WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meeting of March 20, 2007; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. Wm. Mueller & Sons, Inc. operate a mining operation on the Lundquist property (approximately 20 acres) located in the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section 35, Dahlgren Township. The property is located in the Agricultural Zoning District, the Agricultural Preservation Program (until 2011), and the CCWRMA (Bevens Creek).
- 2. On December 1, 2003, Conditional Use Permit (Order #PZ20030068) was issued to Wm. Mueller & Sons, Inc. for the mining of aggregate on this property. The amount of material (sand & gravel) being excavated and hauled from the site was approved for up to a maximum of 50,000 cubic yards per year.
- 3. Wm. Mueller & Sons, Inc. is requesting to amend the existing Conditional Use Permit (Order #PZ20030068) which would include the processing of Class 5 material which will be utilized on the MN State Hwy 312 project (currently underway) and possibly the Carver County 10 project (beginning Spring/Summer 2007). Both projects are set to be completed approximately Fall/Winter of 2008. The processing on the Lundquist site will be done by a company called Intech, Inc. The hauling of material to and from the site will be handled by Zumbro River Constructors (ZRC), Ames Construction, Wm. Mueller & Sons and independent contractors working on the two (2) projects. After the State Hwy 312 and C.S.A.H 30 projects are completed, the processing activity taking place on the Lundquist site would cease, and the mining activity would continue to operate under the previously approved conditions.
- 4. Section 152.080 C4 of the Carver County Zoning Code (LARGE SCALE ACTIVITIES WITH UNIQUE LAND OR LOCATION NEEDS) allows for mining as a Conditional Use Permit.
- 5. Based on the previous permit, the mining operation primarily involves a front-end loader or backhoe with the intention of excavating and hauling up to 50,000 cubic yards of material (sand & gravel) per year. The hours of operation are 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, except operations may extend beyond these hours for occasional short-term projects or emergencies provided the Permittee notifies the County Land Management Department and Dahlgren Township prior to the project(s). The temporary processing activity (crushing) would be done within the existing approved operational area and would consist of hours from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. during peak production. In addition, the applicant is

requesting the trucks (common to have 35-45 w/an average of 40-60 minute round trips) be allowed to haul material out from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. All truck hauling will cease if East Union Lutheran Church has a function (wedding, funeral, etc.). The processing crew would consist of 3 or 4 men and two (2) fontend loaders which will charge the processing equipment and load trucks. The crew has a portable trailer where all tools, oil, fuel and generator(s) are stored. Accurate quantities of material needed for the two (2) projects are not known at this time; however, realistic numbers could be in the 150,000 to 200,000 cubic yard range. After the State Hwy 312 & Co Rd 10 projects are completed, the processing activity will cease and the mining activity will resume as originally approved.

