A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on May 3, 2022. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 9:02 a.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, John P. Fahey, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Matt Udermann and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Under public comments, Karen Johnson Leuthner, 15735 38th Street, Mayer, raised her concerns with parts of her comments being cut from last week's videotape of the meeting. She pointed out the public file that she distributed at today's meeting. She noted a previous Board's vote not to do a full investigation on the Hollywood Tower and referenced the additional information she distributed today. Johnson Leuthner stated her mission has been health concerns and wanted an investigation.

The following amendment was made to the agenda: Add 5.25 Motorcycle Awareness Month in Carver County

Lynch moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

Udermann moved, Workman seconded, to approve the minutes of the April 26, 2022, Special Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Resolution #37-22, Adopting Ordinance 98-2022 an Ordinance Imposing Slow-No Wake Watercraft Restrictions on Designated Lakes.

Approved professional services agreement for Habilitation Center, LLC.

Authorized the issuance of a special event use permit to St. Joseph Catholic Church of Waconia for their Walk on Waconia Fundraiser Event on May 21, 2022.

Agreements with the cities of Chanhassen, Chaska, Carver, Mayer and Waconia for snow removal on Destination Regional Trails upon completion of the contract review process.

Approved professional services agreement with MAXIM Healthcare Staffing Services, Inc., for the provision of professional services not to exceed \$50,000, pending approval of Attorney/Risk Management.

Resolution #38-22, Authorizing Offers of Just Compensation to Owners for Acquisition of Real Property Interests Needed for the Highway 20/25 Intersection Project-Watertown.

Purchase of service agreement with Koch School Bus Services, Inc. and related HH&S budget amendment.

Approved the professional services agreement with Midwest Electric and Generator for the purchase and installation of the generator pending completion of the contract review process and transferring ownership of the generator to SW Transit once installation of the generator and all project deliverables have been completed.

Purchase agreement with Cartegraph Systems, Inc., pending finalization of the contract review process.

Approved the issuance of the special use permit to Podium Sports Marketing for the Lola's ½ Marathon Events on June 4, 2022.

Approved joint powers agreement with the City of Eden Prairie and District 272 Eden Prairie Schools pending completion of the contract review process.

Approved the professional services agreement with Castrejon, Inc. pending completion of the contract review process.

Approved professional services agreement with Taylor Electric in the amount of \$95,720 for traffic signal improvements on Highway 59, pending completion of the contract review process.

Resolution #39-22, Approving Carver County's Application for Funding from the Ballot Drop Box Grant Program.

Approved the release of the CCWMO Water Management Minor Plan Amendment for 30-day public and agency review.

Resolution #40-22, Amending the Carver County Water Management Water Stewardship Cost Share Program.

Approved software purchase agreements with Procore and Finario, pending finalization of the contract review process.

Resolution #41-22, Support and Approval of Submittal of Community Project Funding and Congressionally Directed Spending Requests.

Adopted Findings of Fact and issued Order #PZ20220012 for the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit, Emily and Zach Stover, Watertown Township.

Adopted the Findings of Fact and issued Order #PZ20220003 for the issuance of a Conditional User Permit, USS Dressen Family Solar, LLC, Watertown Township.

Adopted the Findings of Fact and issued Order #PZ20220011 for the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit, Tamie Schmitz, Watertown Township.

Resolution #42-22, Support and Approval for Submittal of the US Highway 212 Rural Freight Mobility and Safety Project to US DOT's Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Opportunity Program.

Approved addendum to the agreement between the County Attorney, Mark Metz and the Chief Deputy County Attorney, Peter Ivy.

Reviewed May 4, 2022, Community Social Services' actions/Commissioners' warrants in the amount of \$448,855.70.

Motion carried unanimously.

The Board considered a Resolution to proclaim May as Motorcycle Awareness Month in Carver County. Workman read into the record the proposed Resolution.

Workman offered the following Resolution, seconded by Fahey:

Resolution #43-22 Motorcycle Awareness Month in Carver County

On vote taken, all voted aye.

David Frischmon, Finance, explained a public hearing was required for a 5-year Capital Improvement Bonding Plan and for a bond sale to reimburse the County for the 2.5 million in cash reserves that was used to acquire the Steiner Kelting Mental Wellness Facility. He stated previously the Board adopted a declaration of intent to reimburse the County with a bond sale that gives them an opportunity to get cash back to use for other purposes. He noted the 18-month time window to issue bonds and the public hearing that was required.

Workman moved, Udermann seconded to open the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously.

Nick Anhut, Ehlers and Associates, reviewed the bonding process. He stated the Steiner Kelting Facility was up and running and pointed out the related cost. He indicated the bond issue would recover 2.5 million that could be invested in other funding needs. Anhut noted a lease agreement was in place with People's Inc to provide for the bonds' debt service.

He identified the eight statutory CIP bond considerations. Anhut outlined the County's existing debt. He indicated they did not anticipate the 2.5 million bond would impose any limitations on the County's future plans and have no impact on the County's AAA rating. Anhut pointed out the petition period that would follow and the plan to present financing bids to the Board on June 14th. He clarified the County would not be able to lock in a rate until after that 30-day petition window. Anhut stated they estimated a 3.25 rate if they were to finalize this now based on a 24-year debt issuance.

