A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on June 26, 2007. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 9:00 a.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, James Ische, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Workman moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the minutes of the June 12, 2007, Regular Session Motion carried unanimously.

Under public participation, James Kuhl, San Francisco Township, stated there were to be passing lanes on County Road but motorists are unable to use it because there was a solid white lane. He indicated he notified Public Works and was hoping a dashed line could be completed so the lane can be used legally.

Kuhl commented on the Kari Myrold's recommendation to appoint Robert Hendricks as the Acting County Attorney. He questioned the legal advice given in the past to the Board by Mr. Hendricks. Vice Chair Ische responded that Mr. Hendricks has given excellent advice to the County and pointed out that Hendricks has been successful in defending lawsuits brought against the County. Maluchnik stated he spent nine years on the Planning Commission and stated he also had full and complete confidence in Mr. Hendricks.

Chris Weldon, Risk and Emergency Management, highlighted the Outstanding Achievement Award in Occupational Safety received by the County for 2006. He stated this was based on the average number of employees, number of hours worked, recordable injuries and days away from work. Weldon noted Risk Management staff has and will continue to work hard on improving the County's safety record.

Del Hurt, Public Health, appeared before the Board to request the approval of a Public Health planner position. He stated the position would be funded by the Local Public Health grant in support of the Office of Aging.

Hurt explained the Health Partnership Senior Commission was established in 2001 based upon a Public Health community needs assessment. He highlighted the composition of the Senior Commission, their purpose and accomplishments. He pointed out the anticipated growth projections of seniors living within the County and noted the Senior Commissions that have developed in several communities.

He reviewed current and future living arrangements of seniors as well their social/economic profile. Hurt shared the Commission's vision for education, community based services, healthcare, housing, transportation, recreation and volunteerism.

He clarified home health care was currently being handled through Ridgeview Medical Services and

they would be doing further assessments to determine what the future needs are.

Hurt indicated as the Senior Commission has developed the Master Plan, they have recognized Public Health's role to provide leadership and coordination of these services. He stated Public Health role is to act as a clearing house for services both public and private.

Robert Roepke, Senior Commission Co-Chair, stated a key component is recognizing the aging population as a resource. He stated future issues will revolve around the aging population and there were not many counties that have put together a master plan for aging.

Ische moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve the Public Health Planner position. Motion carried unanimously.

Robert Hendricks, Acting County Attorney, clarified the Board was being asked to go into closed session pursuant to Minnesota Statue 13D.05 Subd. 3 (c) (3) to develop or consider offers or

counteroffers for the purchase of real estate.

Workman moved, Lynch seconded, to go into closed session to discuss License Center land acquisition. Motion carried unanimously.

Present were: Gayle Degler, James Ische, Randy Maluchnik, Tim Lynch, Tom Workman, David Hemze, Steve Taylor, Mark Lundgren, Laurie Engelen and Steve Taylor.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to approve the minutes of the June 12, 2007, Board of Equalization meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Keith Kern, Assistant County Assessor, explained the recommendation to maintain the values of the Todd Brown and Dennis Lackey properties and their recommended reduction to the Lois Droege property.

Todd Brown, PID #65.0850390, voiced his concerns with the appeals process and believed he should have been provided the same information as the Boards of Review to allow him an opportunity to respond. He suggested he was denied his appeal at the City as he was unable to make the second meeting. Brown stated that the land values surrounding his property were not calculated the same.

Angie Johnson, County Assessor, clarified the process for an appeal and stated the reason for the denial at the Local Board was because the Local Board upheld the Assessor's recommendation.

The Board acknowledged the current slowing market trends. Kern stated that would be addressed in the upcoming assessment and for this assessment they were looking at older data.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to concur with the Assessor's recommendation on PID #65.0850390, Todd Brown. Degler, Ische, Lynch voted aye. Engelen, Maluchnik, Workman voted nay. Motion failed.


WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of June 19, 2007; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

Jason and Deanna Dennis own a 9.37 acre property located in the Southeast quarter (SE ¼) of the Northeast quarter (NE1/4) of Section 6 of Dahlgren Township. The property is improved with a house with attached garage, and a detached garage. The property is in the Ag Zoning District, the Shoreland Overlay District, and the CCWRMA (Carver Creek).

The applicants are requesting a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to operate a Home Extended Business Accessory Use pursuant to Section 152.079 C9 of the Carver County Zoning Code.

