A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on March 11, 2008. Chair James Ische convened the session at 9:17 a.m.

Members present: James Ische, Chair, Tim Lynch, Vice Chair, Gayle Degler, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Degler moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the March 4, 2008, Regular Session Motion carried unanimously.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Resolution #27-08, Acceptance of Donation from Get Your Gear.

Resolution #28-08, Rescinding Resolution Revoking County Highway 110.

Resolution #29-08, Resolution Revoking County Highway 110.

Approved UCare for Seniors Group Employer Agreement for 2008 plan year.

Agreement between ESRI and Carver County for Enterprise License.

Contract with Norma Cadena De Hinderer to provide professional and paraprofessional community based services from October 1, 2007, through December 31, 2012.

Approved Kawasaki's 2008 mule utility vehicle user relations loan program between Cities Edge Motor Sports and the Sheriff's Office.

Approved the Yamaha WaveRunner law loan program agreement between Cities Edge Motor Sports and the Sheriff's Office.

Community Social Services' actions.

Motion carried unanimously.

Steve Just, Land and Water Services, reviewed proposed Resolution granting the petition for an EAW for the proposed L.G. Everist transload facility. He noted the County Attorney's office has reviewed the Resolution and pointed out the letter received from the L.G. Everist attorney. Just clarified the standard is may have potential for significant environmental effects and reviewed the material submitted.

Jason Kuboushek, Esq, representing the County, stated fly ash was mentioned as a possible expansion in the application and one of the possible future activities. He stated that is one of the items that Wenck looked at and the possible cumulative effects. He indicated there would be a more expansive review as part of the EAW and the EAW will look at items proposed.

Maluchnik offered the following Resolution, seconded by Degler:

On vote taken, Degler, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik voted aye. Workman voted nay.

Peggy Booth, representing the DNR, requested the Board approve the DNR's purchase of 106.08 acres located in Chanhassen that is part of an area commonly known as the Seminary Fen. She stated, if the Board approved the purchased, 32.9 acres would be added to the Raguet Wildlife Management Area and 73.1 acres would be designated as the Seminary Fen Scientific and Natural Area. She reviewed the public activities that could occur on each site.

She stated the Seminary Fen had been identified as a priority for DNR protection and the DNR reached an agreement with the landowner. Ms. Booth noted the County and other local jurisdictions will receive a payment in lieu of taxes. She clarified the purchase has not been completed but the landowner has made a commitment to sell to the State. She stated they have received permission from the landowner for the work they are presently doing at the site.

Degler offered the following Resolution, seconded by Workman:

On vote taken, all voted aye.

The Board considered appointments to the Water, Environment and Natural Resource Committee.

Lynch moved, Maluchnik seconded, to appoint Scott Hoese as the Crow River Watershed representative on the WENR Committee. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to appoint Robert Burandt to represent Commissioner District 2 on the WENR Committee. Motion carried unanimously.

David Frischmon, Financial Services, reviewed the 2008 Omnibus Transportation Bill recently passed by the Legislature. He noted the primary resource for that was the gas tax increase. He reviewed the County's current funding gap, the increase in State aid and the need for the bond sale for current projects. Frischmon stated the transit sales tax only becomes effective with County Board approval. He indicated staff has been reviewing issues related to the joint powers agreement.

James Keeler, County Attorney, pointed out one of the issues under the transit tax legislation is whether any of the seven metro counties can opt in at a later date. He believed the intent of the legislation was to allow the metro counties to opt in at a later, but it was unclear under what procedure. He suggested these decisions may be made by the counties that sign up now and partner in drafting the joint powers agreement.

Roger Gustafson, Public Works, explained the new distribution formula, new revenue streams and the impacts to Carver County. He indicated discussion has also occurred on what the transit tax can be spent on.

The Board recognized the feedback they have received related to the transit tax and the difficult economic times.

David Hemze, County Administrator, stated as the transit tax is being looked at questions are being asked and it was important that the County pays attention to the issues even if the County was not looking to implement the tax. He proposed bringing back a Resolution at a future Board meeting that clarifies what the County would like to see as it relates to getting in and out and influencing that process.

Frischmon requested the Board set the public hearing date on the intention to issue bonds and to adopt the CIP Plan. He reviewed the proposed 8.8 million bond sale based on current projects, as well as the option for the Board to consider authorizing 7.5 million for future road and bridge projects in the CIP Plan. Frischmon pointed out the option to include Laketown Road and County Road 20 to the 2008 bond sale proceeds for a total of \$11.45 million. He stated, in addition to setting the public hearing date, he was asking the Board to set the preliminary amount for the bond sale.

