A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on March 22, 2011. Chair Randy Maluchnik convened the session at 9:15 a.m.

Members present: Randy Maluchnik, Chair, Tim Lynch, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler, James Ische and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve the minutes of the March 8, 2011, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Randy Wolf, Public Health and Environment, updated the Board on the flood coverage the County recently purchased. Ken Carlson, Emergency Management, reviewed the flooding status of the Minnesota and Crow Rivers and identified road closures.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Motion carried unanimously.

Randy Wolf, Public Health and Environment, requested the Board approve a budget amendment that reflected funding changes that have come from the Solid Waste Management Coordinating Board (SWMCB). He highlighted the budget changes and clarified he was uncertain if these funding changes would continue next year as the SWMCB was still having those discussions.

Mike Lein, Public Health and Environment, highlighted the mission and makeup of the SWMCB beginning in the 1980's. He stated the SWMCB consisted of six of the seven metro counties. He reviewed their future priorities and funding sources. He stated the arrangement with the PCA lasted many years but grant guidelines changed. Lein explained SWMCB's funding history.

Lein reviewed the negotiations and one year agreement that was reached between SWMCB and PCA related to the flow of funding. He indicated the PCA agreed to increase the counties local recycling development grant and the counties could then increase their SWMCB funding to accomplish the work plan. He stated he was asking the Board to approve the special project assessment and related budget amendment.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the 2011 Solid Waste Management Coordinating Board special project budget and related Public Health and Environment budget amendment increasing intergovernmental revenue \$84,865 and increasing dues expenditure \$72,006 and increasing Environmental Center professional services \$12,859. Motion carried unanimously.

David Hemze, County Administrator, reviewed proposed changes to the 2011 Board's Operating Rules and meeting schedule. He noted last week's work session that reviewed each of the suggested changes. He pointed out the change to videotape the public comment section of the agenda and the guidelines established.

He reviewed changes to the current meeting schedule that would add a regularly scheduled late day meeting to better accommodate the public. He noted they would continue to have the option of holding additional evening meetings.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to adopt the proposed changes to provide more open county government effective immediately. Motion carried unanimously.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Board approve the submittal of 2011 federal grant applications. He stated the regional solicitation occurs every two years for the Twin Cities metropolitan area. He identified the five federal programs available and indicated he was recommending they apply under the categories of the Surface Transportation Program for roads and Transportation Enhancements for trails. He indicated 80% of construction costs are eligible for federal funds under the STP program.

He stated road candidates were based on known issues and priorities. Robjent indicated the projects were prescreened for eligibility, safety and traffic volumes as well as looking at costs and who was responsible for them. He indicated trail candidates were based on regional needs and plans.

Robjent identified the list of road projects and recognized the work session with the Board which narrowed the list down to six. He reviewed project construction costs and the required local match. He explained possible funding sources for the match and clarified they do not have to accept the grant if things change.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to authorize the County Engineer and Parks Director to prepare and submit federal funding applications to the Metropolitan Council for CSAH 10, 14, 18, CR 122 Extension, CSAH 10 Regional Trail and MN River Bluffs Regional Trail. Motion carried unanimously.

Martin Walsh, Parks, requested the Board adopt a Resolution of support for a grant application to the DNR. He explained the Legacy Fund grant fund application process and the stated the grant program was funded with dedicated sales tax from the constitutional amendment for clean water, habitat, parks and trails and the arts. He stated the applications are scored in a competitive process and pointed out the required match.

He highlighted three proposed projects and the benefits of each. Walsh stated a public hearing was held by the Park Commission. He noted the work session held last week to review the three grant applications and the Board's direction to apply for a grant for phase II of the Dakota Rail Regional Trail due to timing issues with the other two projects.

