Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to approve the minutes of the August 11, 2009, Regular Session. Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to recess as the County Board and convene as the Community Health Board. Motion carried unanimously

Carolyn Schmidt, Public Health, requested that the Board accept the Statewide Health Improvement Plan grant. She explained the 1.4 million grant had been awarded jointly to Carver and Scott Counties. She indicated the grant would be received over the next two years, with \$170,000 to be added to the County's budget to begin the planning phase of the program on behalf of the two counties.

RaeJean Madsen, Public Health, explained the program was an integral part of the Statewide Health Care reform bill. She stated the goal is to reduce the burden of chronic disease by reducing tobacco use and obesity not through individual behavior but by looking at policy, systems and environmental changes in schools, worksites, communities and healthcare organizations.

Madsen stated during the next several months they would be looking at finalizing the community leadership team and going through an in-depth assessment process. She pointed out there was a requirement that the community be engaged in the process. Madsen added they would then be developing a plan that would move into the implementation phase of the grant. She clarified a SHIP coordinator would be hired through Scott County and they would be bringing in consultants in the areas of assessment, evaluation and technology services. In November or December, an implementation specialist would be hired to be prepared for the implementation stage in January. Madsen added they have already received interest from the community and have been approached by schools and health care organizations that have heard about the program.

Maluchnik moved, Ische seconded, to approve the Statewide Health Improvement Plan grant award from the Minnesota Department of Health. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Ische seconded, to adjourn as the Community Health Board and reconvene as the County Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Martin Walsh, Parks, requested the Board approve a contract amendment to SRF Consulting contract for professional services related to the Dakota Rail Regional Trail. He reviewed the additional work to be performed and the need to address stormwater management due to the construction of the parking facility. He pointed out space limitations of the site and the parking facility enhancements.

Walsh explained Phase I work on the Dakota Rail project includes an approximate seven mile section from the East County line and goes to the City of Mayer. He stated the plan is currently being reviewed by MnDOT and they are hoping that initial construction can take place this fall. He indicated Phase II is planned for 2011 but they have not started the construction design phase at this time.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to authorize Chair to sign Amendment No. 1 with SRF Consulting. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to go into closed session at 9:50 a.m. pursuant to MSA 13D.05 to discuss confidential appraisal data, Lake Waconia Regional Park land acquisition. Motion

The Board adjourned the closed and Regular Session and went into a work session to discuss the 2010 preliminary property tax levy and budget summary.
