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**BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM:** In Feb of 2006, the Board passed a resolution entering into a joint powers agreement with the MN Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) to continue the Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL's) program for impaired waters in the County, including several lakes which are listed on the State's 303D list.

Several of these lakes are in the Carver Creek Watershed and have been grouped in a Five Lake TMDL (Total Maximum Daily Load). Lakes contained in the TMDL are Benton, Goose, Hydes, Miller, and Winkler. A draft of this TMDL study has been completed and has gone through initial MPCA staff review. In addition, stakeholders that would be impacted by the Carver Creek Lake TMDL have been given the opportunity to voice their opinions of the TMDL through public surveys mailed to lakeshore residents, public and open house meetings held in 2008, and one-on-one contacts.

TMDL progress, methods, data results and implementation procedures were presented and analyzed at County Water, Environment, and Natural Resource (WENR) committee meetings between 2005 and 2008.

Staff is requesting that the Board to approve the DRAFT Five Lake TMDL for submittal to the MPCA to begin the official review period. Comments from the PCA will be addressed prior to the 30-day public comment period, followed by re-submittal to the County Board for approval.

## **Executive Summary**

This Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) study addresses a nutrient impairment in five lakes in the Carver Creek watershed. The goal of this TMDL is to quantify the pollutant reductions needed to meet State water quality standards for nutrients in the lakes of Benton (10-0069), Goose (10-0089), Hydes (10-0088), Miller (10-0029), and Winkler (10-0066).

The Carver Creek Lakes are located in Carver County, west of the Twin Cities Metro. With the exception of Benton Lake which is located in the city of Cologne, the lakes are in areas that are primarily rural. The Western suburbs of the Twin Cities Metropolitan area are experiencing moderate to high levels of development and there is increasing awareness of water quality issues by the public. The lakes are not currently used for recreation beyond their aesthetic values, fishing, and some boating, although there is pressure from local citizens to improve the lakes for swimming.

The combined drainage area of the lake chain is 55,0763 acres, roughly 54 percent is agricultural land and 10 percent being developed acreage. The lakes are connected by channels of varying lengths and Carver Creek, which has been identified by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) as turbidity impaired and is part of a current TMDL study. The lake system and Carver Creek flow to the southeast, ultimately discharging into the Minnesota River.

Benton and Winkler Lakes are designated by the MPCA and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MnDNR) as shallow lakes, but their morphometries, extent of littoral zones, ecological communities, and lack of public access are more characteristic of wetlands (see appendix A). Negotiations are currently underway to redefine their limnologic status, thereby changing their designated use and required standards for nutrient concentrations set by the state. Goose, Hydes, and Miller Lakes are larger, deeper lakes with more opportunities for recreation.

Water quality in all 5 lakes is considered poor with frequent algal blooms. Monitoring data in the Carver Creek chain of lakes suggest that it is a highly productive system, with the greatest water quality problems occurring in Benton and Winkler Lakes.

Benton Lake, located within the city limits of Cologne, is a hypereutrophic lake. Significant sources of phosphorous appears to be from both internal loading and agricultural runoff. Also contributing to phosphorous loading is Meuwissen Lake, which flows directly into Benton Lake.

Goose Lake is a hypereutrophic lake located west of Lake Waconia. Phosphorous loadings have significant sources from inlets to the lake. These sources include lakesheds of Swan, Donders, and Rutz Lakes all contributing to Goose Lake.

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Both internal and external sources have significant phosphorous loadings to Hydes Lake. This lake is hypereutrophic and located southwest of the City of Waconia.

Miller Lake, located northeast of the City of Cologne, is a hypereutrophic lake. Internal loading was not factored into determining the TMDL Load Allocation, but it is deemed a significant source of phosphorous. Since Miller Lake has a large lakeshed, the external loading is the target of this TMDL. Agriculture is the primary land use and is the major contributer to the external phosphorous load to Miller Lake.

Winkler Lake, located northwest of the City of Cologne, is a hypereutrophic lake.

External phosphorous loading from agricultural land uses are the major source of phosphorous to the lake. Rice Lake also contributes to the phosphorous loading of Winkler Lake.

Wasteload and Load Allocations for all lakes to meet State standards for the Western Cornbelt Plains ecoregion range from 7 to 95 percent reduction in phosphorous loading. Two permitted facilities located with in the Carver Creek Watershed would need to have a 55 to 68 percent reduction in the permitted maximum allowable load. These reductions would potentially help in other TMDLs currently underway within the Carver Creek Watershed. Main emphasis to reduce these loads include landowner BMPs, rough fish management, and updated permits to the NPDES permitted facilities of the City of Cologne WWTP and Bongards' Creamery.





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

**BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM:** Mn/DOT and Carver County have an opportunity to jointly utilize a new truck station at the NE intersection of CR11 and 212. Conceptual plans call for a 56,500 square foot facility with 20% or 11,300 sf dedicated for County use. The building would house County owned single & tandem axle trucks, 1-ton trucks, pick-ups, mowers and other equipment. There would be a shared break room, lockers, and employee parking stalls. Additionally the state and county would share sand/salt storage, unheated storage and a fueling island.

Sharing space with another governmental unit provides a host of benefits to the County including the consolidation of shared use functions, capital and utility savings, co-purchasing of materials & supplies etc. Additionally, this site is well situated to deploy equipment – the proximity is excellent relative to the County's roadway system. Design work is planned to be complete in the fall of this year with bidding taking place shortly thereafter. Occupancy is expected in fall 2010.

The existing shop is on 4.3 acres and the building is 6,700 sf with 2,700 sf mezzanine. The current facility has significant limitations, cannot be expanded, lacks sewer and water, doesn't have a covered salt/sand structure, and would require capital upgrades. The plan would be to sell the 4.3 acres property.

The costs, at this early juncture, are in the \$1.6 to \$1.8 million range although conversations with the architect and Mn/DOT are continuing to take place to minimize the County's costs. At this point, schematic design is expected to be complete at the end of this month and at that point the parties involved will have a better idea handle on estimated building costs. Project funding sources would be a combination of the following:

- Reassigning designated reserves for the Public Works Headquarter land purchase in Cologne,
- Sale of the existing Chaska Shop land, and
- Courthouse bonds debt service which ends in 2009 and could be use to leverage a new bond sale in 2010 of up to approximately \$1.5 million.

Staff is requesting the Board approve a contract with Mn/DOT for a not exceed \$112,930 plus \$6,000 for reimbursables. The County may terminate this agreement for any reason at the completion of the schematic design phase. In that event the County would be responsible for \$22,586.00 plus up to \$3,500.00 to reconfigure the space so it is suitable for use by Mn/DOT or a total of \$26,086. Schematic design and the accompanying cost estimate is expected to be completed the last week of February. The County Attorney's Office has reviewed the contract.
