

### A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PRELIMINARY PLAT OF WHISPERING CREEK RANCH

WHEREAS, the following application for a Preliminary Plat has been submitted and accepted:

**FILE:** PP-PZ20120033

APPLICANT: Gerald "Jerry" Hartman

SITE ADDRESS: 6755 County Road 50, Carver MN PURSUANT TO: County Code, Chapter 151 & 152 LEGAL DESCRIPTION: See attached Exhibit "A"

PARCEL: #08-003-1300

WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meetings of September 18, 2012, and forwarded to the Carver County Board of Commissioners for action; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has reviewed the recommendations and proposed conditions put forward by the Planning Commission after the public hearings on the matter and concurs with the findings, recommendations and conditions of the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the plat substantially meets the requirements of applicable county ordinances except where noted by Planning Commission Resolution No. 12-10 and the areas of deficiency can be addressed through conditions placed on the preliminary plat that must be complied with prior to acceptance of the Final Plat.

- 1. Mr. and Mrs. Hartman were issued Conditional Use Permit (CUP) #PZ20120019 in order to create six (6) residential parcels and an agricultural parcel with two (2) Outlots pursuant to Section 152.078 E of the Carver County Zoning Code. With the approval of the CUP, the property owners are requesting approval of the Preliminary Plat "Whispering Creek Ranch" Subdivision. The request would result in a total of seven (7) homes which would consist of six (6) conservation incentive lots (Lots 1-4, Block 2 and Lots 1 & 2, Block 3) and one (1) 1 per 40 lot (Lot 1, Block 1). The plat would also include two (2) Outlots (A & B). The entire Outlot B would have a conservation easement recorded on the plat which is required as part of the additional density option under the Conservation Incentive section of the County Code. In addition to the building sites and conservation area, a privately maintained township road will need to be constructed.
- 2. The subject parcel consists of 75 acres which is located in the West Half (W½) of the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section 3, San Francisco Township. The property is improved with a house, attached garage, personal stable, indoor riding arena and horticultural growing area. It is located within the Agricultural Zoning District, Shoreland Overlay District of Bevens Creek, and the Carver County Water Management Organization (CCWMO) Bevens Creek Watershed. CUP #PZ20120019 was issued July 2012, in order to create six (6) conservation incentive residential lots pursuant to Section 152.078 of the Carver County Zoning Code.
- 3. Copies of the plat have been sent to the Carver County Attorney's Office (Jennifer Tichey), Carver County Planning & Water Management Department (Kristen Larson), Carver County Public Works Division (Bill Weckman), Carver County Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) (Chip Hentges), Carver County Consulting Engineer (Wenck Assoc. Kent Torve), Center Point Energy (natural gas utility company serving the area), Century Link (local

- telephone provider), Independent School District #112 (Finance & Operations Office), the San Francisco Town Board, and Xcel Energy (electric utility company serving the area). The Carver SWCD, the Carver County Consulting Engineer and Carver County Public Works have submitted comments.
- 4. The conservation incentive lots and 1 per 40 building eligibility are laid out in such a manner that there are no more than four (4) homes per ½ ½ (40 acres) as permitted by the density regulations and conservation incentive flexibility of the Carver County Zoning Code. The residential lot sizes range from 2.2 acres to 2.9 acres. Each lot has a defined building site that conforms to code requirements, and any home constructed within this site will meet the zoning setback requirements. Two (2) Outlots (A & B) are a result of the road configuration and identified natural resource area being protected as part of the plat by easement. Outlot A is less than the 20 acre minimum (13.6 acres) that is required for standalone lots; therefore, it will need to be combined for zoning purposes with Lot 1, Block 1 ("1 per 40" lot). Outlot B is the conservation protected parcel; therefore, an easement must be placed over it in order to meet the conservation incentive requirement of the Carver County Zoning Code. Outlot B is approximately 26.6 acres and could be allowed as a standalone parcel for common area; however, Mr. Hartman intends to combine Outlot B with Outlot A and the 1 per 40 agricultural parcel (Lot 1, Block 1).
- 5. On October 3, 2012, Mr. Hartman attended a Board of Adjustment meeting, and received approval (Order #PZ20120037) for three (3) different reduced setback variance requests. His request includes three (3) different reduced setback variances to address existing conditions and practical difficulties. The first request would be to allow for a reduced front yard setback from the centerline of the proposed township road to an existing structure due to the location of an existing well. The required 68-foot setback would be reduced to 59 feet; therefore, reflecting a 9-foot variance. The second request would be to allow for a reduced front yard setback from the centerline of the proposed township road to an existing farm windmill. The required 68-foot front yard setback would be reduced to 61 feet; therefore, reflecting a 7-foot variance. The third request would be to allow for a reduced bluff setback from the top of a bluff to a constructed cabin. The required 50-foot setback would be reduced to 40 feet; therefore, reflecting a 10-foot variance. The variance requests were needed due to the subject parcel being platted and in conjunction with the new road alignment.
- 6. The Carver County Environmental Services Department received a report identifying the primary and alternate Subsurface Sewage Treatment System (SSTS) locations on the six (6) residential lots and 1 "1 per 40" lot. This report is considered a preliminary report to identify two possible SSTS locations per lot. At the time of application for a new home on each lot, a SSTS design will need to be submitted, reviewed and approved by the Carver County Environmental Services Department. Soil boring logs and locations on the survey were included for all but the lot with the existing house (Lot 2, Block 3). A certificate of compliance was submitted for the existing system serving the house. However, there is a tank that lifts the waste from the shop bathroom to the system for the house that was not included in the compliance. There is also a full system and a holding tank that serves the riding arena. These will need to be inspected for compliance prior to Environmental Services approval. All of the SSTS system locations will need to be fenced off prior to any land alteration for road construction, etc. Several of the lots have limited driveway access due to the system locations and the property lines. A few of the driveway locations will be limited due to septic location borings. (i.e. Lot 1, Block 3, where driveway could access off of either road).
- 7. This plat will require the construction of a township road; therefore, a Development Contract is needed. All proposed lots conform to the Carver County Zoning Code with regard to road frontage. Each lot can allow for a separate driveway access in which a 100-foot separation would be required.
- 8. The Carver County Public Works Division completed their initial review of the preliminary plat with regard to the new township roads. An access permit will be required from the Carver County Public Works Division for the improved access onto County Road 50, construction of a turn lane will not be required and final access construction plans will need to be submitted as part of the access permit application. The proposed 66-foot right-of-way width is adequate for a "local" road with projected traffic volumes of 200 vehicles per day or less.
- 9. The proposed road would be constructed to meet township standards; however, it would be privately maintained until such time as the township decides to accept maintenance responsibilities. The San Francisco Town Board will need to approve the road plans before the development contract is completed.