- The applicants have been operating their small landscaping business, Creekside Inc, for seven years. They have been 3. utilizing the existing accessory structure for vehicle and equipment storage. The business vehicles used in the operation are three one-ton pick-up trucks. The business employs four employees in the summer for the landscaping business, and the same number work in the winter doing snow removal. The summer hours of operation are 7:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. During the winter, weather dictates the operating hours but generally the work is done off site at night.
- The number of trips (ADT) generated each day would be approximately seven for employees and business vehicles 4. entering and leaving the site. Deliveries are made to work sites only. The applicants' letter states that customers would not come to the site.
- Outside storage consists of leftover landscaping materials stored in the indicated storage area and vehicles parked on 5. the west side of the shed. The applicants' site plan shows two rows of trees screening the outside storage area, and natural topography also acts as screening. The vehicles and equipment to be stored outside will be minimal as supplies are delivered to job sites.
- Building officials have reviewed the shed and business use and determined that since the shed met Building Code at 6. the time it was built and the use has not changed, Building Code requirements are met.
- The facility would be accessed via the existing driveway off of Co Rd 140. The Dennis' have been informed that they need to contact County Public Works to determine the requirements for an access permit and discuss any necessary improvements. Mr. Dennis had been using a field access drive to access his business, but upon learning that this does not

comply with County Code, has stated that he will no longer use the access for business purposes and the residential driveway will be the sole access for the business. County Public Works has been informed of the application, and may have comments available for the public hearing.

- 8. The applicants have a 4' X 8' (32 sq. ft.) sign hanging on the shed. The sign ordinance allows for one double sided sign for each conditional use which shall not exceed 36 sq. ft. per surface. The applicants' request appears to meet the requirement for signage.
- 9. The Dahlgren Town Board reviewed the request at their June 11, 2007 Town Board meeting and recommended approval, and a Town Board Supervisor will be present at the public hearing to comment.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of the subject permit on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- 1. The permit is subject to administrative review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by Land Management for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners and/or operators are encouraged to contact Land Management as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. The operation shall be in accordance with the submitted operational & site plans (dated: May 18, 2007). These plans shall be attached to and become part of this permit.
- All structures used in conjunction with the Home Extended Business Accessory Use operation shall meet the 3. requirements of the Minnesota State Building Code.
- Outside storage of business equipment, supplies and/or vehicles is permitted within the designated area only. 4. Permanent outside storage of vehicles and equipment shall be permitted if the storage in the designated area is screened from nearby roads and residences. No more than 4 business vehicles shall be permitted.
- The Permittee shall be responsible for obtaining proper access permits as authorized by the responsible road authority. 5.
- Permittee shall submit a Certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance and/or proper affidavit to the Land Management 6. Department. No more than 4 employees shall be permitted.
- Section 154.18 of the Carver County Sign Code allows for an aggregate of 36 square feet of surface area, or an aggregate of 72 square feet for two-sided signs. The permittee shall not exceed the allowed square footage of signage. If the permittee is considering the addition of signage, they will be required to submit a variance application and be granted the variance request through the Board of Adjustment.
- At all times this property shall be occupied as a homestead by a principal of the activity. 8.




Dahlgren Township AUGUSTA RD AUGUSTA MAN 51 GLENS RC

The Transportation Advisory Board and Metropolitan Council will award approximately \$80 million from the STP-Urban Guarantee program, \$50 million from the CMAQ program and \$15 million from the TEP to projects and programs in the seven-county metropolitan area. The local Bridge Improvement or Replacement program will award approximately \$9 million. These funds will be allocated to the region in 2011 and 2012. The amount of funds available in these programs is based on the funding levels established by SAFETEA-LU. Prior to selecting projects, the funding level will be reviewed to ensure fiscal balance of the Transportation Improvement Program.

The selected projects and programs will be programmed for construction or implementation in 2011 and 2012 as part of the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for 2009-2012. The 2009–2012 TIP will be drafted in March 2008 and adopted by the TAB in September 2008. Notification of applicants "to proceed" is anticipated to occur in November or December of 2008.

The Chanhassen City Council adopted on June 25, 2007, a resolution by the same title as the one attached and being requested for adoption by the County Board.

APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM FUNDING

TH 101 from Lyman Boulevard (CSAH 18) to Pioneer Trail (CSAH 14)

WHEREAS, Carver County, in conjunction with the City of Chanhassen and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (Mn/DOT), completed a corridor and environmental screening study for TH 101 in May, 2007, from Lyman Boulevard to the Carver/Scott County line; and,

WHEREAS, in June , 2007, a technical memorandum identified TH 101 north of Pioneer Trail to Lyman Boulevard as having independent utility allowing project development to proceed prior to further environmental review of the area south of Pioneer Trail, thereby creating Project 1 and Project 2; and,

WHEREAS, Project 1 (TH 101 from Lyman Boulevard to Pioneer Trail) is the first TH 101 project planned for construction. Construction funding is needed and proposed from Federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds (80 percent) and State/Local funds (20 percent).

