A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on May 4, 2010. Chair James Ische convened the session at 9:15 a.m.

Members present: James Ische, Chair, Gayle Degler, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Degler moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the minutes of the April 13, 2010, and April 27, 2010, Regular Session. Maidie Felton, San Francisco Township, thanked the Board for amending the April 13<sup>th</sup> minutes to include the comments made at the public hearing and to give the nay vote more credit. She noted no negative comments were included in the first draft. She stated she wanted to ensure the material distributed by Kim Gapen would be included in the record. Felton added the minutes help re-create what happened and should be recorded why the Board came to the conclusions they did and the secondary affects should have been part of the discussion. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Payment of emergency claims in the amount of \$25 and \$224.43.

Approved the designation of the Chanhassen Service Center, 7808 Kerber Boulevard, Chanhassen, Minnesota, as an alternate Carver County absentee polling location with the designation to be effective as of the 2010 primary election.

As the Community Health Board approved the appointment of RaeJean Madsen, Public Health & Environment Manager, as the SCHSAC alternate representative and Carver County CHS Administrator, effective April 12, 2010.

Memorandum of Agreement allowing for a transition period for the employees newly included in the AFSCME General Unit to reduce their leave balances and have part time holidays paid in one manner throughout 2010.

Motion carried unanimously.

Dave Hemze, County Administrator, requested the Board adopt a Proclamation identifying May 3-9, 2010, as Public Service Recognition Week. He stated the County was proud of its employees and read the proposed proclamation.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to adopt the Public Service Recognition Week Proclamation and authorized the Chair to sign. Motion carried unanimously.

Doris Krogman, Employee Relations, requested the Board recognize employees reaching milestone years of service.

Workman moved, Maluchnik seconded, to recognize the employees reaching 25, 30, 35 and 40 years of service in 2010.

Years of service certificates were given to Deborah Bergstom, Thomas Dauwalter, Debra Maresch, Richard Olson, Elton Anderson, Rowena Lauterbach, Jan Palumbo, William Weckman, Mark Williams, Lynette Wittsack, James Gamlin, Norbert Gomer and Linda Mueller.

Krogman highlighted the employee recognition program recommended by the AFSCME General Unit Labor Management Committee. She explained earlier this year they asked for nominations for the Public Employee Excellence Recognition (PEER) awards.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to identify and congratulate the second annual Public Employee Excellence Recognition award recipients. Motion carried unanimously.

Shane Patrick, Employee Relations, thanked AFSCME for donating the plaques for the awards. He explained each of the three program categories.

Michelle Franzen read the nominations for the Customer Service Award. She highlighted the nominee's work and presented the award to Sonya Wolter, Employee Relations.

Steve Taylor read the list of nominees for the Innovation Award. He explained the nominee's accomplishments and stated this year's award would go to Alan Herrmann, Community Social Services.

Jackie Moehring read a list of the nominees for the teamwork category. She reviewed the work performed by the team and announced this year's Teamwork Award would be given to the Social Services Child Welfare and Protection Team.

The Board congratulated the award winners and thanked the employees for the hard work they do.

Krogman noted the closed session held last week on the Administrator's performance and the requirement that a summary be presented for the public record at the next Board meeting.

Chair Ische read a summary of Administrator's Hemze May, 2009, through April 2010, performance. He stated the Board continued to appreciate the good work of Hemze and that he was approachable,

professional and fair in dealing with people. The Commissioners cited his strength as selecting and delegating to good staff, being honest and personable as well as setting priorities well.

The Board asked Hemze to focus on strategic and financial planning and direction as well as improving efficiencies across the organization.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to adopt the summary statement as the official summary of Mr. Hemze's performance as County Administrator for the year May, 2009, - April, 2010. Motion carried unanimously.

Gary Bork, Community Social Services, requested the Board approve creating four temporary on call bus drivers positions.

He explained the Prep Adventure program and stated the summer program allows staff to continue to work with kids with severe emotional disabilities. Bork stated, in the past, vans driven by staff have been used to pick up the students. Given the challenges with insurance, Bork indicated they have looked at different ways of providing the necessary transportation. He stated, with the merger of the Carver and Scott transit, they were proposing to utilize SmartLink and hire the temporary bus drivers to drive the buses. Bork added they believed they would be able to cover the cost and end up with additional revenue.

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to approve creating four temporary on call bus drivers to provide transit services for the Carver County Prep Adventure program and related CSS budget amendment increasing Federal MA revenue \$20,000 and increasing salaries and benefits \$13,500 and vehicle costs \$1,500. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 9:59 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.

