

Cradleboard Variance Request Form

The Department of Human Services (DHS) may grant a variance to a license holder to permit the use of a cradleboard in a licensed setting, when requested by a parent or guardian for a cultural accommodation, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, sections 245A.1435 (g) and 245A.16, subd. 1 (a) (9).

Cradleboard means a board or frame on which an infant is secured using blankets or other material, such as fabric or leather sides, and laces and often has a frame extending to protect the infant's head. The infant is always placed with the infant's head facing outward, and the infant remains supervised in the cradleboard while sleeping or being carried. (Minnesota Statutes, section 245A.02, subd. 5b)

Complete this form and submit it to your licensor to request this variance.

For family child care or family foster care, county and private licensing agencies determine whether to recommend approval or denial of the cradleboard variance request. DHS approves a variance request based on the recommendation of the licensing agency and supporting documentation.
