A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on February 23, 2010. Chair James Ische convened the session at 9:15 a.m.

Members present: James Ische, Chair, Gayle Degler, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the February 9, 2010 Regular Session. Degler, Ische, Maluchnik, Workman voted aye. Lynch abstained as he was absent from the meeting. Motion carried.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Resolution #12-10 Accepting Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs Enhancement Grant and related Veterans Service budget amendment increasing Veteran's Council revenue \$35,000, CVSO enhancement grant revenue \$35,000 and increasing Veteran's Affairs Van expenditure \$70,000.

Authorized Chair to sign addendum to Targeted Case Management agreement regarding Health Partners.

Authorized the CSS Encore Adult Day Care Services program to accept various donations valued at approximately \$714.

Motion carried unanimously.

Paul Moline, Land and Water Services, introduced Kurt Deter, with the Rinke Noonan law firm, and stated he was present to provide them with an update. He explained the County retains Mr. Deter to provide legal advisory services for the County's Ditch Boards and water management organization.

Deter stated he represented counties across the State and visits them to provide a legislative update and review ongoing issues. He indicated the legislature mandated a Drainage Work Group and they have been meeting to discuss items that need to be changed. He reviewed each of the Work Group's recommended drainage law clarifications that were proposed to the legislature. Deter pointed out the importance of the dollar amount being raised for the drainage system repair fund. He stated County ditches not showing up in title opinions have also started to raise problems and referenced the process counties could utilize for recording County ditch systems.

RaeJean Madsen, Public Health, requested the Board approve the Statewide Health Improvement Program (SHIP) joint powers agreement and the consultant contracts for conducting a health survey and the evaluation of SHIP interventions and implementation work. She noted the SHIP grant that was awarded in 2009 and the work plan that covered Scott and Carver counties. Madsen stated the goal is to reduce chronic disease and look at policy and environmental changes.

David Hemze, County Administrator, pointed out the Governor's proposed cut to this program and inquired on the impact of that on this grant.

Madsen stated the grant is funded in different years. She reviewed the work that would occur in 2010 and 2011 and indicated, if there was any budget reduction, they would re-evaluate the work and ask for guidance from the State Health Department. She stated, with the contracts in place, there was a standard provision that allows them to reduce or terminate the contract if there was a reduction in funds.

The Board inquired on the recent data that was released as part of the health rankings of counties. Madsen responded that information was all estimated and the validity of that data is only valid if there is real data backing it up. She stated the health rankings were useful to raise awareness but was not data to rely on when making long term plans.

The Board recognized the increase use of cell phones and technology and questioned how individuals would be contacted for the survey. Madsen stated 500 surveys were to be completed for

each county and they are relying on the vendor on how to best obtain those surveys. She highlighted the types of questions that would be asked. Madsen stated the survey was the first step to address long term planning.

She explained how the data would be used and stated this will allow them to take specific targeted steps. She stated a community leadership team has been meeting and they would be making recommendations.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to approve the joint approve the Joint Powers Agreement for a Metro-area Adult Health Survey, for a total cost not to exceed \$150,000, to be divided equally between six counties, with Carver County as the fiscal agent, with parties to the JPA to be Anoka County, Carver County, Dakota County, Ramsey County, Scott County and Washington County. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to approve the contract with Wilder Research to conduct the metro-area adult health survey, for a cost to Carver County of \$25,000, with the total contract cost not to exceed \$150,000, to be divided equally between six counties. Motion carried unanimously. This motion also approved a related budget amendment increasing Public Health revenue \$100,000 and increasing expenditures \$100,000.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the contract with Wilder Research to do evaluation of interventions and implementation efforts for the Statewide Health Improvement Program (SHIP) on behalf of Carver and Scott counties, for a total cost not to exceed \$220,500. Motion carried unanimously.

Carolyn Schmidt, Public Health, updated the Board on the H1N1 immunizations. She stated they were continuing to recommend residents receive the H1N1 immunization and were continuing to offer their twice a month, by appointment, immunization clinics.

Steve Taylor, Administrative Services, requested the Board award the bid and approve a contract for the E-Branch self service library kiosk to be located at the Victoria Recreation Center. He explained Carver and Washington Counties jointly applied and received a \$140,000 grant for a self service kiosk. Taylor indicated, after a thorough review of the bids, they were recommending the bid be awarded to LEID Products. He indicated Carver County was the fiscal agent with one kiosk to be located in the City of Hugo and the other at the Victoria Recreation Center.

Melissa Brechon, Library Director, stated the kiosks would be the first in the State. She stated residents will be able to go to the kiosk to request a book and be able to come back later to pick up the book from a locker. She indicated there would be delivery service every day and they anticipated a June completion date.

