PLEASE BE ADVISED that there will be a special meeting of the joint ditch authority for joint ditch #4 on Tuesday evening, May 30, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. at the Hollywood Township Hall, 15855 County Road 122, Watertown, Minnesota.

The purpose of the meeting of the joint ditch authority is to consider a repair project on joint ditch #4, in particular removing trees from the ditch channel. This procedure is pursuant to Minnesota Statute Section 103E.705.

The joint ditch authority for joint ditch #4 is comprised of three County Commissioners from Carver County and one County Commissioner from McLeod and Wright counties.

They presented a petition and a proposed resolution for adoption by the County Board. The resolution states that the Board is opposed to the use of eminent domain or threat thereof in the acquisition of land for a Regional Park, Trail, or Reserve. The Resolution also states that the Board is opposed to any private property along the River being zoned, guided, mapped or otherwise designated as Regional Park, Trail, or Reserve. A petition signed by 53 citizens was also submitted, along with resolutions from Watertown, Hollywood, & Camden Townships. A copy of the resolution is attached. The City of Mayer is on record in support of continuing planning efforts in the area. The letter is attached. The City of Watertown has not taken a position as of this date. The Board has several options: adopt the resolution or modifications there of; take no action, table action. The staff is recommending that no action be taken on the resolution. The staff has prepared a memo outlining concerns and supporting the recommendation. The memo is attached. Subject: Factors Relating to Adoption of Crow River Citizens Resolution

The Citizens' resolution addresses two Issues: the use of eminent domain to acquire property for a Regional recreational activity; mapping or designation of any property in the Crow River Study area for regional recreation purposes. It must be noted that the resolution is simply that and indicates the policy of the Board on the date passed. The Board could choose to rescind or modify the resolution any time in the future should it chooses to do so. The staff has discussed the implications of adoption of the resolution by the Board.

OPPOSITION TO EMINENT DOMAIN ACQUISITIONS – historically the County has tried to acquire land for regional facilities from willing sellers as opposed to the use of eminent domain. This position has been made clear by staff throughout the process in the Crow River study. Practically speaking, at this time there are no funds available to purchase land from a willing seller let alone go through a condemnation process.

One of the questions raised by the Board at the April meeting was potential legislative activity regarding eminent domain. An AMC update from 11 May seems to indicate that the proposed legislation does not contain language that would substantially affect the eminent domain/parks issue. It appears that their changes are primarily focused on the issue of using eminent domain to support economic development. The changes more clearly and narrowly define what is a "public purpose" in the context of eminent domain proceeding for economic development. The changes also provide for the potential for additional compensation to property owners under certain circumstance. The changes do not seem to have a direct bearing on the issue before the Board.

OPPOSITION TO DESIGNATION OF LAND FOR A REGIONAL RECREATION ACTIVITY (Park, Trail, Reserve) — The Crow River area has been identified as a potential location for recreational activities in a variety of local and regional planning documents dating back to the 1970 Comprehensive Plan. The 2020 Plan adopted in 2000 identified and generally mapped the Crow River between Watertown and Mayer as one of seven Future Open Space Search Areas. The areas in a addition to the Crow river Area are: Lake Waconia North. Coney Island, Baylor Park, Miller Lake, Carver Ravine Area, Bevens Ravine Area, Minnesota River Bluffs, and the Seminary Fen. The areas are shown on Map 4-2 From the Plan attached to this document. The current Plan was adopted after a substantial public process including cities, townships, and the public. Designation on that map has no legal effect on the sale or use of land in the designated areas. To the knowledge of the staff, the ability to sell property or to apply for and be issued the same permits as property outside these areas has not been affected by the mapping of any of the designated search areas.

There was some discussion by landowners of the possibility Three Rivers Park District would "take over" any future park. Carver County is the implementing regional park agency of Carver County. It is highly unlikely that Three Rivers Park District could acquire additional land in Carver County without some sort of a notice or an agreement with the County Board. Three Rivers has Carver Park Reserve that is being operated with funds primarily from the taxing jurisdiction of the Three Rivers Park District and not Carver County. There is no indication that Three Rivers is interested in additional park lands in Carver County.


From a staff point of view, implementation of this portion of the resolution is problematic for several reasons:

- Carver County is experiencing rapid growth the growth of both Watertown and Mayer are prime examples. Both cities are expanding along the Crow River corridor. Both cities will plan for their local parks and open space as they develop. However, if there is no overall vision for the Crow River area on a larger scale and no identification of important natural resources at the larger scale, it is likely the development process will result in fragmentation and isolation of natural resources.
- The County, along with the cities, has a statutory responsibility to plan for future park and open space needs (Land Planning Act; Metropolitan System statements). The implementation of the resolution will make it much more difficult to fulfill this requirement.
- Regional funding is a key component of the acquisition and development larger park and open space facilities. Implementation of the resolution will essentially remove the potential for regional funding for parks and open space facilities in the area. Funding sources will be limited to local and/or private sources, or someone wishing to gift land to the County.
- The Board's adopted vision statement includes as part of the vision the preservation of "natural areas, parklands, lakes and streams;". There is clearly public support of this vision. In the 2004 Citizen's survey 85% of those surveyed voiced support (45% strong support, 40% somewhat support) for County acquisition of amenity areas, (lakes, streams, rivers, natural areas, etc) for open space or parks. When asked if they would be willing to pay additional property taxes to support acquisition 67% answered "yes". The amounts they were willing to pay varied from \$1 per year to \$120 per year. Implementation of the resolution will make this vision more difficult to achieve in the Crow River Area. The results were similar in all of the Commissioner districts across the county.
- The goal of the planning process is to achieve the goals expressed by the citizens of the county. There is overall citizen support for recreation open space including parks and trails. The planning process is intended to achieve the goal by finding out what resources exist (inventory); analyzing the data (in this case determining what park & open space resources are in the area) and identifying where the resources are located; developing implementation plans to protect, preserve, and utilize identified resources. Implementation of the resolution will make this process much more difficult by limiting the identification of regional scale resources and have an overall chilling effect on planning efforts of this nature. If this approach is applied in other areas of long range planning transportation, transit, trails, growth areas, corridors the County will have no real ability to develop long range plans.
- The current parks Open Space Plan is the result of 30 years or more of planning on a comprehensive and public scale. The comprehensive planning process is "comprehensive" and is intended to engage diverse stakeholders to develop an overall plan to address inter-related, and sometimes competing, public policy goals. For example decisions about parks do not affect parks alone, these decisions may have impacts on local taxes, geographic distribution of recreational lands and services, infrastructure, quality of life and environmental issues.

While the significant controversy and citizens concern, it is likely that the basic interests of the area citizens and the county as a whole – are the same – preservation of the natural resources in the Crow River area. The issue probably more in how and when. The County is beginning a comprehensive planning process where issues such as this can be addressed in a more global forum and decided with the input of all stakeholders.

The areas of concern identified above are general in nature the staff feels the Board should be aware of if they choose to adopt the proposed resolution. The staff has not included large volumes of background material. If the Board wishes to review further background material the staff can supply such material as requested. Representatives of the Park Commission and Park Staff could present the materials provided at other public meetings about Crow River natural resources features and recreation opportunities if desired. For the Board's information we have attached a detailed chronology of the Crow River project from its inception in 2003 through the most current activities in 2006.
