ACCEL Meeting

August 6, 2009 – 7:00 p.m.

Cologne Community Center

A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on July 28, 2009. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 9:19 a.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, James Ische, Tim Lynch and Tom Workman.

Members absent:

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to approve the minutes of the July 14, 2009, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to move consent agenda item to 5.3 to 6.0 and to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved tobacco license #10-628, Walgreens #12434.

Approved acceptance of the Family Homeless Prevention and Assistance Program Grant from the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency in the amount of \$275,000 for two years for Carver and Scott Counties.

Resolution #51-09, County Board Acknowledgment SAP 10-599-16 Final Payment.

Authorized Chair and Administrator to the sign joint powers agreement between Carver County and the City of Carver for CSAH 40 design and reconstruction.

Authorized the Chair and Administrator to the sign joint powers agreement between Carver County and McLeod County for CSAH 30 professional services.

Community Social Services' actions.

Approved payment of the following Commissioners' warrants:

Motion carried unanimously.

Bill Weckman, Public Works, requested Board authorize the advertising of bids and to set bid opening date for the Laketown Road base stabilization and overlay project. He stated he was placing this item on the agenda at this time as the advertising process takes over four weeks and they were running out of time to get this project completed this year. He noted a condition was

holding up the joint powers agreement with the Township and a meeting has been scheduled for August 13th to discuss the issue with the Township. He noted the option to accept or reject the bids.

Jim Keeler, County Attorney, continued to advise the Board that they not proceed with taking control of Laketown Road until all outstanding issues with respect to the right of way have been resolved to the satisfaction of the County. He suggested they continue to work to resolve the issue.

Weckman pointed out the advertising and engineering costs that will be incurred if the project does not move forward.

Chair Degler recognized the County's moving forward on this agenda item was a good faith effort to meet the County's responsibilities under the joint powers agreement and they encouraged the Township to do the same. Ische acknowledged the receipt of the Township's previous petition to take over the road and the tight timeline to get this resolved.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to allow the placing of the advertising for bids and to set the bid opening date to August 31, 2009, at 2:30 p.m. for the Laketown Road base stabilization and overlay project. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board thanked Mr. Weckman for the additional work he did while serving as the Public Works Interim Director over the last several months.

Dave Drealan, Land and Water Services, requested the Board authorize sending out and posting the re-drafted Parks, Open Space and Trails Plan on the website. He explained the redrafted plan addresses the comments from the public and other units of government. Drealan indicated they have attempted put together a document that addresses the local needs and the items that are needed on a regional level.

He noted the transportation plan, and considering the limited comments received, questioned if the Board also wanted to review it prior to it being released. The Board agreed they would like to review and Drealan indicated he would bring it back next week.

Paul Moline, Land and Water Services, explained the key points that have changed in the Parks Plan and stated they were asking for authority to send it out to the Townships and Cities. He stated the previous version had a Park System Plan and since that time they have attempted to separate the two documents and not include the Park System Plan as part of the 2030 comprehensive plan.

He stated references to all conservation corridors have been removed. He indicated there was no reference to a Crow River Regional Park search area. Moline noted the Coney Island, Miller Lake and Minnesota River Bluff search area remain and these are in the Regional Park Plan.

He highlighted the maps that identify the regional search areas and the map that outlines the DNR, Fish and Wildlife and Minnesota Landscape Arboretum.

He explained the text describing the search area location. Moline pointed out the text does not describe a specific location but general vicinity. He stated they tried to balance what the overall needs of the public are vs. individual owner rights. He indicated that the plan language emphasizes landowner willingness as a necessary component of park acquisition. He indicated they received a request from a township to have the approval authority for future park designations.

The Board discussed whether a township has veto power if there is a willing landowner. They acknowledged the language included attempts to accommodate the concerns of the township. They agreed purchasing land from only willing landowners may not raise any concerns and agreed it was good to get the township's input.

The Board discussed whether the text and circle illustrating the Miller Lake search area was too vague, what impact this may have on a property and whether this could be used to deny something in the future. Moline stated the previous circle was wider and the general idea was to wait for a willing landowner and is dependent on what a landowner wants to do.