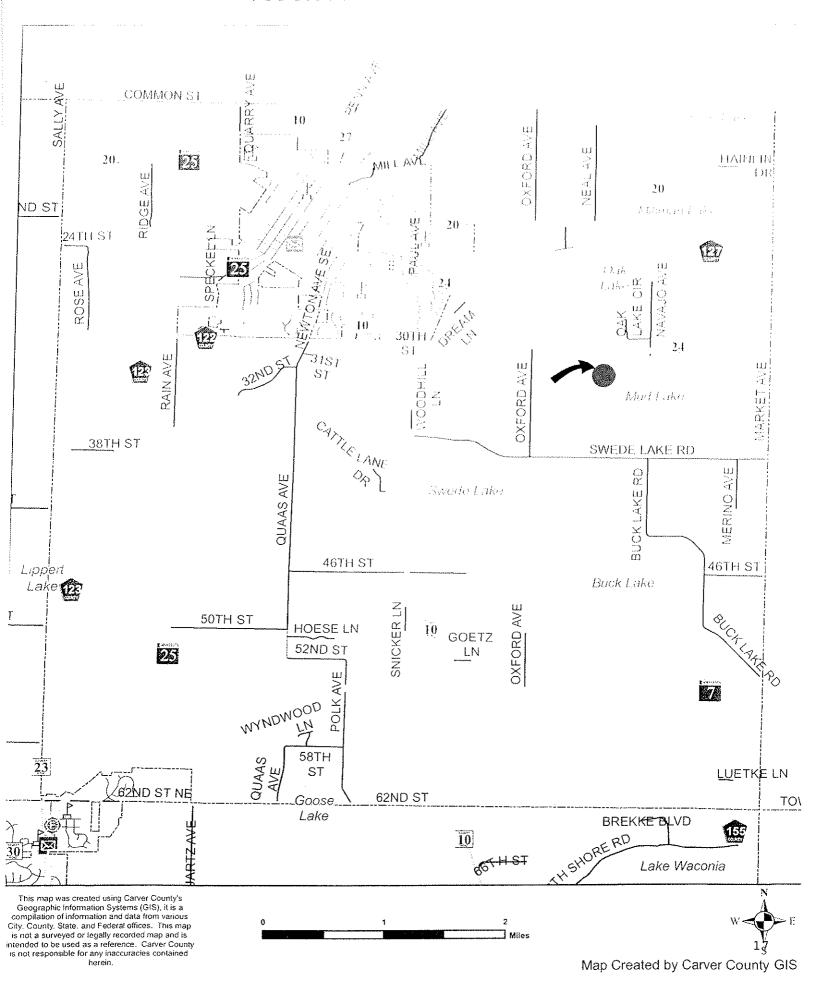

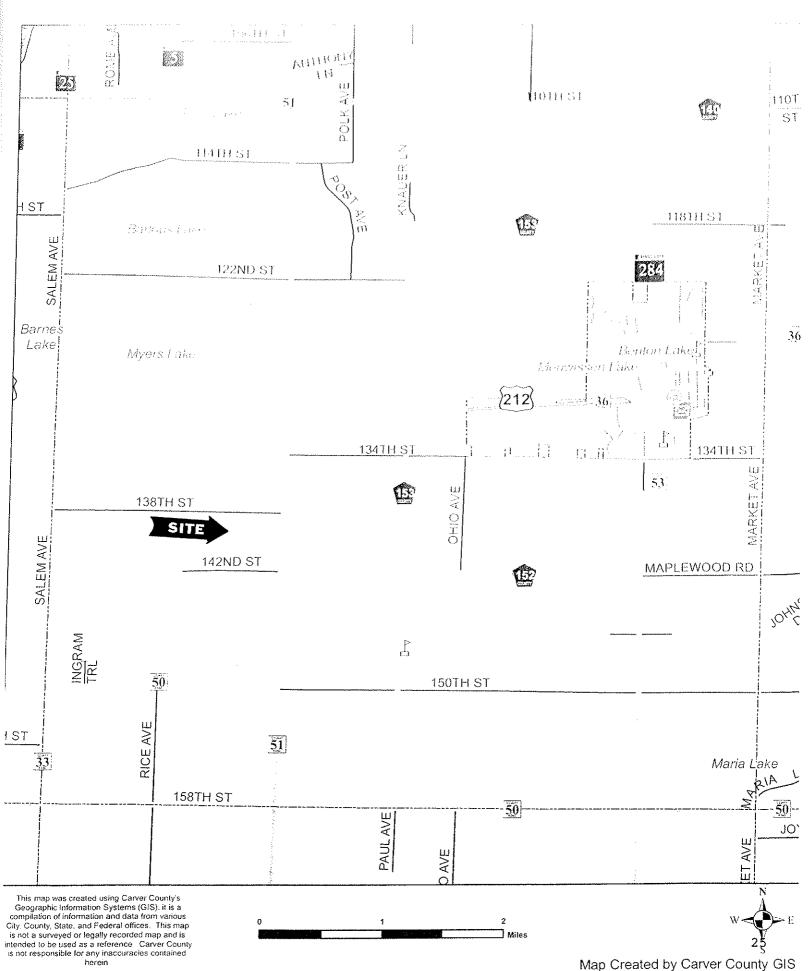

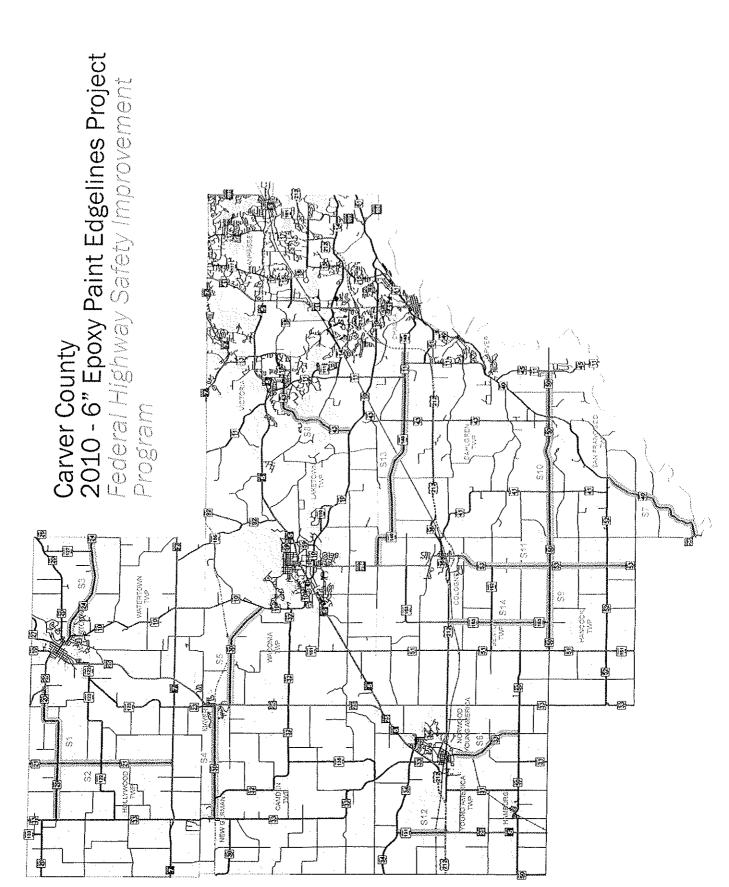

<ul> <li>Carver County's fire paging system uses technology that the FCC requires is replaced by January 2013.</li> <li>The fire paging system was not upgraded in 2002 with the 800 mhz radio system.</li> <li>The County fire departments have identified a grant through the US Dept of Homeland Security "Assistance to Firefighter Grants" (AFG) which could provide funding for a new fire paging system.</li> <li>The grant can fund 80% and requires a 20% match.</li> <li>A task force of fire chiefs, sheriff's and emergency management personnel are working together.</li> <li>The grant requires a fire department be the fiscal agent – Cologne has agreed to do this.</li> <li>The grant deadline is May 28, 2010.</li> <li>The grant could help fund a fire paging system with enhancements to provide greater efficiency and safety than today's system has such as:</li> <li>Meeting new FCC narrow banding requirements prior to the FCC's January 2013 deadline.</li> <li>Allow fire pagers to monitor fire/rescue units checking in service so responders would know the type and number of trucks enroute as well as the number and skill of staff responding. They could also monitor reports from those first arriving at a fire or rescue scene.</li> <li>Simulcast paging covering the entire county rather than just one community area.</li> <li>Increased efficiency and less room for mistakes in call dispatching at the communications center.</li> <li>The grant would also fund 300 new fire pagers to work with the updated paging system.</li> <li>Cost of a new fire paging system and new pagers for all fire personnel is estimated at \$1.2 million.