- 6. Access to the site would remain via an existing field entrance to Co Rd 40, which was approved as part of the original Conditional Use Permit. In 2003, Carver County Public Works reviewed and approved the field access location for site distances; however, the suitability of the access for the mining operation as it pertains to width, strength, etc. was not to be determined by Public Works. Based on the 2003 operational plan, there would be about 16 days of heavy hauling per year (e.g. 240 loads x 13 yards each x 16 days = 50,000 yards). That access location has been upgraded to a bituminous entrance leading down to the mining activity. The proposed haul route for the State Hwy 312 project would typically consist of Co Rd 40, Co Rd 147 and onto the Hwy 312 project. The haul route for the Co Rd 10 project has not been determined; however, Co Rd 40 and Co Rd 43 seem to be logical roads.
- 7. The County Public Works Department submitted a memo (dated: 3/14/07) addressing concerns about safety of the motoring public on this roadway when hauling operations are occurring. They recommended that a traffic study be completed to determine impacts to traffic and include a recommendation on potential safety measures, such as turn lane construction, bypass land construction, signage plans, etc that could be installed or used to mitigate the traffic impacts caused by this hauling. After further review and discussion, the Planning Commission recommends approval of the request and further recommended the item not be placed on the County Board agenda until Wm. Mueller & Sons addresses the concerns noted in the Public Works memo.
- 8. As part of the 2003 CUP approval, the County Water Rules required a formal erosion control plan and stormwater management plan for an operation of 5 acres or more (Level 3). Also, impacts within 100' of sensitive areas would fall into this category. There are a couple wetland areas to the west of the proposed operational area that needed to be protected. The applicant retained an engineer to prepare plans and calculations, which were reviewed and approved by SWCD and/or Wenck Assoc. No changes to the actual operational area are taking place; therefore, the amendment will conform to the County Water Management Rules.
- 9. The relatively small size and limited scope of the operation should minimize the potential for adverse environmental effects. The pit would be expanded in an easterly direction with about 1 to 1½ acres being added per year (e.g. 100' x 600'). The applicant indicated that the pit may only be active for 8 to 10 years because of possible City development and the expiration of the Ag Preserve Covenant in 2011. The estimated depth of excavation along the hillside would be about 25 to 30 feet. The profile consists of about 1½' topsoil; 5½' clay; and 20' useable aggregate. The clay would likely be stockpiled along the southwesterly side of the site and the topsoil would be incorporated into the plow ground or stockpiled at the edge of the field. As excavation progresses it may be possible to stage restoration, using the stockpiled material, along the west side of the area that is being actively mined.
- 10. The Carver SWCD (Chip Hentges) reviewed the site regarding erosion control, wetlands, stormwater runoff and restoration. Erosion control should be fairly straightforward. A sand filter berm should be utilized to control runoff toward the wetland. Restoration would require grading at a 5:1 slope for land that would be returned to ag production and 3:1 elsewhere (minimum of 4" of topsoil). An NPDES (MPCA permit) was required, which specifies a rock entrance to assure that sediment does not leave the site, among other standards. Seeding & mulching would be required for the stockpiles and restored areas. He also suggested that staging of restoration might be possible after the third year. SWCD would continue to provide technical assistance on these matters.
- 11. The Dahlgren Town Board reviewed and recommended approval of the amended request on February 21, 2007.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends the issuance of Conditional Use Permit #PZ20070005 on the subject permit on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application. The Planning Commission further recommends the item not be placed on the County Board agenda until Wm. Mueller & Sons addresses the concerns noted in the Public Works memo (dated: March 14, 2007). If approved by the County Board, this permit shall Terminate and Supercede the prior approved Conditional Use Permit #PZ20030068. The Planning Commission further recommends that the following conditions be attached to the permit:

- 1. The permit is subject to compliance review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by the Land Management Department for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners and/or operators are encouraged to contact the County Land Management Department as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. The mining operation shall conform in accordance with the letter, dated 10/27/03, and the approved site plans, dated 11/05/03. The hours of operation shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, except operations may extend beyond these hours for occasional short-term projects and/or emergencies provided the Permittee notifies the County Land Management Department and Dahlgren Township, prior to the project(s).
- 3. The temporary processing activity, being conducted on the site by Intech, Inc., shall conform in accordance with the letter dated 2/20/07, and approved site plan, dated 2/20/07. The amended temporary processing activity (crushing) would be done within the existing approved operational area and would consist of hours from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. during peak production. In addition, the applicant is requesting the trucks (common to have 35-45 w/an average of 40-60 minute round trips) be allowed to haul material out from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. All truck hauling will cease if East Union Lutheran Church has a function (Wedding, Funeral, etc.). The processing crew would consist of 3 or 4 men and two (2) font-end loader which will charge the processing equipment and load trucks. The crew has a portable trailer where all tools, oil, fuel and generator(s) are stored. After the State Hwy 312 & Co Rd 10 projects are completed, the processing activity will cease and the mining activity will resume with the originally approved conditions. Therefore, once the processing for the above mentioned projects is completed, this condition is no longer authorized and shall become Null and Void.
- 4. Permittee must obtain Co Rd 40 access approval and maintain the mining access and signage according to Public Works' requirements. Mining and/or similar disturbance shall not occur within 40 feet of the public right-of-way.
- 5. This request shall not be placed on the County Board agenda until Wm. Mueller & Sons addresses the concerns noted in the Public Works memo (dated: March 14, 2007).
- 6. A Grading Plan (including restoration), Erosion/Sediment Control Plan and Stormwater Management Plan shall be prepared and implemented in accordance with the Carver County Water Management Plan before mining commences. Permittee shall obtain an NPDES permit as required by the MPCA.

12. Please notify SWCD and/or the Carver County Land Management Department 24 hours prior to beginning any processing activities. (The Carver SWCD will be monitoring the site and the County will be enforcing implementation of the erosion and sediment control measures.)

OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

These requirements combined with the Site/Operational Plan shall govern the mining operation.

- 1. The operation shall be conducted so that the required material can be removed while disturbing a minimal area and to permit restoration at the earliest possible time.
- 2. The Permittee shall confine mining operations as much as possible to one area at a time or to minimum areas required to obtain the proper materials required for blending. Exploration may be conducted in un-mined areas, but actual mining shall consist only under the conditions of this permit. Exploration shall consist only of boring or excavation required to determine extent and quality of the resource; material disturbed during exploration shall not be processed or removed until actual mining has begun.
- 3. Permittee shall maintain erosion control measures including, but not limited to, a sand filter berm near the wetland to ensure erosion and sedimentation do not occur. Permittee must maintain existing vegetation wherever possible and implement erosion control as required by the County Water Rules permit.
- 4. Existing drainage patterns shall not be altered if possible; if alteration is unavoidable, the alteration shall not adversely affect surrounding properties and/or cause erosion or sedimentation.
- 5. Topsoil and overburden required for restoration shall be maintained and shall be preserved from erosion or other loss. Only material necessary for restoration may be hauled to the site. Said material shall be incorporated into site restoration immediately or stockpiled according to the site plan.
- 6. Vertical faces shall be kept to a minimum except during the actual mining operation. Mining below the water level is not allowed.
- 7. The material removed pursuant to this permit is not expected to exceed 50,000 cubic yards per calendar year. The volume will be reviewed by the Land Management Administrator during review. The permit must be amended if the Land Management Administrator determines that the size and/or intensity of the operation exceeds the scope of the permit.

RESTORATION

1. The design of the restored areas must be according to standards of the Zoning Code and the Carver Water Management Rules. To the extent possible, restoration shall be staged (beginning in about the 3rd year) such that the exhausted areas along the westerly side of the operation are stabilized & turf established. Said design may be subject to revisions and modifications by the Land Management Department and Carver SWCD.

PERFORMANCE SECURITIES & INSURANCE

- 1. Permittee shall provide a performance security in a form acceptable to the County, naming the County as oblige. The security shall be drafted so as to be effective for at least 3 months after the annual anniversary dated of this point.
- 2. PERFORMANCE SECURITY REQUIRED FOR THIS PERMIT \$50,000.
- 3. The conditions of the surety shall be that if the Permittee fails to conform to any of the conditions or requirements of this permit or for any reason ceases to operate the facility in accordance with the provisions of this permit and the County is required to expend monies, labor, or material to bring the operation into conformance with the permit or to

perform restoration as provided in this permit due to non-performance by the Permittee, the County may utilize the performance security for reimbursement for any and all expenses incurred to remedy such failure of the Permittee.

- 4. The obligor and its sureties hereby indemnify and save the County harmless from all losses, costs, and charges that may occur to the County because of default.
- 5. The Permittee shall furnish to the County a Certificate of Insurance providing coverage by an insurance company duly licensed by the State of Minnesota indicating that the Permittee has in force coverage for public liability, vehicle liability, loading and unloading, completed operations liability, explosion and collapse of underground operations liability, and bodily injury liability in the amount of at least \$1,000,000 for injury of any one person in any one occurrence. Property damage insurance coverage shall be in force with a minimum amount of at least \$1,000,000. Further, the Permittee shall furnish proof of workman's compensation coverage. Insurance certificate(s) described above shall carry an irrevocable notice to the County by the carrier 30 days prior to any change, modification, lapse, or cancellation of the policies required.
- 6. Insurance coverage required above shall be kept in effect for the duration of the permit. If the permit is to be terminated, insurance shall be maintained until the completion of restoration and return of the performance security.



