A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on February 20, 2007. Chair Gayle Degler convened the session at 4:00 p.m.

Members present: Gayle Degler, Chair, James Ische, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Lynch moved, Workman seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Ische seconded, to approve the minutes of the February 13, 2007, Regular Session Motion carried unanimously.

Under public participation, Gloria Ostrowski, Chaska, stated she received a notice of delinquent taxes and requested the penalty be waived. She explained she was not the original owner and never received a bill. Ms. Ostrowski stated she spoke with the Taxpayer Services Department and they were not willing to accept payment without the penalty. She indicated she was asking for the penalty to be removed and asked to get this resolved as soon as possible.

Chair Degler directed that the County Administrator discuss this with Taxpayer Services and follow up with a phone call to Ms. Ostrowski.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Renewed set up license for Marsh Lake Hunting Preserve, Inc.

Approved letter of agreement between the University of Minnesota CEED and Carver County Public Health for workshop/presentation on March 13, 2007.

Motion carried unanimously.

David Hemze, County Administrator, requested the Board approve the purchase of property related to a future CSAH 30 corridor.

Roger Gustafson, County Engineer, reviewed the history of the corridor and studies that were done. He highlighted the area that was originally a search area for a North/South corridor to the East of

Highway 284. Gustafson illustrated the general location that is conceptually being considered for the North/South corridor. He identified the section that is currently owned by PlowShares and being considered for purchase.

Hemze noted the previous discussions related to the critical nature of the North/South corridor. He stated they have reached a verbal agreement for a 50-50 cost share with the City of Waconia which the City will also be considering tonight. Hemze explained the comparable sales that have occurred in the area and the purchase price of \$110,000 per acre that was verbally agreed to. He noted they would purchasing approximately 10.63 acres. He stated he was asking for the Board to give him the authority to develop a formal agreement for the purchase and to develop a cost share agreement with the City of Waconia.

Gustafson noted the possible timeframe for the entire corridor to be developed. Hemze pointed out the City of Waconia was interested in preserving this corridor and while there was no immediate funding for the entire corridor, preservation was critical.

The Board discussed the purchase price and the importance of preserving the corridor.

Lynch moved, Ische seconded, to approve purchase of up to 10.63 acres of property from Plowshares Development for \$110,000 per acre for a total purchase price of \$1,169.300, to direct the County Administrator to develop final purchase agreements subject to review of the County Attorney and Risk/Management Offices and related Public Works budget amendment transferring \$589,650 from fund balance to land acquisition account. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Lynch seconded, to direct the County Administrator to develop cost share agreement with the City of Waconia to split the purchase price of the corridor equally with the County, subject to the review of the County Attorney and Risk/Emergency Management Offices. Motion carried unanimously.

Ische moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 4:30 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.


Construction Plans and Specifications


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Child Support Officer Reclassification

Child Support is a federally mandated function involving the establishment and enforcement of court orders so that custodial parents have the necessary financial resources to raise their children. There are numerous functions that our 6 Child Support Officers (CSO) and 6 Support Enforcement Aides (SEA) perform to ensure that basic child support, child care support & medical support are ordered and enforced. The program is financed by a combination of sources, including Federal Financial Participation funds, Federal Incentive Funds, State Incentive Funds, and County Tax Levy. Federal and State Incentive funds are earned based upon how well the county performs on selected measures. In 2006 the county earned \$157,000 in Federal Incentive funding & \$41,000 in State Incentive funding.


We have been attempting to earn the maximum amount of Federal Incentive funding available, which requires attainment of 80% or greater on the individual measures. While some of our efforts have resulted in lasting improvements, others have not. The chart below lists our results over the past seven federal fiscal years.

Child Support Federal Performance Measures



While we have consistently earned 100% of the incentive funding possible in two of the measures, paternity establishment and order establishment, we have yet to do so in the remaining measures. Our arrears collection improved in 2000 & 2001 due to our ability to intercept MN tax rebates during those years. Earlier this year we assigned a Support Enforcement Aide to work 25% of her time exclusively on arrears only cases where no payment has been received for over a year in order to increase our results on this measure. Even though we have improved our current support collections since 2001, we have been unable to sustain it. Due to how the incentive funds are calculated & weighted, increasing our current support collected measure would earn us considerably more incentive funding than if we increased our arrears collected.

In 2006 we began a pilot project in an attempt to improve our current support collected. Previously Child Support Officer duties were assigned by function, with selected staff responsible for paternity establishment, order establishment, order enforcement, etc. The pilot assigned 2 staff to focus on all of the various Child Support Officer duties of a distinct caseload, operating under the theory that ownership of a caseload would improve the overall service to our clients and improve our current support collected. The results of this pilot are encouraging, as the chart below illustrates.



2006 - 2007 Current Support Collected %

Since inception through January, there is a 3.4% difference between Case & Function Based percentages. For the last 6 months, August through January, the difference is 4.27%.

Over the nine month pilot period, the 2 case based workers exceeded the results of our function based workers by 3.4%. For the last six months, August through January, the difference was 4.27%. This is a significant improvement in performance. Each 1% increase in the current support measure will generate an additional \$3000 in federal incentive funding.

The department intends to convert all of it's' function based CSOs to case based, & further shift where appropriate selected support enforcement aide duties to the CSOs. In order for this realignment to work as envisioned, the department is requesting to reclassify 2 SEA positions as CSOs. With this realignment, we anticipate generating at least an additional \$6000 in federal incentive funding in 2007, which will more than offset the anticipated \$2738 (\$4086 annually) in additional 2007 salary costs.
