New Business:

A) Request to gate the Lake Bavaria Boat Access to Prevent the Spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS)

The Lake Bavaria Homeowners Association has made a request to have electronic gates installed at the public boat access on Lake Bavaria to provide protection against the spread of AIS.

Background

Carver County owns and operates the public boat access on Lake Bavaria.

In February, the Friends of Lake Bavaria (FLB) requested that an AIS inspection program be implemented at the boat access similar as what the County and Minnehaha Creek Watershed District provided at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park.

The Park Commission did not recommend approval of an inspection program at Lake Bavaria citing that the program at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park was a trial or pilot program.

Separate from the inspection program at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park, the County is providing AIS service at Bavaria, Waconia, Hydes and Reitz lakes. Funding for the inspections has been provided through a grant provided by the DNR and funds from the Carver County Land and Water Services Department. Generally, an inspector will be staffed at the Lake Bavaria access one 4 to 8 hour shift on a Saturday or Sunday each weekend during the summer.

Additional signage has been installed at the Lake Bavaria access reminding boaters to check, clean and drain their boats. A sign has also been installed indicating that boaters can voluntarily get free watercraft inspections at Lake Minnewashta Park. A map showing directions to Lake Minnewashta is included on the sign.

The 2012 Legislative Session has provided new law effective July 1, 2012. This legislation provides the Commissioner of the DNR with additional latitude to enter into agreements delegating inspection authority and allowing for inspection stations to be located near or at public water access sites or in locations that allow for the servicing of multiple waters.

<u>Proposal</u>

The request by the FLB for gated boat access would prevent boaters from accessing the boat launch area until they received an AIS inspection and access code. The proposal directs boaters that want to launch watercraft on Lake Bavaria to Lake Minnewashta Regional Park for an AIS inspection and access code before entering Lake Bavaria.

Restricting public access with an automated gate is proposed as an alternative to providing on site inspectors and as a potential means to be a more cost effective approach to providing inspection service at a regional or area basis as compared to each boat access having staffed inspectors.

The request by the FLB would have an effect beyond their members. Other users of the lake are largely unaware of the request for a gated access or have not had opportunity to voice support or oppose the request.

The request would imply additional costs or arrangements would be needed beyond the cost to install a gated access on the Lake. It is estimated that an electronic gated system with accompanying electric and utility lines may exceed \$25,000.

The new legislation which allows for aquatic invasive inspection stations also requires that a decontamination station be available or within a reasonable distance.

Potential costs of a decontamination unit or an agreement for decontamination would need to be included in with a proposal to gate the Lake Bavaria access. Additional costs for infrastructure may also be needed to expand an area in the park to provide suitable space or a fairly level area for a decontamination unit and boat inspections. Other needs would include a shelter to house staff and computer to provide access codes. Operational costs of providing decontamination staffing for decontamination are not currently calculated.

The request to gate the access at Lake Bavaria has implications which go beyond the cost to install gates at Lake Bavaria. These other implication include a need for a broader public involvement process, decontamination site selection or agreement for decontamination service, costs for infrastructure, capital equipment, operational costs and changes to operations at Lake Minnewashta Park. A more detailed analysis, plan, and public input would be needed to make a recommendation to provide an electronic gate system which would restrict watercraft from launching.

Recommendation:

- 1) Recommend additional aquatic invasive species measures above what is currently being offered not be considered for the 2012 season at Lake Bavaria.
- 2) Request the County Board at an upcoming workshop session provide direction to Park Commission and staff for aquatic invasive species inspection services to be offered by the County for 2013.

Attached to this report is a summary of Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Legislation that has been prepared by the Minnesota Department of Natural resources.

A) Recommendation to Issue Annual Vehicle Passes to County Board Members

County Board Members should feel comfortable accessing our County Park areas without the worry of not having a vehicle permit and risking possible patrol stops for permits while in our county parks. There are lots of programs, ongoing maintenance operations and construction projects that Board Members should have access too. Providing annual vehicle permits to Board Members is a way in which they would be properly identified in the park areas and reduces the need for explanations as to who they are at park entrance points. Additionally, should they be approached by the County Sheriff Deputies while in the park, they would be properly permitted.