A public hearing was held on this matter on March 20, 2007, by the Carver County Planning Commission, and the recommendation of the Planning Commission was duly considered in the issuance of this order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Wm. Mueller & Sons, Inc. operate a mining operation on the Lundquist property (approximately 20 acres) located in the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section 35, Dahlgren Township. The property is located in the Agricultural Zoning District, the Agricultural Preservation Program (until 2011), and the CCWRMA (Bevens Creek).
- 2. On December 1, 2003, Conditional Use Permit (Order #PZ20030068) was issued to Wm. Mueller & Sons, Inc. for the mining of aggregate on this property. The amount of material (sand & gravel) being excavated and hauled from the site was approved for up to a maximum of 50,000 cubic yards per year.
- 3. Wm. Mueller & Sons, Inc. is requesting to amend the existing Conditional Use Permit (Order #PZ20030068) which would include the processing of Class 5 material which will be utilized on the MN State Hwy 312 project (currently underway) and possibly the Carver County 10 project (beginning Spring/Summer 2007). Both projects are set to be completed approximately Fall/Winter of 2008. The processing on the Lundquist site will be done by a company called Intech, Inc. The hauling of material to and from the site will be handled by Zumbro River Constructors (ZRC), Ames Construction, Wm. Mueller & Sons and independent contractors working on the two (2) projects. After the State Hwy 312 and C.S.A.H 30 projects are completed, the processing activity taking place on the Lundquist site would cease, and the mining activity would continue to operate under the previously approved conditions.
- 4. Section 152.080 C4 of the Carver County Zoning Code (LARGE SCALE ACTIVITIES WITH UNIQUE LAND OR LOCATION NEEDS) allows for mining as a Conditional Use Permit.
- 5. Based on the previous permit, the mining operation primarily involves a front-end loader or backhoe with the intention of excavating and hauling up to 50,000 cubic yards of material (sand & gravel) per year. The hours of operation are 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, except operations may extend beyond these hours for occasional short-term projects or emergencies provided the Permittee notifies the County Land Management Department and Dahlgren Township prior to the project(s). The temporary processing activity (crushing) would be done within the existing approved operational area and would consist of hours from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. during peak production. In addition, the applicant is requesting the trucks (common to have 35-45 w/an average of 40-60 minute round trips) be allowed to haul material

out from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. All truck hauling will cease if East Union Lutheran Church has a function (wedding, funeral, etc.). The processing crew would consist of 3 or 4 men and two (2) fontend loaders which will charge the processing equipment and load trucks. The crew has a portable trailer where all tools, oil, fuel and generator(s) are stored. Accurate quantities of material needed for the two (2) projects are not known at this time; however, realistic numbers could be in the 150,000 to 200,000 cubic yard range. After the State Hwy 312 & Co Rd 10 projects are completed, the processing activity will cease and the mining activity will resume as originally approved.

- 6. Access to the site would remain via an existing field entrance to Co Rd 40, which was approved as part of the original Conditional Use Permit. In 2003, Carver County Public Works reviewed and approved the field access location for site distances; however, the suitability of the access for the mining operation as it pertains to width, strength, etc. was not to be determined by Public Works. Based on the 2003 operational plan, there would be about 16 days of heavy hauling per year (e.g. 240 loads x 13 yards each x 16 days = 50,000 yards). That access location has been upgraded to a bituminous entrance leading down to the mining activity. The proposed haul route for the State Hwy 312 project would typically consist of Co Rd 40, Co Rd 147 and onto the Hwy 312 project. The haul route for the Co Rd 10 project has not been determined; however, Co Rd 40 and Co Rd 43 seem to be logical roads.
- 7. Wm. Mueller & Son's Inc. has agreed to widen the entrance and construct a west bound by-pass lane at the pit location. Due to existing right-of-way restrictions, exact dimensions will need to be determined in the field. **Note:** Attached for your review is the brief letter (dated: 3/29/07) submitted by Wm. Meuller & Son's, Inc.
- 8. As part of the 2003 CUP approval, the County Water Rules required a formal erosion control plan and stormwater management plan for an operation of 5 acres or more (Level 3). Also, impacts within 100' of sensitive areas would fall into this category. There are a couple wetland areas to the west of the proposed operational area that needed to be protected. The applicant retained an engineer to prepare plans and calculations, which were reviewed and approved by SWCD and/or Wenck Assoc. No changes to the actual operational area are taking place; therefore, the amendment will conform to the County Water Management Rules.
- 9. The relatively small size and limited scope of the operation should minimize the potential for adverse environmental effects. The pit would be expanded in an easterly direction with about 1 to 1½ acres being added per year (e.g. 100' x 600'). The applicant indicated that the pit may only be active for 8 to 10 years because of possible City development and the expiration of the Ag Preserve Covenant in 2011. The estimated depth of excavation along the hillside would be about 25 to 30 feet. The profile consists of about 1½' topsoil; 5½' clay; and 20' useable aggregate. The clay would likely be stockpiled along the southwesterly side of the site and the topsoil would be incorporated into the plow ground or stockpiled at the edge of the field. As excavation progresses it may be possible to stage restoration, using the stockpiled material, along the west side of the area that is being actively mined.
- 10. The Carver SWCD (Chip Hentges) reviewed the site regarding erosion control, wetlands, stormwater runoff and restoration. Erosion control should be fairly straightforward. A sand filter berm should be utilized to control runoff toward the wetland. Restoration would require grading at a 5:1 slope for land that would be returned to ag production and 3:1 elsewhere (minimum of 4" of topsoil). An NPDES (MPCA permit) was required, which specifies a rock entrance to assure that sediment does not leave the site, among other standards. Seeding & mulching would be required for the stockpiles and restored areas. He also suggested that staging of restoration might be possible after the third year. SWCD would continue to provide technical assistance on these matters.
- 11. The Dahlgren Town Board reviewed and recommended approval of the amended request on February 21, 2007.
- 12. The Board has considered all the factors required by Section 152.251 of the Carver County Code and finds that all are either true in this case or can be mitigated by conditions placed on the permit.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT THE CARVER COUNTY ZONING ADMINISTRATOR SHALL ISSUE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT #PZ20070005. THIS PERMIT IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO THE CARVER COUNTY CODE, SECTION(S) 152.080 C4 ON PROPERTY LEGALLY DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A". THIS PERMIT SHALL TERMINATE AND SUPERCEDE THE PRIOR APPROVED CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT #PZ20030068. THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS SHALL BE ATTACHED TO THE PERMIT:

