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A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on October 16, 2012. Chair James Ische convened the session at 4:00 p.m.

Dawn Simonson, Director for the Metropolitan Area Agency on Aging, appeared before the Board to review the work they do in the County on behalf of older adults. She stated the agency was a nonprofit organization designated by the Minnesota Board of Aging to serve the seven county metro area. She noted their role is to be a leader and advocate for older adults. Simonson explained their focus is on the well-being of older adults and family caregivers. She indicated their work is based on the values set by the MAAA Board and they strive to be a transparent organization.

She highlighted the County's demographics and number served. Simonson stated they distribute federal resources across the region and reviewed the fund distribution by category. She pointed out they develop partnerships with community organizations and stressed the number of individuals served through the Senior Linkage Line.

Pam Zimmermann, Information and Assistance Program Director, pointed out the importance of individuals being able to have and access information. She highlighted the information and services provided and pointed out the Senior Linkage Line has statewide resources.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

The University of Maryland at Baltimore has asked Carver County to assist them in training child welfare social workers in the State of Maryland in the Signs of Safety. The agreement begins July 1, 2012 and ends June 30, 2014, with an option for a one year extension. The agreement calls for Carver County social workers to deliver 140 hours of training and consultation. Adding in preparation time, this amounts to about .07FTE. The funds to be paid to Carver County in the agreement will fund .25FTE of social worker time. In addition, such training activities increase the enthusiasm, confidence, and knowledge of Carver County's social workers.

Cindy Barfknecht was hired recently as a .5FTE social worker. For the remainder of this year she is covering a maternity leave and working full time. Angela Korich-Starling's .7FTE position was recently combined with an available .5FTE position to make a 1.0FTE position. The Division would now like to move the remaining .2FTE to Cindy, and use the revenue from the agreement with the University of Maryland to make Cindy's position full time for the duration of the agreement with the University of Maryland.

BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:				

The Community Social Services Department has been the recipient of a Office of Justice Programs Bureau of Justice Assistance grant for three years which funded a Jail Pre-Release Coordinator in the Carver County Jail. The Division was notified on October 10 that the County was not selected for continued funding. Both the Community Social Services Department and the Sheriff's Division believes the He Jail Pre-Release Coordinator was a valuable asset to the jail and to the inmates transition back into society. This included but was not limited to mental health and employment needs.

Community Social Services and Sheriff's Division would like to continue the program in part. Community Social Services has a vacant .5 FTE Social Worker II (Truancy) and the Sheriff has a .5 FTE Medical Records Clerk. There is sufficient funding between the two positions to continue to fund a position that will devote .5 FTE to the Jail Pre-Release duties and perform the truancy functions for the Schools of Eastern Carver County. The current .5 FTE Social Worker II will be assigned to the remaining school districts.

The Jail Pre-Release Coordinator and the Social Worker II are both Pay Grade 13 positions. The Division is requesting that new position be classified as a Jail Pre-Release Coordinator/Truancy.

The Division is requesting that the balance of the funding be used for Purchase of Services money for the the Jail Pre-Release function since this was also part of the original grant.

ACTION REQUESTED:

To delete the .5 FTE Medical Records Clerk and .5 FTE Social Worker II effective January 1, 2013.

To continue the Jail Pre-Release Program by combining the position with the truancy duties utilizing the funding from the deleted positions.

To budget \$8573 in Purchase of Services to be used in the Jail Pre-Release Program for CY2013.

Related Financial/FTE Comments:

There is \$26,100 for the .5 FTE Medical Records Clerk and \$55,000 for the .5 FTE Social Worker II for a total of \$81,100. The projected salary for the Jail Pre-Release Coordinator for CY2013 is \$72,527. The Division will pick up \$5,802 in 8% Federal Financial Participation revenue on the new position. The balance of the funding, \$8,573 will be allocated to Purchases of Services for the Jail Pre-Release Program.
