trail.

OLD BUSINESS -

a. Legacy Forest and Park Donation Program

Klevan Schmitz and Walsh provided a draft policy for donations to the parks department. Discuss took place about plaques on donated items and if it would be appropriate in our park areas. Discussion also took place about how to get people connected to the item(s) they chose to donate towards. Staff will continue to work on the Draft Policy and present again in the upcoming months.

NEW BUSINESS -

a. Park CIP Presentation

Walsh provided a handout of the PowerPoint presentation he recently made to the County Board regarding the Park Department CIP. Walsh walked through the presentation for the park commission highlighting the goals of the CIP, prioritized projects for the upcoming 3-4 years, unfunded projects and providing some options to help fund future CIP projects.

b. Baylor Park Beach Usage Report

Klevan Schmitz provided a brief summary of the report he put together based on the surveys which were collected this past summer at Baylor Regional Park. One of the reasons for the survey was to find out the importance of the park facilities, especially the beach and swimming area. This information could help guide staff in evaluating the cost benefit of maintaining the swimming area at Baylor Regional Park into the future.

STAFF REPORTS-

a. Application to the Lessard Sams Outdoor Heritage Council

Walsh informed the park commission that staff has recently submitted a funding request application for funds through the L-SOHC (Legacy Funding) for the acquisition of the Paul's Parcel needed for Lake Waconia Regional Park. The request was for \$1,260,000 and would be combined with \$567,000 in county funds and \$1,700,000 in metropolitan council Acquisition Opportunity Funds for the acquisition and restoration of the site.

b. Events and Activities

Klevan Schmitz thanked park commissioner Wingert for attending the Chili Cook off at Baylor on October 17th. Wingert assisted with judging the event as they crowned the 2009 Baylor Chili Champ. Klevan Schmitz also invited members of the park commission to the following upcoming events:

- Santa in the Park on December 19th from 1-4 at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park
- Candlelight Ski/Walk events on January 9th and February 6th from 6-9 p.m. at Baylor Regional Park

c. Regional Park Policy Plan

Walsh briefly talked about the updates being considered for addition to the Met Council Policy Plan Update. Most notable in Carver County would be a regional trail corridor along the Minnesota River Bluffs.

COMMISSION MEMBERS REPORTS

a. Equestrian Sub Committee Karki informed the park commission that the subcommittee met on October 24th at Carver Park Reserve to look at established horse trails in the park. Karki and a member of the subcommittee took a short horse ride and Walsh and Tieden walked along with those on horseback. As part of the onsite tour they also had a chance to talk with a member of the Three Rivers Park District Mounted Police. Tieden noted that he felt that equestrian facilities needed a lot of space for parking, trailers, loading and unloading and trails. The next meeting of the subcommittee will be Saturday November 7th at Murphy Harahan Regional Park in Scott County.

New Business

A) Request for Event Flag Pole Installation at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park

Savannah Riese, Meaghan Walker, and Sara Morton of Girl Scout Troup 11257 have requested to install two event flag poles at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park near picnic area #5. The scouts are proposing that the two flag poles to have a permanent base anchoring system and poles which would be erected on an event basis.

I have met with the scouts to review their request. They are proposing a site that is quite visible on a small knoll west of the shelter area. Attached is an aerial photograph of picnic area #5 including the shelter. The letter "A" represents the location the scouts have selected. This site meets the scouts objectives in terms of visibility and would be located adjacent to a sizable open area for to assembling scouts during flag raising ceremonies. The location for the permanent base anchoring system is out of the way from most traffic concerns and away from where tents or where other activities might be planned for other events.

Staff also reviewed the site for other possible locations. Site B is shown as a possible option as compared to site A. The Site B is not as prominent in term of visibility as compared to Site A but still quite visible, is in good relation to other built features at picnic area #5 and out of the way for most traffic considerations.

The Scouts will be making a formal presentation to the commission.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of a flag pole installation which has permanent anchors and would have flag poles that could be installed on an event basis. The event basis installation minimizes concerns with maintenance and erected poles which would only be used during an event. Staff does not have a strong recommendation for either site A or site B and defers this decision to the discretion of the Commission.

B) Dakota Rail Regional Trail Recommendation to Accept Low Bid and Proceed with Development of Contract

Bids were opened on January 5th for the construction of approximately 6.9 miles of bituminous trail on the Dakota Rail Regional Trail corridor, extending from the east county line to the City of Mayer. The engineers estimate for the project was \$1,967,939. The project received authorization to use \$1,042,000 of Federal Transportation Enhancement Funds, and \$550,000 of Federal American Reinvestment Recovery Act Funds (Stimulus Funds). In addition it was anticipated that approximately \$375,939 in local funds would be needed as a match to the Federal Transportation Enhancement funds and provide the remaining funding needed to balance the cost of construction.

The County received very favorable bids for the project. The apparent low bidder is Chard Tiling and Excavating out of Belle Plain with a low bid of \$1,244,713.71. I have attached the Bid Summary for additional information.

At this time we are waiting to hear back from MNDOT on the how our federal funds can be applied to the project. We are anticipating that the ARRA funds would be utilized first then Transportation Enhancement Funds. If this is the case, then the following table explains what could be anticipated for a local construction share to the project.

Staff is exploring with our consulting engineer and the MNDOT project manager if uncommitted federal funds could be used in other ways such as funding remaining engineering work, landscaping, trailhead features such as a kiosk, and possibly to extend the trail further west. Exploring these option may help maximize federal funding.

Recommendation:

Staff is recommending that the County accept the low bid form Chard Tiling and Excavating for the amount \$1,244,713.71 and that the contract be prepared.

C) Review Goals and Activities of 2009

I have included for your review the listing of goals and activities for 2009. Staff will review what has been accomplished and as a group we can begin to assemble goals and activities for 2010

Staff Reports:

A) Use and Revenue Reports

During our meeting graphics will be presented showing the usage and revenue generated at our park areas. The charts show significant increases in activity over the last 5 years.

- B) Lenny has been working to update addresses of our park facilities and areas. He will review with you work to date on addressing and a consideration to name the main park road at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park. By updating our addresses it is anticipated that emergency response personnel and other service providers to our parks will have better information to get them to locations within the parks.
- C) Upcoming events and activities include:
 - a. Candlelight Ski Events Saturday, January 9 and February 6, 2010
 - b. Camping Reservation begin January 12, for the 2010 season
 - c. January 23 rd, Free Ski Day at Baylor and Lake Minnewashta Regional Parks

D) Regional Park Foundation

The last meeting of the Regional Park foundation was December 10, 2009. The Executive Director, Jane Johnson, review with the foundation accomplishments of the first year of the foundation. Accomplishments included the formation of the foundation, hiring of an executive director, appointment of board members, creation of promotional materials such as brochures and development of the Regional Park Foundation Web Page. A treasure's report was provided. December's report had a balance of \$158,734.97. The foundation continues to look for philanthropic and enthusiastic persons to fill three open seats.