The study identified long-term transportation improvements to address safety, capacity, and connectivity issues south of new TH 212. The limits of the study were the Carver/Scott County line on the south end to Lyman Boulevard (CSAH 18) on the north end, which is where the 4-lane section will end upon completion of the new TH 212 freeway improvements. A range of alternatives and a scoping process were developed and applied to evaluate the alternatives. Environmental "screening" was performed to identify natural and social environmental issues that influence selection alternatives and to identify issues that may require further study in future phases of project development. Also, a technical memorandum was drafted that identified the area north of Pioneer Trail as an independent utility allowing project development Trail.

The corridor has several major safety problems related to steep grades, sharp curves and severe undulations in the vertical profile. Inadequate sight distances along the corridor create blind public street, driveway and trail intersections. "Run off the road" and "loss of control" type crashes are prevalent throughout the corridor. Intersection and congestion related crashes are prevalent at the Old U.S. Highway 212 (U.S. 212) and Trunk Highway 101 intersection. These issues contribute to overall crash and severity rates that are more than three times greater than those experienced on other rural two lane roadways in the Metro area.

MN 101 (between the Minnesota River and New U.S. 212) is a logical and direct link that would serve travel demands to and from the heart of the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. While Old U.S. 212 serves a regional transportation route today, its effectiveness is hampered by traffic congestion in the commercial districts of Eden Prairie and Chaska. - Project 1 Construction would tie into the roadway that is currently being constructed by the 212 project, south of Lyman Boulevard and extend south, through the intersection of Pioneer Trail. This segment is the next logical part of the corridor to be improved. The total length of Project 1 is 0.75 miles. Approximately 6.5 acres of right-of-way will need to be acquired for the widening and safety improvements. However, most of the land is anticipated to be dedicated through new development plats.
- Project 2 Reconstruction/widening between Pioneer Trail and US 212 would take place after Project 1. The reconstruction/widening between US 212 to the Scott County border, improvements to the bluff alignment with fixes to the "Y" intersection would be included in this project.


Carver County and LELS Local 289, Sergeants are in the process of negotiating a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA), but have not yet completed negotiaitons.

Earlier this year, Local 289 prevailed in a grievance arbitration granting the Patrol Sergeants overtime payments for hours worked in excess of 2,080 in a year. The result of that arbitration award would require the payment of overtime for Sheriff's Patrol Sergeants continuing to work the 12-hour shifts allowed by the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA).

The Sergeants in Local 289 and the Sheriff's Office leadership team realize the benefit of the 12-hour shifts to the communities with the most consistent coverage possible at this time, and to the employees with a more desireable schedule. In order to continue that coverage and avoid the overtime, the County and Local 289 have entered into a memorandum of understanding whereby the Patrol Sergearnts will continue to work the 12-hour shifts resulting in 2,184 hours worked in a year, and will have the additional benefit of bidding their shifts by seniority once they are assigned to the Patrol duties.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: In 2006 the Division converted a Case Aide position to a				

Social Worker II position in the Developmental Disabilities Unit. Some significant changes have take place within the past year that justifies putting a Case Aide position back in this unit. The Consumer Support Grant (CSG), which is a Medical Assistance Waiver Program that allows the client and their family to direct their own care. Prior to July 1, 2007, the Division received reimbursement from this waiver by submitting the claim in tis quarterly expense report to the state. Effective July 1, 2007, each service has to be individually billed to the State. This change significantly increases the amount of administrative time the Division spends on collecting the revenue. Currently, a Social Worker performs some of these functions but it is not an efficient use of position at Pay Grade 13 to perform these functions. A Case Aide position (Pay Grade 9) would be a more cost effective way of handling this workload and the tracking that needs to accomphlished.

Up until this time, the Division has not been deducting an administrative allowance from the individual CSG's. The grant allows up to 5%. The Division is proposing that an administrative allowance be duducted from the grants to cover the increased administrative costs of the individualized billing. The Case Aide position will monitor the monthly claims from CSG, enter the billing data into the state systems and ensure that the clients are not overspending their allocation.

The Division is requesting that a new 1.0 FTE Case Aide position be created this year. Furthermore, the Division will seek reimbursement for these services from the client's CSG Grant and other waiver allocations as appropriate.