<u>Recommendation:</u> It is recommended that the Park Commission recommended each Board Member be issued two annual vehicle permits for their vehicles for the purposes of having access to County Park facilities.

Construction of the large retaining wall north of Lake Lucy Road is underway. Installation of culverts required for drainage has begun. Work to establish trail grade has begun near Picnic Shelter #3.



Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Legislation Summary

Laws of Minnesota 2012, Chapter 272





Effective 7-1-2012, unless otherwise noted

This is a summary of new laws related to prevention and management of aquatic invasive species (AIS) that will apply to boaters, property owners, service providers, bait dealers and others involved with the transportation of water-related equipment.

Penalties

- Civil penalties/amounts are generally doubled from previous amounts
- Penalty amounts are doubled the base amount if one or more prior convictions or civil citations
- Failing to leave drain plug opened while transporting technical correction to civil citation penalty provision

Inspections

- DNR can require mandatory inspections of water-related equipment before a person places or removed equipment into/out of a water body
- Inspection stations can be located at or near public water access sites or in locations that allow for servicing multiple water bodies
- Commissioner shall ensure inspection stations: 1) have adequate staffing, 2) allow for reasonable travel time between accesses and inspection stations, 3) are located so as not to create traffic delays or public safety issues, 4) have decontamination equipment available, and 5) do not reduce capacity or hours of operation of public accesses.
- Commissioner may enter into delegation agreements with local or tribal government if local or tribal government assume all legal, financial, and administrative responsibility in their jurisdiction, and must:
 - 1) employ inspectors that have been trained/authorized by DNR, 2) conduct inspections and decontamination measures as approved by DNR, 3) have decontamination equipment available at inspection stations or within reasonable distance of inspection stations, 4) provide inspection stations that do not create traffic delays or public safety issues, 5) submit a plan approved by DNR with no reduction in capacity or hours of operation of public accesses, adequate staffing and enforcement capacity, 6) must submit an annual report to DNR, and 7) other requirements per section
- Allows conservation officers and other peace officers to require water-related equipment be removed from a water body if necessary to implement aquatic invasive species control measures.

Boating/Fishing

- Clarifying that a person may not launch any water-related equipment (was watercraft/trailer) into waters of the state with prohibited species attached
- Portable bait containers do not need to be drained when fishing through the ice, except when in VHS designated waters
- Requirement to attach AIS rules decal to boats is repealed (2011 legislation)
- Require anyone who transports watercraft or water-related equipment with a trailer to complete an online education course. After completing the course, the person will receive a decal that must be placed on their trailer, certifying they have taken the course. People taking the course can receive extra stickers if they own or use multiple trailers for watercraft or water-related equipment.
 - o 7-day temporary can be requested by persons that have not completed the training
 - O Decal must be adhered to side of the trailer frame tongue near the hitch
 - O Decals are not transferable
 - o Goes into effect 7/01/2015
 - Warnings only, no criminal penalty even after effective

Property Owners

 Boat lift, dock, swim raft, etc. removed from any water body may not be placed in another water body for at least 21 days

Service Providers

- Service providers definition includes service provided as a benefit of a yacht club, boat club, marina, or similar organization
- Service provider decals to be displayed on inside lower driver's side windshield

Bait Harvesting/ possession of bait

- Harvest of bait by hook and line from infested waters is allowed for bullheads, goldeyes mooneyes, sheepshead (freshwater drum) and suckers with following conditions: 1) to be used for personal use ONLY; 2) used on the same body of water where caught and while still on that water body; 3) the bait/fish may not be transported live from or off that water body; 4) bait/fish meet all other size restrictions and requirements; and 5) bait/fish are included in any daily limits
- Possession/importation of dead bait from VHS waters must be preserved in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. Shipments need to have documentation showing water body source, lot number, company contact information (name, phone, address), date of packaging and labeling, and valid negative fish health certification for the water body/