Carolyn Drude, Ehlers and Associates, stated if a governmental unit anticipates issuing more than 10 million in tax exempt securities in a given year they are unable to designate them as bank qualified. She noted it was generally more advantageous to have bonds bank qualified. Frischmon clarified the decision on the bond authorization amount could be made after the public hearing on April 8th.

Workman offered the following Resolution, seconded by Degler:

Maluchnik moved, Workman seconded, to approve 2008 preliminary bond sale proceeds of \$8.8 million plus an additional authorized project list of \$7.5 million. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to add \$750,000 for Laketown Road to the 2008 preliminary bond sale proceeds (total proceeds of \$9.55M). Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Maluchnik seconded, to add \$1.9M for Highway 20 to the 2008 preliminary bond sale proceeds (total proceeds of \$11.45). Motion carried unanimously.

Frischmon requested the Board set a public hearing date on the proposed Lyman Boulevard Tax Abatement. He stated the tax base increase from the new development would assist paying for the Lyman Boulevard project and reviewed the financial impact.

Workman offered the following Resolution, seconded by Maluchnik:

On vote taken, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik, Workman voted aye. Degler abstained due to a possible conflict of interest.

Frischmon stated after the April 8th public hearing he would be asking the Board to adopt the CIP and determine the bonding amount. He stated competitive bids would be opened May 13th and bond proceeds would be received in June.

Workman moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 10:40 a.m. to go into a work session with Land and Water Services. Motion carried unanimously.