Degler moved, Maluchnik seconded, to award the self service library kiosk bid to LEID, to approve a contract with LEID and authorized the Administrative Services Director to approve up to \$5,000 in

project contingency. Motion carried unanimously. This motion also approved a related budget amendment increasing Federal library services and technology grant revenue \$99,920 and increased Carver County kiosk (Victoria) expenditure \$50,890, increased Washington County kiosk (Hugo) expenditure \$44,030 and contingency \$5,000.

Gary Bork, Community Social Services, requested Board approve creating a 1.0 FTE support services aide. Bork highlighted charts showing increases in financial aid caseloads due to the difficult economic times. He reviewed the number of clients that were eligible for medical, food support or cash assistance.

He stated the Compass/On Base system that the Financial Assistance unit has been using has been making them more productive, but the documents have to be scanned. He explained, given the increase in caseloads and documents to be scanned, he was requesting an additional support aide. Bork reviewed the changes that would be made in restructuring the financial reimbursement for a current aide position and the new position. He stated without the additional staff they could not move the OnBase system any further.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to approve the creation of a 1.0 FTE support services aide and related budget amendment increasing Federal Admin Revenue \$43,447 and increasing support aide salary and benefits \$43,447. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to go into closed session to discuss labor negotiations strategies. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn the closed and Regular Session at 12:10 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.

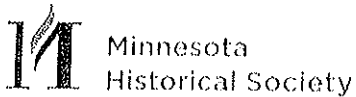

We are pleased to inform you that the above referenced property, which the county owns, will be considered by the State Review Board for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places. The National Register of Historic Places is the Federal government's official list of historic properties worthy of preservation. Listing in the National Register provides recognition and assists in preserving our Nation's heritage.

Listing of this property provides recognition of its historic importance. Federal and State agencies are required to consider effects of their projects on historic properties. In addition, units of government are required to complete a State Environmental Assessment Worksheet (EAW) prior to permitting the destruction of a property listed in the National Register. If the property is listed in the National Register, certain Federal investment tax credits for rehabilitation and other provisions may apply.

Listing in the National Register does not mean that limitations will be placed on the property by the Federal government. Public visitation rights are not required of owners. The Federal government will not attach restrictive covenants to the properties or seek to acquire them.

You are invited to attend the State Review Board meeting on Tuesday, March 23, 2010, at which the nomination will be considered. The Preservation Office staff will make an informational presentation on program activities at 6:45 p.m. The meeting will be called to order and the nominations will be presented at 7:00 p.m. The meeting will be held in the Cargill Commons, MacMillan Education Center, Minnesota Historical Society History Center, 345 Kellogg Boulevard West, St. Paul, MN 55102. BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: The County Regional Rail Authority authorized permit for a trail and advertisement for bid for phase 1 construction of a trail on the Dakota Rail Line September 22nd, 2009.

Bids were opened on January 5, 2010 for the construction of approximately 6.9 miles of bituminous trail on the Dakota Rail Regional Trail corridor, extending from the east county line to the City of Mayer (See Attached Map). The engineers estimate for the project was \$1,967,939. The project received authorization to use \$1,042,000 of Federal Transportation Enhancement Funds, and \$550,000 of Federal American Reinvestment Recovery Act Funds (Stimulus Funds). In addition, it was anticipated that approximately \$375,939 in local funds would be needed as a match to the Federal Transportation Enhancement funds and provide the remaining funding needed to balance the cost of construction.

The County received very favorable bids for the project. Nine contractors provided bids for the project. The low bidder is Chard Tiling and Excavating out of Belle Plaine with a low bid of \$1,244,713.71.

Additionally, MNDOT has swapped Transportation Enhancement Funds (TEA) for American Reinvestment Recovery Act (ARRA) Funds. This change fully finances the construction of the project with ARRA funds. Further, a new Surface Transportation Funds (STP) cap for any overruns, supplemental agreements, and/or change orders in the amount of \$69,704 has been authorized. This change of funding nearly eliminates the need for County cost participation in the construction of the trail.

Attached is the bid abstract.

MNDOT has received the necessary documents from Chard Tiling and Excavating, Inc. and has authorized the project.

Chard Tiling and Excavating is eager to begin work on bridges as soon as a contract is executed. The anticipated completion date of the trail project is December 31, 2010.

ACTION REQUESTED: It is requested that the Board award the contract to Chard Tiling and Excavating, of Belle Plain, authorize the Board Chair to sign the contract upon review and approval by Risk Management and County Attorney's Office.