- 10. The applicant will need to develop covenants as required by the CUP #PZ20120019. The covenants will need to be reviewed by the County Attorney's Office prior to final plat approval. The covenants shall be filed with the final plat and include minimum requirements as identified in the CUP.
- 11. The property has been analyzed by a professional wetland delineator to determine if wetlands exist. The wetland delineation was completed July 26, 2012. There were two (2) Type 2 partially drained, fresh (wet) meadow wetlands were delineated within site boundaries and two (2) other wetlands in the southern one-fourth of the site which are not included in this report. These wetlands are: one (1) Type 2 fresh (wet) meadow/wetland seep in the southwest corner of the site; and one (1) Type 1 floodplain wetland along part of Bevens Creek. The Notice of Decision and Technical Evaluation Panel (TEP) Findings will be completed in the near future in order to concur with the findings of the professional delineator hired by the applicant. Appropriate easements for the wetlands and drainage/utilities have been included on the plat.
- 12. The preliminary plat shows 10-foot drainage & utility easements around each of the seven (7) lots. An appropriate drainage easement will be provided for wetlands as part of the final plat. No obstructions shall be permitted in any of the drainage and/or utility easements. The covenants should address the preservation of the drainage easements and that no obstructions shall be permitted within those areas.
- 13. The 75 acre plat is located within the CCWMO jurisdiction. Kent Torve, Consultant Engineer from Wenck Associates, has reviewed the project in regards to the Carver County Water Management Rules. Stormwater management and erosion control measures must meet updated County Code standards pursuant to Chapter 153 of the Water Management Rules. The County consulting engineer would also be involved in the review and approval of the plans as they relate to the Water Rules and Wetland Conservation Act (WCA).
- 14. The Carver SWCD has reviewed the project in regards to the Carver County Water Management Rules as well. Comments have been made regarding erosion/sediment control practices on the site and filtration requirements around the infiltration pond. All lots shall be reviewed for erosion/sediment control measures during the building permit process. The Carver SWCD would also be involved in the review and approval of the plans as they relate to the Water Rules and WCA.
- 15. The draft Conservation Easement has been submitted for review. County staff has reviewed the draft easement and minor changes are being addressed.
- 16. The plat substantially meets the requirements of applicable County Zoning Code except where noted. The areas of deficiency would need to be addressed through conditions placed on the preliminary plat approval that must be complied with prior to acceptance of the final plat.
- 17. The San Francisco Town Board has reviewed and approved the preliminary plat request during their September 17, 2012, meeting.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** THAT The Carver County Board of Commissioners hereby approves the Preliminary Plat of Whispering Creek Ranch for the land described on the preliminary plat with the following conditions attached to the preliminary plat approval:

- 1. Six (6) conservation incentive residential lots, 1 (1 per 40) lot and two (2) Outlots are permitted. The property shall be platted in accordance with M.S. Chapter 505, Carver County Zoning Subdivision Code, Chapter 151, and the Carver County Zoning Code, Chapter 152.
- 2. The layout of the final plat must substantially conform to the preliminary plat. Any significant departure from the preliminary plat must be approved by the Planning Commission before final plat consideration. As part of the preliminary plat approval, each lot shall document a suitable one (1) acre building site and Outlot A and Outlot B shall not be considered standalone parcels and must be combined with Lot 1, Block 1 for zoning purposes. All

conditions of CUP #PZ20120019 shall be satisfied prior to the recording of the final plat.

