<p>Agenda Item 5:</p>	<p>New Business: People INC-Beth Allen & Jessie Hill Non-profit Been around for 50 years Serve 11000 people a year Talking about Steiner Kelting Sept 8th they are gearing up to start their opening 12 bed residential program in both short and long term support options Will have an OT on staff and wellness services (movement, music, art therapy) Do you need a providers reference or police order? People will call into a call center and then they would be transfer Take people from all walks of life and they will get people connected to programs and they are in house working for People Inc Police cannot bring someone over How come they can't go directly there like they could to the doctor *They want to make sure before someone goes somewhere that they are connected to the right service They are taken at their word if they are in crisis-yes How does insurance play into this? They work with the client to figure out what their insurance will cover Would they turn people away if they don't have insurance? No, they service people without insurance all the time County providers cover when they don't get paid. They work with people to get back on insurance</p>	<p>Information</p>

Agenda Item 5: cont.	<p>What is People Inc satisfaction rating? They are trying to get as much feedback as they can. Beth could do some digging and bring this feedback to this next meeting. Carver CO has an 87% coverage rate. A large number of people referred will have insurance coverage AARPA funding options, are proposing a set aside to cover where a client doesn't have the funds Do patients need to be residents of Carver County-all Carver Co residents will be given priority Stay can be 10 days to 90 days</p> <p>Intake process Crisis Assessment Assess immediate needs & get into their room Clients attend sessions during their stay After 5-10 days determine if long term is needed Continuous therapy services based on needs (client centered supports) Would not be a 72 hold facility Similar to a Crisis in urts??-Ana's question</p> <p>How is this being marketed?