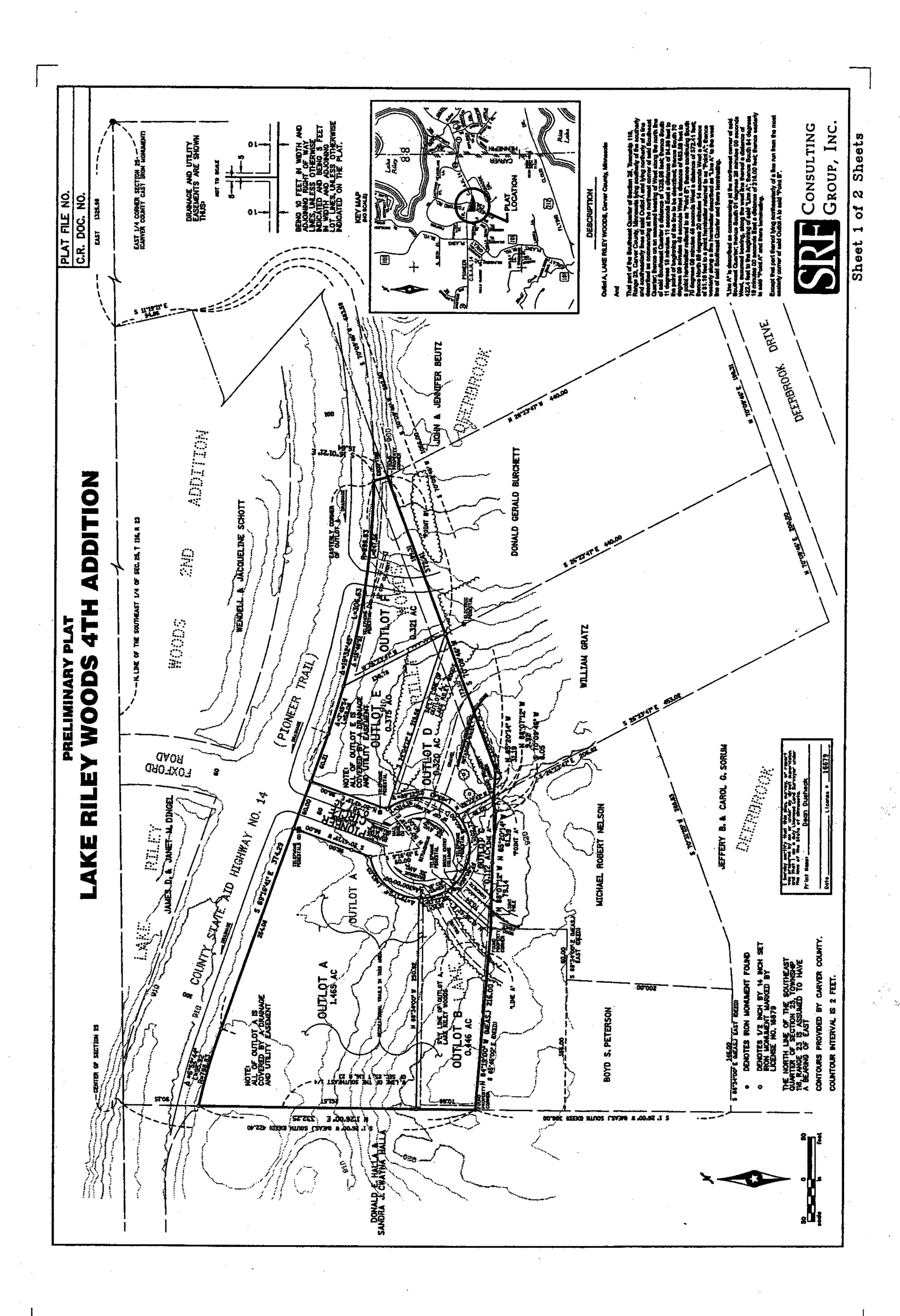

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: Until recently, the County owned 3.43 acres (legally described as Outlot A, Lake Riley Woods, Carver County, MN, Section 25, Township 116, Range 23) originally acquired in the late 1980's resulting from the realignment of CR14 just north of Lake Riley Woods 2 nd Addition. The properties affected are to the south and east of Pioneer Circle which is a cul-de-sac, just east of Highway 101. After discussing this issue informally with the County Board, Administrative Services requested subdivision approval to create parcels which could then be conveyed to adjacent property owners to provide the abutting parcels access to Pioneer Trail (CR 14) without crossing County property. The City of Chanhassen did approve the subdivision, breaking Outlot A (formerly owned by the County) into six smaller outlots (see attachment). Outlots A & E are potential sites for stormwater-related improvements that would improve water quality and reduce erosion potential. In summary, the creation of the outlots permits the transfer of property to alleviate a problem of lack of frontage on public roads for the four homes south of the subdivision which was created by the County realigning CR14 Additionally, the City, in conjunction with the County, would continue to own parcels for storm water improvements and potentially wetland creation (Outlots A & E).			
The current issue is a small piece of land with unknown ownership hereafter referred to as the gap. The gap must be corrected and registered to the homeowners impacted prior to all the title work being completed. This land registration action will be performed by Melchert, Hubert, Sjodin via a contract for a not-to-exceed of \$12,000.

RESOLUTION DENYING THE IMPOSITION OF TRANSIT TAXES

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Legislature has, by Laws of Minnesota 2008 Chapter 152, Article 4, Section 2, authorized metropolitan counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott and Washington to impose a one-quarter percent sales and use tax, and an excise tax of \$20 per motor vehicle sale (collectively referred to as "transit taxes") to be made available for the development and operation of transitways, including rail and bus rapid transit projects serving the residents and businesses of the Metropolitan Transportation Area; and

WHEREAS, Carver County is committed to participating in the development of a system of transitways to better serve the residents and businesses of the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area and to efficiently move people and goods throughout the region;

WHEREAS, the southwest metropolitan transportation region including most of Carver County does not have a single light-rail or commuter rail route identified in either the State's, the Metropolitan Council's, or the County's 2020 Comprehensive Plans; and

WHEREAS, Carver County is in the process of developing its first transit plan element as part of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan Update; and

WHEREAS, the transit plan element of the 2030 Carver County Comprehensive Plan Update is expected to include the need for:

- expansion of the current transit service area to cities currently not served by transit,
- increased number and size of transit hubs and Transit Oriented Development (TOD's) sites,
- planning for financing and associated land use planning around future commuter rail service,
- increased access to rural service such as the current CART system, and
- creation of a feeder transit service system, if the Southwest Light Rail Corridor that ends in Hennepin County is developed; and

WHEREAS, the transit plan element of the 2030 Carver County Comprehensive Plan Update is subject to review, comment, and approval; and

WHEREAS, it is unclear if and how the imposition of transit taxes in Carver County could provide the capital and operating resources necessary to implement Carver County's transit plan; and

WHEREAS, imposing transit taxes during the current difficult economic times is especially hard to justify.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Carver County Board of Commissioners denies the imposition of transit taxes in Carver County at this time.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Carver County Board of Commissioners expresses its interest in further discussion with any and all parties on the best and fairest way to implement the County's forthcoming Transit Plan consistent with the development of a transitway system for the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Carver County Board of Commissioners may reconsider the decision to impose transit taxes in the future based on more specific identification of benefit to the citizens of Carver County.