- 3. All Carver County Public Works concerns/issues shall be addressed prior to beginning work on the Development Contract.
- 4. The developer must enter into a Development Contract with the County and the Township as per Chapter 151 of the County Subdivision Code prior to the initiation of construction of any improvements. The County Engineer, Carver SWCD and County Consultant Engineer must approve the road plan(s) and stormwater drainage plan(s) before approval of the development contract. All road and improvements must be completed before final plat approval or the applicant must post a financial guarantee as per Subdivision Code, Chapter 151. Any additional information that is needed by Wenck Associates, Inc. for review shall be submitted in an acceptable form prior to receiving approval of the Development Contract.
- 5. The developer shall comply with the Emergency Services Department requirements with regard to street names and the site address for each lot. It shall be the obligation of the developer to furnish the street names signs. These signs shall conform to the county standards.
- 6. The County Engineer, Carver SWCD, County Planning & Water Management Department and San Francisco Town Board must approve the road plan(s) and storm water drainage plan(s) before approval of the development contract. An access permit must be obtained, as determined by the County Engineer. All roads and improvements must be completed before final plat approval or the applicant must post a financial guarantee.
- 7. The Covenants as required by CUP #PZ20120019 must be approved prior to final plat consideration. The County Attorney Office shall review the Covenants and title work prior to the final plat consideration by the County Board. As a part of the platting process the applicant will develop covenants to be filed with the final plat. The Covenants, at minimum, will address the following:
  - A. A covenant must clearly state the building eligibility status for each parcel in the development and that Outlots A & B shall be considered one agricultural parcel for zoning purposes with Lot 1, Block1 and shall not be sold separately, unless otherwise authorized by Carver County. The keeping of animals, with the exception of dogs, cats and similar animals kept as household pets, is prohibited on any lot in the residential area.
  - B. A covenant stating that the area is rural and that commercial agriculture and other rural land use activities will likely be occurring in the area. A notification must be provided regarding "odors, dirt, dust, noises, long hours of operation and other factors associated with agriculture and feedlot activities". Complaints relating to these activities shall be considered unwarranted so long as such activities are being conducted in accordance with existing standards. A condition clearly stating and restricting the use of the land in the agricultural area to agriculture with certain conditional use(s) listed in the "A" district.
  - C. If the home sites include any environmentally sensitive land then restrictions must be placed in the covenants addressing: clear cutting of land, vegetation removal, plus the development and implementation of an erosion control plan to control erosion during and after building construction.
  - D. A covenant must be included to provide notice and restrictions pertaining to the conservation easement on the wooded bluff land.
  - E. A covenant must be added requiring that the alternative sewer site must be preserved for a future sewer site. No buildings can be erected on the alternative site and no trees can be planted on the site. Heavy equipment must be kept off the site. If the lot owner must build on the site, he will have to submit percolation tests and soil borings for another site before any building permit will be issued.
  - F. The plat indicates the outside boundary of the delineated wetlands, which impacts all proposed lots. A covenant must clearly state that each lot must be reviewed in the field prior to the issuance of any building permit and/or septic permit.

- G. A covenant must clearly state that lot owners shall maintain the road until such time as the Township agrees to accept the road and assume maintenance responsibility.
- H. A covenant stating that if any lot exceeds the impervious coverage area, pursuant to the Carver County Water Management Rules Chapter 153, Section 153.11 A2, additional review by Carver County Planning & water Management may be needed.
- 8. The above-required Covenants shall be become part of the plat approval.
- 9. The approved Conservation Easement must be recorded simultaneously with the final plat.
- 10. Each lot must be reviewed in the field prior to the issuance of any building permit and/or SSTS permit. All of the septic system locations will need to be fenced off prior to any land alteration for road construction, etc.
- 11. The individual lot owners will maintain the road until such time that the Township agrees to assume maintenance responsibility. A maintenance agreement (or similar provision in the covenants) must be drafted for recording with the final plat, defining the lot owners' responsibilities for the road. The lot owners are not responsible for future extension(s) of the road unless they agree otherwise.
- 12. The proposed residential driveway access and/or any modification to the access location(s) shall be reviewed and the appropriate permit for the access shall be obtained from San Francisco Township.
- 13. As per Section 151.163 of the Carver County Subdivision Code, all utility facilities are to be located underground. The access and drainage ways will be designed so that public utilities can be installed at a later date.
