<p>Call to Order: Welcome and Introductions</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> I. April agenda approved. General consensus. II. February meeting minutes reviewed and approved. III. Jesse Hill from People Incorporated presented on The Steiner Kelting Program. A document was provided to the group describing the program. Short and long term treatment is provided. Assessments are done to determine appropriate level of care. Opening may be as soon as September 8th and they are in the process of hiring for some positions. All genders are served, 18 and older. Another wing has been added on to the building. There are 12 private rooms. In the future they may add capacity for up to 4 more people. MA and PMAP insurance plans are the best payers, especially for long term stays. Commercial insurance can be a little more difficult, due to higher deductible plans. They will also assist clients in applying for insurance. It will be licensed as a full residential crisis and IRTS program. Essential Access program typically Mon-Saturday; complete intakes for clients to determine if IRTS or Crisis Services are needed. They will be hiring an OT, nurses, yoga instructors / wellness instructors for Steiner Kelting as well. Depending on COVID-19 situation, they may be able to have an open house in August. IV. Jen Romero gave updates on a few items. 1) Renthelppmn.org went live statewide. They have \$200 million to assist people in getting caught up on their rent. Applications can now be submitted, or call 211 United Way to ask any questions. They can mail out paper applications and connect people with partners throughout the state to assist in filling it out.
