BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION: In 2014, changes were made to the state law that includes electronic delivery devices (e-cigarettes) in the definition of tobacco products and allows local municipalities to regulate e-cigarettes. Due to these changes in the law and the current state of the County Ordinance, it is important the County stays current with similar language that defines all electronic delivery products. The Taxpayer Services Division and Public Health Department began working to update the County's tobacco ordinance to include electronic delivery devices in the definition of tobacco products to ensure that the County and local municipalities have regulatory authority to license e-cigarettes. E-cigarettes are not subject to manufacturing standards; and while most electronic delivery devices contain nicotine, some devices are marketed as nicotine and/or tobacco free and as a result, are not covered by laws that only regulate tobacco products. Accordingly, Taxpayer Services has made discrete changes to the County Tobacco Ordinance to have electronic delivery devices properly included into the definition of a "Tobacco Product." Changes were made in the Park's Ordinance in order to have uniformity among the County's tobacco regulations. The Sheriff's Office has been consulted and is comfortable with the proposed changes.