Issue #6: Transfer of Administrative & Policy Authority of the Carver County Library Board to the Carver County Board

Background

Recently Washington County has successfully received approval to transfer the administrative and policy authority of the County Library Board to the County Board, retaining the Library Board in an advisory capacity. With Scott and Hennepin County having undertaken similar actions, Carver County is also recommending a similar legislative change. The proposed legislation would allow the Carver County Board to direct, operate, and manage the Carver County library system, establish that the library board shall provide advice and make recommendations on pertinent policy matter regarding the library system to the county board. The legislation would also establish that the library director shall exercise the powers and perform the duties delegated to it by the county board.

Benefits of the proposed legislation include:

- Increases direct citizen accountability
- Greater integration with the County's priorities and plans especially in the areas of new library facilities and services
- Preserves the important influence of the Library Board in matters of intellectual freedom
- Allows for more efficient management and response schedule (County Board meets more frequently than Library Board)
- Creates more integrated culture between the County and County Library staff
- Increases the visibility of the library system
- Regularized communication with those elected to represent the people of the County
- Increases efficiency reduces duplication (accounting functions, technology etc.)

Resolution to Support Special Legislation Transferring Certain Authorities of the Carver County Board

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carver County Board of Commissioners proposes special legislation to improve the governance of the Carver County library system listed as Attachment #1: Proposed Legislation.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that effective upon passage of this resolution and adoption of the special legislation, the Carver County Board of Commissioners shall delegate to the newly formed library board the authority to:

- 1. Establish operating hours.
- 2. Expand the library system within the budget approved by the County Board.
- 3. Ensure that library facilities meet the Minnesota State library standards.
- 4. Establish rules governing library operations.
- 5. Assist the Administrative Services Division Director in filling any vacancy in the Library Director position.
- Provide advice and make recommendations on any other matters pertaining to the library system to the Library Director and Carver County Board of Commissioners.
- 7. Be responsible for any other duties delegated to it by the Carver County Board of Commissioners.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. CARVER COUNTY LIBRARY.

The Carver County Board shall be the authority over all aspects of the Carver County library system except those authorities and responsibilities specifically assigned to the library board in this Section or otherwise delegated to the library board from the County Board. The county library board consisting of five members who reside in the county library service area shall be appointed by the County Board. The County Board shall be responsible for appointing a qualified library director and other staff as necessary, establishing the compensation of employees, and removing any of them for cause. The County Board shall be the authority over and be responsible for the fiscal operations of the library board in all financial areas including, but not limited to, budgeting and receipt and expenditure of funds. The County Board shall also be responsible as the legal authority over the library board. The library board shall be responsible for the establishment of policies and rules governing library operations, review of the annual operating budget and five-year capital plan for submission to the county board, development of long-range plans and any other duties delegated to it by the County Board. The library board shall be <u>responsible for the acceptance of gift and trust funds and notifying the County Board of the acceptance</u> of those funds. The library board shall have the sole authority and discretion in maintaining and developing the collections of the library system. The library board shall also be responsible for the use of library meeting rooms.

Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

Section 1 is effective the day after the governing body of Carver County complies with Minnesota Statutes, section 645.021, subdivision 3.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: The Board has identified economic development as a high priority in its vision statement and economic development has become one of the focal points of the comprehensive planning process. In response to the Board's vision the CDA established an economic development department several years ago. The department has been very active and successful in its efforts. In working with existing and potential businesses, the CDA has found that railroad access with the potential for transload facilities has a high potential to support economic development. At the same tine the TC&W Railroad has become very active in pursuing new business opportunities which would include transload facilities. In order for any meaningful planning to be done by TC&W, the CDA, the County or any of the cities, information regarding suitable sites needed to be developed. Not all rail line frontage is suitable for facilities. A number of factors such as topography, soils, road access, natural resource features, regional location, physical characteristics of the track, and other factors all need to be taken into account when planning for transload facilities. The CDA and TC&W Railroad have collaborated on a study to identify sites along the rail line that, based on the factors in the study, would be candidates to be planned for transload facilities. This study provides a factual basis for further discussion, land planning and economic development efforts. A presentation outline is attached. It includes information on what factors were included in the study.			
The study results will be presented at the work session.			
ACTION REQUESTED: The staff will be looking to the Board for guidance on how to incorporate the into the planning process, particularly into the land use plan and economic development efforts.