Ische offered the following Resolution, seconded by Degler:

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to go into closed session at 10:26 a.m. according to MSA Section 13D.05 to discuss confidential information of offers or counter officers for the purchase of the Union Pacific Rail Line Chaska Industrial Lead and to discuss confidential appraisal data and to update the Board on the status of the Lake Waconia Regional Park land acquisition Motion carried unanimously. The Board adjourned the closed and Regular Session at 11:42 a.m.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: The purpose of this action is to contract with Executive Outdoor Services for lawn services and grounds maintenance. Facilities Services also uses this contract for annual plantings at the Veteran's Memorial and Law Enforcement Center entrance.				
Staff issued an RFP through the mail and published it on the Carver County web site February 9, 2011. Thirteen responses were delivered and recorded on the due date of February 24, 2011. The majority of the services to be provided are lawn mowing, leaf clean up, weed control and fertilization at County facilities in Waconia, Cologne, Chaska and Chanhassen. Staff has interviewed representatives from the organizations that submitted the three lowest proposals to learn about their insurance, references, and equipment. The fourth is the incumbent service provider. After reviewing the proposals, the low responder failed to provide a State Applicator licenses and also indicated that a subcontractor (TruGreen) was used on their behalf to apply weed control in a liquid form. Staff is recommending not entering into a Contract with the low quote since the contractor can't provide all the services themselves that we require. The interview process determined that Executive Outdoor Services is recommended for contract approval for County properties. All of the low quotes from Executive Outdoor Services kept the pricing the same for 2012.				
The recommended contract is \$18,216 for lawn service which is 10.5% reduction (County paid \$20,385 this past year) in base services compared to last year. The total two-year amount is \$36,432 based upon 6 months base contract. Staff is also requesting an allowance for perennial plantings, two fertilization applications and additional cleanup should a storm or other event occur of a NTE of \$3,000/year.

The Public Health & Environment Division would like to contract with Allied Waste for the loading and transportation of yard waste collected at the Carver County Environmental Center in Chaska; and delivery and disposal of it to the Specialized Environmental Technology compost site in Shakopee.				
This contract replaces a previous contract with RW Farms for this service. Bid requests were mailed out to all haulers operating in Carver County and seven bids obtained. Allied Waste is a licensed hauler in Carver County as well as the rest of the metro region and submitted the most competitive bid for this service. The Allied Waste bid of \$8.45 per cubic yard is significantly less than the previous contract amount of \$9.50 per cubic yard. RW Farms did not submit a bid for this contract. The contract also includes new loading and measurement requirements to improve record keeping and accountability.

The preliminary construction cost including design and engineering is estimated at \$1,650,000. The proposed contract with SRF Consulting Group, Inc. provides the necessary consulting, design and engineering service to complete construction of the project at a value of \$249,426. Work to begin construction documents is recommended to begin due to the necessary reviews to meet federal standards for the project. The County's share for construction and design and engineering of the Local matching funds is planned to come from CCRRA and Parks and Trails funds that the County will receive through the Metropolitan Council/state sales tax proceeds for parks. Staff recommends approval of the professional service agreement for design and engineering service.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: The Carver County Environmental Center opened in the summer of 2002 with the mission of providing a convenient year round location for residents and business to recycle and/or responsibly manage household hazardous waste and other special wastes such as tires and appliances. The Environmental Center has proven to be a very popular waste management option. Almost 12,500 visits to the Center were made by residents and business in 2003, the first full year of operation. Almost 25,000 visits were made in 2010. Thus participation has more than doubled in eight years of operation.		
Many changes in operations have been made since the Center opened. Hours have been expanded and "tweaked" to reflect users habits, services have been added, and changes in operation have occurs. One example is the yard waste bunker which was constructed in 2007 to make yard waste drop-off easier for residents and less expensive to manage for the County. Some materials have also become more popular or increased. For example, changes in regulations regarding the disposal waste consumer electronics such as televisions and computers have resulted in amounts of these materials increasing from 317,000 pounds in 2008 to 558,000 pounds in 2010.		
The increase in participation requires constant reassessment of the Environmental Center operations to remain cost effective and customer friendly. One need that was identified several years ago was a canopy over the receiving area. Currently the receiving area is uncovered and exposed to the elements. This limits both operational efficiencies and customer service during rain snow and other weather related events. Funds for a canopy were included in the 2009 Capital Improvement Budget. However, the City of Chaska expressed concerns about the canopy and did not recommend construction. We have since further discussed the issue with the City and have obtained agreement to move ahead with a building permit for the project.		
The Facilities Department coordinated design and city approvals for the proposed canopy project. Construction costs including construction management services indicate a preliminary total cost estimate of \$130,000. Staff is designing a proposed storm water feature that will accommodate the weight bearing columns for support. Major construction divisions are design, engineering, steel, fire protection, site, and asphalt.		
Funds are available in the Capital Improvement budget for the construction.