He stated they try to balance recognizing a search area but not draw a specific area to include or exclude any parcel as they do not know what opportunities may occur in the future. He referenced the Miller Lake illustration that the Met Council currently uses. He stated that the Board has the option to use the similar sized circle as the Met Council plan indicates.

The Board inquired on the affects to property when land has been designated as a Park search area. Moline explained the current zoning would not change or preclude a land use. He stated designating a park area allows the County to have access to funds to allow the County to purchase.

Marty Walsh, Parks, clarified once there is an agreement where a Park may be located, there is a public process to establish the boundaries with ultimate approval of the County Board. He stated a search area opens up the possibility of regional funding and boundaries are set in the master plan. The Board questioned the impact on land values when land is designated for a park. He stated the land value is based on its highest and best use when the property is purchased.

Moline clarified, even after this is adopted, anything that fits into the County ordinance and land use around Miller Lake is not precluded from happening.

Walsh stated the Miller Lake area was part of the 2000 comp plan update and it was then recognized regionally by the Met Council.

Steve Taylor, Administrative Services, recognized the sensitivity in drawing lines and suggested the circles were meant to be representative of general areas and not a specific area.

The Board recognized with the current economic times and required 25% County contribution it may take time considerable time before these areas actually become designated park areas.

Moline pointed out they would still need to have Met Council review and approve the use of the draft text and maps.

Moline reviewed the text related to the Minnesota River Bluffs and Western Carver County destination trail corridors. He stated the western destination trail is described as making a connection between Norwood Young America, Baylor Park, Dakota Trail and the Luce Line trail. He indicated the focus in the 2030 timeframe is on establishing trails as growth occurs and as a City annexes. Moline pointed out the language added at the request of Watertown Township. He indicated, if funding is available before a City annexes, language is included that the trail be established along the Highway 25 right of way.

The Board inquired on the language and sketch referencing the possible widths of a trail which follows a rail to trail corridor. Walsh stated the different widths of a trail may allow for future consideration for another transportation purpose and provide ability for the cities to enhance green space. Walsh clarified the intent is not to change the boundaries along the current corridors. Drealan clarified the sketch was included to illustrate what the trail might look like and it could be removed. The Board agreed to have the illustration showing a rail to trail corridor and reference to width removed.

The Board inquired about the right of way based trail graphic and the reference to right of way widths. Bill Weckman, Public Works, stated the County has not gotten into trails in the past and he sees this as an illustration. He stated the transportation plan is the area where more details are included on right of way widths which do vary based on road function. The Board agreed that the plan should make a reference to the roadway systems plan and the right of way designations there as these would be the guiding numbers.

Moline pointed out revisions to the implementation plan. He stressed the language that was included that states land acquisition would be based on opportunities with willing landowners. He added, if anything was to occur, funding was key and referenced potential funding sources.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to authorize the distribution of the redrafted Parks, Open Space and Trails Comprehensive Plan Element with the revisions noted. Motion carried unanimously.

Sonja Wolter, Loss Control Specialist, introduced representatives from the Minnesota Counties Insurance Trust and explained they would be submitting their annual report.

Jane Hennagir, MCIT, explained dividend notices would be coming out this week and acknowledged the County's involvement for nearly 30 years. She stated MCIT's focus has changed from getting claims paid to managing risk and controlling losses.

She stated MCIT was a joint powers entity and pointed out the benefits of joint risk sharing. Henagar explained membership benefits include coverage that is tailored to meet specific County needs, stable rates and dividends. She noted accidents continue to be the most frequent type of loss while not the most severe. The most frequent type of worker's compensation claim tends to be lifting. She reviewed the County's workers comp costs and dividends.

She pointed out resources available through MCIT and thanked Carver County for its continued partnership.

Under public participation, Merle Ekstrom, Chaska, questioned transfers he believed occurred and signatures that were on a Quit Claim Deed that he believed were not his. Chair Degler indicated they would follow up on the issue.

