Holtmeier noted Peterson's immigration to Carver County in 1855 and diaries he kept. He explained several years ago Swedish people came over to visit the Peterson farm and were very concerned about the conditions of the buildings. Holtmeier stated this prompted four Swedish people to come over in 2006 and repair one of the buildings. He stated last year 27 people from the Andrew Peterson Society came over to tour the Peterson farm, among other sites, and that group asked that he deliver a package to the County

Chair Ische thanked the group for the flag, pictures, book and literature and stated the materials would be displayed in the County buildings.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 9:30 a.m. to go into a work session with the Community Development Agency to discuss their budget and levy. Motion carried unanimously.

WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of August 19, 2008; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. Lyle & Sue Goetz own a 98.8 acre dairy farm located in the NE¼ of Section 36 of Waconia Township. The farmstead is improved with a house, garage, barn and several outbuildings. The property is in the Ag Zoning District, Shoreland Overlay District, and CCWRMA -Carver Creek watershed.
- 2. The applicants are proposing a modification to the existing feedlot, which is located in the Shoreland Overlay District. Therefore, a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) has been requested pursuant to Section 152 (Carver County Zoning Code), and Section 52 (Feedlot Management Ordinance).
- 3. The Goetz Family own and operate a dairy in the NE ¼ of Section 36 of Waconia Township. The Goetz's own 75 acres and rent an additional 180 acres of cropland which is also available for manure application. At the present time there are 85 dairy cows, 60 dairy heifers, and 57 dairy calves for a total of 172.4 animal units.
- 4. Carver Creek borders the feedlot facility on the east. A dairy heifer barn and associated lot lie within shoreland and are directly adjacent to Carver Creek. In addition, the dairy barn and associated lot are within shoreland. The calf hutches are also located in shoreland.
- 5. A routine site inspection was conducted by Environmental Services staff on 3/11/08. The Carver SWCD was contacted following the inspection to complete a more comprehensive evaluation, including survey, to better determine feedlot runoff patterns. Following the delineation of the site, a MN Farm evaluation was completed to determine the pollution rating. It was determined that the site had a rating of 30 at the time of the inspection due to feedlot runoff from a heifer lot directly adjacent to Carver Creek and from dairy lot runoff to Carver Creek. Feedlots are required to have a rating of 0 to be in compliance.
- 6. The Goetz's have made considerable effort to eliminate the pollution rating on their feedlot. They have worked closely with the Carver SWCD and Carver County Environmental Services to develop a plan to bring the feedlot into compliance and to meet permitting requirements.


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- 7. In order to minimize continued feedlot runoff into Carver Creek, much of the work to bring the feedlot into compliance has already been completed. The heifer lot adjacent to Carver Creek was abandoned in June. In addition, some minimal grading and shaping was completed to direct water flow through a grassed buffer that has been seeded south of the feedlot area.
- 8. In August, fill was brought in to increase the elevation of a field road. The road will act as a diversion for feedlot runoff. With the diversion in place, feedlot runoff is directed through 350 feet of permanent meadow before it reaches a spur ditch to the south of the building site.
- 9. In addition to feedlot runoff control implemented, the Goetz's are proposing to construct a 32' x 20' lean onto their dairy barn to accommodate the future construction of a parlor within the dairy barn.
- 10. A 16' x 24' building is also being proposed to house young stock. The building will be constructed west of the machine shed and all lot runoff will be directed toward the west.
- 11. There is no increase in animal units proposed with these changes. The additional facilities will improve on the management of the dairy as it exists.
- 12. Section 152.035 and Section 152.122 of the Zoning Code address the requirements for the elimination of direct discharge septic systems and for septic system compliance within Shoreland. The applicants are in the process of replacing the onsite sewer system for the farmhouse. A design for the new system has been approved and cost share funding has been authorized. The applicants plan to have the system installed this fall unless there is an unforeseen delay.
- 13. With the issuance of the CUP and the completion of the proposed improvements, the applicants would meet the applicable standards of the County Code (i.e. zoning, feedlot and sewage treatment) and the MN Approved Carver Creek Bacteria TMDL's, which would provide significant water quality benefits to the watershed.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of CUP #PZ20080026 for the feedlot modifications on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- 1. The permit is subject to administrative review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by Environmental Services for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners and/or operators are encouraged to contact Environmental Services as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. The conditional use permit shall not be finalized (signed & recorded) until the Feedlot Permit (or Interim Permit) or Certificate of Compliance is approved by either the MPCA or County Feedlot Officer.
- 3. The conditions of the Feedlot Permit and/or Certificate of Compliance shall be considered conditions of this permit.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: By September 15 th , State Law requires that the County Board adopt a 2009 Preliminary Property Tax Levy to finance 2009 County Operations and Capital Projects. The Final Property Tax Levy which will be adopted in December can be lower than the Preliminary Levy but cannot higher. Individual Divisions have presented their budget requests during public hearings in July and August. The requested increase in the 2009 Property Tax Levy was \$10.6 million (25%).	be				
The County Administrator has developed a recommended 2009 preliminary property tax which was presented August 19 th Budget workshop. The recommended 2009 preliminary property tax of \$47,411,000 is an increase \$4,286,413 (9.9%) compared to the 2008 property tax levy of \$43,124,587. The impact on the average value home of \$312,300 would be an increase in county property taxes of approximately \$68 or a monthly increase slightly less than \$6. The primary drivers for the 9.9% increase:	; OI				
 5.5% increased cost for maintaining the same level of County services (wages, health insurance, utili inflation, gas, etc.) 3% to offset revenue decreases from investments and recorders fees 1.4% increase for capital projects (roads & bridges debt service, fiber ring, Justice/Government Cent boilers and chillers) 					
In addition, the County Board approved in June 2008 a tax abatement levy for for the Undestad Development to be used to be to pay a portion of the debt service for the 2008 Bond sale that was used to finance the County's Lyman Boulevard improvements. The 2009 tax abatement levy is \$71,000.

In October, the County Adminstrator will present a detailed budget based on the adopted 2009 preliminary property tax levy.					
In November, the County Administrator will present an updated Long-Term Financial Plan which includes Capital Improvement Plans for Roads, Bridges and Buildings.



BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: The levy request below is for each of the special taxing districts making up the Carver County Watershed Management Organization, also referred to as the Carver County Water Resource Management Area (CCWRMA). The levy consist of funds levied in each watershed for projects in that watershed plus general operating expenses distributed proportionally across all of the watersheds in the WMO. General operating expenses include staff time, general engineering, development review expenses, training, mileage, equipment repair & maintenance, per deim for WENR Committee meetings, educational expenses, and addition to the Low Impact Conservation fund primarily intended to support the Direct Discharge program.						
The total levy request is \$514,984 as compared to the 2008 request of \$459,481, an increase of 12%. The principal components of the increase are salary adjustments and benefit increases for the existing personnel in LWS and the SWCD, a \$15,000 increase in capital (\$5,000 in Carver & \$10,000 In East Chaska) to respond to city project requests, and an additional \$15,000 into the Low Impact Conservation fund primarily intended to support the Direct Discharge program.