</li> <li>\$240,000 in estimated local match funds is required to qualify for the grant (20% of 1.2 million).</li> <li>This new fire paging system would be managed and maintained by the county staff and could replace the county's outdoor warning siren system which also needs to meet FCC changes by 2013.</li> </ul>
ACTION REQUESTED: Resolution: Whereas, the Carver County Board of Commissioners supports the collaboration of local fire departments in their grant application to update and enhance the fire paging system and purchase new pagers for volunteer firefighters;  Now therefore the Board resolves to provide a 20% match to assist in funding the new simulcast paging system up to \$240,000 if the local fire departments are awarded an AFG grant to upgrade the existing fire paging system.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM  On January 23, 2008, Carver County Regional Rail Authority, Scott County Regional Rail Authority, the City of Chaska and City of Carver entered into a joint powers agreement and formed an entity entitled the Minnesota River Valley Rail Line (MRVL), to consider the possible acquisition of the 5.6 mile stretch of the Union Pacific Rail Line Chaska Industrial Lead which extends from Chaska (Mile post 33.0) to Merriam (Milepost 38.6) in Scott and Carver Counties, Minnesota. This agreement provides the ability for MRVL to enter into negotiations with the Union Pacific to obtain an agreement to acquire the rail right of way for public and/or trail use under federal law, rules and provisions.  June 5, 2009 an offer was made by MRVL to Union Pacific for the corridor. That offer was rejected.  Staff will update the Board on the abandonment process since June of 2009 and present options for the Board to consider moving ahead with a discussion with the Union Pacific Railroad.