David Frischmon, Finance, introduced Rick Clark from the State Auditor's Office and explained Mr. Clark would be presenting the State Auditor's Management and Compliance Report. He explained the County's 2008 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report sets forth the County's financial positions and the results of operations and cash flows.

Clark reviewed with the Board the State Auditor's responsibilities under auditing standards. He stated Carver County was determined to be a low risk auditee.

He stated total assets increased primarily due to highway projects and long term debt increased due to the 2008 CIP bonds. He explained the revenue and expenditure increase and highlighted sources of revenue over the last five years. He stated intergovernmental revenue decreased and investment income was down.

Clark reviewed changes to fund balance in the general, road and bridge, Social Service, debt service and CIP funds. He pointed out the recommended fund balance of 35 to 50% of revenues or five months of expenditures and recognized the increase in fund balance designations.

The Board thanked Mr. Clark for his review and update.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to go into closed session at 11:40 a.m., according to MSA 13D.05, in order to discuss confidential appraisal date and to receive an update on the status of an offer to purchase property, Lake Waconia Regional Park. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned the closed and Regular Session at 12:20 p.m.

BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARVER, MINNESOTA REQUESTING A CONVEYANCE TO THE CITY OF CARVER OF OUTLOT A IN CARVER BLUFFS 10TH ADDITION FREE OF CHARGE FOR AN AUTHORIZED PUBLIC USE

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City of Carver ("City") approved a Final Plat ("Plat") for property now known as Carver Bluffs 10th Addition in 2003; and

WHEREAS, said Plat contained an outlot legally described as follows, to wit:

Outlot A, Carver Bluffs 10th Addition, City of Carver

(the "Subject Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Subject Property contains a trail that is used for both recreational purposes and for maintenance access to a regional stormwater facility ("Authorized Public Use"); and

WHEREAS, the Developer did not provide the City with an easement for the trail; and

WHEREAS, the Carver County Auditor recorded a Certificate of Forfeiture for the Subject Property on August 28, 2008 and a subsequent Corrective Certificate of Forfeiture on September 10, 2008; and

WHEREAS, on April 14, 2009, the Carver County Board certified the Subject Property as non-conservation lands as provided by MINN. STAT. §282.01.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved by the Carver City Council as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Recitals are incorporated into and adopted as specific findings of fact.

- 2. The Subject Property is currently used by the City for the Authorized Public Use of a trail.
- 3. The City is authorized under Statute to provide parks and recreational services to its residents, and is authorized to acquire property for this purpose.
- 4. The Subject Property will be used as a recreational trail that is both available for the use of and provides a direct benefit to the general public.
- 5. The Subject Property and trail will be used for a supplementary use of providing access for maintenance purposes to a regional stormwater facility that directly benefits the general public.

RESOLUTION

Based upon these findings, it is resolved by the Carver City Council as follows:

1. The City requests a conveyance by the State of Minnesota to the City of the Subject Property as tax forfeited lands for an Authorized Public Use in a manner set forth on the form attached hereto as **Exhibit "A."**

WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of July 21, 2009; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:


- 1. David and Heidi Handt own 10.07 acres located in the East Half (E½) of the Southeast Quarter (SE¼) of Section 19, Hollywood Township. The property is improved with an existing home, barn and several outbuildings, riding arena, paddocks and grazing pasture. The site is located within the Agriculture Zoning District, and the CCWRMA Crow River.
- 2. The applicant is requesting a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for an equestrian facility which will be utilized as a commercial boarding and training facility pursuant to Section 152.079 C5 of the Carver County Code.
- 3. According to the applicant's operational letter (dated: 6/18/09), the operation would consist of up to 29 horses including the three (3) horses they own. The property has a relative homestead by Brianna Mahoney, a niece of the Handt's. Ms. Mahoney will reside in the home and assist with feeding and rotating the horses when they graze in the pastures. Ms. Mahoney will also assist with office related duties including advertising and bookkeeping responsibilities.
- 4. The operational and site plans identify the existing structures on the property that the public may access including the barn, horse shelters, detached garage, and arena. The applicants are not proposing any new structures with this request. Any future plans to expand the facility, will require the applicant to apply for and receive an amendment to this Conditional Use Permit.
- 5. The Carver County Building Official, MNSPECT (formerly called Waldron & Assoc.), will be going out to the property to inspect the existing buildings being utilized as part of the operation. All buildings on the property accessed by the public will need to meet Minnesota State Building Code to be continued to be utilized by the public.

