BACKGROUND/JUSTIFICATION:

<u>Background</u>: As one of the seven metropolitan counties, Carver County is subject to State regulations and statutes that guide and mandate how solid waste generated within its borders is managed. These requirements are often much more detailed and restrictive than those for non-metro counties. Among these requirements are mandates for an overall County Solid Waste Master Plan and yearly reporting on how waste is managed by such methods as recycling, composting, processing, and landfilling. Under this statewide system, enforced by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) environmental protection via reduction of the amount of waste landfilled is the ultimate goal.

As part of these requirements, the County is required to submit to the MPCA a yearly Solid Waste Certification Report that details the amounts of waste managed by different methods and entities and documents progress toward goals and other mandates. The MPCA is charged with reviewing the report and approving or disapproving it. If the MPCA disapproves two-consecutive reports (two-years in a row), Minnesota Statute 473.848, subd. 2(b) states, "the MPCA shall develop specific reduction techniques that are designed for the particular needs of the county. The county shall implement those techniques by specific dates to be determined by the MPCA." The statute carries the implied threat of a loss of state solid waste program grant dollars. Carver County currents receives about \$260,000 per year in the SCORE Solid Waste Grant from the MPCA, about \$150,000 per year from the LRDG Solid Waste Grant, and funding from other competitive grant programs for specific needs.

The County received a letter from MPCA staff dated May 14, 2015. The letter states that the 2014 Waste Certification report was disapproved. The letter states "the basis for the disapproval is the determination that Carver County is not in compliance with Minn. Statute 473.848, subd. 2(b) requiring the county to reduce the amount of unprocessed waste." That is, the MPCA concluded that too much of the waste generated in the County has been going to landfills. At this work session, the staff will discuss with the Board the response below, developed in conjunction with the MPCA.

County Staff Response: The County does not generate enough waste to make its own waste processing facility economically viable, and other options are limited. The County has chosen to concentrate efforts on problem materials management, recycling, and composting and to work on a regional level on the issue of solid waste processing capacity for the Metro region.

The County staff reviewed options with MPCA staff and developed the following course of action. In addition to satisfying the MPCA's request for further action to generate waste processing, the efforts below will provide information that will assist the staff and the County Board in developing the next County Solid Waste Master Plan, which will be required in 2017.

- The County staff will organize a meeting with all County municipalities and schools to discuss waste processing from publicly owned facilities. MPCA staff will participate in these meeting and stress the need to consider options that comply with State Statutes requiring processing. This meeting is scheduled for 11/05/15.
- The County staff will organize a meeting with private solid waste haulers that operate in Carver County. MPCA staff will
 participate in the meeting and provide information and technical assistance about options for waste processing. This meeting
 has been scheduled for 10/22/15.
- 3. The County staff is pursuing a contract with Minnesota Waste Wise, an affiliate of the Minnesota Chamber of Commerce, to conduct a series of training sessions and one-on-one technical assistance meetings with businesses and multi-family housing units. A contract for this effort is going through the County contract review process.
- 4. The County's Environmental Services Department also applied for and received a "GreenCorp" staff person via a MPCA program. This person has an 11-month assignment to work directly with the Environmental Services staff on developing a multifamily housing unit recycling program and assisting with a study of current residential recycling rates. The staff is interviewing consultants for assistance on this process.

Besides helping to obtain approval of the 2015 Waste Certification Report, another result of these efforts should be increased information on the status of recycling in Carver County, increases in recycling and waste processing, and information that will assist efforts in developing the new Solid Waste Master Plan in 2017.

Dear Mr. Lein:

Thank you for meeting with Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) staff to discuss strategies to advance solid waste management in Carver County (County). We appreciate the effort you have made to address issues that resulted in disproval of Carver County's 2014 Annual Certification Report based on our recent conversations. In a May 2015 letter, the MPCA proposed three areas in which to focus your efforts – hauling contracts, meetings with licensed waste haulers, and improving residential recycling rates.

We understand you have reviewed county waste hauling contracts to ensure the contract language requires all public entity waste be delivered to a waste processing facility. The MPCA also encourages the County to ensure penalties be specified in the contracts for not delivering waste to a facility, a violation of the contract terms. Further, language should be included that ensures "like waste" provisions are not acceptable.

The County has agreed to organize a meeting with Carver County municipalities as well as one-on-one meetings with licensed solid waste haulers. The MPCA will participate in these meetings, as requested by the County, to help clear up any confusion with state law and statute governing waste processing and disposal, as well as to provide technical support and assistance with implementation activities. Please contact us as you are scheduling these meetings to ensure staff can attend.

Proposed topics to include in the meeting with cities are as follows:

- Waste processing requirements of public entities
- Contract language
- Consistency with the County Master Plan
- Strategies to increase traditional recyclables collection
 - Green Steps Cities resources
 - GreenCorp member work plan
 - o Research into waste/recycling composition and public participation

Proposed topics for meeting with waste haulers:

- Public entity waste processing requirements
- Verification provided to customers regarding where waste is taken
- Discussion of "like waste"
- · State, county, city and hauler obligations and accountability
- Research into waste/recycling composition and public participation

County staff indicated initial outreach has begun to develop a contract for services to obtain data on residential recycling programs, specifically participation and set out rates. In addition to conducting a study, the County has mentioned working with businesses and multi-family residential buildings to improve recycling participation, likely through a contract with WasteWise. The County also has a GreenCorps member starting this fall who will be tasked with working with these multi-family buildings on an ongoing basis.

Please take time to review the actions proposed in this letter and contact me with any questions and to coordinate on forthcoming meetings. Thank you for your continued commitment to improving solid waste management in Minnesota.
