CARVER COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

RENTAL HOUSING PROGRAMS – the CDA administers a variety of rental housing programs in Carver County that assist households with various affordable housing options. The following is a summary of the major rental programs:

Public Housing-The CDA owns and operates a Federally subsidized Public Housing Rental Program that consists of 81 units scattered thru-out the county that range from apartment style units to single family homes. This program is for households at or below 80% of Area Median Income (\$44,800 for 1 person). The CDA waiting list is currently open for applicants to apply.

The CDA is contracted through the Metropolitan Council to administer the federally subsidized HUD Section 8 Rental Assistance Program. This program consists of approximately 573 rental housing vouchers offered to households at or below 50% of area median income (\$29,350 for 1 person). The Section 8 waiting lists remain very long; projected wait for assistance could be up to 7 years.

The CDA administers a variety of smaller rental assistance programs with funding provided thru a variety of agencies to include HUD, the State of MN and Minnesota Housing Finance Agency. These programs are offered in collaboration with the First Street Center/Mental Health Dept., COOP's New Beginnings Program, and Southern Valley Alliance for Battered Women.

The CDA owns four rental developments within the county that consist of affordable, work force housing; over 200 units that range from efficiency type units to three-bedroom townhomes.

Senior Housing-the CDA also owns over 100 units of 55+ housing for seniors looking to down size into a more manageable housing unit in a senior, socially active community.

Housing Counseling Program-Fiscal years:

Oct 1, 2007 - Sept 30, 2008 assisted 2,542 clients

Oct 1, 2008 – June 30th, 2009 assisted 2,377 clients (partial year third quarter data as reported to HUD)

Of those 2,377 clients, 724 were "underserved populations", i.e. people of color, single head of household, disabled head of household

Carver County Sheriff sales from January 1-June 30th, 2009 were at 167. Notably, our counselors were able to stop 35 households from losing their homes throughout this time period. The federal dollars this agency receives through HUD covers the administrative costs for counselor time. The most prevalent reasons our clients report default are loss or decrease of income, job loss and medical and health issues. Our counseling staff continues to be informed about the new *Making Home Affordable* program set forth by the Obama Administration in March 2009. This knowledge helps us assist clients better in navigating

through the sometimes daunting processes of foreclosure and loan modification. Staying informed with all these changes at the local, state and federal level is critical for the CDA in order to continue to offer high quality and efficient services to our clients. The CDA remains a high performing agency through its recent achievements and will continue to be a viable resource to residents of Carver County.

<u>COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANTS-</u>This past spring the CDA also secured federal stimulus monies via the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) for the acquisition and rehabilitation of vacant, foreclosed homes in the downtown area of Chaska. These homes will be rehabbed and then sold to the area workforce at affordable purchase prices.

In August the CDA will be closing on its first community land trust home in Waconia as a result of the county-wide expansion. The recipient's: A household of six, under 80% of area median income, currently commuting daily to Shakopee from the north metro for work.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS - economic development and planning activities occurring in several areas of the County.

- The CDA oversees the federal Small Cities Development Program funds for any cities awarded funding within Carver County. Currently, Program Income Funds that are paid back by past SCDP recipients are put into an account in their respective cities. We then re-administer them as each city dictates via contract with that city and the State Department of Employment and Economic Development.
- The CDA has a partnership with the Land & Water Services, Planning & Water Management; and Environmental Services Departments to process applications, administer low interest loan funds, and apply special assessments to properties for homeowners that replace Individual Sewage Treatment Systems (ISTS) throughout Carver County.
- The CDA actively works with Carver County cities, Chambers of Commerce and local businesses to promote Carver County as a prospective place to locate their business.
- The CDA provides technical assistance to cities and their businesses with expansion plans; and to develop funds for development and redevelopment projects.
- The CDA is an active partner in the 2030 Comprehensive Plan for Carver County.
- The CDA operates the CDA Business Loan Fund (BLF) and for three years prior, operated the Twin Cities Community Capital Fund (TCCCF) (and did 4 economic development loans) for Carver County, until the 2008 credit crisis severely impacted that program and the CDA was forced to transfer TCCCF funds to the BLF.

2009 Major Accomplishments & Challenges

Bioscience Development in Chaska

- CDA provided technical assistance and supported the City of Chaska's successful DEED grant application for a new Bioscience Park in Chaska and associated infrastructure needs.
- The CDA is assisting the City of Chaska in marketing, and business attraction in uses such as: corporate headquarters, educational (both technical and college), institutional, research and bioscience based organizations, and medical uses. The site is planned to hold potentially up to 10,000 new jobs.
- The CDA is working with the City of Chaska and a private medical device company to build a plant in the City and to also build a biosciences incubator facility.

