A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on April 19, 2022. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 9:02 a.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, John P. Fahey, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Matt Udermann and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

No public comments were received.

Lynch moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Udermann seconded, to approve the minutes of the April 12, 2022 Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Udermann moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved \$315,000 from the Year End Savings Account to upgrade the Jail's Security system.

Authorized Court Services acceptance of donations made to the Carver County Drug Treatment Court.

Issued charitable gambling license to the Augusta Ball Club, Inc., for a raffle to be held on October 1, 2022.

Approved the one day to four day temporary on-sale liquor license application for Augusta Ball Club for an event to be held on June 3-5, 2022 and for an event to be held on October 1, 2022.

Resolution #31-22, Master Partnership Contract 1050133 Between State of Minnesota and County of Carver.

Approved the elimination of a 0.60 Veterans Transportation Driver and the increase of remaining 0.60 FTE driver to a 0.80 FTE driver and related Veterans Services budget amendment.

Approved updates and additions to the IT section of the Administrative Policy Manual.

Approved submitting letters to request support for State bonding for Highway 5 and County Road 18 and authorized the Chair to sign the letters.

Reviewed April 19, 2022, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$385,404.67.

Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Fahey seconded, to open the 2022 redistricting public hearing. Motion carried unanimously.

Kendra Olson, Elections and Licensing Manager, explained the purpose of the public hearing was an opportunity to receive public input on redistricting. She reviewed the redistricting schedule and the deadline to approve a plan. She indicated the current commissioner districts were used as a baseline with Districts 1 and 5 on the 2022 ballot due to boundary changes and annexation and Districts 2 and 4 on the ballot due to the four-year terms ending in 2022. She pointed out district options are limited due to Waconia annexations in Laketown Township and city precinct boundary changes.

Olson explained Options A, B and C and explained the positive and negative impacts for each option. She reviewed Option D that was submitted by the public and explained why that option did not meet the statutory requirements or municipal precinct boundary requirements.

She pointed out the statutory requirements that drive the plan. Olson highlighted population changes by municipality and noted precinct changes needed to be factored in when redistricting. She explained the Waconia "marriage" requirement that requires them to lock together certain precincts due to annexations and islands. Olson stated this marriage limits their redistricting options.

She stated she would be asking the Board to close the public hearing next week and at that meeting approve the 2022 Redistricting Plan. She indicated they would also asking for a Resolution to determine two- and four-year terms going forward and for approval of the Soil and Water 2022 Redistricting Plan. She noted Soil and Water may be recommending a slightly different boundary plan, but the Soil and Water Districts are not required to be exactly the same as the Board's plan.

Reid Welch, Carver, Minnesota, recognized the unique redistricting challenges and, in his opinion, suggested they choose Option B or C. He thought the compactness and boundary requirements made sense and there was not a good solution to the Waconia marriage requirement. He stated equal population representation was important and anything to get the Districts as close to the 10% was ideal.

Mark Metz, County Attorney, stated there was not a mathematical equation in the decision and the Board needed to do their due diligence and balance out the criteria. He stressed it was important to consider all factors and one does not have any more weight than the other. Metz added it was important for the Board's consideration to be thoughtful and specific and when they make their determination they express why they are choosing or rejecting an option.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to continue the 2022 Redistricting Public Hearing to April 26, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

Kerie Anderka, Employee Relations, requested the Board approve updates to the Personnel Policy and Health & Safety Policy manuals. She noted Employee Relations periodically reviews policies and brings recommended updates to the Board for approval.

Anderka explained updates to the motor vehicle, respiratory protection and lactation support policies. She stated the former telework policy will now be located in the Personnel Policy Manual. She stated the telework policy was completely updated and recognizes the shift in employment practices since the pandemic. She stated telework was a key business strategy and would increase flexibility, service delivery options and reduce the need to expand office space. Anderka indicated telework has proven highly successful and 70% of the non-law enforcement workforce was engaged via telework, either primarily remote or hybrid work arrangements.

She stated performance-based outcomes will continue to be a key strategies with telework.

Fahey moved, Lynch seconded, to adopt the Carver County Personnel Policy and Health & Safety Policy updates as recommended by the Employee Relations Division and remove the former Telework Policy from the Administrative Policy Manual. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman left the room at this time.

Pat Lambert, Public Works, requested the Board adopt a Resolution authorizing settlement agreements for right of way acquisition for the Highway 24 project.

Fahey offered the following Resolution, seconded by Degler:

Resolution #32-22 Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for Highway 24 Project

Degler, Fahey, Udermann voted aye. Lynch abstained. Workman absent.

Workman returned to the room at 10:12 a.m.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session and go into work sessions with Public Works and Public Services. Motion carried unanimously.

Employee Relations recommends an update to the STOC wage ranges to allow for greater flexibility in the current job market and to continue to enable departments to attract candidates to seasonal, temporary, and on-call position in a competitive employment market. Recent STOC Wage Schedule updates focused primarily on addressing seasonal worker ranges ahead of annual seasonal staffing. The current update includes recommendations arising from a review of jobs, and groups of jobs, where STOC workers are less frequently hired but may be needed on occasion. The updates move certain former stand-alone listings into broader STOC groups based on general level of work, and adjust ranges for the capacity to include additional jobs or unique needs.