- 6. There will be two (2) family members working at the facility. The applicants have submitted an affidavit concerning Workers Compensation stating that they do not have any employees.
- 7. Boarders are permitted on the property during daylight and evening hours and otherwise as needed to attend to their horses. Currently the property is transitioning between 19-22 horses owned by 13 different people, some of whom board more than one (1) horse. Late afternoon and weekends are busier times, when an average of four (4) –six (6) people come to ride or work with their horses. Hours are similar in the winter, except that the temperatures tend to reduce the number of people riding outdoors. The applicants anticipate five (5) vehicles or ten (10) trips to be generated per day during warmer months and approximately two (2) vehicles or four (4) trips per day during winter. The site has adequate parking in the lot and along the driveway to accommodate approximately twenty (20) vehicles.
- 8. Boarders often ride the perimeter of the ten (10) acre property. At times, the applicant will transport horses to meet their owners at the nearby Luce Line Trail. Riding on private property would be prohibited unless written agreements are provided to Land Management.
- 9. The applicants have been working with the Feedlot Inspector in the Environmental Services Department. The site must comply with the requirements in the letter from Lori Brinkman, Assistant Feedlot Administrator dated July 10, 2009 (see attached).
- 10. One (1) handicapped accessible portable restroom facility is located on the property.
- 11. A letter of support dated July 17, 2009 was received from Curt & Sue Hart, 4275 Yale Avenue, New Germany.
- 12. The Hollywood Town Board has reviewed the request at their March 9, 2009, Town Board meeting and recommended approval.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of Conditional Use Permit #PZ20090013 for an Equestrian Facility on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- 1. The permit is subject to administrative review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by Land Management for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners/operators are encouraged to contact Land Management as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. The Equestrian Facility shall operate in accordance with the operation and site plans (dated 6/18/09). These plans shall be attached to and become part of this permit. This Equestrian Facility request only allows for up to 29 horses which include those owned by the applicant and the use of existing buildings on the property. Any future plans to expand the facility will require the applicant to apply for and receive an amendment to this Conditional Use Permit.
- 3. The Permittee shall comply with all necessary Carver County Feedlot Ordinance requirements and/or appropriate permit(s) as well as the letter from Environmental Services dated July 10, 2009.
- 4. The Permittee shall comply at all times with the County standards as detailed in Chapter 152 Zoning Code and Chapter 154 Sign Regulations.
- 5. All structures utilized as part of the operation in which public has access shall meet the applicable State Building Code requirements.
- 6. The Permittee shall submit a copy of the agreement annually for the placement and maintenance of one (1) handicapped accessible portable restroom facility.

7. Riding on private property would be prohibited unless written agreements are provided to Land Management.

ORDINANCE 65 - 2009

AMEND CHAPTER 91, GENERAL REGULATIONS; AMENDING SECTION 91.04, (E)

THE CARVER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HEREBY ORDAINS:

- SECTION 1. The specified sections of Chapter 91, the General Regulations, shall be amended as follows. Strikethrough signifies deleted language and underline is new language.
- SECTION 2. The existing language of 91.04 (E) shall be amended as provided below:

§ 91.04 PUBLIC USE REGULATIONS.