Transit Related Projects:

• TC & W Railroad: Working with the railroad to develop a plan for future industrial park development in the county to serve non-traditional and rail served types of industrial development.

Redevelopment projects:

- Joined the City of NYA in a joint powers agreement to purchase and redevelop the former 4.2 acre Oak Grove Dairy (Kemp's) site in the southern downtown adjacent to Hwy 212. The \$11,000,000 redevelopment project is planned for an October 1, 2009 construction start.
- The Carver County CDA is working with the City of Watertown to redevelop a portion of the southern downtown Main Street for a new mixed use senior housing and commercial use along with public and private parking. The project involves the removal of three older manufacturing and processing buildings in the southern downtown area.
- The Carver County CDA is working with the City of Carver to develop workforce and senior
 housing options in the newly developing areas of the city that can be served with newly planned
 transit stations.

Grants:

- The CDA developed plans and received grants of approximately \$200,000 from private foundations and government for the 2030 Comprehensive Plan in conjunction with the County LWS, County Public Health and numerous cities in Carver County.
- The CDA assisted the City of NYA in obtaining a \$350,000 Met Council LCDA grant for the Oak Grove Redevelopment project in NYA.
- The CDA than applied for additional LCDA grant funds for the project in 2008, and was successful in obtaining an additional \$710,000 for the project.
- The CDA recently worked in conjunction with the cities of Norwood Young America, Hamburg and Cologne to submit a Small Cities Development Program application to the Department of Employment & Economic Development for the rehab of up to 20 single-family homes within those communities. The application was funded and will be implemented in 2009-2010.

Loans:

- The CDA operates the CDA Business Loan Fund (BLF)
- The CDA provided a \$50,000 loan to Auto Body Specialties of NYA to acquire and redevelop an
 existing auto body repair shop.
- The CDA, in partnership with the City of Chaska and the State DEED, approved a \$250,000 loan as part of an overall financing package to Michaels Foods in Chaska for the acquisition and remodeling of the former Mammoth building for a major potato food processing facility that will create well over 350 new jobs and increase the tax base.

Special Studies:

- Multi-Modal Rail Facility Study
 - The CDA completed a study to analyze the feasibility of development of a multi-modal rail industrial park in rural locations of Carver County. The plan was incorporated into the carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan
- McComb County-wide Economic Development Study
 - The CDA developed a County-wide economic development study with the McComb Group. The study was completed in spring 2008 and will be an integral marketing, feasibility and planning tool for land use decision-makers throughout Carver County.

ONGOING INITIATIVES

- Develop workforce, senior, and affordable housing in Carver County so workers can live and work here in Carver County, which will support economic development and business throughout the county.
- Promote redevelopment within the cities of Carver County through new mixed use projects which
 promote downtown living and shopping.
- Plan and integrate economic development and housing projects that will occur as the result of the new Highway 212 project in the eastern side of the county.
- Provide marketing, technical assistance to cities, and business finance resources to industrial and business park developments in the county such as Tacoma Industrial Park in NYA, Pine Hill Business Park in Waconia, Chanhassen West and Arboretum Parks in Chanhassen. This also includes business projects in the development of the Watertown Industrial Park, Mayer Industrial Park, and the new Bioscience Park in Chaska, and others.
- Establish and maintain high quality service with interested stakeholders to build a collegial working relationship that contributes to CDA initiatives.
- Provide support services to LWS, Planning & Water and Environmental Services to coordinate, develop, and maintain efficiencies related to activities of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan.
- Work towards attracting new sources of capital and investment to Carver County through the
 establishment of Angel Fund Venture Investments for promising and high growth fields such as
 biosciences and alternative energy, animal health, medical devices, diagnostics/vaccinations and
 pharmaceuticals.
- Develop additional low interest revolving loan funds for business.
- Complete design, financing and demolition for the Oak Grove Dairy Redevelopment project in NYA.
- Make strategic railroad investments in the Tacoma Industrial Park in NYA to assist industrial business.
- Participate in the planning and public process and support cities regarding the new Hwy. 212 MnDOT project proposal from the city of Carver to the city of NYA.
- Work with the TC & W Railroad to develop a rural rail-served multi-modal industrial park.
- Continue to work with the TC & W Railroad, Carver County cities, MNDOT, SW Transit, Vision 212
 Group, and Carver County Board to promote the development of commuter rail, linked transit stations, with workforce housing centered on job/transportation hubs.
- Continue its support and representation on the Vision 212 Group and to work with stakeholders to achieve the vision and goals developed by the group.