Frischmon pointed out the State requirement to issue debt in order to pass that on through the lease agreement. He explained the 2.5 million would be used for the required match for the Lake Waconia Regional Park Phase II project.

No public testimony was received.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to close the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman offered the following Resolution, seconded by Lynch:

Resolution #44-22 Approving Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan 2022-2026 and Confirming Intent to Issue Bonds

On vote taken, all voted aye.

Lyndon Robjent, Public Works, requested the Board approve a reorganization in public Works. He noted the work session that was previously held with the Board. He pointed out Public Works was very busy, that the County was growing rapidly, and they had large programs ahead of them in the next ten to twenty years. He highlighted the current organizational chart and explained proposed revisions in Operations, Program Delivery, Asset and Performance Management and the Parks Departments.

He reviewed costs and overall FTE changes. He noted as they get through the grading process, the costs may change.

Workman moved, Fahey seconded, to approve the reorganization in Public Works. Degler, Fahey, Lynch, Workman voted aye. Udermann voted nay. Motion carried

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 10:14 a.m. and go into a work session with Public Services. Motion carried unanimously.

The 2022 Maifest has been reformatted to accommodate possible social distancing while still providing a quality, fun cultural experience. We anticipate 1000+ guests in attendance. Please see attached advertisement for the main details.

2022 Maifest offers the opportunity to purchase authentic German food on line & schedule a time for pick up or you may attend in person. Online orders can be placed at www.stpeterlc.org All food will be prepared on property in our commercial grade kitchen.

Schnitzel dinner, Bratwurst dinner, Apfelstudel & Pretzels will be served.

Our west parking lot entrance will be split in two sections with the west side being directed to park in the adjoining hay field & the east section being directed to the drive through food pick up line.

Guests will be encouraged to park at the CCLS parking lot in Watertown. A bus from Stahlke Bus Co., Delano will be employed to transport guests to & from the CCLS parking lot every 1/2 hour.

The drive through line will pass between the Church building & the service tent. Once the customers have picked up their prepaid orders they will exit out of the east parking lot, drive on to Navajo & back out on to 24.

There will be no entry allowed on the east side of the parking lot.

The event has been trimmed back from 9 hours to 4 hours.

The silent auction will be held in the church fellowship hall

There will be the maibaum raising ceremony and children's activities.

St. Peter members & volunteers will wear face masks & gloves when serving food & beverages to the guests, if state guidelines require it.

We will use only our own 20x30 tents for seating.

Attendees will enter through an open air information tent so attendance instructions & food menus may be distributed.

Guests will be encouraged to wear masks while shopping at the Maifest Markt & ordering food or beer.

Lupine Brewing Company, Delano MN will be our soul beer supplier.

Tent seating will be limited with the main seating along the tree line on the east side of the parking lot & in front of the 20x30 tents.

There will be only one band & one strolling musician.

Food will be ordered in a 10x20 "payment/order" tent and our youth group members will then pick up the orders from the food service tent & deliver the food to the tables.

Guests will be responsible for their own beer orders & pick up from the separate beer tent. An open air Maifest Market will be placed on both the east & west side of the Church proper for guests to shop for gift & garden items.

Food service will operate out of both sides of a 20x30 cook/service tent with to go orders being picked up on the south side & on property dining orders being picked up on the north side by our youth members who will then deliver the orders to the guests at their tables. Guests will dispose of their own garbage in strategically placed garbage cans throughout the property.

The beer tent will be set up to the east of the food tent & be a separate unit. Guests will be responsible for their own alcoholic beverage pick up.

We will be renting a garbage dumpster from Blackowiak Disposal, Mound MN. We will be renting 2 regular & 2 handicap porta potties plus two hand wash stations from Mini Biff, Hutchinson MN. This is double our usual outdoor facilities due to no admittance to the Church proper for bathrooms







Findings and Order Initiating the Redetermination of Benefits and Appointing Viewers for Carver County Ditches 2-3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10 by the Carver County Ditch Authority

Findings:

- 1. County Ditches 2-3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10 were established between 1904 and 1980 and County staff believe the current benefits roll reflects the benefited and damaged properties and benefitted and damaged areas as determined in the original proceedings.
- 2. Since the original determination of benefits and damages, land uses and drainage practices have changed to accelerate and increase to flow of water to the drainage system changing the nature and value of benefits accruing to lands from construction of CD 2-3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10.
- 3. Since the original determination of benefits and damages, additional lands, not previously determined to be benefitted properties and areas have improved drainage to take advantage of CD 2-3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10 as an outlet for drainage.
- 4. Since the original determination of benefits and damages, land values have substantially changed within the benefitted area of CD 2-3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10.
- 5. The Drainage Authority for CD 2-3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10 finds that the conditions required for the initiation of a redetermination of benefits exist, that the original benefits and damages do not reflect reasonable present day land values and the benefitted areas have changed.