- 1. The permit is subject to compliance review. A change in ownership, operations or operator shall be cause for the permit to be reviewed by the Land Management Department for a determination as to whether an application for an amendment or similar consideration is necessary. Proposed owners and/or operators are encouraged to contact the County Land Management Department as early on in the timeline of the proposed change as possible.
- 2. The mining operation shall conform in accordance with the letter, dated 10/27/03, and the approved site plans, dated 11/05/03. The hours of operation shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, except operations may extend beyond these hours for occasional short-term projects and/or emergencies provided the Permittee notifies the County Land Management Department and Dahlgren Township, prior to the project(s).

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION OF AGENDA ITEM: Facilities Services has been working with an architect (Architectural Alliance) to complete planning and predevelopment activities for the construction of additional vehicle and equipment storage needs at Public Works HQ. Public Works, the Sheriff's Office and other county departments have been involved in the development of programming, master planning, and architectural plans; all of which are complete. As of this writing, civil engineering is in process but is expected to be completed prior presentation of this board action. Competitive pricing shall be requested from suppliers after completion of the engineering plans.
This board action provides an update of a new semi-heated storage facility and added space to cold storage at PWHQ in Cologne. We anticipate both efforts can be accomplished with the \$654,000 budgeted for this effort.
The programming and master plan activities indicate construction of a new semi-heated 14,856 square foot metal building with a concrete floor and heated fresh (make up) air. The building design allows for the Sheriff's Emergency Response Team (SERT) vehicles to be moved from building area "C" of the main Public Works Facility to a new drive through space in the new storage building thus freeing up space for PW. Additionally, the new storage building will accommodate various specialty emergency vehicles as well as evidence storage.
While most of the immediate demand for the semi-heated space is being motivated by Law Enforcement and is initially being dedicated towards that use, exclusive use the space is not intended. Final use plans for the expanded cold storage is expected to be mainly of units from public works.
A goal achieved by the programming and master planning is the addition of vehicle parking for staff, service vehicles and equipment. Thirty two new stalls are programmed between the existing semi-heated building and proposed new structure allowing for a distance of sixty (60) feet between buildings. Should additional security be necessary, this area can be fenced and gated.
The cold storage facility is programmed to be expanded by the original plan amount of 7,136 square feet. Some site work will be needed to be addressed by our staff to accommodate adequate movement in and out of the new cold storage.
The primary issue associated with the project is the amount of site work necessary to accommodate the project and the amount of new bituminous necessary. Depending on the bids, portions of bituminous may have to be removed due to budget considerations and the use of in-house staff may be a consideration to support the additional site work. PW does have pile of recycled asphalt on site that maybe used to accommodate this project.
Planning submittals are expected at the time of this review. Planning staff has indicated that the preliminary plans, as presented, follows the conditions of the existing Conditional Use Permit and Master Plan thus no review by the Planning Commission is scheduled.
