Open House #2 Summary

HIGHWAY 40 PROJECT



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1. Introduction

This report summarizes the second open house held for the Highway 40 Project (CSAH 40 between TH 25 and CSAH 11). The open house was held in person and online in May 2022.

1.1 Open House Purpose

The purpose of the second open house was to solicit feedback on the proposed preferred layout for the segment between TH 25 and CSAH 52. Information was also presented regarding conceptual realignment options for CSAH 43 and CSAH 40 near CSAH 50. Carver County is moving forward with final design of a project to reconstruct CSAH 40 between TH 25 and CSAH 52 beginning as early as 2023. Future projects to improve additional segments of CSAH 40 between CSAH 52 and CSAH 11 are not yet programmed. Preliminary designs will be completed for segments between CSAH 52 to CSAH 50 and CSAH 50 to CSAH 11 to prepare for future final design and construction. Information presented at the open house included goals and schedule, proposed improvements, and the right-of-way process.

1.2 Advertisement

Advertisement for the open house included a postcard to property owners in the area, an email notification to subscribers, and social media advertisements. Images of these advertisement efforts are shown in **Appendix A**.

Three notices were posted on Facebook on May 6, May 11, and May 20. The Facebook ad reached 176 people on May 6, 379 people on May 11, and 329 people on May 20.

Emails were sent to the project subscriber list on May 6th (1116 recipients) to promote the inperson and online events and on May 11 (1117 recipients) and May 25 (1136 recipients) to promote the online event.

2. Open House Structure

This open house had both an in-person and an online component with the goal of reaching many members of the public and providing options that would allow people to engage in a way that worked for them.

2.1 In-Person Component

On May 11, 2022 an in-person open house was held from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Carver County Public Works facility in Cologne, MN. Carver County staff and consultant staff attended to facilitate small discussions about the project goals, schedule, proposed improvements and Right-of-Way process. 30 people signed in at the open house.

Materials provided by the project team included informational boards, and large maps where participants could view the proposed improvements and place comments with markers or postit notes where they had comments and concerns. In addition, a questionnaire was utilized to receive additional comments and demographic information.



2.2 Online Component

Beginning on May 11, 2022, the online open house was launched and was live on the Carver County website through May 25, 2022 (approximately 2 weeks). The website had 189 views between May 11 and May 25, 2022. The online content included all the information that was provided on the display boards and maps at the in-person event.

There were multiple ways for the public to get involved during the online open house. They could respond to the questionnaire that was available on the open house website or contact the project manager, Cory Spanier, directly by email using a link on the site or by telephone.

The online content has remained viewable following May 25, 2022 with the questionnaire feature suspended. Members of the public may still contact the project manager by email or phone, which is listed on the website.

3. Public Comments

The sections below provide an overview of the public comments. All public comments (with private information redacted) are available in **Appendix B**.

3.1 Comment Options

There were multiple ways that the public could provide comments: a questionnaire, table-top maps, and direct contact with the project team.

3.1.1 Questionnaire

In the questionnaire that was available in person and online, participants were asked about how they use the roadways in the area and what questions or comments they have regarding the proposed corridor changes. There was also an optional section to provide demographic information which is discussed the Title VI section of this summary.

3.1.2 Maps

Participants had the option to provide location-specific comments on table-top maps with markers and post-it notes on large maps at the in-person open house.

3.1.3 Direct Contact with the Project Team

At the in-person open house, participants were encouraged to talk to project team members and agency staff. Participants could ask questions and discuss issues directly with the team and specific questions could be directed to subject experts.

Online, participants were encouraged to sign up for email updates and were provided with email and phone contact information for the Carver County project manager.



3.2 Summary of Comments Received

At the in-person event, input was received from over 30 people, primarily via verbal comments and via the questionnaire. 3 people provided comments via the questionnaire including 2 people who filled out the optional demographic questions.

During the online comment period, 72 respondents filled out the questionnaire. Through the questionnaire, the project team was able to gain an understanding of how respondents use the roadways in the area. Of the 75 respondents:

- 30 commute to home/work daily
- 39 visit nearby businesses
- 28 visit nearby residences
- 20 recreational motorcycling
- 6 walking or biking
- 6 other

Respondents were asked to comment on which realignment option for Highway 40 and Highway 43 that they prefer. Of the 75 respondents:

- 8 prefer Option 1
- 8 prefer Option 2
- 4 prefer Option 3
- 56 prefer the current alignment

Across all commenting platforms, many participants had similar ideas. Key comments and concerns include:

- Speed (concerns about speeds along the corridor)
- Encourage safety improvements
- Concerns over truck traffic
- In favor of existing roadway curves
- In favor of curve improvements for safety reasons
- Intersection controls
- Enjoy the current scenic characteristics of the roadway
- Want better signage
- Like the road the way it is
- Enjoy the current ride
- Accident history
- Bicycle and pedestrian use along the roadway'
- Project costs



4. Demographics and Title VI

To ensure compliance with Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Acts and ensure non-discrimination in the public engagement process optional questions related to demographics were included in the questionnaire. 32 out of 75 questionnaire respondents answered at least one of these optional questions. Of the 32 respondents:

- 21 were female and 10 were male
- 5 were 34 years of age or younger, 24 were between 35 and 54 years of age, and 3 were age 55 or older
- 28 were white
- 28 identified English as the language most frequently spoken in their house
- 9 listed their household income as between \$35,000 and \$100,000 and 15 listed their household income as over \$100,000 per year.





PRIVATE PROPERTY ACQUISITION

Carver County will need to acquire additional easements and right-of-way as part of this project. All impacted property owners will be contacted by a Carver County Right-of-Way Agent as soon as project construction limits and needs have been determined.

PROPERTY ACQUISITION PROCESS

In cases where acquiring private property beyond the existing right-of-way is required, the County will go through its standard process for property acquisition. The County will contact impacted property owners to review existing property conditions. An independent appraiser will be hired to determine the value of the property. The County will make an initial offer to purchase the necessary easements for no less than the amount determined in the appraisal. Any property owners with questions are encouraged to contact the County Project Manager.

PROPERTY ACQUISITION TIMELINE

Spring 2022

- Finalize construction limits.
- Carver County will hire an independent appraiser.

Summer 2022

- Carver County will send impacted property owners an initial contact letter.
- Proposed easements will be staked.

Fall 2022

- Appraisals will be completed.
- Once appraisals are complete, the Right-of-Way Agent will reach out to each impacted property owner to set up a meeting. At this meeting, the County will provide the property owner with a copy of the complete appraisal.

Winter 2022/2023

Carver County will make offers to property owners.