- (A) Hours of operation.
- (1) Parks shall be open to the public daily at hours established by the Board. It shall be unlawful for any person to enter or remain in a park at any other time without a use permit, except when the park area or facility is otherwise designated by the Board.
- (2) The Director or designee is authorized to close any park or portion thereof at any time for the protection of park property or for the public health, safety or welfare.
 - (B) Use permits.
- (1) Use permits shall be required for the exclusive or special use of all or portions of park areas, buildings or trails; for use of park areas and facilities when they are closed to the public; to conduct certain activities not normally permitted as per conditions of this chapter; for regulation of large group activities, as defined herein; or to reduce or eliminate certain user fees for groups, as defined herein.
- (2) Procedures to issue use permits shall be in accordance with guidelines established by Board resolution.
- (3) Use permits shall be approved by the Park Director or his or her authorized designee, or if required by this chapter, by the Board. However, the Park Director reserves the right to defer any use permit approval to the Board.
- (4) It shall be unlawful for a person or persons to violate any provisions of an approved use permit.
- (5) It shall be unlawful for a person or persons to engage in any activity requiring a use permit without first obtaining the permit.
 - (C) User and special use fees/modifications.

- (1) User fees for entrance into parks and special use fees for various park uses shall be set by Board resolution.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to use, without payment, any facility or area for which a user fee or special use fee is charged, unless payment is reduced or waived by use permit.
- (3) Upon group request for reduction or elimination of fees, the issuing authority shall evaluate the request including, but not limited to the following factors:
 - (a) Charitable nonprofit;
 - (b) Property or income tax supported; and
 - (c) Educational or religious.
- (4) Use permits to reduce or eliminate fees shall be approved by the Park Director or his or her authorized designee. The Park Director reserves the right to defer any fee modification request to the Board.
- (D) Use by groups. Use permits shall be required for any entertainment, tournament, exhibition or any other special use which can reasonably be expected to have 20 or more persons involved or potentially have a detrimental effect on park property or other park users. (Ord. 30, passed 4-14-87) Penalty, see § 91.99
- (E) <u>Vehicle Permits</u>. It shall be unlawful for any person to bring a motor vehicle into a park (where a vehicle permit is required) without appropriately displaying an approved annual, daily, or temporary vehicle permit, attached with its own adhesive, hung from a rear view mirror or otherwise displayed as directed, unless exempted by a use permit.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication by the Dakota County Board of Commissioners.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM:			
The Waconia Event Center sewage treatment system was most recently inspected and a Certificate of Compliance was issued on May 7, 2008. The compliance inspection examines three characteristics to determine compliance – watertight tanks below the operating level; the required separation from the periodically saturated soil or bedrock; and that there is no surface discharge, backup or surface seeping.			
LWS staff twice met with Mr. Ziermann in July 2009 to resolve questions on the location of distribution box pipes. During the initial meeting, Mr. Ziermann provided LWS staff with his field notes he compiled during the May 7, 2008 compliance inspection. WHEREAS, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.017, the Carver County Community Development Agency (the "CDA") is authorized to undertake housing development projects and to acquire and construct multifamily rental housing for the purposes of providing housing for seniors; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.034, Subd. 2, the CDA is authorized to issue bonds backed by the full faith and credit of Carver County, Minnesota, (the "County") to finance a housing development project following (a) a determination by the CDA that pledged revenues will equal or exceed 110% of the principal and interest due on such bonds for each year, and (b) approval by the County of the principal amount of the Bonds following a public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the CDA has proposed the issuance of Bonds to finance the acquisition and construction of an approximately 50-unit senior housing project in Norwood Young America known as the Oak Grove Dairy Housing Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project constitutes a "qualified housing development project", which is defined under Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.034, Subd. 2, to include a housing development project providing housing for the elderly; and

WHEREAS, on the date hereof after due publication of notice in the official newspaper of the County, the County conducted a public hearing pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.034, subd. 2;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the County hereby gives preliminary approval to the issuance by the CDA of up to \$6,500,000 aggregate principal amount of Housing Development Bonds (Carver County, Minnesota, General Obligation) (the "Bonds"), to which Bonds, and the payment of principal of and interest thereon, the CDA will pledge the County's general

obligation, being its full faith and credit and taxing power, as authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.034, subd. 2.

2. The Board shall consider final approval following receipt of (a) a satisfactory joint powers agreement relating to the Project among the County, the CDA and Norwood Young America and (b) receipt by the CDA of construction bids and preparation of a budget satisfactory to the County Administrator showing that the Project can be completed with available funds.
