECOMMENDATION: Fund request using 2011 Carver Creek funds.

4. Miller Lake Sed Detention Feasibility Study Carver Creek/Miller Lake \$10,000

Study the cost/feasibility of constructing a sediment detention structure at the inlet of Miller Lake. RECOMMENDATION: Fund request using 2012 CCWMO funds.

5. Swede lake TP Study Swede lake \$10,000

Study the sources of phosphorus loading for Swede Lake. Swede Lake is on the State Impaired waters list and has continuously tested high for Phosphorous. Specific sources of internal and external load need to be determined prior to projects being recommended.

RECOMMENDATION: Fund request using 2012 CCWMO funds.

6. Hamburg Stormwater Retrofit Bevens Creek \$10,000

Replace existing drainage structure with sump manholes and SAFL baffles. Stormwater from downtown and drains to Ditch 3 (Bevens creek). Funds were previously. Partnership with the City of Hamburg. RECOMMENDATION: Fund request using 2012 CCWMO funds

7. Sugarbush Stormwater & Cherry St/Fairgrounds Stormwater Retrofit

Carver Creek/Burandt lake \$32.000

Replace 2 existing drainage structures with sump manholes and SAFL baffles (Sugarbush Neighborhood). Stormwater drains to Burandt lake. & Replace existing drainage structure with sump manholes and SAFL baffles (Cherry St). Stormwater from County Fairgrounds and drains to Bent creek (Carver). Partnership with the City of Waconia.

RECOMMENDATION: Fund request using 2011 Carver Creek funds committed match

Resolution Establishing Employee Pay for Performance

DATE	RESOLUTION NO
MOTION BY COMMISSIONER	SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER

WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners has authority to establish and revise compensation systems for non-bargaining and certain represented employees; and

WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners intends to establish a pay for performance system for non-bargaining and certain represented employees, effective in 2013; and

WHEREAS, a pay for performance system should include the salary ranges for the affected employees' classifications, the methods, amounts and timing of salary increases based on employee performance evaluation ratings.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Carver County shall establish a pay for performance system for non-bargaining employees, effective in 2013, including the following the salary range adjustments, salary payment methods, percentage salary increases based on employee performance evaluation overall ratings, and timing of salary increases:

- A. The current 2012 salary ranges for non-bargaining employees' classifications shall be increased by two percent (2.0%) at the range minimums, mid-points and maximums, effective January 14, 2013.
- B. The current 2012 salary range for the represented employees who have negotiated pay for performance beginning in 2013 shall be increased by two percent (2.0%) at the range minimums, mid-points and maximums, effective January 14, 2013.
- C. Pay for performance salary increases shall be base pay adjustments for employees whose salaries are within the current range, not to exceed the new range maximum, and computed on: the midpoint of the salary range for salaries at or below the midpoint of the new range, or the employee's actual salary for salaries above the midpoint of the new range, but not exceeding the new range maximum,.
- D. Pay for performance salary increases shall be lump sums for any amount of the increase that exceeds the new range maximum, as long as the employee's current base salary is at or below the new range maximum.
- E. Pay for performance salary increases shall be lump sums based on the new range maximum for any employee whose current salary is above the new range maximum.
- F. In 2013, the percentages used to compute pay for performance salary increases based on the overall rating on each employee's performance evaluation shall be: zero percent (0%) for needs improvement, one and one-half percent (1.5%) for meets expectations, two and one-half percent (2.5%) for exceeds expectations, and three and one-half percent (3.5%) for outstanding.
- G. The pay for performance salary adjustments shall be effective for the pay period beginning on March 11, 2013, based on the overall performance evaluation rating for 2012 work, with the evaluation completed and signed by all parties, no later than February 15, 2013.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Personnel Policies be revised to reflect the establishment of the pay for performance system, and the procedures to revise the system in the future.