The attached shows the proposed rates by position and job type groups. Employee Relations reviewed comparable types of work within the County's classification structure and referenced the County's updated 2022 salary ranges to assemble the recommended STOC wage ranges. For STOC positions or groups that address comparable types of work as regular positions, Employee Relations recommends the STOC ranges encompass the portion of the range from minimum to target rate associated with comparable regular positions and/or similar types of work. This provides a method to define STOC ranges that can accommodate a variety of needs, including areas where STOC assistance is rarely needed. The proposed STOC Wage Schedule also removes the stand-alone Computer Support Personnel and Computer Systems Application Analyst and adds an Information Technology Personnel STOC wage range that encompasses technical IT positions with a higher maximum due to the increasing difficulty in recruiting these highly technical positions.

Recommended STOC Wage Scale updates do not have a direct immediate impact on actual rates for current staff. Employee Relations, in partnership with the hiring manager, will continue to review qualifications of the candidate and related market conditions when determining actual wage.

Divisions utilizing STOC personnel will continue to be responsible to maintain overall STOC costs within the approved budgets for this purpose and no funds are being requested with these recommended adjustments.

Seasonal, temporary and on-call workers shall generally be paid within the first quartile of the range listed above for the type of work they will perform. The Employee Relations Division Director or designee may authorize a higher wage based on the qualifications and background of the worker or related market conditions. Movement within the range shall be based on the specific situation of each worker, given the nature of the assignment. No STOC worker shall be paid above the maximum listed above for any given positon.

*Minimum wage requirements will be adjusted to comply with the large employer provisions for MN. As of January 1, 2018, Minnesota's minimum wage is indexed to inflation; the inflationary increase is capped at 2.5% per year. Impacted minimum wages will be adjusted accordingly.

STOC Wage Scale Amendment Crisis Program Intermittent Staff

Ready Reserve - Telephone and Mobile Status for Non-Exempt Intermittent Employees

1. Employees who are required by the Employer to be in Ready Reserve - Telephone Status shall be compensated at the rate of \$6.00 per hour while assigned to be in Ready Reserve -Telephone Status. Employees who are required by the Employer to be in Ready Reserve - Mobile Status shall be compensated at the rate of \$18.00 per hour while assigned to be in Ready Reserve - Mobile Status.

2. Employees in Ready Reserve - Telephone Status who answer a telephone call move from Ready Reserve - Telephone Status to Active Work Status. Employees in Ready Reserve - Mobile Status who answer a telephone call or initiate a mobile response move from Ready Reserve - Mobile Status to Active Work Status.

3. Employees in Active Work Status shall report hours worked to the nearest quarter hour increment.

4. Time spent in Ready Reserve - Telephone Status shall constitute hours of work for the purposes of calculating overtime after forty (40) hours in a work week.

5. Employees working on the designated holiday shall receive premium pay of time and one half for all compensated hours.

6. Employees shall not receive both Ready Reserve Status pay and their regular straight time rate of pay for the same hours.

Intermittent Mental Health Professional and Practitioner Non-Ready Reserve Shifts

1. Intermittent Mental Health Professionals and Practitioners working between 12:00 a.m. (midnight) and 8:00 a.m. on a Non-Ready Reserve shift shall receive shift differential of \$0.80 per hour for the time they are deemed to be working. Shift differential as outlined above is not available to Intermittent Mental Health Professionals and Practitioners serving in Ready Reserve -Telephone Status or in Active Work Status as part of their assigned Ready Reserve - Telephone Status shift.

2. Intermittent Mental Health Professionals and Practitioners working on the designated holiday shall receive premium pay of time and one half for all compensated hours.

Resolution Authorizing Settlement of Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for Highway 24 Project

- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Carver County is the official governing body of Carver County ("County"); and
- WHEREAS, the County, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, is authorized by law, and pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, § 163.02, subd. 2; §117.012; and § 117.042, to acquire land and other real property interests in Carver County which the County needs for a public use or public purpose; and
- WHEREAS, the County proposes to construct highway and related improvements in Carver County for shoulder widening as part of the Highway 24 Project ("Project"); and
- WHEREAS, to complete the Project, the County must acquire the real property interests described in Exhibit A, attached hereto, from the Owners of the real property interests identified in said Exhibit A; and
- WHEREAS, the County obtained either an appraisal(s) from a licensed real estate appraiser when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A exceeds \$25,000, or the County obtained a minimum damage acquisition report from a qualified person with appraisal knowledge, in lieu of an appraisal, when the estimate of the damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A is under \$25,000; and
- WHEREAS, County must determine and submit an initial written offer of just compensation to the Owners of said needed real property interests covering the full amount of damages caused by the County's proposed acquisitions; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests may obtain an independent appraisal by a qualified appraiser of the real property interests which the County proposes to acquire for the Project; and
- WHEREAS, the Owners of said real property interests are entitled to reimbursement for the reasonable costs of the appraisal from the County up to a maximum of the limits stated in Minn. Stat. §117.036, provided the Owner submits to County the information necessary for reimbursement; and
- WHEREAS, the Carver County Board of Commissioners authorized the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, to make initial written offers of just compensation to the Owners within the Project from whom property interests are required; and

- WHEREAS, the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, have negotiated settlement(s) with the Owners impacted by the Project as described in said Exhibit A.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that County's acquisition of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A and the construction of highway and related improvements of shoulder widening as part of the Highway 24 Project constitute a valid public use or public purpose; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that based upon the estimate of damages from the County's proposed acquisitions of the real property interests described in said Exhibit A which the County obtained either from an appraisal(s) or a minimum damage acquisition report(s) and the negotiations between said Owner(s) and the Public Works Division Director or agents under his supervision, County shall make a payment of compensation to the Owners within the Project from whom the County must acquire needed real property interests, in the amounts as described in said Exhibit A; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Carver County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes and directs the Carver County Board Chairman and Carver County Administrator to enter into Stipulation of Settlement Agreement with said property owner(s), in the name of the County of Carver for the Project.
