#### BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

#### Background for License Center front doors remaining closed to walk-in customers and opened by appointment only:

Last summer, when the County Board re-opened the front doors to County buildings for walk-in customers, License Center management recommended and the County Board approved keeping the County's License Center front doors closed to walk-in customers and remain open by appointment only due to:

- 1. The customer traffic flow going thru the License Center drive-thru's was extremely high due to limited alternative options for customers which we feared could have become overwhelming and out of control chaos inside our License Center buildings if we would have opened our front doors to walk-in customers last summer.
- 2. License Center staff turnover of a Senior Specialist in Chaska and two experienced Specialists in Chaska meant both License Centers were short staffed last summer.
- 3. The State of Mn operates DMV's across the State and the front doors to their buildings are opened by appointment only and remain closed to walk-in customers. State of MN staff who work inside the County's Chaska License Center managing a behind the wheel driving test have requested that the Chaska License Center front doors remain closed to walk-in customers until the front doors for the State of Mn DMV's are similarly re-opened. The State of Mn's written agreement with the County to allow State employees to work inside our County building does not address the possibility of keeping the front doors closed for the State's driving test walk-in customers while opening the front doors for County License Center walk-in customers.

### **Update:**

- 1. Customer traffic flow has significantly slowed down at both County License Centers as metro and out-state DMV's have gradually increased their operational capacity since last summer.
- 2. County License Centers are now fully staffed! (FYI: Fully trained typically takes 6-12 months)
- 3. Front doors to the State DMV's remain closed to walk-in customers and opened by appointment only.
- 4. The County's virtual waiting room queuing software ("Qless") will provide walk-in customers with the option to wait inside their vehicles until it is their turn to be served for any customers who are concerned about maintaining social distance in our customer lobby waiting area.

County staff will provide a high level overview of License Center operational strategies including our very popular online appointment process which was operational pre-Covid so it won't be impacted once the License Center front doors are reopened for walk-in customers.

### BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

The County Board acting as the Ditch Authority is responsible for inspecting and maintaining the efficiency of the drainage system and to make sure the lands utilizing the drainage systems pay for the maintenance and repairs of the system in a fair and equitable way. Over time, land development can expand the number of property owners who benefit from the ditch system. A Redetermination of Benefits is a formal process where viewers use updated maps, photos and other data to identify current drainage patterns and boundaries to determine which property owners are benefitting from the ditch system so the Ditch Authority can make sure the maintenance and repairs of ditch systems are being paid by the appropriate property owners. Recent MN Statutes require that payments to property owners for required buffer strips along ditches be completed as part of the Redetermination of Ditch Benefits process. The following is a listing of Carver County Ditches and Joint Ditches - bold indicates a Redetermination of Benefits has not been completed/started for over 15 years:

County Ditch 2-3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10: County staff have no records of a Redetermination of Benefits since these ditches were originally established.

County Ditch 4A: Redetermined in 2011

Joint Ditch 1: Carver 65.16%/McLeod 34.84% Mcleod has requested Carver to consider a Redetermination

Joint Ditch 3-A: Redetermined in 2012

Joint Ditch 2: Recently established in 2013 Sibley 96.87%/Carver 3.13% - no need for a Redetermination

Joint Ditch 4: Carver 70.387%; Wright 26.458%; McLeod 3.155%

Joint Ditch 5: Carver 77.52%; McLeod 22.48%

Joint Ditch 21: Sibley County working on Redetermination

Joint Ditch 22: Sibley County working on Redetermination

Joint Ditch 24: Sibley County is working on Redetermination

Joint Ditch 28: McLeod County working on Redetermination

Joint Ditch 33: Newly established in 2020 Sibley/Carver - no need for a Redetermination

County staff is recommending that the remaining ditches identified above in bold be Redetermined in 2022. The process begins by the Ditch Authority ordering the Redetermination of Benefits and selecting the viewers. After the viewers complete their work, each benefitting ditch property owner receive an individualized report explaining their ditch benefit and their % of the cost of the Redetermination. County staff will present additional details and answer any questions about the Redetermination process.

Ditch maintenance and repair costs are annually assessed to the benefitting land owners. Thus, no County levy dollars are						
spent maintaining or repairing ditches. The Redetermination of Benefits for the remaining ditches are expected to cost						
approximately \$250,000. County staff recommend that the County Board authorize a one-year no interest loan for the initial						
cost of the Redetermination which will be assessed to the ditch property owners in 2023 which will be used to repay to the
